The reason for the declaration is to achieve a high level of access control to:

- ensure that the required arterial road functionality of these major road transport assets is achieved and preserved, and
- maximise the traffic carrying and safety characteristics that are required for the roads.

Any person whose interests are affected by the declaration may—

- (i) under section 485 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* — ask for the decision to be reviewed and appeal against the reviewed decision; and
- (ii) under the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994*, part 5 — ask for the decision or the reviewed decision to be stayed.

Notice is hereby given that there is a policy in place in relation to the application of section 62 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* to access between the franchised roads described in The Schedule and adjacent land. This policy is outlined below.

ACCESS MANAGEMENT POLICY FOR LOGAN MOTORWAY (Gales - Loganholme), GATEWAY EXTENSION MOTORWAY (Drewvale - Eight Mile Plains), and GATEWAY MOTORWAY (Eight Mile Plains - Nudgee)

1. Objective

To ensure that the abovementioned QML franchised roads can provide the required traffic speed, traffic flow capacity and level of safety.

2. Access Management

Access will be managed in accordance with the following plans and principles:

Limitation of Access and Motorway Plan Nos. LA 11957 to LA 11972 (inclusive) define:

- the area to which access is limited (i.e. the subject area);
- the location of all approved points of access between the subject area and adjacent areas of land (including roads); and
- the future management strategy which will be applied to the subject area.

No access is permitted between the abovementioned QML franchised roads and the adjacent land (or roads) other than as defined above on the relevant Limitation of Access and Motorway Plans.

3. Access Management Strategy

Property Access:

There are no existing property access points to the subject area shown on Plans LA 11957 to LA 11972 (inclusive).

It is not anticipated that any new property access points to the subject area will be permitted on the initiative of Queensland Motorways Limited.

Roadway Access:

The Plans referred to in this policy depict existing roadway access to the subject area in its current location and form. Queensland Motorways Limited expects that future upgrades to the abovementioned QML franchised roads will result in changes to the existing access conditions at several locations.

4. Approval of Policy

This policy shall:

- apply to the sections of franchised roads (or land) defined by Limitation of Access and Motorway Plans referred to in this policy;
- be utilised when applying section 62 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*; and
- supersede any previous Access Limitation applied to these sections of roads.

- (i) the amendment merely changes or repeals specific provision for 1 or more particular properties; and
- (ii) the owner or occupier of each property has been given written notice of the amendment;

Any person whose interests are affected by this policy may—

- (i) under section 485 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*—
ask for the decision to be reviewed and appeal against the reviewed decision; and
- (ii) under the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994*, part 5—
ask for the decision or the reviewed decision to be stayed.

Under section 62G of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*, a person must not construct or change a physical means of entry or exit for traffic between land and a limited access road without first obtaining a decision under section 62(1) that authorises the construction or change. Maximum penalty - 200 penalty units.

This limited access road declaration on Logan Motorway, Gateway Extension Motorway and Gateway Motorway supersedes previous limited access road declaration as notified in Queensland Government Gazette No. 25, pages 327-329, on 30 September 2005.

Commissions of Inquiry Act 1950

COMMISSIONS OF INQUIRY ORDER (NO. 2) 2015**Short Title**

1. This Order in Council may be cited as the *Commissions of Inquiry Order (No. 2) 2015*.

Commencement

2. This Order in Council commences on 10 April 2015.

Appointment of Commission

3. UNDER the provisions of the *Commissions of Inquiry Act 1950* the Governor in Council hereby appoints Mr Alan MacSporran QC, from 10 April 2015, to make full and careful inquiry in an open and independent manner in relation to the Queensland Greyhound Racing Industry with respect to:
 - (a) the effectiveness of the current regulatory framework of the Queensland Greyhound Racing Industry in detecting, assessing, mitigating and prosecuting all breaches of the *Racing Act 2002*, or any other relevant act;
 - (b) the regulatory arrangements for the protection of animal welfare of racing dogs and other animals, including the extent of live-baiting practices in Queensland;
 - (c) the suitability of the current regime of monitoring, regulation and integrity, including of statutory (including licensed clubs) and departmental bodies, in the management and oversight of the industry meeting all racing and legal obligations;
 - (d) the Queensland Greyhound Racing Industry's need to maintain a social licence with the community;
 - (e) any other aspect of the Queensland Greyhound Racing Industry (including registered trainers operating from unlicensed premises) or its regulations that the Commissioner considers necessary.

Commission to report

4. AND directs that the Commissioner deliver an interim report to the Honourable the Minister for Sport and Racing on 10 April 2015 and that the Commissioner make full and faithful report and recommendations on the aforesaid subject matter of inquiry, and transmit the same to the Honourable the Premier by 1 June 2015.

Commission to make recommendations

5. IN making recommendations the Commissioner should consider the need to promote integrity and public confidence into the Queensland Greyhound Racing Industry and any recommended changes that need to be made to existing laws or regulations to ensure that the Queensland Greyhound Racing Industry is compliant with all racing, animal welfare and legal obligations.

Application of Act

6. THE provisions of the *Commissions of Inquiry Act 1950* shall be applicable for the purposes of this inquiry except for section 19C – Authority to use listening devices.

Conduct of Inquiry

7. THE Commissioner may hold public and private hearings in such a manner and in such locations as may be necessary and convenient.
