As neglect on the part of many surveyors to forward monthly Progress Journals regularly, causes much loss of time and difficulty in regulating the work of the Department, you are advised that it has been decided to strictly enforce the provisions of Clauses 17 and 232 of the General Directions.

Be good enough, therefore, in future to forward your journal, promptly at the end of each month, and to observe the foot-note on the face of the journal form.

Failure in this respect renders it impossible to discover how your work stands, and will probably lead to the withdrawal of instructions, as specified in Clause 17, without consulting you as to the progress you have made.
