DIRECTIVE 19/16*Supersedes: 07/16***Minister for Employment and Industrial Relations Directive:
Hours, Overtime and Excess Travel**

Pursuant to section 52(3) of the *Public Service Act 2008* and section 687(3) of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999*, **Part A** of this directive prevails over an industrial instrument to the extent of any inconsistency. Industrial instrument means an award, certified agreement or decision of the Queensland Industrial Relations Commission.

1. Purpose:

To prescribe:

- the ordinary hours of work for employees not covered by awards or agreements
- compensation for overtime for public service employees, whether covered by awards or not
- compensation for overtime meal allowance for certain employees
- the compensation for excess travel time for certain employees.

2. Effective date: 1 July 2016.**3. Legislative authority:**

Section 54(1) of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

4. Application:

This Directive applies to particular public service employees as specified in the provisions of this Directive.

This Directive applies to employees engaged at the Senior Officer classification level only in relation to Part B – Overtime Meal Allowance.

DIRECTIVE**PART A - HOURS AND OVERTIME****6. Hours of work not specified in an industrial instrument**

- 6.1 Where an industrial instrument does not specify hours of work, the ordinary hours of work are to be the hours that were previously determined to apply or were worked by that class of employee immediately before the commencement of this Directive.

7. Requirement to undertake overtime

- 7.1 Public service employees required to work overtime are, as far as practicable:

- (a) to be provided with reasonable notice of such requirement
- (b) not to be required to work overtime for more than:
 - (i) a reasonable length of time on any one occasion; or
 - (ii) a reasonable number of times in any period.

- 7.2 Public service employees who worked overtime and

- (a) who obtained approval from their chief executive prior to working overtime; or
- (b) in the absence of prior approval, whose chief executive is subsequently satisfied that it was essential for the proper conduct of public business that the employee work overtime and that the work could not have reasonably been performed within the employee's ordinary work hours,

are to be compensated in accordance with the applicable industrial instrument, read in conjunction with clause 7.3. No claim for overtime is to be approved where an employee elects (elected) to work overtime solely for their own convenience.

- 7.3 Subject to clause 7.5, compensation for overtime:

- (a) for employees (excluding field staff) in receipt of wages that do not exceed AO5(4) of the CRS **and** all casual employees, is in accordance with the provisions of an applicable industrial instrument;
- (b) for employees (excluding casual employees) in receipt of wages in excess of AO5(4) of the CRS but not in excess of AO6(4) of the CRS, is by the provision of equivalent time-off-in lieu (TOIL);
 - (i) Provided that TOIL so accrued will be paid out at ordinary time rates if it remains unused after 12 months from the date overtime was worked, where the employee has both taken reasonable steps to avoid excessive TOIL balances and been refused an application to take such TOIL.
- (c) for employees (excluding casual employees) in receipt of wages in excess of AO6(4) of the CRS, is by the provision of equivalent TOIL.
 - (i) Provided that TOIL so accrued will lapse if not taken within 12 months from the date overtime was worked.

- 7.4 TOIL is to be taken within 12 months of the date overtime was worked and at a time convenient to the department and the employee. Where agreement cannot be reached, the department may direct the employee when the TOIL is to be taken.

- 7.5 A chief executive may in exceptional circumstances, approve an exclusion from the salary limitations for overtime compensation set out in clause 7.3. Applications to a chief executive must be supported by persuasive evidence and must be considered on a case by case basis.

- (a) Where an exclusion is approved under clause 7.5, overtime will be paid at the AO5(4) rate unless otherwise approved by the chief executive.

7.6 Where a public service employee is required to work overtime **and** public transport is not available or taking public transport is a safety risk, the employer is responsible for ensuring that alternative transport to that employee's home is available. This generally means the provision of a departmental car, taxi vouchers or reimbursement of taxi fares on production of a receipt.

PART B – OVERTIME MEAL ALLOWANCE

8. Overtime meal allowance

8.1 Part B does not apply to:

- (a) general employees engaged under s147 of the *Public Service Act 2008*, or
(b) employees engaged on a casual basis under s148(2)(b) of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

8.2 Where a public service employee is required to work more than:

- (a) 3 hours overtime in addition to hours worked between ordinary starting and ceasing time; or
(b) 3 hours overtime worked where such overtime is in excess of a full overtime shift,
they are to take a meal break of 45 minutes for each such period of overtime.

8.3 A public service employee required to work overtime is to be paid meal allowances in accordance with schedule one, provided that a meal allowance is not payable where a meal of reasonable quality and adequate quantity is supplied in lieu.

8.4 Without the approval of the chief executive, a claim for a meal allowance under clause 8.3 will not be paid unless it is submitted within 12 months of:

- (a) the date of completion of the work; or
(b) the incurring of the expense; or
(c) the conclusion of the circumstances leading to the claim.

8.5 In the interests of health and efficiency, overtime as described in clause 8.2 should not occur unless special circumstances exist.

8.6 An employee is not eligible for an overtime meal allowance under this directive if they also claim an overtime meal allowance under the relevant modern award in relation to the same meal (i.e. the first meal or the second meal) in respect of a single instance of overtime on any one day (or continuous period if the overtime commences on one day and continues into the next day). This means that an employee may elect to claim an overtime meal allowance under the directive or the relevant award, but not both.

8.7 At the same time of any adjustment to the allowances in the relevant award, the allowances set out in schedule one of this directive shall be automatically increased by the percentage movement in the Eight Capitals Consumer Price Index for the Take-away and fast foods sub-group most recently published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics since the allowance was last adjusted (starting from an initial 'adjustment date' of 1 September 2015).

PART C - EXCESS TRAVEL TIME

9. Requirement to undertake official travel outside of hours

9.1 Public service employees covered by the *Queensland Public Service Award – State 2012* who are required to undertake official travel away from their normal headquarters outside the ordinary spread of hours (excess travel) are to be compensated by the provision of TOIL.

9.2 The amount of compensation under clause 9.1:

- (a) is calculated on the time taken for the official travel less the time the employee would usually spend travelling between their residence and usual workplace; and

Example:
(based on 6am-6pm spread of hours)

Start of travel	End of travel	Out of hours travel	Usual travel time	Excess travel time
5:00am	7:00am	1 hour	30 minutes	30 minutes
5:00am	6:00am	1 hour	30 minutes	30 minutes
6:00pm	8:00pm	2 hours	30 minutes	1 ½ hours

- (b) is calculated to the nearest quarter hour, provided that the minimum claim is 30 minutes (i.e. no compensation is due where excess travel is less than 30 minutes) and the maximum is eight (8) hours in any one calendar day.

Example:

Excess travel time	Rounded time	Compensation
20 minutes	15 minutes	Nil (rounded time is less than 30 minutes)
25 minutes	30 minutes	30 minutes

- 9.3 Claims for TOIL under clause 9.1 must be supported by documentation acceptable to the chief executive, including detailing departure and arrival times.
- 9.4 Claims under clause 9.1 do not affect the employee's entitlement to travel allowances / expenses, meal allowances, vehicle allowances etc, where applicable.
- 9.5 TOIL is to be taken at a time convenient to the department and the employee and within 12 months of the date overtime was worked. Where agreement cannot be reached, the department may direct the employee when the TOIL is to be taken.
- 9.6 Unused TOIL will be paid out at ordinary time rates after 12 months from the date overtime was worked where:
- (a) an employee has taken reasonable steps to avoid excessive TOIL balances; and
- (b) the employee has been refused an application to take such TOIL.

GENERAL

10. Definitions

Unless otherwise defined, terms in this Directive have the meaning prescribed in the *Public Service Act 2008*.

CRS means the Public Service Classification and Remuneration System. The monetary rate is the rate applicable for the department where the employee is employed.

Equivalent TOIL means time-off-in-lieu on a time for time basis.

Field staff means those employees identified as field staff in accordance with the ministerial Directive relating to field staff as issued or amended from time to time.

Full overtime shift means the same number of hours an employee is required to work on an ordinary day (e.g. clerical administrative officer 7.25 hours, field staff 7.6 hours).

Industrial instrument means an award, industrial agreement or certified agreement or decision of the Queensland Industrial Relations Commission.

Ordinary spread of hours has the definition prescribed in the *Queensland Public Service Award – State 2012*.

Ordinary hours of work are as specified in the applicable award, industrial agreement or certified agreement. Where no such hours are specified, the ordinary hours of work are to be the hours that were previously determined to apply or were worked by that class of employee immediately before the commencement of this Directive.

Ordinary starting and ceasing time means the starting and ceasing time authorised for an employee within the normal operating hours on any one day as determined by the chief executive (or delegate) of a department or work unit.

Overtime means additional work in excess of ordinary hours. On a public holiday (or substituted day) under the *Holidays Act 1983* – the term includes work in excess of ordinary hours, but excludes ordinary hours on a public holiday.

Official travel includes but is not restricted to time spent travelling to attend approved seminars and departmental courses which are undertaken by direction and to suit Departmental convenience, but does not include:

- travelling by an employee who is on duty at temporary headquarters to the employee's home for the weekend, holidays etc. for their own convenience and subsequent return to such temporary headquarters;
- travelling between an employee's home and normal place of work;
- travelling to undertake private business; or
- travelling outside Australia.

Official travel time is calculated based on the period of time which would reasonably have been taken by the most practicable direct route using approved means of transport OR the time actually involved, whichever is the lesser. Excess travel time includes time in transit, however wherever practicable travel arrangements should be made to minimise excess travel time.

Motor Vehicle Allowances****1. Purpose:**

To prescribe the motor vehicle allowances payable to public service employees when they are required to use a private motor vehicle for official purposes.

2. Effective date: 1 July 2016.**3. Legislative authority:**

Section 54(1) of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

4. Application:

This Directive applies to “public service employees” as defined in section 9 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

DIRECTIVE**PART A – GENERAL CONDITIONS****6. Entitlement**

- 6.1 A “public service employee” (**referred to as an "employee" in this directive**) who uses his or her private motor vehicle to undertake official duties is to be paid a motor vehicle allowance as provided in this directive for the distance necessarily and actually travelled.
- 6.2 The amount of the allowance will depend upon the type of motor vehicle used.

7. Vehicles on novated leases

- 7.1 Employees with vehicles on novated leases are eligible to claim motor vehicle allowances under the conditions prescribed in this directive. These allowances are paid via the payroll system and are included in the gross salary reported on the employee’s payment summary.
- 7.2 Employees with vehicles on novated leases should consider seeking independent advice on taxation issues that may arise from claiming motor vehicle allowances. A novated lease vehicle is technically the employer’s car. Therefore, it can be expected that employees would be unable to claim a tax deduction on their personal income tax return for business travel undertaken in a car that is subject to a novated lease.
- 7.3 Employees who are a party to a novated lease arrangement that is subject to a claim for a motor vehicle allowance are required to clearly identify on the claim form that the claim relates to a novated lease vehicle.

8. Chief Executive authorisation

- 8.1 For all purposes of this directive, the use of a private motor vehicle for official purposes must be authorised by the Chief Executive.
- 8.2 Before authorisations are given under this directive, the following conditions are to be met:
- the vehicle is to be covered by either a comprehensive motor vehicle insurance policy or a third party property damage insurance policy; and
 - the employee is to produce evidence that the insurance policy has been endorsed to indemnify the Queensland Government against certain liabilities at law. This is a standard endorsement available on request from all insurance companies. The policy does not require the actual words ‘Queensland Government’; the word ‘employer’ will suffice.
 - The department should refund any endorsement fees.

9. Residence to headquarters

- 9.1 Motor vehicle allowance is not payable for the distance travelled from an employee’s residence to the employee’s headquarters and return.

10. Time limits on claims

- 10.1 Without the approval of the chief executive, a claim will not be paid unless it is submitted within 12 months –
- of the date of completion of the work; or
 - the incurring of the expense; or
 - the conclusion of the circumstances leading to the claim.

PART B – MOTOR VEHICLE ALLOWANCES**11. Employee Performing Official Duties**

- 11.1 An employee who is required to use his or her private motor vehicle for official purposes is to be paid the appropriate rate prescribed within the relevant modern award, with the exception of an employee using a motorcycle, for which the applicable allowance is 30.0c per kilometre.
- 11.2 At the same time of any adjustment to the allowances in the relevant award, the motorcycle allowance set out in clause 11.1 shall be automatically increased by the percentage movement in the Eight Capitals Consumer Price Index for the Private motoring sub-group most recently published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics since the allowance was last adjusted (starting from an initial 'adjustment date' of 1 September 2014).

12. Relieving or Special Duties

- 12.1 An employee who is required to use his or her private motor vehicle while performing relieving or special duty for the following situations is to be paid the appropriate rate prescribed below:
- (a) An employee not absent from normal headquarters overnight who is required to commute daily to the centre where the relieving takes place is entitled to the appropriate allowance in clause 11 above for the additional distance travelled between the employees' residence and the centre where the relief is being provided. No allowance is payable where the distance between the employees' residence and the centre (at which the employee is relieving) is less than the distance between the employee's residence and the employee's normal headquarters.
- (b) An employee absent from his or her normal headquarters overnight who is required to travel from his or her residence or normal headquarters to the centre where the relieving takes place is entitled to the appropriate allowance in clause 11 above for the forward and return journey and between centres where special or relieving duty is performed at more than one centre.

13. Courses and Seminars, etc.

- 13.1 An employee who is required to use his or her private motor vehicle to attend a course, seminar, conference, convention, etc, as an official representative is to be paid the appropriate allowance in clause 11 above for the additional distance travelled between the employee's residence and the place of attendance.
- 13.2 No allowance is payable where the distance between the employee's residence and the place of attendance is less than the distance between the employee's residence and the employee's normal headquarters.

14. Employees who choose to use their Private Motor Vehicles

- 14.1 Where the approved means of travel is other than the use of an employee's private motor vehicle, and the employee requests and is granted permission to use his or her motor vehicle, the allowance paid is to be determined by the chief executive. This allowance is not to exceed the rates specified below:
- (a) Automobiles – 37.5 cents per km
(b) Motorcycles – 15.0 cents per km
- 14.2 The allowance paid is not to exceed the costs associated with the approved means of travel.

NOTE: These rates may be incorporated in Directives or policies covering:

- Transfer and appointment expenses;
- Leave/travel concessions for isolated centres
- Relocation expenses for retiring officers
- Study and research assistance

DIRECTIVE 21/16**Minister for Employment and Industrial Relations Directive:
Continuation of directive application for certain employees****1. Purpose:**

To maintain directive application for certain employees.

2. Effective date: 1 July 2016**3. Legislative authority:**

Section 54(1) of the Public Service Act 2008 (PSA).

4. Application:

This directive applies to the classifications of employees in the departments, classifications, groups or areas listed in the Schedule to whom one of the following awards apply:

- *General Employees (Queensland Government Departments) and Other Employees Award – State 2015*
- *Parks and Wildlife Employees Award – State 2016*
- *Teaching in State Education Award – State 2016*
- *Queensland Police Service Employees Award – State 2016*

5. Related information:

See the Schedule for the directives, or parts of directives, which cover certain classifications of employees in departments, classifications, groups or areas.

DIRECTIVE**6. Continued application of directives to certain employees**

- 6.1. The directives, or parts of directives, specified in the Schedule shall cover the classifications of employees in the departments, classifications, groups or areas listed.
- 6.2. Where the directive is repealed and replaced with a directive dealing with the same subject matter, a reference to a directive in the Schedule is taken to be a reference to a new directive.
- 6.3. This directive is not intended to extend additional benefits to employees.

7. Definitions

Unless otherwise provided, the terms in this directive have the meaning prescribed in the PSA.

5. Under sections 14(2) and 15(a) of the Act, that part of the Department of National Parks, Sport and Racing known as the Office of Racing is established as a government entity and declared to be part of the Department of National Parks, Sport and Racing.
6. Under sections 14(2) and 15(a) of the Act, that part of the Racing Queensland Board responsible for licensing (animals and participants), integrity, stewarding and animal welfare functions is established as a government entity and declared to be part of the Racing Queensland Board.
7. Under sections 14(2) and 15(a) of the Act, that part of the Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services known as the Court Coordinator Program, providing litigation services and representing the Director-General in Children's Court and higher courts for the child protection related functions of the chief executive (child safety) under the *Child Protection Act 1999* in relation to child protection orders and litigation and advice related thereto is established as a government entity and declared to be part of the Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services.
