

## Land Act 1994 OBJECTIONS TO PROPOSED ROAD CLOSURE NOTICE (No 09) 2013

#### Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Objections to Proposed Road Closure Notice (No 09) 2013*.

#### Application for road closure [s.100 of the Act]

2. Applications have been made for the permanent closure of the roads mentioned in the Schedule.

#### **Objections**

- **3.(1)** An objection (in writing) to a proposed road closure mentioned in the Schedule may be lodged with the Regional Service Director, Department of Natural Resources and Mines, at the regional office for the region in which the road is situated.
  - (2) Latest day for lodgement of objections is 18 April 2013.
- (3) Any objections received may be viewed by other parties interested in the proposed road closure under the provisions of the *Right to Information Act 2009*. If you lodge an objection, please include in your objection letter whether you would like to be consulted if this issue becomes the subject of an access request under the *Right to Information Act 2009*.

#### Plans

- 4. Inspection of the plans of the proposed road closures may be made at-
  - (a) the Department of Natural Resources and Mines Offices at Mackay, Hughenden, Beenleigh, Ipswich, Nambour and Warwick; and
  - (b) the Local Government Offices of Mackay Regional, McKinlay Shire, Redland City, Lockyer Valley Regional, Sunshine Coast Regional and Southern Downs Regional;

for a particular plan in that district or that local government area.

## SOUTHERN DOWNS REGIONAL COUNCIL ADOPTION OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE SOUTHERN DOWNS PLANNING SCHEME

Notice is given pursuant to section 117 of the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009*, that the Southern Downs Regional Council has adopted a number of minor and administrative amendments to the Southern Downs Planning Scheme.

The minor and administrative amendments were adopted by Council at its meeting held on 27 February 2013 and will commence on 14 March 2013.

The purpose of the amendment which is entitled – Minor and Administrative Amendment March 2013 – is to improve the comprehension and functionality of the Southern Downs Planning Scheme by:

- Correcting the format of the planning scheme;
- Correcting spelling, inconsistent numbering and cross referencing;
- Correcting factual matters;
- Amending the Table of assessment for the Low density residential zone and the Medium density residential zone where it refers to dwelling houses by excluding all assessment criteria except the Flood hazard overlay code;
- Amending the Tables of assessment where they refer to home based businesses that are not a bed and breakfast or rural farm stay by limiting the assessment criteria to the Home based business code;
- Amending the Table of assessment for the Township zone where it refers to educational establishments and emergency services:
- Amending the levels of assessment for Reconfiguring a lot by changing the level of assessment for rearrangement of boundaries to code assessment;
- Amending the Table of assessment for overlays to clarify the provisions regarding the heritage overlay;
- Amending the Rural zone code by clarifying the provisions regarding rearrangement of boundaries;
- Amending the Rural residential zone code by changing the provisions regarding setbacks, clarifying the provisions regarding the provision of infrastructure and clarifying the provisions regarding rearrangement of boundaries;
- Amending the provisions of the Bushfire hazard overlay code to change the requirements for dwelling houses in the overlay area;

- Amending the Flood hazard overlay by clarifying the provisions about domestic outbuildings and otherwise avoiding duplication with the Building Codes;
- Amending the Residential uses code by clarifying the provisions about domestic outbuildings and deleting the required setback for a dwelling house in the Rural zone from sealed Council controlled roads;
- Amending the Carparking and loading code by removing provisions that duplicate the Clean Waters State Planning Policy




