Where the term appears in Clauses 3, 4, 5, 6 and 8 it includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen and contractors of the Owner and other persons authorised by the Owner to use or enter upon the Easement Land.
- 1.8 "QETC" means the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited, together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of QETC and other persons authorised by QETC to exercise its rights under this Easement.
- 1.9 "Registered Proprietor" has the same meaning as in the *Land Title Act 1994*.
- 1.10 "Structure" means any building, improvement, plant, equipment, fixture, fitting, pole, cable, wire, pipe, tower, apparatus or chattel or of any kind whether on, over, in, under, across or through the Easement Land and includes by way of example but is not limited to any dwelling (including any extension or overhang of eaves or guttering), swimming pool, shed, retaining or other wall and lighting.

QETC'S RIGHTS

2. The QETC is acquiring this Easement to permit QETC the right to:
- 2.1 convey and transmit electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms on, from, over, under and through the Easement Land by Electricity Works;
- 2.2 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land, with vehicles, plant and equipment, if necessary, to exercise its rights under this Easement;
- 2.3 construct Electricity Works on, over, under or through the Easement Land;
- 2.4 inspect, maintain, repair or replace the Electricity Works;
- 2.5 clear the Easement Land of trees, undergrowth or vegetation or any obstruction including soil in the manner and by the means QETC considers appropriate;
- 2.6 construct and maintain on the Easement Land such tracks, roads, gates, fences and other structures and works as QETC considers necessary;
- 2.7 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any infringement by the Owner of QETC's rights under this Easement by the Owner; and

the QETC may in connection with its use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of its rights, powers, discretion and functions under the Acts, or any other Act or at law as it sees fit.

QETC'S OBLIGATIONS TO THE OWNER

3. QETC will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:
- 3.1 cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible; and
- 3.2 act reasonably.

QETC WILL COMPLY WITH SAFETY LAWS

4. 4.1 QETC will comply with all laws regarding the exercise of its rights under this Easement and the safety of persons to use the Easement

- Land.
- 4.2 QETC will not be liable for:
- 4.2.1 the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
- 4.2.2 the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.

THINGS THE OWNER MUST NOT DO

5. The Owner must not:
- 5.1 interfere with, damage or place at risk the Electricity Works or plant, equipment, tools or material of QETC on or near the Easement Land;
- 5.2 interfere with or obstruct QETC in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under this Easement; or
- 5.3 grow sugarcane within ten (10) metres of any tower, base or pole upon the Easement Land.

THINGS THE OWNER MAY ONLY DO IF QETC CONSENTS

6. The Owner must not, or consent to allow another party to, after the Date of this Easement, without first obtaining the written consent of QETC:
- 6.1 erect or place any Structure or make any additions or alterations to any Structure on the Easement Land;
- 6.2 erect any fence that is higher than three (3) metres on the Easement Land;
- 6.3 place fill or other substance or carry out any works or do anything whatsoever on the Easement Land which would reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the voltage class of the transmission line on the Easement Land;
- 6.4 cause or allow, except in the case of force majeure, the inundation of those parts of the Easement Land where any Electricity Works are erected or located or are proposed to be erected or located;
- 6.5 lay any metal conduit or pipe within five (5) metres of the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or other means of support on the Easement Land;
- 6.6 do any act or thing which jeopardises the foundations, ground anchorages, supports, the towers or poles, including (without limitation) excavate or remove any soil, sand or gravel within a distance of twenty (20) metres from the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support on the Easement Land;
- 6.7 grow sugar cane on the Easement Land except:
- 6.7.1 where the Owner is a holder of a valid cane supply contract under the *Sugar Industry Act 1999* as at the Date of this Easement; and
- 6.7.2 the Owner grows sugar cane in accordance with clause 5.3 above;
- 6.8 plant or grow upon the Easement Land trees whose size or height would in any way interfere with the statutory clearance that may exist from time to time; or
- 6.9 reside in or permit anyone to reside in or occupy any Structure, caravan, or other accommodation (including temporary accommodation) which may be located on the Easement Land,

and QETC will not unreasonably withhold its consent but in granting any consent may impose reasonable conditions.

OWNER MAY USE EASEMENT

7. The Owner may use the Easement Land for any lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement.

THINGS QETC MAY DO IF THE OWNER IS IN BREACH

8. 8.1 In the event of any breach by the Owner of the terms of Clauses 5 and 6, QETC may in its absolute discretion give notice to the Owner to rectify the breach which may include the demolition or removal of all, or any part of, a Structure; and
- 8.2 If after 30 days, the Owner has not rectified the breach, then QETC may rectify the breach which may include:
- 8.2.1 the demolition and/or removal of a Structure or any part thereof upon the Easement Land; or
- 8.2.2 mitigation or remedial work to restore the safety of the Electricity Works without liability to the Owner for reinstatement, restitution, damages, compensation or otherwise.
- 8.3 Notwithstanding anything contained in Clauses 8.1 or 8.2, in the case of an emergency, QETC may enter the Easement Land to remedy a defect, eliminate an actual or potential danger or remove a Structure or any part thereof that is affecting, or may affect, the safety of Electricity Works or continuity of supply without giving notice.
- 8.4 If QETC acts under clause 8.3, it must give the notice, if not already given, mentioned in clause 8.1 as soon as practicable.
- 8.5 Any costs incurred by QETC in relation to either Clauses 8.2 or 8.3, or both, may be recovered from the Owner.

INDEMNITY

9. QETC indemnifies the Owner against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, costs, losses, damages and expenses arising out of or in respect of any act or omission of QETC in the use or attempted use of the Easement Land by QETC, except where such actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages or expenses arise as a result of any negligent act or omission of the Owner, breach of this Easement or of the law.

PUBLIC RISK

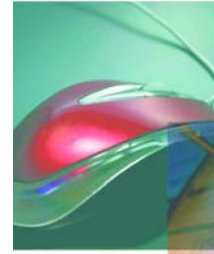

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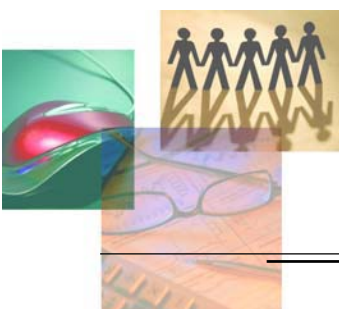

The Queensland State Government's policy is to seek to retain skilled staff. Registered deployees who apply for an advertised job will be considered before other applicants. The symbol (g) appears next to vacancies where an exemption from this requirement applies. Deployees are to indicate in their application for the advertised job that they are registered with the Office of the Public Service Commissioner. The Queensland Public Service Commissioner is committed to equal opportunity in employment. Selection will be given on the basis of merit only and fair consideration will be given to all applicants.

CONTINUOUS APPLICANT POOLS

A continuous applicant pool allows you to apply for jobs within an occupation where vacancies are regularly available. This means that agencies can 'dip' into the pool for suitable applicants as soon as they have a vacancy. You can submit or refresh your application at any time. If you are refreshing your application, make sure that you indicate this either on your email or, if sending by post, in a covering letter. In search results, continuous applicant pools can be identified by 'Ongoing' in the 'Closes' column of a search result.

Note: If a continuous applicant pool is closing, applicants will be notified two weeks prior to this date. Applications may be used for up to six months after the pool closes.

MULTI-AGENCY POOLS

Some Queensland Government agencies are on the lookout for people to fill similar jobs or occupations at the same time. Some of these jobs have a fixed closing date and others are ongoing (continuous applicant pools). With multi-agency pools, you only have to apply once to access job opportunities across participating agencies. Your application will then be able to be viewed and assessed by all the agencies in that pool - or, if you prefer, you can specify that you want to be considered only for particular agencies. Make sure you check the specific vacancy to find out how each pool works.

HOW TO APPLY

When you have found the job you would like to apply for.

1. You can phone for a copy of the information kit or you can download the documents from the Smart Jobs and Careers website at www.jobs.qld.gov.au. The information kit will include:
 - the position or job description detailing: background of the department or work area; roles and responsibilities, and selection criteria
 - a job information package, outlining the procedure for preparing and sending in your application, and
 - an application cover sheet.
2. Do your homework - research the agency to understand the background to the job.
3. Prepare your application. This should include your:
 - completed cover sheet (available on jobs online or in the kit mailed to you)
 - covering letter
 - resumé / curriculum vitae
 - names and contact details of (2) referees, and
 - responses to the selection criteria if required.
4. Mail or email your application (Details of where and how are available in either the job description or the job information package).

Check with the job vacancy contact person if you are unsure about how or where to submit your application or how many copies to send. Make sure you send your application by the closing date. If you don't, it may not be accepted. Once your application is received, you will usually be sent a written acknowledgement.

3. the officer's notice of appeal must be actually received by the Commission Chief Executive before the deadline for its receipt;
4. the officer must continue to be entitled to appeal.

FOOTNOTES

- (a) Appointees may be required to serve in any part of the State. Where a centre is included under "Locality", the headquarters of the appointee will be at such centre unless otherwise determined.
- (b) An appointment has been declared by the Public Service Commissioner, by gazette notice, to be a non-appealable appointment, pursuant to section 195 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.
- (c) Also being advertised in daily press and/or internet/email advertising or technical journals.
- (d) The appointment may be appointed in a temporary capacity. If a tenured employee of the Public Service is selected for appointment, the officer will retain tenured status.

SCHEDULE 7 State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971 Rights and Obligations Under Easement

1. Interpretation

1.1 In this Schedule:

Approval means any licence, permit, consent, approval, determination, certificate or permission from any governmental authority or under any Law or requirement made under any Law.

BAPF Pipeline means the Brisbane Airport Pipeline Facility.

Burdened Land means the land over which the Easement is taken.

Contamination means a discharge, emission or deposit of any solid, liquid, gas or substance of any kind that brings about a detrimental change in the condition of the Environment and that makes or may make the Environment unsafe, unfit or harmful for habitation, use or occupation by any person or animal or is such that any part of the Environment does not satisfy the contamination criteria or standards published or adopted from time to time by the Governmental Agency responsible for Hazardous Substances, environmental protection and Contamination matters in Queensland.

Coordinator-General means the Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, and where, applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

DGSM Act means the *Dangerous Goods Safety Management Act 2001* (Qld) as amended from time to time and any regulations made pursuant to that Act.

Easement means this schedule and the Form 9 to which this schedule is attached.

Easement Area means that portion of the Burdened Land identified in Item 2 of the Form 9 in this Easement.

Environment includes:

- (a) the meaning given at common law;
- (b) the meaning given in any legislation in force in Queensland; and
- (c) any land, water, atmosphere, climate, sound, odour, taste, the biological factors of animals and plants and the social factors of aesthetics.

Environmental Law means any law relating to the Environment including any law relating to land use, planning, pollution of air, water, soil or groundwater, chemicals, waste, the use of transport, the storage or handling of dangerous goods, the health or safety of any person or Hazardous Substances, or any other matters relating to the protection of the Environment, health or property.

Equipment means equipment which is reasonably necessary to be taken onto the Easement Area by the Coordinator-General for a purpose in connection with this Easement.

Excavation means any activity which breaks open or disturbs the soil of the Easement Area to an extent that would or would be likely to cause any damage to, or compromise the integrity of, the Pipeline.

Governmental Agency means a government or a governmental, semi-governmental or judicial entity or authority.

Hazardous Substance means any substance that would or might reasonably be expected to cause injury to any person or the Environment including those substances included or defined as hazardous or dangerous under any Law in Queensland.

Infrastructure means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and

anything generated or produced and includes the Pipeline.

Landowner means the person who is a registered owner or, if the Burdened Land is State Leasehold land, the registered lessee of the Burdened Land from time to time.

Law means:

- (a) statutes, regulations, by-laws and other subordinate regulations of the Commonwealth, a state or territory or Governmental Agency and common law; and
- (b) binding requirements and Approvals (including any conditions or requirements under them).

Major Hazard Facility has the meaning given in the *Dangerous Goods Safety Management Act 2001* (Qld).

Non-State Entity means an entity other than the Coordinator-General, any State government authority, statutory body, crown instrumentality, Water Entity or government owned corporation or company established under the *Corporations Act 2001* that the State owns or controls, which receives more than 50% of its annual income from the State.

Pipeline means 2 underground recycled water pipelines and includes their associated structures, infrastructure, materials and related equipment.

Public Risk Insurance means a public risk policy in the sum of \$20 million for any one occurrence or such greater amount as a prudent provider of significant public utilities infrastructure would have in place from time to time.

Project means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

Services means water, gas, electricity, sewerage, telecommunications and similar services and any plant, equipment or infrastructure installed or located on or in the Burdened Land in connection with those services.

State Entity means the Coordinator-General, any State government authority, statutory body, crown instrumentality, Water Entity or government owned corporation or company established under the *Corporations Act 2001* that the State owns or controls, which receives more than 50% of its annual income from the State.

Water Entity means a water entity as defined under s.65 of the *South East Queensland Water (Restructuring) Act 2007* (Qld).

WHS Act means the *Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995* (Qld) as amended from time to time and any regulations made pursuant to that Act.

Work Method Statement has the meaning given in clause 4.4 or clause 7.1(b)(ii) for the Coordinator-General and Landowner respectively.

Work means any work carried out on the Easement Area by or on behalf of the Coordinator-General including, without limitation:

- (c) work associated with the operation, maintenance or repair of the Infrastructure;
- (d) work associated with upgrading or replacing the Infrastructure;
- (e) work associated with the testing and inspection of the Infrastructure; and
- (f) preparatory works,

which involves breaking open the soil of the Easement Area (both the surface and sub-surface) or erecting, altering or replacing fencing, barriers or other structures on the Easement Area or the Infrastructure.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works*

Organisation Act 1971 and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement will be registered as a public utility easement.

1.5 In this Schedule unless the context requires otherwise:

- (a) the singular includes the plural and vice versa;
- (b) a reference to one gender includes a reference to all other genders;
- (c) headings to clauses are included for the sake of convenience only and will not affect the interpretation of the clauses to which they relate; and
- (d) references to any statute or statutory provision include that statute or statutory provision as amended, extended, consolidated or replaced by subsequent legislation and any orders, regulations, instruments or other subordinate legislation made under the relevant statute.

2. Rights of Coordinator-General

2.1 Use of the Easement Area by the Coordinator-General

Subject to the terms and conditions of the Easement, the Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other

things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;

- (d) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is reasonably necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) take Equipment onto the Easement Area and use and operate that Equipment; and
- (f) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is reasonably necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
 - (i) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
 - (ii) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
 - (iii) doing things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (i) or soil referred to in subparagraph (ii).

2.2 Use of Easement Area by other parties

- (a) The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under

the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

- (b) Except in the case of an emergency, the Coordinator-General must give not less than 2 days' prior notice to the Landowner of any other party authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General under clause 2.2(a).

3. Access to Easement Area

3.1 Requirements for Access to Easement Area

- (a) Subject to clause 3.2, before accessing the Easement Area for a purpose in connection with this Easement, the Coordinator-General must provide reasonable notice to the Landowner.
- (b) If reasonably required by the Landowner, the Coordinator-General must be accompanied by an authorised representative of the Landowner when accessing the Easement Area.

3.2 Emergency Access

In the case of an emergency:

- (a) the requirements of clause 3.1 will not apply; and
- (b) the Coordinator-General must use reasonable endeavours to give the Landowner prior notice before accessing the Easement Area.

3.3 Requirements for Access to Burdened Land

- (a) General obligation
The Coordinator-General must:
 - (i) ensure that when accessing the Easement Area:

- (A) it engages in no act or makes any omission that puts either the Coordinator-General or the Landowner in breach of any Law in respect of workplace health and safety and hazard management, including but not limited to the WHS Act and DGSM Act; and
- (B) its employees, consultants or contractors comply with the requirements referred to in this clause 3.3; and
- (ii) subject to any privacy or confidentiality obligations that the Coordinator-General has, keep the Landowner and, if directed by the Landowner, any other party identified by the Landowner, fully informed of all workplace health and safety and hazard management matters arising out of or in any way connected with access to the Easement Area as soon as they occur.
- (b) WHS Act obligations
- (i) For the purposes of the WHS Act, the Coordinator-General is (or shall appoint a duly qualified person ("Nominee")) the 'principal contractor' for the period during which the Coordinator-General accesses the Easement Area for the purpose of carrying out Works.
- (ii) For the period that the Coordinator-General accesses
- the Easement Area for the purpose of carrying out Works, the Coordinator-General:
- (A) accepts (or undertakes to ensure its Nominee accepts) its appointment as 'principal contractor' and shall do all acts necessary to effect the appointment under clause 3.3(b)(i);
- (B) will provide evidence of the appointment as 'principal contractor' to the Landowner within 14 days of notification of the appointment;
- (C) accepts responsibility for compliance with all workplace health and safety legislative requirements (including the WHS Act) in respect of access to the Easement Area;
- (D) shall attend to all applicable lodgements required and pay all fees, fines and other amounts becoming payable under or in connection with all workplace health and safety legislative requirements (including the WHS Act) in respect of its access to the Easement Area;
- (E) must comply with the duties of a 'principal contractor' under the WHS Act in respect of

its access to the Easement Area (regardless of whether any access to the Easement Area is granted to any person) including:

- (1) having a corporate workplace health and safety and rehabilitation management system in place which is in accordance with the most current Queensland Government requirements;
- (2) ensuring that any workplace health and safety plans include safety procedures to ensure compliance with the obligation of a 'principal contractor' under the WHS Act;
- (3) carrying out all works in the Easement Area in a safe manner; and
- (4) identifying any land or improvements which may be affected by

access to the Easement Area;

- (F) without limiting its obligations under this Easement, shall carry out all risk assessments as and when required by all workplace health and safety legislative requirements (and, in any event, by no later than a reasonable time prior to carrying out any work in the Easement Area the subject of the relevant risk assessment);
- (G) must provide a copy of each risk assessment referred to in clause 3.3(b)(ii)(F) above (and updates of such risk assessments) to the Landowner's representative;
- (H) must, (and must ensure its consultants and contractors), reasonably consult with the Landowner, any person nominated by the Landowner and any person required under the WHS Act in relation to how access to and work on the Easement Area can be undertaken in a way which prevents or minimises all risks to health and safety of all persons including identifying potential associated hazards.

- (c) DGSM Act obligations
For the purpose of the DGSM Act, the Coordinator-General:
- (i) accepts responsibility for ensuring compliance with the DGSM Act in respect access to the Easement Area and work performed on the Easement Area; and
 - (ii) will, when reasonably directed by the Landowner, provide such assistance as is reasonably necessary, including the provision of any information or documents, to assist the Landowner to comply with its obligations under the DGSM Act.

4. Construction Works

4.1 Prior notice for Works

- (a) Except in the case of an emergency, before commencing Works on the Easement Area, the Coordinator-General must give the Landowner reasonable prior notice of:
- (i) the nature of the Works to be carried out;
 - (ii) the proposed timing for the Works; and
 - (iii) whether the Works be likely to involve any restriction of access to the Burdened Land or be carried out in the vicinity of the car parking areas on the Easement Area or the Burdened Land.
- (b) In the case of an emergency, the notice required by clause 4.1(a) must be given by the Coordinator-General as soon as reasonably practicable.

- (c) The Coordinator-General acknowledges and agrees that:
- (i) it will be wholly responsible for all Works carried out in the Easement Area by or any behalf of the Coordinator-General; and
 - (ii) by giving its consent to, or imposing conditions on, the carrying out of the Works, the Landowner is not assuming any responsibility whatsoever for the Works.

4.2 Excavation Works

Except in the case of an emergency and without limiting clause 4.1(a), the Coordinator-General must

- (a) give the Landowner not less than 2 days' prior notice of its intention to excavate any part of the Easement Area in which the Services or the BAPF Pipeline exist; and
- (b) upon reasonable request permit the Landowner to:
 - (i) inspect the excavation works; and
 - (ii) to the extent that it will not pose a material risk to the Pipeline or materially prejudice the carrying out of the Works or the exercise by the Coordinator-General of its rights under this Easement, undertake its own works or testing in connection with the BAPF Pipeline or the Services before the excavation works are refilled.

4.3 Work Method Statement

Except in the case of an emergency, before commencing Works on the Easement Area

the Coordinator-General must prepare a Work Method Statement (which must be updated from time to time as reasonably required during the performance of the Works) to the Landowner's reasonable satisfaction which addresses the following in respect of the Works:

- (a) safe practices and procedures for carrying out the Works (including, without limitation, practices and procedures relevant to the Major Hazard Facility (if relevant));
- (b) actions to be taken to minimise the risk of harm being caused to the Environment by the Works;
- (c) actions to be taken to maintain the security of the Land and minimise interference with the Landowner's business operations on the Land; and
- (d) the workplace health and safety responsibilities in respect of the Works.

4.4 Approvals and Laws

- (a) The Coordinator-General must ensure that all Approvals required for the Works (including Approvals from the owners of the Services) are obtained before the Works commence.
- (b) All Works carried out by the Coordinator-General on the Easement Area must be carried out in accordance with:
 - (i) the requirements of the Work Method Statement as updated from time to time in accordance with clause 4.3;
 - (ii) the reasonable requirements of the Landowner in relation to the use and availability of the existing access ways and car parking areas on the Easement Area;

- (iii) any relevant Approvals (including Approvals from the owners of the Services); and
- (iv) all Laws including, without limitation:
 - (A) Environmental Laws; and
 - (B) Laws relating to occupational health and safety.

4.5 Obligation to Minimise Interference

In accessing the Easement Area or carrying out Works, the Coordinator-General must take all action reasonably necessary to minimise:

- (a) damage to the Easement Area and the Burdened Land;
- (b) damage to the property of the Landowner or to that of its employees, servants, agents, tenants, licensees, visitors or invitees;
- (c) interference with the Services on the Easement Area or Burdened Land; and
- (d) disruption to or interference with the Landowner's business operations, its employees, servants, agents, tenants, licensees, visitors, invitees or others using or present on the Burdened Land.

4.6 Make-Good Obligations

If the Coordinator-General causes damage to the Easement Area or the Burdened Land in carrying out Works or otherwise, the Coordinator-General must promptly reinstate, repair and make good the Easement Area and/or the Burdened Land to the Landowner's reasonable satisfaction so as to return the Easement Area and/or the Burdened Land to the same state of repair that it was in (but having regard to the Works so undertaken) immediately before the damage occurred.

5. BAPF Pipeline

5.1 Operation of Clause 5

This clause will operate only for the period that the BAPF Pipeline exists and continues to exist within the Easement Area.

5.2 Coordinator-General's Obligation

The Coordinator-General must do everything reasonably necessary to prevent interference with or damage to the BAPF Pipeline by the Infrastructure or Coordinator-General's use of the Easement Area, including, but not limited to:

- (a) carrying out regular monitoring, testing and inspection of the Infrastructure ("Test"); and
- (b) ensuring appropriate cathodic protection of the Infrastructure is maintained at all times and upgraded where necessary in accordance with applicable industry standards.

A copy of the results of each Test must be provided to the Landowner within a reasonable time after the results are available.

5.3 Notification by Landowner

If the Landowner:

- (a) notifies the Coordinator-General that the Test results or the results of its testing, monitoring or inspection of the BAPF Pipeline indicate that the BAPF Pipeline is being detrimentally impacted by the Infrastructure; and
- (b) provides the Coordinator-General with reasonable independent evidence in support of that detrimental impact,

then the Coordinator-General must promptly upgrade the cathodic protection of the Infrastructure to meet the appropriate industry standards.

6. Obligations of Landowner

6.1 Subject to the Landowner's rights under clause 7, the Landowner must:

- (a) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) not plant trees on the Easement Area which are likely to interfere with the Infrastructure without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (c) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not erect improvements, buildings, structures, pipelines, Services, roads, fences, driveways or paving on or under the Easement Area without the consent of the Coordinator-General (such consent not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed);
- (e) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (f) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (g) use reasonable endeavours to prevent anyone else under the Landowner's control doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to any of those things; and
- (h) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or

enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement except in accordance with the Landowner's rights under this Easement.

7. Rights and Obligations of Landowner

7.1 Existing Improvements, Upkeep and Environmental Obligations

(a) Subject to clause 7.1(b), the Landowner may:

- (i) repair and maintain any existing improvement, road, fence, driveway or paving on the Easement Area;
- (ii) carry out works on the Easement Area to upkeep the Easement Area to the Landowner's satisfaction including, without limitation, mowing, slashing or pruning vegetation, gardening and landscaping works; and
- (iii) subject to clause 8.2, carry out any works on the Easement Area necessary to comply with the Landowner's obligations under a Law (including an Environmental Law) or the Landowner's environmental policies and procedures for the Burdened Land including, without limitation, works necessary to remediate Contamination or test for the presence of Contamination on the Burdened Land or in the groundwater,

(Landowner's Works) without the consent of the Coordinator-General provided that it takes all reasonable steps necessary to minimise

interference with the safety, security or operation of the Infrastructure.

(b) Except in the case of an emergency, where the Landowner's Works involve any Excavation or other activity that would pose a material risk to the integrity or safety of the Pipeline within the Easement Area the Landowner must:

- (i) give the Coordinator-General reasonable prior notice of:
 - (A) the nature of the Landowner's Works to be carried out;
 - (B) the proposed timing for the Landowner's Works; and
 - (C) whether the Landowner's Works be likely to involve any restriction of access to the Easement Area; and
- (ii) prepare a Work Method Statement (which must be updated from time to time as reasonably required during the performance of the Landowner's Works) to the Coordinator-General's (or its nominee's) reasonable satisfaction which addresses the following in respect of the Works:
 - (A) safe practices and procedures for carrying out the Landowner's Works;
 - (B) actions to be taken to minimise the risk of harm being caused to

- the Pipeline by the Landowner's Works;
- (C) actions to be taken to minimise interference with the Coordinator-General's exercise and enjoyment of its rights under this Easement; and
- (D) the workplace health and safety responsibilities in respect of the Landowner's Works.
- (iii) carry out the Landowner's Works in accordance with the requirements of that Work Method Statement.

8. Other Matters

8.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

8.2 Fencing

- (a) The Landowner must not erect or maintain any fencing preventing access to or within the Easement Area, unless:
- (i) the fencing includes a lockable gate of suitable size to permit entry for maintenance vehicles to the Easement Area in a location agreed with the Coordinator-General (acting reasonably); and
- (ii) a set of keys to the lockable gate referred to in clause 8.2(a)(i) are provided to the Coordinator-General.

- (b) The Coordinator-General must reimburse the Landowner all reasonable costs incurred by the Landowner in erecting the lockable gate pursuant to this clause.

8.3 Stamping and Registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

8.4 Mining or Petroleum Tenement

The Landowner will use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within a reasonable time after the Landowner receives such notification.

8.5 Further Assurances

- (a) The Landowner will, at the cost of the Coordinator-General, execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.
- (b) The Coordinator-General must, at its cost, obtain the consent of any person necessary for the registration of the Easement (including, without limitation, the consent of the Minister for Natural Resources and Water to the Easement).

9. Notice**9.1 General**

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

9.2 How to Give a Communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

9.3 Particulars for Delivery of Notices

The address and facsimile number of the Coordinator-General and Landowner is that specified below or that which a party specifies by written notice to the other party from time to time:

10. Consent

Where the consent of a party is required under this Easement, that consent must not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

11. Severability

- (a) Subject to clause 11(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or

unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.

- (b) Clause 11(a), does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

12. Indemnity, Risk and Insurance**12.1 Risk**

The Coordinator-General accesses the Burdened Land and the Easement Area and carries out all Works at its own risk.

12.2 Indemnity

- (a) The Coordinator-General releases, indemnifies and keeps indemnified the Landowner (and each of its employees, officers, agents and contractors) including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, from and against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses (excluding any indirect or consequential loss) ("Claims") arising from:

- (i) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; or
- (ii) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement,

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (iii) caused; or

- (iv) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution), by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.
- (b) Despite anything to the contrary in this Deed, nothing in this clause 12 limits any right of the Landowner at general law.
- (c) To avoid doubt, the references to 'Coordinator-General' in clauses 12.2(a)(i) and 12.2(a)(ii) include, without limitation, persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement.

12.3 Insurance

- (a) Where the holder of the benefit of this Easement (the *Easement Holder*) is a Non-State Entity, the Easement Holder must:
 - (i) effect and maintain at all times Public Risk Insurance in respect of liability arising in relation to or in connection with the Easement Area, the Infrastructure and the Easement Holder's activities on, over or under the Easement Area; and
 - (ii) effect workers compensation insurance required by law in respect of Works and maintain such insurance for the entire period that the Easement Holder accesses the Easement Area in connection with the Works,
- (b) All policies of insurance effected by the Easement Holder pursuant to this clause 12.3 must:
 - (i) save for workers compensation insurance, cover the Landowner as an insured party;
 - (ii) cover the liability of the Easement Holder to the Landowner and to third parties for loss or damage to property and the death of or injury to any person caused by the Works; and
 - (iii) be with an insurer and on terms acceptable to the Landowner, acting reasonably, and which are reasonably available in the insurance market.
- (c) Where a State Entity (other than the Coordinator-General) is the Easement Holder:
 - (i) the Easement Holder must effect and maintain insurance on the same terms and for at least the same coverage as required by clause 12.3; and
 - (ii) the Landowner acknowledges and agrees that such insurance may be effected with the Queensland Government Insurance Fund.
- (d) Notwithstanding the definition of Coordinator-General in clause 1.1, the reference to Coordinator-General in clause 12.3(c) does not include an assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.
- (e) The Easement Holder must provide the Landowner with evidence of its compliance with this clause 12.3 upon request.

**State Development and Public Works Organisation
Act 1971
Rights and Obligations Under Volumetric
Easement**

1. INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

"Burdened Land" means the area of land over which the Easement is taken;

"Coordinator-General" means the Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971*, and the Coordinator-General's assigns and, where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, sub-contractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement;

"Easement" means the volumetric easement taken by the Coordinator-General under the provisions of the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*, including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule;

"Infrastructure" means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced;

"Landowner" means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land, or who has an estate or interest in the Burdened Land, from time to time;

"Project" means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Project as referred to in Part 4A of the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Regulation 1999*; and

"Structure" means any improvement, building, structure, footings (including piled footings), pipeline or services other than fencing.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement burdens the Burdened Land described in Schedule 1 in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*.

2. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, construct, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure in or through the Burdened Land from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Burdened Land, or any Infrastructure in it, from time to time;
- (c) break open the soil of the Burdened Land for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do in the Burdened Land;
- (d) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain in (for so long as is necessary), the Burdened Land for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-

General can do under the Easement; and

- (e) take anything into the Burdened Land and use and operate what has been taken into the Burdened Land.

2.2 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General must:

- (a) ensure that any work done in the Burdened Land is carried out in a safe, proper and workmanlike manner;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner; and
- (c) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done in the Burdened Land.

2.3 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach. Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

3. OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

3.1 The Landowner:

- (a) may only erect, permit to be erected or materially alter any Structure within the Burdened Land with the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General. However, the Landowner may remove a Structure in the Burdened Land which has been erected in contravention of the Easement without the need to obtain the Coordinator-General's consent.
- (b) must maintain and repair, and not change, any Structure erected in accordance with paragraph (a) above;
- (c) must not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure in the Burdened Land from time to time or interfere with anything

that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed in the Burdened Land from time to time (including plant and equipment) and in this regard must comply with clause 4 below;

- (d) must not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure in the Burdened Land from time to time;
- (e) must promptly abate any such nuisance caused by the Landowner;
- (f) must use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement, and must not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things; and
- (g) must not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement.

3.2 The Landowner must not grant any rights to any person to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will:

- (a) conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement; or
- (b) cause the Landowner to be in breach of its obligations under the Easement.

4. LANDOWNER DEVELOPMENT

4.1 Prior to any Structure being installed, constructed, removed, replaced or added to ("Structure Works") in the Burdened Land or on the Landowner's land above the Burdened Land, the Landowner must:

- (a) notify the Coordinator-General of the intention to carry out the Structure Works; and

(b) secure the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General to the carrying out of the Structure Works.

4.2 If, in the opinion of the Coordinator-General, the Structure Works may, if carried out, cause the Landowner to breach the Easement, then the Coordinator-General may withhold written consent pending receipt from the Landowner of such assessments and design documentation as may be requested by the Coordinator-General.

4.3 Upon receipt of those assessments and design documentation, the Coordinator-General will make a final determination as to whether the Structure Works, if carried out, may cause the Landowner to breach the Easement. If the Coordinator-General remains of the opinion that the Structure works, if carried out, may cause the Landowner to breach the Easement, then the Coordinator-General may refuse written consent to the Structure Works. Alternatively, if the Coordinator-General forms the opinion that the Structure works, if carried out, are unlikely to cause the Landowner to breach the Easement, then the Coordinator-General will provide written consent to the Structure Works.

4.4 Provision by the Coordinator-General of written consent to the Structure Works does not constitute authority for the Landowner to breach the Easement, and any breach of the Easement arising in the course of or as a result of carrying out the Structure Works is not excused, abrogated, waived or released by reason of the Coordinator-General's provision of written consent in accordance with this clause 4.

5. OTHER MATTERS

5.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought into or installed in or through the Burdened Land from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Burdened Land, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

5.2 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

5.3 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner must use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Burdened Land, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

5.4 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document relating to the Burdened Land and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement or the Burdened Land.

6. NOTICE

6.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

6.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;

- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or

7. COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT

- (a) The Coordinator-General may conditionally or unconditionally give or withhold any consent to be given under the Easement, and is not obliged to give reasons for doing so, however the Coordinator-General will not unreasonably refuse or withhold its consent to the Landowner.
- (b) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the Landowner are, in the Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security or operation of the Infrastructure, or otherwise interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict the Coordinator-General's exercise of rights and powers under the Easement.

- (c) For the purpose of considering any request by the Landowner for any consent required under the Easement, the Coordinator-General may request any information in writing from the Landowner that the Coordinator-General considers reasonable to enable the Coordinator-General to decide whether to give such consent.

8. SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to paragraph (b) below, if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Paragraph (a) above does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

9. INDEMNITY

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss ("**Claims**") arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; and
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement;

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (c) caused; or
- (d) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution),

by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.

10. GST

(a) Interpretation

(i) Except where the context suggests otherwise, terms used in this clause have the meanings given to those terms by the *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Cth) (as amended from time to time).

(ii) Any part of a supply that is treated as a separate supply for GST purposes (including attributing GST payable to tax periods) will be treated as a separate supply for the purposes of this clause.

(iii) Any reference in this clause to GST payable by an entity includes any GST payable by the representative member of any GST group of which that entity is a member. Any reference in this clause to input tax credits to which an entity is entitled will include input tax credits to which the representative member of any GST group of which that entity is a member is entitled.

(b) **Reimbursements and similar payments**

Any payment or reimbursement required to be made under the Easement for a cost, expense, or other amount paid or incurred will be limited to the total cost, expense or amount less the amount of any input tax credit to which an entity is entitled for the

acquisition to which the cost, expense or amount relates.

(c) **GST payable**

If GST is payable in relation to a supply made under or in connection with this Easement then:

(i) any party ("**Recipient**") that is required to provide consideration to another party ("**Supplier**") for that supply must pay an additional amount to the Supplier equal to the amount of GST payable on the supply;

(ii) the additional amount is payable at the same time as any of the consideration is to be first provided for the supply or, if later, after the Supplier provides a valid tax invoice to the Recipient.

(d) If the GST payable in relation to a supply made under or in connection with this Easement varies from the additional amount paid by the Recipient under paragraph (c) above in relation to that supply then the Supplier will provide a corresponding refund or credit to, or will be entitled to receive the amount of that variation from, the Recipient. Any payment, credit or refund under this paragraph is deemed to be a payment, credit or refund of the additional amount payable under paragraph (c) above.

SCHEDULE 9

**State Development and Public Works Organisation
Act 1971
Rights and Obligations Under Easement**

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

“**Burdened Land**” means the land over which the Easement is taken.

“**Coordinator-General**” means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General’s rights under the Easement, and, where applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

“**Easement**” means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

“**Easement Area**” means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is obtained.

“**Infrastructure**” means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced.

“**Landowner**” means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

“**Project**” means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement may be registered as a public utility easement.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;

- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
- (g) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
- (h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
 - (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
 - (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
 - (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use

the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area; and
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area.

2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) maintain and repair, and not change, any existing improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area (other than the Infrastructure);
- (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on

- or adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
 - (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
 - (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time, but if any nuisance is caused, then promptly abate such nuisance;
 - (i) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
 - (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
 - (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

4 OTHER MATTERS

4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General may either repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard reasonably equivalent to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;
- (b) the owner of the fencing that was pulled down or broken open will become the owner of the repaired fencing or gate; and
- (c) that owner must maintain the repaired fencing or gate.

4.3 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

4.4 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner is to use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

4.5 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

5 NOTICE

5.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the

Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

5.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;

(B) the Landowner supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to the Coordinator-General.

- (c) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the Landowner are, in the Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security or operation of, or interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict the Coordinator-General's access or other rights under the Easement along or across the Easement Area.

SCHEDULE 10

Acquisition of Land Act 1967 State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971 Rights and Obligations Under Easement

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

"Burdened Land" means the land over which the Easement is taken;

"Coordinator-General" means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* of 100 George Street, Brisbane in the State of Queensland and, where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General, and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement;

"Development Works" means the construction or alteration of any Structure or of any assets of the Landowner existing, or proposed to be built on, over or through the Easement Area;

"Easement" means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General, by agreement with the Landowner under the provisions of the *State*

Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971 and the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*, including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule;

"Easement Area" means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is taken;

"Infrastructure" means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced;

"Landowner" means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land, or who has an estate or interest in the Burdened Land, from time to time;

"Project" means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*; and

"Structure" means any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to an individual, a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person, and includes that person's executors, administrators and permitted assigns.

1.4 The Coordinator-General may exercise any right conferred on it, and discharge any obligation assigned to it, under the Easement by ensuring that the right is exercised or the obligation discharged, by persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General.

1.5 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General and all persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to surveyors, engineers, servants, agents, contractors and sub-contractors of the Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on or adjacent to the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
- (g) take anything onto the Easement Area (and any other adjacent land owned or occupied by the Landowner when entering it to access the Easement Area) and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
- (h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's

opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:

- (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
- (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
- (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 (a) The Coordinator-General does not need to exercise its rights and powers under the Easement personally and the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement are not intended to be exclusive to the Coordinator-General. The Coordinator-General may authorise other people to exercise those rights and powers.

(b) The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) except in the case of emergency where the giving of such notice would not be practicable, give the Landowner at least 2 days' notice of their intention to access the Easement Area;
- (b) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is carried out in a safe, proper and workmanlike manner and use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that the Landowner's access to and operation of any of its Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not disrupted or jeopardised;
- (c) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (d) without limiting any other provisions of this Easement, take all reasonable steps to ensure that water does not escape from the Infrastructure;
- (e) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area;
- (f) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area; and
- (g) make good any damage to the Easement Area, or to any assets owned the Landowner on the Easement Area, caused by the Coordinator-General in undertaking the Town Water Supply Project Works ("Damage") at no cost to the Landowner. If the Coordinator-General fails to make good any such Damage, the Landowner may give the Coordinator-General a notice requiring the Coordinator-General to take steps to make good the Damage within 14 days of the notice. If the Coordinator-General fails to do so within that period, the Landowner may make good the Damage itself and the Coordinator-General will, subject to submission of a valid tax invoice, be liable to reimburse the Landowner its reasonable and actual costs directly incurred in repairing the Damage.

- 2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General or persons authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any such action shall be taken without the Coordinator-General or persons authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) not erect, permit to be erected, or materially alter any Structure without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General in accordance with clause 3.3, although the Landowner may remove a Structure on the Easement Area which has been erected in contravention of the Easement;
- (b) maintain and repair, and (subject to clause 3.3) not change, any Structure;
- (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or light or permit the lighting of fires on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that the Coordinator-General or a person authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area

- or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time;
 - (i) promptly abate any such nuisance;
 - (j) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
 - (k) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General, or any person authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General, in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement;
 - (l) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement; and
 - (m) if the Landholder intends to inundate part of the Easement Area, give the Coordinator General reasonable prior written notice of the location and expected period of inundation.

3.2 The Landowner may:

- (a) enter upon and traverse the Easement Area with vehicles, plant and equipment if necessary for the conduct of the Landowner's operations on the Burdened Land, so long as that entry does not damage or materially affect the Infrastructure, its operation or the Coordinator-General's ability to exercise its rights under the Easement;
- (b) with the consent of the Coordinator-General and otherwise subject to clause 3.3, undertake Development Works on, over, under or through the Easement Area;
- (c) subject to clause 3.1(m), inundate part of the Easement Area by water;

- (d) inspect, maintain, repair or replace its existing infrastructure on the Easement Area; and
- (e) inspect, maintain, repair or replace any service road within the Easement Area.

3.3 Development Works

- (a) Within a reasonable period prior to the commencement of any Development Works, the Landowner will:
 - (i) consult in good faith with the Coordinator-General on the nature and design of the Development Works; and
 - (ii) without limiting clause 3.3(a)(i), provide copies of the plans, design, drawings and specifications related to the Development Works ("Design Documentation") to the Coordinator-General in accordance with clause 3.3(b).
- (b) The Design Documentation must include:
 - (i) details sufficient to enable the Coordinator-General to gain an understanding of the nature and expected duration of the proposed Development Works; and
 - (ii) the Landowner's assessment of the effect the proposed Development Works are likely to have on the Infrastructure or its operation; and
 - (iii) any other details reasonably requested by the Coordinator-General.

(c) The Coordinator-General must consider the Design Documentation in good faith and must grant its consent to the undertaking of the relevant Development Works if, acting reasonably, the Coordinator-General considers that:

- (i) the Development Works are not likely to cause damage to the Infrastructure, or materially affect the safety, security or operation of, or otherwise interfere with, the Infrastructure; and
- (ii) the Development Works are not likely to materially restrict the Coordinator-General's ability to exercise its access or other rights under the Easement on or through the Easement Area.

4 OTHER MATTERS

4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General or a person authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General or the person authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General may either repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard reasonably equivalent to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

SCHEDULE 11

State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971 Rights and Obligations Under Easement

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

"Burdened Land" means the land over which the Easement is taken.

"Coordinator-General" means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, and, where applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

"Landowner" means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

"Project" means the Eastern Pipeline Interconnector as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement may be registered as a public utility easement.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;

- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
- (g) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
- (h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
- (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
 - (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
 - (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).
- 2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.
- 2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:
- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
 - (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
 - (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area; and
 - (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area.
- 2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.
- ### 3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER
- 3.1 The Landowner must:
- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
 - (b) maintain and repair, and not change, any existing improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area (other than the Infrastructure);
 - (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;

- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time, but if any nuisance is caused, then promptly abate such nuisance;
- (i) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.
