Dear Sir,

I have to inform you that in survey of the boundaries of a Main Road through Grazing Farms or land held under a similar tenure, it will be necessary to survey one side only as laid down in the latter part of Clause 138 Rules and Directions for the Guidance of Surveyors.

This applies to roads of a general uniform width but in the case of roads of irregular width or road widenings where it would be impossible to obtain an exact area without survey, it will be necessary to survey both sides.

It can be taken as a general rule that where your Department does not insist on the survey of both sides of a road, the survey of one side only with the opposite angles marked, will meet the requirements of the Commissioner.
