- Special care should be taken to ensure adequate and sufficient surveys of the Heads of Navigation. All necessary instructions are given you and are to be read and followed. Proper attention should be given to the bearings and distances of the points of land and the position of the points of land. If for some reason you are unable to survey a point of land, you should report the same to the Commissioner of the District. The area of the points of land should be from 1 to 10 square miles according to the probable importance of the point. This is not however to be taken as authority for surveying and marking the boundaries, but you are authorized to make such connecting traverse as would be needful to determine a fixed and recognizable point by which a description may be prepared and the correct position determined whenever further action may be taken.

The Commissioner of the District is the proper officer to recommend important Reserves to the Minister and you are expected to give the Commissioner the advantage of your knowledge of the District.

Some Reserves are provided for in Clauses 63 and 64 of printed general instructions
