Plans of land for Auction sale effected by you are to be furnished without color so as if required they will be available for photographic copying

You are particularly requested to adopt a clear clean open and yet substantial style of lettering printing and line drawing, and the ink used should be thoroughly black. See Specimen herewith

As in some cases where coloring is omitted the intended boundaries may be doubtful the lines forming the boundaries should be shewn somewhat heavier and more decided than the others both in the case of feature (creek) and marked line boundaries. Where however the information cannot well be conveyed on the plan without color a light edging of blue may be used to define the doubtful part (as for instance the inclusion or exclusion of a small island and many other similar cases)

The blue edging should not however quite touch the line.
