CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM

To Mr. \_\_\_\_\_ Surveyor

Selections after survey having been authorised by the Land Act of 1884 there was no necessity to demand from Surveyors the preparation of duplicate plans, all Departmental requirements having been satisfied by lithograph copies; since however the amending Act of 1885 reintroduces "selection before survey" it has become necessary to demand duplicate maps from surveyors for such selections, and for land which may be surveyed after being mapped out under the 44<sup>th</sup> section of the principal Act.

It may be observed that as the vacant land subject to the operation of the Act of 1885 is comparatively limited the labor reimposed on Surveyors is not likely to be very heavy.
