SAFETY INSTRUCTION NOTICE (No 04(B)) 2015

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Safety Instruction Notice (No 04(b)) 2015*.

Notice of safety instruction [s.708B of the Act]

2. (1) On 20 March 2015, in accordance with s708B of the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004*, the Acting Chief Inspector, Petroleum and Gas, Department of Natural Resources and Mines, issued Safety Instruction No. 04(b).

(2) The instruction shall take effect from 20 March 2015 and remain in force until 20 September 2015¹.

3. The instruction is as follows:

Suspended or cancelled certificates

It is an offence under section 733(1) of the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* (P&G Act) for a person to supply a gas device (type A) unless the supply, installation or use has been approved by the Chief Inspector, or a person or body approved by the Chief Inspector.

The Department of Natural Resources and Mines has received a number of notices from Conformity Assessment Bodies (CAB) with regard to the suspension of certain approval certificates in relation to butane 'lunch box' cookers.

These approvals have been suspended by the CAB after product samples from the market place were found to be non-compliant with the requirements of the appliance standard AS2658 LP Gas Portable and mobile appliances.

Having considered the risk to public safety from the use of non-compliant butane 'lunch box' cookers, the Chief Inspector, Petroleum and Gas (or delegate), as required by section 733(3) of the P&G Act, has consented to the suspension of the following approval certificates (Approval Certificates):

Australian Gas Association certificate No. 5241, 5907, 6810, 6834, 7378, 7437, 7633 and 7920; and SAI Global certificate No. GSCS20063 and GAS40077. Instruction.

Suppliers are hereby instructed pursuant to section 708B of the P&G Act to:

1. Cease supply (stop selling) any Gas Appliance brands and models for which the product approval has been suspended or cancelled; and
2. Display the Information Bulletin, provided with *Safety Instruction No. 04(b)*, prominently within the store or product outlet (e.g. within the vicinity of the product display area, customer service desk or checkout area); and
3. Provide confirmation via email to Gassafe@dnrm.qld.gov.au by close of business 3 April 2015 that you have received this Safety Instruction, ceased supply and actioned the requirement to display the Information Bulletin.

¹Note: Section 708B of the Act provides that a safety instruction stays in force until the earliest of either: the expiration of 6 months until after the day it is made, the chief inspector cancels the instruction; a regulation replaces the instruction.

ADOPTION OF TEMPORARY LOCAL PLANNING INSTRUMENT FOR
THE CITY OF LOGAN**

Notice is given under the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009* that on 20 March 2015 Logan City Council adopted Temporary Local Planning Instrument No. 1 (Logan Interim Flood Response) 2015 for the City of Logan.

The temporary local planning instrument will take effect on 27 March 2015 and cease to have effect on 26 March 2016 or when it is repealed in accordance with the provisions of the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009*.

The purpose and general effect of the temporary local planning instrument is to manage development in a flood plain in the local government area by:

- (a) suspending the operation of specific provisions of the planning schemes for the local government area; and
- (b) applying new provisions affecting the operation of the planning schemes for the local government area.

The temporary local planning instrument applies to those areas affected by the:

- (a) Beaudesert Shire Planning Scheme 2007 (as administered by Logan City Council); and
- (b) Gold Coast Planning Scheme 2003 (as administered by Logan City Council); and
- (c) Logan Planning Scheme 2006.

The temporary local planning instrument overrides the provisions contained in the affected planning schemes to the extent of matters outlined in Schedule 2 of the TLPI. Where an inconsistency arises the TLPI shall prevail.

Speech to the Legislative Assembly of Queensland
First Session of the Fifty-Fifth Parliament
by His Excellency the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC
Governor of Queensland
25 March 2015

I acknowledge the traditional owners of the land upon which we meet and pay my respects to their elders past and present.

Honourable Members, I congratulate all of you on your being elected to represent the people of our State in your respective electorates in this, the 55th Queensland Parliament.

Following the State election held on Saturday 31 January this year I accepted the resignation of Campbell Newman as Premier and invited Annastacia Palaszczuk to form government.

An interim Cabinet led by Ms Palaszczuk was sworn in on Saturday 14 February with the full Ministry sworn in on Monday 16 February.

I am sure all Honourable Members know it is an honour and a privilege to hold a place in this House.

As with every new Parliament there is a mix of continuing and new Members.

Regardless of your levels of experience, all of you will be making a contribution to the governance of our State and to debates on important issues affecting the future of this and successive generations.

This is a Legislative Assembly, which reminds us all that your most important task is the making or amending of the laws of our State.

In this Parliament, my government will embark on an extensive legislative program.

It has made commitments to create jobs and expand training opportunities.

Indeed delivering jobs for Queenslanders will be the major focus of my government.

My government has also made commitments in many areas to restore or improve frontline services.

It will also improve integrity and accountability in the way government operates in our State.

In addition, my government will implement a plan to reduce general government debt.

Focus on jobs

The availability of secure, fairly-paid jobs is central to the wellbeing and future of every Queenslanders.

My government believes most Queenslanders measure the health of the State's economy on the simple measure of whether they are employed; whether their children have or can obtain a job; and whether training is available for those wanting to enter the work force or change jobs as the demands of our economy change.

To that end, it is proposing major initiatives to help Queenslanders wanting to enter or re-enter the work force.

A Working Queensland jobs plan will include a number of policies announced in the recent election campaign or beforehand.

They include a reinstatement of the successful Skilling Queenslanders for Work programs scrapped in 2012.

Those programs were assessed by respected independent consultants to have helped people into jobs, but also to return almost \$8.00 to the community for every \$1.00 they cost to run.

Skilling Queenslanders for Work programs are estimated to be able to deliver training to a cohort of approximately 32,000 young people, Indigenous Queenslanders, mature-aged Queenslanders, and others wanting to join the work force.

My government will also introduce a Ready for Work scheme to help young people prepare themselves to enter the job market.

In addition to a payroll tax rebate for employers engaging trainees or apprentices, my government will also ensure that 10 per cent of workers on major public projects are apprentices and trainees, and will also extend that requirement to government-owned corporations.

Jobs Queensland will be established as a roundtable group representing those directly involved in business and industry who can advise government on the skills our State needs now and will need in future years, so the government can plan accordingly.

My government values our regions and those who live and work in our many unique regional communities.

It will implement a Locals First program to support local contractors and suppliers.

It will also be legislating against 100 per cent fly-in / fly-out projects, to create more jobs for Queenslanders living in regional communities.

Rescuing TAFE

My government will aim to revitalise our State's TAFE system and restore it to its position as Queensland's leading provider of Vocational Education and Training.

To do so, it will create up to 100 new TAFE teaching and support positions, fund new training schemes in emerging industries, invest in student support services, and subsidise foundation skills courses for disadvantaged learners.

My government sees TAFE as a provider of well-trained workers for our future, and an essential element in our training sector if young Queenslanders are to have worthwhile and viable career options.

Jobs of the future

My government not only wants to generate jobs for this generation, but for the next as well.

Its Working Queensland plan will also implement its Advance Queensland program to reinvigorate research and development and harness new ideas to create secure, knowledge-based jobs of the future.

It will provide:

- 100 Advance Queensland Research Fellowships to foster research on projects such as protecting our Great Barrier Reef and on new industries such as industrial biotechnology; and as well,
- a three-year payroll tax holiday for new companies coming to Queensland as a result of Advance Queensland research programs; together with,
- 20 University Scholarships to post-graduate students each year to encourage women, Indigenous students and those from low socio-economic areas to pursue a Master's degree in specific fields of study; and also
- the Advance Queensland Women's Academic Fund to support female researchers advance their careers.

The government will implement a Business Development Fund to help finance the progress of bright ideas into new products that can also create sustainable, secure jobs in our State.

Industrial conditions

Just as important as having a job are the rights that workers should expect to exercise when it comes to negotiating wages and conditions and other entitlements.

My government will restore basic decency and fairness for workers, restoring the rights that had been stripped from them.

State public sector workers will have access to good faith bargaining, an independent Queensland Industrial Relations Commission and will have enterprise bargaining agreements and co-operation restored as the core elements of a modern industrial relations system.

Most importantly for injured workers and their families, changes to the State's previously highly successful workers' compensation scheme that denied them their common law rights will be reversed.

My government will prioritise safety in the workplace and reverse a number of damaging changes made in recent years.

This will include once again allowing workplace health and safety permit holders to enter potentially unsafe work sites to protect the wellbeing of workers at those locations.

Changes to the scheduling of the historic Labour Day public holiday will also be reversed to take effect from 2016.

Asset sales

My government came to office after making clear to voters its opposition to asset sales proposed by the former government.

It believes asset sales cause job losses and that income-producing government-owned corporations earmarked for sale by the former government should be retained.

To fulfil its promises to voters, my government has already put in place steps to halt work associated with the sale of those assets which contribute an estimated \$2 billion a year to the State Budget.

Debt action plan

The retention of revenue from government-owned corporations is a key element of the new government's debt action plan.

This plan will pay down \$12 billion of the State's \$46 billion general government debt over the next decade.

This can be achieved without asset sales and by earmarking a share of the returns from government-owned corporations to pay off debt while also implementing plans to realise savings by merging a number of power industry organisations.

Infrastructure

My government recognises the importance of infrastructure projects to meet the demands of a growing State and their role in fostering jobs and strengthening State and regional economic activity.

It will release a comprehensive forward Infrastructure Plan while maintaining an ongoing program of capital works estimated at \$9 billion a year.

A new body, Building Queensland, will also be established to assess all major infrastructure proposals worth \$50 million or more.

This independent body will ensure infrastructure is funded and sited where it is needed, and is not determined by political demands or influences.

Building Our Regions

Wherever Queenslanders live, they require infrastructure to meet their needs and the needs of their local community.

My government will implement its Building Our Regions program to better target funds and ensure all regions are treated on a fair basis.

Once again, the proposed funding of up to \$390 million for regional infrastructure including \$200 million in new funds over three years will not rely on asset sales.

Our Great Barrier Reef

While our built environment is important, we must also recognise the need to act as protectors and custodians of our natural environment.

Our State is home to one of Earth's most significant natural assets — our Great Barrier Reef, truly one of the wonders of the world.

The Reef stretches 2,300 kilometres along our coast — from the tip of our State to just north of Bundaberg.

It includes 3,000 individual reef systems, and covers more than 344,000 square kilometres.

My government is committed to ensuring the world can continue to enjoy our Great Barrier Reef's magnificent attractions while our State continues to receive the benefits of the 60,000 jobs it supports and the \$6 billion it injects into our economy.

The Reef faces threats on many fronts — poor water quality, coastal development, climate change, and damage from crown-of-thorns starfish.

Our generation must protect it for future generations.

My government has already acted on the dumping of capital dredge spoil within the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area in relation to a planned new port facility at Abbot Point.

It has also committed to a \$100 million, five-year policy package to improve water quality.

These and other initiatives — many needing the co-operation and support of the Federal Government — are important to the future of our Great Barrier Reef and the government sees them as priority actions.

Frontline services

My government is committed to beginning the work on restoring frontline services after the cutbacks of the past three years.

In particular, our State's health and hospital system will be boosted through several initiatives.

The Refresh Nursing program will employ 1,000 graduate nurses in our public hospitals for 12 months each over a four-year period.

That will help start the careers of 4,000 nurses and will also mean better service standards for patients in public hospitals.

My government will also boost nurse numbers to improve patient safety.

The employment of 400 new nurses will ensure safer patient-to-nurse ratios in both intensive care and general wards.

As part of its plans to boost frontline services, my government will ensure schools with more than 500 high school students each have a fulltime guidance officer or equivalent.

An extra 45 fulltime guidance officer positions over three years will be created to ensure students receive the professional support and advice needed to make sound career choices.

Jobs for 875 new teachers will also be provided in state schools to help reduce class sizes that have been allowed to grow in the past three years.

The additional teachers will be over and above the more than 1,600 already planned to be engaged to keep pace with population growth, meaning a total of 2,500 extra teachers over three years.

My government's Letting Teachers Teach initiative will also improve our school system and its outcomes by encouraging our best teachers to stay in the classroom, rather than moving to administrative jobs.

Currently many excellent teachers move into administrative roles to advance their careers.

But this initiative means teachers will be able to be classed as Highly Accomplished or Lead Teachers with pay grades reflecting their value to students and our school system.

Mental health

My government will expand services available to young Queenslanders with serious mental health issues.

This will include the establishment of a dedicated facility with an integrated school in South East Queensland.

It will deliver services based on the successful approach used at the former Barrett Centre at Wacol closed by the former government.

The rebuilding of adolescent mental health services will also include an expanded range of services in Townsville to service families in northern and regional Queensland.

Tough on crime

My government will have a zero tolerance for those who choose to break the law, especially organised crime gangs engaged in the drug trade, extortion, stand-over tactics, or violent behaviour.

A Commission of Inquiry into organised crime across the State will be established with the powers of a Royal Commission to focus on organised crime and broaden laws to target more than just bikie gangs.

Existing crime gang laws will be reviewed and where necessary amended or replaced with more effective ones that target real criminals, and cannot be used to intimidate innocent people.

Changes will occur only after consultation with police, the Crime and Corruption Commission, experts and other stakeholders.

Current legislation will remain in place until more workable laws are introduced.

The government will also advocate for nationally consistent laws to tackle organised crime across the nation without variance from state to state.

Statistics show drug arrests rising dramatically in Queensland and damaging and destructive drugs like 'ice' are becoming a bigger problem across Australia.

My government recognises the urgent need to attack this scourge and the devastating impacts other illicit drugs and the drug trade have on the lives of Queenslanders.

It will give police the resources they need to tackle organised crime and the drug trade.

It has also committed to take real action on alcohol-fuelled violence by adjusting trading hours for licensed venues; to ensure the publication of independent crime statistics; and to increase penalties for domestic violence and streamlining domestic violence applications and court processes.

My government will be responding to the recommendations by the task force on domestic violence chaired by Dame Quentin Bryce and has already moved to establish an additional portfolio committee of this Assembly which will consider any necessary changes to laws covering family and domestic violence.

Integrity and accountability

A major focus of the government will be on the standards of government itself in our State.

Significant commitments have been made to ensure integrity and accountability in public administration.

Legislation will be introduced to re-assert the independence of the State's corruption watchdog, the Crime and Corruption Commission.

Queenslanders know from their own history the importance of accountability and integrity in government.

The Fitzgerald Inquiry of the late 1980s and its subsequent recommendations for reform helped establish more open and accountable government.

They also established across our community higher expectations of behaviour by those engaged in public life and those on the public payroll.

My government believes these standards have been eroded in the past three years and must be reasserted.

Changes to electoral laws covering political donations will be reversed.

The higher \$12,800 threshold for declaring donations to a political party or candidate will be returned to \$1,000.

The new declaration level will apply from November 2013 when the higher threshold implemented by the previous government took effect.

A consultative approach

Just as important as what a government does is how it does it.

My government has pledged to be more consultative, and to listen to Queenslanders before acting on their concerns.

It has pledged to be a government of consensus, but one that also is unafraid to take decisive action when necessary.

This recognises the fact that Queenslanders always work better when they work together.

My government also seeks a constructive and consultative relationship with the Federal Government.

But it will never shy away from standing up for the interests of our State.

This historic year

Honourable Members, this year, like all others, will see the celebration of various milestones and anniversaries.

Possibly the most important for 2015 will be the Anzac Centenary, highlighting our nation's involvement in World War One.

It is often remarked, quite rightly, that the men and women who served our nation and sacrificed their own lives in such conflicts did so to protect the rights we enjoy today.

The Anzac Centenary is a chance for all of us to remember the price paid by those who have protected our rights and our nation over the past century.

As Honourable Members exercise their rights in the Legislative Assembly Chamber I trust you will remember those who have ensured the survival of our great and precious democratic system.

I wish all Honourable Members well for their service to Queenslanders in our 55th Parliament.

Notice

General Approval of a resource for beneficial use—Sugar Mill By-Products (Filter Mud, Filter Mud/Ash Blends and Boiler Ash from Sugar Mill Boilers)

This notice is issued by the chief executive, to advise of a decision made under sections 170 and 172 of the Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011 to amend a general approval of a resource for beneficial use.

This notice amends and replaces general approval referenced ENBU01236210 and is a general approval of sugar mill by-products as a resource of which everyone has the benefit where they are able to meet the conditions imposed on the approval. This approval is subject to the following conditions imposed in accordance with s. 166 of the WRR Act and remains in force until **31 March 2017** (the period of the approval).

The granting of this approval does not warrant or imply the lawfulness of the activity under all legislation, or that approvals necessary under other legislation have or will be approved. It is the responsibility of each person operating under this approval to identify and obtain all other approvals necessary for the proposed activity.

The granting of this approval also does not remove the obligation to take all reasonable and practicable measures to prevent and/or to minimise the likelihood of environmental harm being caused (the 'general environmental duty' in accordance with s. 319 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (EP Act)).

Environmental harm is any adverse effect, or potential adverse effect (whether temporary or permanent and of whatever magnitude, duration or frequency) on an environmental value, and includes environmental nuisance. It also does not remove the obligation to comply with the notification provisions contained in the EP Act where an event causes or threatens to cause serious or material environmental harm.

Advice about this general approval

Persons wishing the use of sugar mill by-products (the resource) under this general approval must comply with the approval conditions relevant to them and/or the end use for which the resource will be applied.

Failure to comply with a condition of this approval is an offence carrying a maximum penalty of 1665 penalty units (\$189,560.25 for an individual and \$947,801.25 for a corporation as at 1 July 2014).

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Requirement to notify

1. Any generators operating under this approval must notify the chief executive in writing using the approved form¹ within 10 business days of beginning the use of the resource under this general approval.

Limitations of approval

2. The approved resource is by-products (filter mud, filter mud/boiler ash blend or boiler ash) generated by sugar mills within Queensland that comply with the quality characteristic limit ranges listed in Table 1 – Resource quality characteristics, that is used for the following purposes²:
 - a) soil ameliorant or conditioner on agricultural land
 - b) soil ameliorant or conditioner for the purposes of growing turf
 - c) feedstock in composting or soil conditioner manufacturing activities that produce <200t per year
 - d) additive to soil used for landscaping

3. In addition to Condition 2, the resource must not have any properties nor contain any other contaminants at concentrations which may cause environmental harm³ when used in accordance with the conditions of this approval.

Resource quality monitoring

4. The generator must sample, measure and record the composition of the resource for at least the quality characteristics in Table 1 – Resource quality characteristics, on an annual basis as a minimum.
5. Where the composition of the resource has changed or is likely to change, more frequent monitoring must be conducted sufficient to detect and characterise the extent of any change⁴.
6. Any sampling, measuring or interpretation or results relating to monitoring required by condition 4, must be undertaken by an **appropriately qualified person**.

² Any resource that is not used as stated in condition 1 is considered a waste and must be managed in accordance with the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* and *Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011*, and their subordinate legislation.

⁴ Such additional monitoring should occur if there have been significant changes or modifications to any harvest or processing equipment which may knowingly result in variation. Additional monitoring should be undertaken until such time where results demonstrate that the material is compliant with Condition 2.

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7. All determinations of the quality of the resource must be carried out on appropriately representative samples and all analysis of samples taken must be undertaken by a National Association of Testing Authorities (NATA) accredited laboratory or one holding an equivalent certification.

Written Procedure

8. From commencement of reuse of the resource to which this approval relates, a written procedure must be developed and maintained by the generator. The written procedure must contain the following:
 - a. Identification of risks of potential environmental harm from the use of the resource during routine operations and emergencies;
 - b. Control measures that minimise the identified risks of potential for environmental harm (e.g. application frequency, rate, method, placement etc);
 - c. Monitoring of contaminant releases associated with the use of the resource under this approval;
 - d. Staff training in relation to the conditions and requirements of this approval;
 - e. Record keeping requirements;
 - f. Users Method Statement;
 - g. MSDS;
 - h. A copy of the BUA Notice.
9. The generator must make the supplier or user aware of the written procedure developed in accordance with condition 8.

Records

10. Generators and suppliers must keep the following records when the resource is distributed:
 - a. origin of the resource;
 - b. quantity of the resource;
 - c. quality characteristics of the resource (at least for parameters listed in Table 1 Resource quality characteristics);
 - d. date of dispatch of the resource;
 - e. date of delivery of the resource;
 - f. name of the transporter of the resource; and
 - g. destination of the resource (including the name and address of the user or the supplier).
11. All **records** required by the conditions of this approval must be kept for a period of not less than five (5) years and provided to the chief executive upon request.

Transportation of the resource

12. Should a delivery of the resource be rejected at site/destination, it must be immediately returned to the generator, supplier, or a facility that can lawfully receive the material.
13. The resource must be handled and transferred in a manner that prevents any release during transport.
14. Any material adhering to the truck body after loading must be cleaned off and returned to the load or storage or disposed of to an appropriate treatment or disposal system.

Storage of the resource

15. Any storage of the resource must be in a quantity that meets the current operational demand.
16. The resource must be stored in a way that prevents or minimises contact with stormwater or runoff.

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17. Stormwater or runoff that has come in contact with the resource must be managed to prevent any adverse impacts on the **environmental values** of the receiving environment.
18. The resource must not be stored within 350m of waters (except for ground waters, secure irrigation and confined storm-water systems) unless:
 - a. the resource is in a solid form; and
 - b. the stockpile size does not exceed 1000m³.
19. Any pond used for the storage of the resource must be constructed, installed and maintained so as to :
 - a. minimise the likelihood of any release of resource through bed or banks of the pond to any waters;
 - b. maintain a freeboard of not less than 0.5 meters, except in emergencies; and
 - c. ensure the stability of the ponds' construction.
20. Any resource that is stored must be used within a reasonable timeframe.

Land application of the resource

21. The resource must only be applied to the land where the:
 - a. the application is conducted at an agronomic loading rate and in a way determined by an appropriately qualified person or as recommended by industry guidelines and/or best management practices considering the resource composition, crop and soil characteristics;
 - b. the resource must not be released to **waters**.
22. The relevant person shall maintain the following records for all applications of the resource to land as an ameliorant or soil conditioner as follows:
 - a. details of the land on which application occurs, e.g. farm and block location;
 - b. date of application of the resource;
 - c. actual application rate (expressed as the quantity e.g. wet tonnes per hectare per application) for each application); and
 - d. application method.

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DEFINITIONS

Words and phrases used throughout this approval are defined below. Where a definition for a term used in this approval is sought and the term is not defined within this permit the definitions provided in the relevant legislation shall be used.

"appropriately qualified person" means a person who has professional qualifications, training, skills or experience relevant to the nominated subject matter and can give authoritative assessment, advice and analysis on performance relating to the subject matter using the relevant protocols, standards, methods or literature.

"chief executive" means the Department of Environment and Heritage Protection or its successor.

"boiler ash" means a by-product produced by sugar mill boilers as fuel is burnt to power the manufacturing process. Varying amounts of soil and other residues are separated out as boiler ash.

"filter mud" means the residual mud and fibre filtered from the raw juice steam after lime addition and juice clarification in rotary vacuum filters. It is comprised mainly of water, fibre, mud solids (from soil) and natural impurities in the sugar cane. Filter mud % cane is approximately 7.0%.

"generator" means a person who generates the resource to be used.

"MSDS" means a form containing data regarding the properties of a particular substance which provides workers a user information on handling or working with that substance in a safe manner; and includes information such as physical data toxicity, environmental characteristics, health effects, first aid, reactivity; and storage disposal, protective equipment and spill handling procedures.

"NATA" is the National Association of Testing Authorities.

"records" include breach notifications, written procedures, analysis results, monitoring reports and monitoring programs required under a condition of this approval.

"relevant person" means the generator, transporter, supplier and user of the resource who is in control of the material at the time.

"resource" means filter mud, filter mud/ash blend or boiler ash (resources) sourced from Sugar mill owner members of the Australian Sugar Milling Council (Entities).

"soil ameliorant" means a substance added to soil to improve the growing conditions for plant roots.

"supplier" means a person who is receiving the resource from the generator and providing it to the user.

"transporter" means a person who is transporting the resource.

"user" means a person who has entered into a written agreement with a generator or supplier to use the resource in accordance with the conditions of this approval.

"users method statement" means a method statement for the loading, transport and storage of the resource to its users.

"waters" includes river, stream, lake, lagoon, pond, swamp, wetland, unconfined surface water, artificial watercourse, bed and bank of any watercourse, dams that are not fit for purpose, non-tidal or tidal waters (including the sea), stormwater channel, stormwater drain, roadside gutter, stormwater run-off, and groundwater and any part thereof.

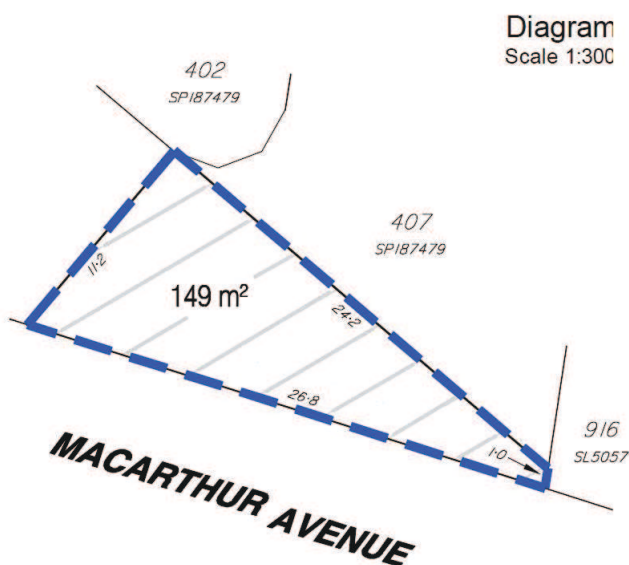

RE-OPENING OF TEMPORARILY CLOSED ROAD**

Under the provisions of section 124 of the *Economic Development Act 2012* (the Act) the Minister for Economic Development Queensland (the MEDQ) may perform functions or exercise powers for a road in a priority development area the MEDQ considers necessary or desirable to perform its other functions.

On 17 May 2013 the MEDQ declared part of a road in the Northshore Hamilton Priority Development Area temporarily closed. The MEDQ deemed it necessary to temporarily close an area of new, unformed road comprising an area about 0.9 hectares located between Lot 402 and Lot 404 on SP187479 and MacArthur Avenue, Hamilton (the Temporarily Closed Road).

The MEDQ declares that from 27 March 2015, part of the Temporarily Closed Road, comprising an area about 149 square metres, located between Lot 407 on SP187479 and MacArthur Avenue, Hamilton and shown on the below plan, is re-opened.
