NOTIFICATION OF MAKING AN AMENDMENT TO THE SOUTH EAST QUEENSLAND KOALA CONSERVATION STATE PLANNING REGULATORY PROVISIONS

I, the Honourable Dr Steven Miles MP, Minister for Environment and Heritage Protection and Minister for National Parks and the Great Barrier Reef and I, the Honourable Jackie Trad MP Deputy Premier, Minister for Transport, Minister for Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister for Trade, hereby notify under sections 60 and 70 of the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009* (SPA) that the Draft South East Queensland Koala Conservation Amendment State Planning Regulatory Provisions (draft SPRP amendment) has been released for public consultation.

In accordance with section 73 of SPA, I the Honourable Jackie Trad MP Deputy Premier, Minister for Transport, Minister for Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister for Trade, notify under SPA that the draft SPRP amendment has effect as if it were a State Planning Regulatory Provision on the date of this gazettal notice (26 June 2015).

Consultation on the draft amendment SPRP is open from 1 July 2015 to 17 August 2015.

Effect of draft SPRP amendment

This draft SPRP amendment will have the effect of maintaining the environmental offset requirements of the *Environmental Offsets Transitional Regulation 2014* which expire on 1 July 2015. The draft amendment will maintain the current koala offset provisions by referencing the *Queensland Environmental Offset Policy*.

NOTIFICATION OF DECLARATION OF A TRANSPORT NOISE CORRIDOR

Notice is hereby given under section 246Z (1) of the *Building Act 1975* that the area adjacent to railways as described in the Schedule is declared as a Transport Noise Corridor.

THE SCHEDULE

That on and from 8 July 2015, land adjacent to the railways as per the Rail Network of Queensland is designated as a Transport Noise Corridor consistent with section 246Z of the *Building Act 1975* and for the purposes of implementing the relevant building legislation applicable to Transport Noise Corridors.

The land designated as a Transport Noise Corridor comprises land within a corridor up to 100 metres on both sides of the railways listed in the table below. The corridor is measured from the boundary of the railway with adjacent land and then continuing the distance of up to 100 metres, depending on the noise contours mapped as a result of rail traffic noise.

The declaration is for the purposes of implementing the relevant building legislation relating to mitigating rail traffic noise impacting on residential buildings located within Transport Noise Corridors. The declaration supersedes previous notices declaring Transport Noise Corridors for the rail network.

As per section 246Z (3)(b) of the *Building Act 1975*, documents identifying land within Transport Noise Corridors are in the register held by the Director-General of the Department of Transport and Main Roads and available for inspection at the Department of Transport and Main Roads' office located at 313 Adelaide Street, Brisbane, or alternatively on the Department of Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning State Planning Policy Interactive Mapping System – Transport Noise Corridors (NAPMAP) for the purposes of implementing the Transport Noise Code.

and maintain on, over, through or under the land described in Schedule 2 (which land is hereinafter called "the said land") an underground drain or drains or pipe or pipes for the passage or conveyance of rain water together with all associated drainage and stormwater run off and all manholes, manhole chambers, inlets, equipment and fittings in connection therewith or for the accommodation of any adjoining or neighbouring property or properties or otherwise in the execution of the said Council's drainage powers and for the purposes aforesaid and for the purpose of obtaining free and uninterrupted access to the said drain or drains, pipe or pipes, manholes, manhole chambers, inlets, equipment and fittings from the surface of the said land and for the purposes of changing the size and number of, operating, inspecting, patrolling, altering, removing, replacing, reconstructing and/or repairing the said drain or drains, pipe or pipes, manholes, manhole chambers, inlets, equipment and fittings as aforesaid, full free and uninterrupted right and liberty at all times by day and by night and from time to time to enter upon and to go, pass and repossess over, along and under the said land or any part or parts thereof with or without engineers, surveyors, servants, agents, licensees, contractors, subcontractors, workmen and others authorised by the said Council together with all vehicles, equipment, machinery, tools and materials considered necessary by the said Council, and to dig into, sink shafts in, erect scaffolding upon and to open and break up the soil of the said land or any part or parts thereof as well the sub-surface as the surface thereof and to bring and place in and upon the said land or any part or parts thereof and remove such vehicles, equipment, machinery, tools and materials and to do such other incidental works and things in the said land as the said Council shall in its discretion think fit and also the full and free right at all times and from time to time to the uninterrupted flow of rain water and associated drainage and stormwater run off flowing in concentration either intermittently or occasionally (all of which is hereinafter called "stormwater drainage") over and along the surface of the said land without

- (1) any obstruction, interruption, impeding, hampering or interference, diversion, scouring, change or alteration in or to the flow or escape of stormwater drainage or its or their natural outlet (if any) or
- (2) any ponding of waters caused by or consequent upon
 - (a) any use to which the said land may be put or
 - (b) the erection, raising, making, placing or suffering to stand or to remain of any building, fence, wall, structure (whether of the class just mentioned or not) paving or vegetation (except grass which is kept properly mown at all times) or thing whatsoever upon the said land or
 - (c) any alteration in level or gradient of the said land or any change to the surface of the said land or to the natural or artificial features of the said land which contain or direct or assist in containing or directing the flow of stormwater drainage over the said land along and within a defined course

other than as is or are permitted in writing by the said Council or the permanent head for the time being of the relevant Division or Department of the said Council and only on such terms and conditions as the said Council or the said permanent head may impose or stipulate in the event of such permission being granted with power for the said Council and its contractors, agents and servants and others authorised by it (but without prejudice to any other powers or remedies of the said Council)

- (i) to demolish, remove or otherwise dispose of any building, fence, wall, structure (whether of the class just mentioned or not) paving or vegetation (except grass which is kept properly mown at all times) or thing whatsoever at any time on or in the said land in contravention of the foregoing provisions and
- (ii) to perform any works necessary for restoring or

reinstating the said land tenement (including the grass thereon) and the natural or artificial features of or on the said land containing or directing or assisting in the containing or directing the flow of stormwater drainage along and within a defined course or channel over the said land to their former state and condition, and also

- (iii) to alter, grade, pave, prepare, grass, fertilise or mow the surface of the said land or place, install, establish or construct and keep any earthworks and any other works whatsoever (whether of the class just mentioned or not) thereon or therein for the purpose of the exercise of the rights hereinbefore given or incidental thereto or for the purpose of forming the surface of the said land in such a way as to contain or direct the flow of stormwater drainage along and within a defined course or channel or for the purpose of rectifying or alleviating any scouring of the said land due to the flow of stormwater drainage there-over

at the cost of the owner or owners, registered proprietor or registered proprietors or occupier or occupiers from time to time and for the time being of the said land and for the purposes aforesaid and for the purpose of obtaining free and uninterrupted access to the said land and any works or things thereon or therein full free and uninterrupted right and liberty at all times by day and by night to enter upon and to go, pass and repossess over, along and under the said land or any part or parts thereof with or without engineers, surveyors, servants, agents, licensees, contractors, subcontractors, workmen and others authorised by the said Council together with all vehicles, equipment, machinery, tools and materials considered necessary by the said Council and to dig into, sink shafts in, erect scaffolding upon and to open and break up the soil of the said land or any part or parts thereof as well the sub-surface as the surface thereof and to bring and place in and upon the said land or any part or parts thereof and remove such vehicles, equipment, machinery, tools and materials and to do such other incidental works and things in the said land as the said Council shall in its discretion think fit.

To provide a framework for the payment of relocation expenses to certain public service executives.

2. Effective date:

3 July 2015

3. Legislative provisions:

Sections 53(b) of the *Public Service Act 2008* (PSA)

4. Application:

This directive applies to:

- chief executives appointed under s92 of the PSA
- senior executives appointed under s110 of the PSA
- public service officers appointed under s121 of the PSA who are remunerated equivalent to or greater than senior executives.

5. Previous references:

Nil

6. Related information:

Standing Offer Arrangement – Relocation Services (0006-14 PTD)

Directive:**7. Principles**

- 7.1 A high performing public service is best supported by a diverse and highly skilled workforce, drawn from the government and non-government sectors (s25(2)(c) PSA) and from local, state, national and international labour markets.
- 7.2 A relocation package can support the attraction of high calibre employees. Approval of a relocation package is at the discretion of the decision maker.
- 7.3 A relocation package is only available where the employee is appointed to a location other than where they currently reside *and*, in the opinion of the decision maker, it would be unreasonable to require the employee to commute from their residence to the work location.
- 7.4 An approved relocation package must be recorded in writing.

8. Relocation Package Components

- 8.1 A relocation package can include any components the decision maker considers reasonable to facilitate the employee's relocation and timely commencement of duty. This may include (but is not limited to) costs associated with:
 - a) temporary accommodation while ongoing accommodation is sought – maximum value \$800 per week for up to three (3) months

- b) transfers between locations for the employee and their family.
 - i) Where transfers are via air, economy fares are to be provided.
 - ii) Where an employee relocates ahead of their family members, a maximum of three (3) return visits may be included in the relocation package
- c) movement / storage of household belongings (e.g. furniture, cars etc.) (three (3) quotes must be provided unless the Standing Offer Arrangement on Relocation Services is used). Storage costs are limited to a maximum of six (6) months.

8.2 In determining what is reasonable the decision maker should consider:

- a) the duration and classification of the appointment
- b) the employee's family and household situation
- c) the actual costs of the components.

9. Timeframe for approval and claims

- 9.1 A relocation package must be approved prior to the commencement of duty unless otherwise agreed by the decision maker.
- 9.2 Claims for reimbursement on package components must be submitted within 12 months of the cost being incurred.
- 9.3 Claims must be supported by appropriate documentation (as determined by the decision maker).

10. Repayment obligation

- 10.1 This clause applies where an employee ceases duty with the Queensland Public Service in the following circumstances:
 - a) resignation
 - b) termination for disciplinary reasons
 - c) termination of a contract of employment with cause.
- 10.2 Where an employee ceases duty in the circumstances specified above, the employee is required to refund the **relevant proportion** of costs associated with the relocation package.

11. Relationship with other directives

- 11.1 This directive overrides any provision about entitlement to transfer and appointment expenses in the directive relating to senior executive service – employment conditions.

12. Dictionary

Unless otherwise provided, the definitions contained in the PSA apply.

INVITATION FOR OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSAL**

The Brisbane City Council has advised that its electoral wards no longer meet the quota requirements set down in the *City of Brisbane Act 2010*. The Minister responsible for Local Government has in turn referred the matter to the Local Government Change Commission for independent assessment.

The Commission now invites written objections from interested persons and bodies' relating to the council's proposed electoral wards, to be lodged **on or before 5.00pm Monday 3 August 2015**.

For this phase of the review, the enrolment for Brisbane City Council as at 23 February 2015 is being used. The total enrolment was 715,338. The Commission has determined that 27,513 is the reasonable proportion of electors for an electoral ward. Section 17 of the Act requires the Commission to ensure that the number of enrolled electors in all wards does not differ from this reasonable proportion by $\pm 10\%$. In order to meet the enrolment criteria set out in the Act the number of electors in each division must be within minimum 24,762 and maximum of 30,264. Further, the Act requires that the reasonable proportion of electors must be worked out as near as practicable to the time when the change is to happen to ensure demographic representation for each ward of Brisbane. Projected data for March 2016 and September 2018 has been used to assist with this requirement.
