CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM.

Mr. Authorised Surveyor.....

As it is found that, outside the Greater Brisbane Area, the lodgment of plans of subdivisions with the Registrar of Titles is often unduly delayed, Surveyors effecting surveys under the Real Property Acts are requested to forward direct to the Surveyor-General the sketch or print prescribed by Clause 28 of the Amended By-law No. 2, so that he may record on the official maps the exact location of all permanent marks and thus be in a position to protect them.

It is pointed out also that subdivisional surveys frequently substitute for the original marks, lines of new pegs and posts which, until the plan is lodged, are unrecorded, and that a Surveyor dealing with this or adjoining land finds it difficult to satisfy himself and the Registrar of Titles that existing marks are properly related to the original.

As the sketches or prints will become official records and can be inspected with the original plans, their lodgment at the Survey Office without delay will simplify the work of all concerned, and Surveyors are requested to ensure this by forwarding them direct instead of entrusting them to their clients.
