The Queensland State Government's policy is to seek to retain skilled staff. Registered deployees who apply for an advertised job will be considered before other applicants. The symbol (g) appears next to vacancies where an exemption from this requirement applies. Deployees are to indicate in their application for the advertised job that they are registered with the Office of the Public Service Commissioner. The Queensland Public Service Commissioner is committed to equal opportunity in employment. Selection will be given on the basis of merit only and fair consideration will be given to all applicants.

CONTINUOUS APPLICANT POOLS

A continuous applicant pool allows you to apply for jobs within an occupation where vacancies are regularly available. This means that agencies can 'dip' into the pool for suitable applicants as soon as they have a vacancy. You can submit or refresh your application at any time. If you are refreshing your application, make sure that you indicate this either on your email or, if sending by post, in a covering letter. In search results, continuous applicant pools can be identified by 'Ongoing' in the 'Closes' column of a search result.

Note: If a continuous applicant pool is closing, applicants will be notified two weeks prior to this date. Applications may be used for up to six months after the pool closes.

MULTI-AGENCY POOLS

Some Queensland Government agencies are on the lookout for people to fill similar jobs or occupations at the same time. Some of these jobs have a fixed closing date and others are ongoing (continuous applicant pools). With multi-agency pools, you only have to apply once to access job opportunities across participating agencies. Your application will then be able to be viewed and assessed by all the agencies in that pool - or, if you prefer, you can specify that you want to be considered only for particular agencies. Make sure you check the specific vacancy to find out how each pool works.

HOW TO APPLY

When you have found the job you would like to apply for.

1. You can phone for a copy of the information kit or you can download the documents from the Smart Jobs and Careers website at www.jobs.qld.gov.au. The information kit will include:
 - the position or job description detailing: background of the department or work area; roles and responsibilities, and selection criteria
 - a job information package, outlining the procedure for preparing and sending in your application, and
 - an application cover sheet.
2. Do your homework - research the agency to understand the background to the job.
3. Prepare your application. This should include your:
 - completed cover sheet (available on jobs online or in the kit mailed to you)
 - covering letter
 - resumé / curriculum vitae
 - names and contact details of (2) referees, and
 - responses to the selection criteria if required.
4. Mail or email your application (Details of where and how are available in either the job description or the job information package).

Check with the job vacancy contact person if you are unsure about how or where to submit your application or how many copies to send. Make sure you send your application by the closing date. If you don't, it may not be accepted. Once your application is received, you will usually be sent a written acknowledgement.

When applying for Continuous Applicant Pools, please check each vacancy for application instructions.

4. the officer must continue to be entitled to appeal.

Directive 16/08

Title: Engaging Officers on Fixed Term Contracts of Employment

- 1. Supersedes:** Directive No. 2/08 – *Contracts for a Fixed Term – Officers whose Remuneration is Less than that of a Senior Officer*
Directive No. 11/04 – *Contracts for a Fixed Term*

2. Purpose:

To provide public service agencies with the flexibility to attract and/or retain officers with critical skills for specific business needs by offering financial and/or other incentives.

- 3. Legislative Provision:** *Public Service Act 2008* – Section 53, section 121 and section 122

- 4. Effective date:** 15 December 2008

5. Application:

This directive applies to public service officers appointed on a contract of employment for a fixed term. It is to be read in conjunction with the directive on *Recruitment and Selection* in force at the relevant time.

6. Inconsistency

Sections 51 and 52 of the *Public Service Act 2008* and section 687 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* apply if there is no conflict with an Act, regulation or industrial instrument.

7. Definitions:

Fixed term	means that the appointment of the officer on a contract of employment is for a defined period.
Job Market Assessment	means the remuneration offered for the position is based on an assessment of what might be paid in the private sector for roles with similar responsibilities. Appropriate advice is generally sourced from a remuneration specialist. It is usually the practice for the remuneration for the position in question to be set in the bottom 25% of the private sector range.
Non-tied Commercial Business Unit	means a commercial operation that truly competes with the private sector for business and revenue.

Technical Specialist	means an officer employed because of his or her exceptional competency in a particular professional, technical or business discipline which would require tertiary qualifications and/or professional/technical expertise including industry or business experience and recognition.
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8. Directive:

8.1 Policy Objective

The objectives of engaging officers on fixed term contracts of employment are to provide:

- (a) a means to attract and retain officers with critical skills essential for a fixed term, significant project;
- (b) a means to attract and retain highly skilled technical specialists and/or officers with critical skills where there is a shortage in the job market;
- (c) a means to retain officers with critical skills until the completion of a significant and essential project, as determined by the chief executive of the agency concerned;
- (d) a means to attract officers to positions in areas of the State where the usual employment conditions attached to a particular vacancy or vacancies have proven to be inadequate to attract and/or retain appropriately qualified and experienced officers;
- (e) a means to provide special employment conditions for officers required to work overseas;
- (f) a means to attract and retain officers to work in non-tied commercial business units; and
- (g) a means to maintain existing employment conditions for officers who have been affected by machinery of government changes or other government initiated action.

8.2 Policy Requirements

8.2.1 The engagement of officers on fixed term contracts of employment must be in accordance with the objectives of this directive. In making a decision to engage an officer under section 122 of the Act, the chief executive must ensure that:

- (a) a job evaluation system, a benchmarking process, or a job market assessment, is used to determine and justify the appropriate remuneration level for the job;
- (b) any conflict with an industrial instrument is resolved so that there is no overall detriment in the employment conditions to the officer;
- (c) except for
 - i. technical specialist positions;
 - ii. service delivery jobs located in areas of the State where there is difficulty in attracting and retaining officers; or
 - iii. jobs that require special or unique employment conditions

fixed term contracts of employment are not to be used for continuing or on-going roles including roles that should properly fall within the Senior Executive Service.

- (d) the arrangement does not adversely impact on the ability of other agencies to attract and retain officers from similar occupational groups.

- 8.2.2** The use of fixed term contracts of employment under a scheme, initiative or employment strategy (including variations to the approved scheme, initiative or strategy) for an occupational group involving a number of roles (e.g. a proposal under the Government's *Attraction and Retention Remuneration and Incentive Policy*), must have prior approval from the Commission Chief Executive and/or the Director-General of the department responsible for administering the *Industrial Relations Act 1999*.
- 8.2.3** Remuneration and employment conditions offered under a contract of employment must be transparent, justified and defensible.
- 8.2.4** The level of total remuneration must not exceed that payable to senior executives (that is, SES 4), unless the chief executive of the agency believes there is a valid reason for doing otherwise. In these cases, approval of the Commission Chief Executive is required prior to engaging the person on a fixed term contract of employment.
- 8.2.5** For situations not clearly covered by the policy objectives set down in section 8.1, the chief executive must:
- (a) where it is intended that the officer will be remunerated above the minimum payable to a senior executive, obtain approval from the Commission Chief Executive; or
 - (b) where the remuneration is intended to be below the minimum payable to a senior executive, obtain approval from the chief executive of the department responsible for administering the *Industrial Relations Act 1999*.
- 8.2.6** The maximum term of a fixed term contract of employment is five (5) years, or a lesser period appropriate to the employment situation. For technical specialist positions, a new contract may be offered if the officer's employment is to extend beyond five (5) years.
- 8.2.7** The template for a contract of employment issued under s.122 of the Act shall be in a form approved and issued by the Commission Chief Executive for positions remunerated in the Senior Executive Service salary range or above. The template for a contract for positions below that level will be approved and issued by the Director-General of the department responsible for administering the *Industrial Relations Act 1999*. Except for salary variations, any amendment to the standard template terms of a contract of employment issued under s.122 of the Act must be approved by the issuing authority.
- 8.2.8** Chief executives are required to:
- (a) report on the number and details of fixed term contracts of employment approved in their agencies through the Commission Chief Executive as required by the Premier; and
 - (b) ensure that information to be reported in (a) above, is in a form required by the Commission Chief Executive.
- 8.2.9** Annual salary increases granted to officers employed on fixed term contracts under section 122 of the Act, must not exceed the increase approved for senior executives or tenured officers at the equivalent classification level. Officers remunerated at rates not tied to senior executive or tenured officer classifications may, at the discretion of the agency's chief executive, be paid annual increases based on the percentage increase approved for officers employed under the *State Government Departments Certified Agreement* applicable to the year in question.

8.2.10 In special circumstances and for a specific purpose, the Commission Chief Executive or the Director-General of the department responsible for administering the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* (depending on the level of remuneration payable) may grant an exemption from compliance with this directive.

Title: Employment Screening

1. Supersedes: 8/08

2. Purpose:

To set out employment screening requirements for persons engaged or proposed to be engaged to perform:

- a) duties that the chief executive determines make a check of the person's criminal history relevant to a consideration of the person's suitability for the duties; or
- b) child-related duties.

To set out risk management requirements to be implemented by employing entities performing child-related or child-associated duties.

3. Legislative Provision: *Public Service Act 2008* — Section 53 and Chapter 5, Part 6

4. Effective date: 15 December 2008

5. Definitions:

Employment Screening means for the purposes of this directive:

- criminal history checking for relevant duties pursuant to Chapter 5, Part 6, Division 2 of the *Public Service Act 2008*; and
- police information checking for child-related duties pursuant to Chapter 5, Part 6, Division 3 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

Employing Entity means departments and public service offices as described in the *Public Service Act 2008*.

Relevant duties means duties, other than child-related duties, that the chief executive of an employing entity decides may require criminal history checking as part of the assessment of the person's suitability for the duties.

Child-related duties means duties that the chief executive of an employing entity decides are likely to involve providing dedicated services or activities where a child or children is/are the primary or significant client group or where the nature of contact with a child or children, and the context in which that contact happens, creates an unacceptable level of risk for the child/children.

Criminal history checking for the purposes of this directive is the process of carrying out relevant criminal history checks on a recommended person proposed to be engaged to perform relevant duties. A criminal history check for relevant duties will not disclose convictions that have been rehabilitated under the *Criminal Law (Rehabilitation of Offenders) Act 1986*.

Police information checking for the purposes of this directive is the process of carrying out police information checks on a recommended person or current employee engaged or proposed to be engaged to perform child-related duties. A police information check is not limited by the operation of the *Criminal Law (Rehabilitation of Offenders) Act 1986* and may disclose:

- recorded or unrecorded convictions and charges for offences in Queensland or elsewhere;
- investigative information¹ about the person;
- information as to whether the person is or has been
 - (i) a relevant disqualified person²; or
 - (ii) the subject of an application for a disqualification order³; or
 - (iii) named as the respondent to an application for an offender prohibition order⁴.

Risk management for the purpose of this directive is the process by which an employing entity identifies, assesses and manages potential risks arising from the performance of child-related or child-associated duties by that entity in order to foster child-safe and child-friendly service environments.

Child-associated duties means duties that the chief executive of an employing entity decides may involve a child or children but do not amount to child-related duties.

General provisions

6 Candidates to be advised of screening requirements

An employing entity must inform candidates about employment screening requirements for any job involving relevant or child-related duties.

During selection a candidate must not be asked to disclose anything about their criminal history or police information, other than information necessary to allow the conduct of an employment screening process.

7 Who may be screened

- 7.1 Employment screening of candidates may be conducted only on recommended persons.
- 7.2 Employment screening of a current employee may be conducted as a result of changed employment circumstances which warrants the screening or as a result of the notification of a relevant charge or conviction by the employee. These changed circumstances can include:
- redeployment, secondment, transfer and appointment to a job;
 - work performance or interchange arrangements;
 - starting training as an apprentice or trainee; or
 - incorporation of new tasks or responsibilities into a job.
- 7.3 The Public Service Regulation 2008 prescribes persons that are to be exempt from police information checking.

8 Consent required for screening

- 8.1 Employment screening can only occur with written consent of the person to be screened.
- 8.2 Written consent to screening may be sought at any time during the selection process but may only be conducted on the recommended person.

- 8.3 Written consent to screening must be sought from current employees engaged in child-related duties at least every 2 years.

9 Refusal to consent

- 9.1 If the person from whom consent to screening is requested does not provide both written consent and acceptable documents which support proof of identity within 7 days from the request and without a reasonable explanation, the person will be deemed to have refused consent.
- 9.2 Where a person refuses consent, the chief executive is not required to consider or further consider that person for engagement to perform the relevant or child-related duties which required screening.
- 9.3 Where the person who refuses or withdraws consent is a current employee, the chief executive must ensure the person does not perform the duties which required screening. This may require the chief executive to relocate/transfer the employee to another job at their equivalent (substantive) classification level where employment screening is not required.

10 Proof of identity

- 10.1 The chief executive may only accept the following documents as proof of a person's identity for the purposes of a screening process:

- 2 primary identification documents; or
- 1 primary identification document and 1 secondary identification document; or
- any other document or documents that, in the chief executive's opinion are capable of establishing the person's identity;

provided that the document or documents show between them the person's full name, date of birth and signature.

- 10.2 Where the name shown on the documents differs from the person's current name, the person must provide the chief executive with sufficient evidence of their change of name.
- 10.3 Primary identification documents are: birth certificate, citizenship certificate, current Australia or overseas passport, current Department of Immigration and Citizenship travel document, current driver's licence, or current proof of age card.
- 10.4 Secondary identification documents are: current identification card issued by the Commonwealth or a State as evidence of the person's entitlement to a financial benefit (e.g. Medicare card, pensioner concession card), financial institution cards or statements, student identification cards issued by an Australian educational institutional or recent notice of assessment issued under the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth)*.

11 Employee's duty to disclose

- 11.1 A current employee must notify any charges and convictions for indictable offences in accordance with section 181 of the Public Service Act 2008. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action.
- 11.2 Penalties under section 171 of the Public Service Act 2008 may also apply to any person that gives a chief executive information that the person knows is false or misleading.

12 Request to Queensland Police Service

- 12.1 A request for a criminal history or police information check to be conducted on a person for the purposes of screening must be sent to the Police Information Centre, Queensland Police Service.

13 Natural justice

- 13.1 The principles of natural justice must be followed before a chief executive decides against a person's suitability to perform relevant or child-related duties on the basis of employment screening information.
- 13.2 The person must be given:
- a copy of all information used to inform the decision; and
 - a reasonable opportunity to make written representations as to why they believe the information obtained through the employment screening process should not render them unsuitable to perform the relevant or child-related duties.

14 Appeals

- 14.1 A decision not to engage a current employee to perform either child-related or relevant duties because of an employment screening process may be subject to a fair treatment appeal to the Public Service Commission chief executive⁵.
- 14.2 A decision by the police commissioner that information about a person is investigative information may be subject to an appeal by a candidate or current employee proposed to be engaged or engaged in child-related duties. In this case, an appeal:
- may be lodged with the Magistrates Court; and
 - must be lodged within 14 days after the person is notified of the decision and that the information has been given to the chief executive who requested the screening.

15 Management of employment screening information

- 15.1 Employment screening information must not be disclosed to anyone except for the purpose of assessing the suitability of the person for particular duties.
- 15.2 Employment screening information must be managed in accordance with Information Standard No 42 or 42A – Information Privacy, whichever is applicable⁶.
- 15.3 Employment screening information held by an employing entity must be destroyed after judicial review and fair treatment appeal time frames have expired following:
- a decision about a person's suitability; or
 - the completion of a recruitment process; or
 - the completion of employment screening for a current employee.
- 15.4 Employment screening information about a candidate or current employee includes, for example:
- the consent form;
 - any correspondence to or from the screening entity or the employing entity;
 - correspondence to and from the person regarding the employment screening process; or
 - the reason for finding the person unsuitable to perform relevant or child-related duties as a result of employment screening.

16 Costs associated with employment screening

- 16.1 An employing entity which undertakes an employment screening process must meet the costs associated with the screening process.

- 16.2 These costs may include charges by the Queensland Police Service for criminal history or police information checks and costs arising from an arrangement pursuant to section 165 of the Public Service Act 2008.

17 Other screening requirements

- 17.1 Employing entities are to comply with other screening requirements (e.g. security clearances and/or other background checking) under Commonwealth or State legislation which are not covered by this directive or the Public Service Act 2008. Contact the Security and Planning Coordination area of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet for further information on security clearances for Queensland Public Service employees.
- 17.2 Employing entities may also have authority under legislation other than the Public Service Act 2008 to conduct screening of candidates or current employees eligible for child-related duties. These employing entities are to conduct such screening to the full extent provided for in their legislation. This applies to the extent that the legislative authority is commensurate with the level of screening conducted under

Part 6 of the Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian Act 2000 (the CCYPCG Act).

18 Duplication of screening

- 18.1 If there has previously been an employment screening process (other than screening under this directive) conducted on a current or intending employee, including a professional registration process, the employing entity may, before initiating further screening, consider:
- the scope of previous screening, including whether further screening will provide additional, relevant information for the purposes of determining the person's suitability;
 - the purpose for which the previous screening process was undertaken; and
 - the time elapsed since the previous screening process and any monitoring that has been in place.

Provisions specific to employment screening for relevant duties

19 Criminal history checking for relevant duties

- 19.1 A decision by a chief executive to conduct criminal history checking on a person must be based on the nature of the relevant duties to be performed. The following circumstances may also be considered:
- whether screening has been conducted under other legislation dealing with criminal history;
 - the perception of public and client confidence in the performance of relevant duties and in the department; and
 - the occupational values, code of behaviour and client service required by the performance of relevant duties.

20 Assessment of suitability

- 20.1 In assessing a person's suitability to perform relevant duties and upon receipt of criminal history information, the chief executive must have regard to the relevance of any offence to the nature of relevant duties to be performed, and should have regard to:
- the seriousness and frequency of any relevant offence;
 - the amount of time that has elapsed since any relevant offence happened;
 - whether any relevant offence is still a crime; and

- any relevant work history of the person in the Queensland public service.
- 20.2 If, in the circumstances in section 20.1, a current employee is unsuitable to perform relevant duties as a result of criminal history information, the employee is to be placed in another job at their equivalent (substantive) classification level.

Provisions specific to employment screening for child-related duties

21 Police information checking for child-related duties

- 21.1. If a chief executive decides that certain duties are child-related duties, the chief executive is to:
- seek written consent from the person to police information checking; and
 - upon receipt of written consent, conduct the police information checking.
- 21.2 A person must not be engaged in child-related duties unless police information checking has been conducted by the employing entity within the previous 2 years and the entity's chief executive has no indication that the information has changed.

22 Matters that a chief executive may have regard to when deciding that certain duties are child-related

- 22.1 In deciding whether the job is likely to provide dedicated services or activities where child/children is/are the primary or significant client group, the chief executive may have regard to the frequency of contact with children that the job involves.
- 22.2 In deciding whether the nature of contact with a child or children, and the context in which that contact happens, creates an unacceptable level of risk, the chief executive should consider factors such as the level and degree of supervision (e.g. is a child likely to be alone with the person, whether the person is in a position of trust or authority, if the child is particularly vulnerable) and the frequency of the contact.

23 Assessment of suitability

- 23.1 Assessment of a person's suitability is in respect of police information checking only and does not imply that the person will be appointed to the job. A suitable person may not be appointed to the job due to supervening reasons including, but not limited to, an adverse referee report or misrepresentation of the person's experience to work with children.
- 23.2 In assessing a person's suitability to perform child-related duties, the safety and wellbeing of children must be paramount.
- 23.3 The chief executive must consider the police information obtained through the screening process as part of assessing a person's suitability to perform child-related duties.
- 23.4 Without exception, a person is suitable where there is no police information about the person⁷ and is unsuitable if they are a relevant disqualified person⁸ other than because of a temporary offender prohibition order.
- 23.5 Save for exceptional cases, a person is suitable where:

- There is no conviction against the person but there is investigative information about the person; and/or there is a current charge for an offence (other than a disqualifying offence); and/or a charge for a disqualifying offence⁹ that has been dealt with; or
 - There is a conviction for an offence other than a serious offence¹⁰.
- 23.6 Save for exceptional cases, a person must be considered unsuitable where there is a conviction for a serious offence¹¹ against the person; or the person is subject to a temporary offender prohibition order or has at any time been a relevant disqualified person.
- 23.7 In deciding that an exceptional case should render a person suitable or unsuitable the chief executive must consider:
- In relation to the commission or alleged commission of an offence:
 - whether it is a conviction or a charge;
 - whether the offence is a serious and disqualifying offence;
 - when the offence was committed or is alleged to have been committed;
 - the nature of the offence;
 - if a conviction, the penalty imposed by the court and, where no imprisonment or disqualification order was made, the court's reasons for its decision; and
 - any other matters relevant to the person's suitability to perform child-related duties.
 - In relation to investigative information:
 - (i) when the acts or omissions constituting the alleged offence to which the investigative information relates were committed; and
 - (ii) any other matters relevant to the person's suitability to perform child-related duties.
- 23.8 If, in the circumstances outlined above, a current employee is unsuitable to perform child-related duties as a result of police information checking, the employee is to be placed in another job at their equivalent (substantive) classification level.

24 Changes in police information

- 24.1 If a chief executive is advised of a change to a person's police information, a further assessment of a person's suitability to perform child-related duties must be undertaken.
- 24.2 If the change to a person's police information is due to a charge for a serious child-related sexual offence¹², disqualifying offence¹³ or the person becomes subject to a temporary offender prohibition order¹⁴, a chief executive must immediately suspend the person from child-related duties¹⁵.
- 24.3 If the change to a person's police information results in a person becoming a 'relevant disqualified person'¹⁶, a chief executive must immediately removed the person from child-related duties and place them in another job that does not involve child-related duties at their equivalent (substantive) classification level.

Risk management strategies for child-related and child-associated duties**25 Risk management strategies**

- 25.1 Employing entities to which this directive applies are required to implement risk management strategies covering child-related and child-associated employment, as set out in Schedule A. This applies only to the extent that entities are not otherwise legislatively required to implement a risk management strategy under the *Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian Act 2000*.
- 25.2 The chief executive must ensure the agency has a risk management strategy in operation within 12 months of the commencement of this directive.

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*Constitution of Queensland 2001***ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 2) 2008****TABLE OF PROVISIONS**

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Short Title

1. This order in council may be cited as the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2008*.

Administrative Arrangements

2. (1) The public business of the State is distributed among Ministers as set out in the Schedule.

(2) Each Minister is to administer the matters set out in the Schedule next to the Minister's title as follows:

- (a) the matters connected with the public business of the State listed under the heading '*Principal Ministerial Responsibilities*';
- (b) the legislation listed under the heading '*Acts Administered*'; and
- (c) the administrative units listed under the heading '*Administrative Units*'.

(3) Information in the Schedule under the heading '*Responsible Heads*' is included for information only and does not form part of this order.

Repeal of earlier Administrative Arrangements

3. The Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2008 is repealed.

Commencement

4. Changes to the Administrative Arrangements due to changes to the *Child Care Act 2002*, the *Community Services Act 2007* and to the *Principal Ministerial Responsibilities* for the Minister for Education and Training and Minister for the Arts and Minister for Communities, Minister for Disability Services, Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships, Minister for Multicultural Affairs, Seniors and Youth take effect from 1 January 2009.

Pursuant to section 9A of the *Queensland Building Services Authority Act 1991*, the amendments made by the Queensland Building Services Board to the *Financial Requirements for Licensing Policy* are hereby published by way of this notice.

Amendments of section 1.3

Omit the definition of 'Applicant' and *insert* -

“**Applicant** – means an applicant for a contractor's licence issued under the *Queensland Building Services Authority Act 1991*.”

Omit the definition of 'Licensee' and *insert* -

“**Licensee** – means the holder of a contractor's licence issued under the *Queensland Building Services Authority Act 1991*.”

Amendment of section 9.1

Omit sections 9.1 (including sections 9.1.1 and 9.1.2) and *insert* –

“9.1 Licence classes requiring professional indemnity insurance

Applicants for and Licensees who hold a class of licence specified in Table M must hold professional indemnity insurance, in addition to satisfying any other requirements in this policy.

The policy conditions for the required professional indemnity insurance must have a minimum limit of indemnity for any one claim and the sum of all claims during any one period of insurance of not less than the limits specified in Table M.

- (b) Professional indemnity insurance that specifies a limit of indemnity for any one claim and the sum of all claims during any one period of insurance of not less than \$5 million.”

“ 12.3 Continuing classes of fire protection licence

To remove doubt, this policy applies to the holder of a continuing class of licence referred to in section 50 of the *Queensland Building Services Authority Regulation 2003*.”

**SCHEDULE 7
State Development and Public Works
Organisation Act 1971
Rights and Obligations Under Easement**

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

“**Burdened Land**” means the land over which the Easement is taken.

“**Coordinator-General**” means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General’s rights under the Easement, and, where applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

“**Easement**” means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

“**Easement Area**” means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is obtained.

“**Infrastructure**” means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced.

“**Landowner**” means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

“**Project**” means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

(a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of

those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and

- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement may be registered as a public utility easement.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);

(g) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and

(h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:

- (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
- (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
- (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;

- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area; and
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area.

2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) maintain and repair, and not change, any existing improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area (other than the Infrastructure);
- (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with

anything that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;

- (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time, but if any nuisance is caused, then promptly abate such nuisance;
- (i) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

4 OTHER MATTERS

4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General may either repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard reasonably equivalent to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;

- (b) the owner of the fencing that was pulled down or broken open will become the owner of the repaired fencing or gate; and
- (c) that owner must maintain the repaired fencing or gate.

6 **COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT**

SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to clause 7(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 7(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

INDEMNITY FOR LANDOWNER

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss ("Claims") arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; and
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement;

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (c) caused; or
- (d) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution),
- by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.

"**Infrastructure**" means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced.

"**Landowner**" means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

"**Project**" means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

- 1.5 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area provided the same is directly relating to the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement and is removed as soon as practicable; and

- (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use

the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area; and
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area.

2.4 If a party breaches the Easement, the other (non-defaulting) party may, subject to this clause or except in the case of an emergency, do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Prior to correcting the breach, the non-defaulting party must provide written notice of the breach to the other party and afford the other party a reasonable time (at least 14 days) to rectify the breach. If the other party does not take reasonable steps to rectify the breach within the time specified in the written notice the non-defaulting party may then do anything reasonably necessary to correct the breach. Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the non-defaulting party incurring any liability to the party in breach.

3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

Subject to clause 6, the Landowner must,:

- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;

- (i) use the Landowner's reasonable endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

4 OTHER MATTERS

4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

4.5 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any

proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area, on the basis that the Coordinator-General bears the Landholder's reasonable out of pocket expenses in providing assistance to the Coordinator-General under this clause 4.6 subject to the Landholder producing valid tax invoices to the Coordinator-General.

6 COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT

- (a) Subject to clause 6(b), the Coordinator-General may conditionally or unconditionally give or withhold any consent to be given under the Easement and is not obliged to give reasons for doing so.
- (b) The Coordinator-General will not unreasonably refuse or withhold its consent to the Landowner:
- (i) maintaining any existing road across the Easement Area; and
 - (ii) subject to clause 6(c), erecting or causing to be erected structures (including signage), services (including electricity, telecommunications, gas, water or sewerage, all where possible crossing the Licence Area on the most reasonable direct route), and fences (including an acoustic fence) on or through the Licence Area subject to the following conditions:
 - i. written details of the design of the proposed works are submitted to the Coordinator-General for approval by the Coordinator-General prior to the Landowner starting any construction. Services must proceed across the Licence Area as directly as possible and will not be permitted to run along the Licence Area;
 - ii. construction must not start until the Coordinator-General advises the Landholder in writing that the proposed works are approved. Approval will not be unreasonably withheld or unreasonably delayed; and
 - iii. approval by the Coordinator-General may be subject to reasonable conditions. The construction of the proposed works will be undertaken in accordance with those conditions; and

(iii) subject to clause 6(c), erecting and maintaining any fence across the Easement Area if:

- (A) each fence includes a lockable gate in a location agreed with the Coordinator-General; and
- (B) the Landowner supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to the Coordinator-General.

(c) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the Landowner are, in the Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security or operation of, or interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict the Coordinator-General's access or other rights under the Easement along or across the Easement Area.

7 SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to clause 7(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 7(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

8 INDEMNITY FOR LANDOWNER

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss (“Claims”) arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; and
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement;

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (c) caused; or
- (d) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution),

by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.

SCHEDULE 9

State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971

Rights and Obligations Under Easement

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

“**Burdened Land**” means the land over which the Easement is taken.

“**Business Day**” means a day other than Saturday, Sunday or a public holiday in Brisbane.

“**Coordinator-General**” means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General’s rights under the Easement, and, where applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

“**Development Works**” means any material change to the Electricity Works on the Easement Area, including a material increase in the Electricity Works or a change of use of the Easement Area.

“**Easement**” means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

“**Easement Area**” means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is taken.

“**Electricity Works**” means such works, apparatus, structures and things as the Landowner may in its absolute discretion consider appropriate as a means of conveying or transmitting electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms, including conductors, cables, towers, aerials, poles, foundations, ground anchorages, supports and other associated or appurtenant works existing on the Easement Area at the date of the Easement and any Development Works undertaken in accordance with clause 3.3.

“**Infrastructure**” means a pipeline to transport substances (including water) and associated infrastructure necessary to operate the pipeline.

“**Landowner**” means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

1.8 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.9 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.10 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Attachment A and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement may be registered as a public utility easement.

1.11 Clauses 2.3(e), 2.4, 2.5, 2.6, 2.7, 2.8, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4 and 3.5 apply to the Burdened Land for so long as the Burdened Land, or any part of the Burdened Land, continues to be used or materially used for Electricity Works by the Landowner.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 Subject to clauses 2.4, 2.5 and 2.6, the Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, and alter the Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time, provided any replacement or alteration does not materially increase the impact of the Infrastructure on the Burdened Land;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;

- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under paragraph (a);
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) in the case of an emergency, or where it is otherwise unavoidable, pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it; and
- (g) do on the Easement Area anything which is necessary to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement.
- 2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.
- 2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:
- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area;
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area; and
- (e) not interfere with, damage or intentionally and materially place at risk the Electricity Works or plant, equipment, tools or material of the Landowner on or near the Easement Area.
- 2.4 Without limiting clause 2.3, the Coordinator-General must not exercise its rights under clause 2.1 without giving the Landowner not less than 48 hours prior notice, except in the case of emergency, in which case the Coordinator-General must provide notice as soon as is practicable having regard to the nature of the emergency;
- 2.5 Without limiting clauses 2.3 or 2.4, the Coordinator-General must not exercise its rights under:
- (a) clause 2.1(a) insofar as it relates to installing, replacing, or altering any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area;
- (b) clause 2.1(c);
- (c) clause 2.1(d) if breaking open the soil of the Easement Area would in any way reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the Electricity Works; and
- (d) clause 2.1(g) to the extent that those activities relate to the right referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) above,
- until the Coordinator-General receives a notice from the Landowner in accordance with clause 2.6(c)(1) or clause 2.6(c)(2).
- 2.6 Prior to the Coordinator-General exercising its rights referred to in clause 2.5:
- (a) the Coordinator-General must submit to the Landowner full plans of the proposed works, including plans showing the proximity of the Infrastructure or any work to be undertaken to any Electricity Works ("Work Plans");
- (b) as soon as reasonably practicable, but in any event within ten (10) Business Days of receipt of the submission of the Work Plans, the Landowner must acknowledge receipt of the submission and indicate whether any further information is required to consider the Work Plans in accordance with paragraph (a); and
- (c) as soon as reasonably practicable after receipt of a submission under paragraph (a) (or if a request for additional information is made under paragraph (b), after receipt of additional information under paragraph (b)), the Landowner must assess, acting reasonably, the Work Plans and advise the Coordinator-General in writing whether:

- (1) it approves the works in accordance with the Work Plans;
- (2) it does not object to the works in accordance with the Work Plans, including providing details of any departures of the Work Plans from the Landowner's requirements; or
- (3) the Work Plans do not comply with the Landowner's requirements, including providing full details of any departures or inconsistencies of the Work Plans from the Landowner's requirements.
- 2.7 If the Landowner advises the Coordinator-General that it does not object in accordance with clause 2.6(c)(2), the Coordinator-General will:
- (a) to the extent that it would otherwise be in breach of an obligation under this Easement as a result of undertaking the works in accordance with the Work Plan, not be in breach of that obligation;
- (b) undertake the work in accordance with the relevant Work Plan at its own risk; and
- (c) indemnify the Landowner from and against any actions, demands, losses, injuries, suits, judgements, injunctions, orders, decrees, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss, arising as a result of the work in accordance with the relevant Work Plan ("Claim"), but only to the extent that the Claim:
- (1) arises as a result of a departure of the relevant Work Plan from the Landowner's notified requirements; and
- (2) is not otherwise caused or contributed to by the acts or omissions of the Landowner, its agents or contractors.
- (d) To avoid any doubt, the indemnity set out in clause 2.7(c) is in addition to the Landholder's other rights at law and under statute. The indemnity does not operate to exclude any liability the Coordinator-General may otherwise have at law or under statute.
- 2.8 If the Landowner advises the Coordinator-General that the Work Plans do not comply with its requirements under clause 2.6(c)(2) or clause 2.6(c)(3), the Coordinator-General may re-submit amended Plans for further consideration by the Landowner and the provisions of clause 2.6 will apply to those amended Work Plans.
- 2.9 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.
- ### 3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER
- 3.1 The Landowner must:
- (a) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (b) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (c) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (d) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.
- 3.2 Prior to the Landowner undertaking any Development Works, the Landowner must:
- (a) give the Coordinator-General reasonable prior written notice of the Development Works;
- (b) comply with any reasonable requests of the Coordinator-General in relation to the conduct of any Development Works; and
- (c) ensure that the Development Works do not damage or materially impact the Infrastructure, its operation or the Coordinator General's ability to exercise its rights under this Easement.
- 3.3 Without limiting clause 3.2, the Landowner may request the Coordinator-General to relocate the Infrastructure in order to accommodate the Landowner's proposed Development Works, at the Landowner's cost.
- 3.4 The Coordinator-General must consider any request received from the Landowner under clause 3.3 in good faith, having regard to the public interest.
- ### 4 OTHER MATTERS
- #### 4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General must as soon as is reasonably practicable repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open, or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard equivalent (including security) to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;
- (b) prior to the repair, the Coordinator-General must take steps to ensure the security of the Landowners assets on the Burdened Land and to ensure members of the public cannot enter the Burdened Land;
- (c) if a gate is installed a lock must be placed on the gate and the Landowner must be given a key to the lock;
- (d) the owner of the fencing that was pulled down or broken open will become the owner of the repaired fencing or gate; and
- (e) that owner must maintain the repaired fencing or gate.

4.3 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

4.4 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner is to use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

4.5 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the

Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

5 NOTICE

5.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

5.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

SCHEDULE 10

Rights and Obligations Under Easement*

1 INTERPRETATION

“**Easement**” means the easement proposed to be taken by the Coordinator-General pursuant to the Notice of Intention to Resume including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

“**Easement Area**” means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is to be obtained (and which is substantially identified in Schedule 3 of the Notice of Intention to Resume).

“**Infrastructure**” means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced.

“**Landowner**” means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

“**Project**” means the Northern Pipeline Interconnector as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

1.12 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

(e) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and

(f) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.13 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.14 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement may be registered as a public utility easement.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

(a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;

(b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;

(c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;

(d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;

(e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do

- any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
 - (g) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
 - (h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
 - (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
 - (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
 - (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from

time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area; and
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area.

2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) maintain and repair, and not change, any existing improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area (other than the Infrastructure);
- (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or

adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;

- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time, but if any nuisance is caused, then promptly abate such nuisance;
- (i) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

4 OTHER MATTERS

4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General may either repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard reasonably equivalent to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;
- (b) the owner of the fencing that was pulled down or broken open will become the owner of the repaired fencing or gate; and
- (c) that owner must maintain the repaired fencing or gate.

4.3 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

4.4 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner is to use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

4.6 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

5 NOTICE

5.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and

may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

6 COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT

- (a) Subject to clause 6(b), the Coordinator-General may conditionally or unconditionally give or withhold any consent to be given under the Easement and is not obliged to give reasons for doing so.
- (b) The Coordinator-General will not unreasonably refuse or withhold its consent to the Landowner:
 - (i) maintaining any existing road across the Easement Area; and
 - (ii) subject to clause 6(c), erecting and maintaining any fence across the Easement Area if:
 - (A) each fence includes a lockable gate in a location agreed with the

Coordinator-General;
and

- (B) the Landowner supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to the Coordinator-General.

- (c) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the Landowner are, in the Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security or operation of, or interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict the Coordinator-General's access or other rights under the Easement along or across the Easement Area.

7 SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to clause 7(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 7(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

8 INDEMNITY FOR LANDOWNER

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss ("Claims") arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; and
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement;

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (c) caused; or
- (d) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution),

by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.
