The regulatory impact statement outlines a number of options for occupational diving industry sectors.

The proposed regulations aim to address risks associated with occupational diving and relate specifically to:

- Diver competency
- Conducting a risk management process
- Keeping dive safety logs
- Inducting workers (divers) to dive sites
- Diving from vessels underway (i.e. vessels that have their propellers engaged)

The primary objective of the preferred option outlined in the RIS is to prevent and minimise the number of occupational diving deaths, injuries and illnesses associated with occupational diving activities, which include:

- the harvesting of marine creatures (e.g. crayfish, rock lobster)
- the activities of aquaculture
- scientific, research, natural resource management or educational diving
- photographing, filming, videoing or sound recording for the entertainment or publishing industry
- other diving work of a light industrial nature
- retrieval objects, such as golf balls.

2. Notice is hereby given that I have decided the threshold amounts for the purposes of section 546 of the *Local Government Act 1993* for the 2003-2004 financial year are as follows-

- (a) for New Type 1 Activities-
 - (i) for water and sewerage combined activities-\$33,300,000; and
 - (ii) for other activities-\$20,000,000;
- (b) for New Type 2 Activities-
 - (i) for water and sewerage combined activities-\$10,000,000; and
 - (ii) for other activities-\$6,700,000.

In accordance with section 547 of the *Local Government Act 1993*, a local government, in deciding whether an activity should be a new type 1 or type 2 business activity for the 2004-2005 financial year, must consider the operating expenditure for the 2003-2004 financial year less any depreciation included therein and any expenditure included therein to achieve competitive neutrality which is not actually incurred by the local government plus any loan redemption payments in that year.

TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE (No 18) 2004

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No 18) 2004*.

Easement taken [s.15 of the Act]

2. The Easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Ipswich City Council for sewerage purposes and vests in Ipswich City Council on and from 9 July 2004.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

The Ipswich City Council (hereinafter with its successors referred to as 'the Council') shall have the full and free right and liberty for the Council to use the easement described in the Schedule hereto (which easement is hereinafter referred to as 'the said easement') for the passage or conveyance of sewage and for that purpose at all times and from time to time through or under the said easement to have, construct and thereafter forever to use and maintain an underground main or pipe or mains or pipes for the passage or conveyance of sewage through or under the said easement and all equipment and fittings in connection therewith and appurtenant thereto (including surface manholes, vents, marker posts and plates) and thereafter at all times to have full free and uninterrupted access to the said underground main or pipe or mains or pipes, equipment and fittings from the surface of the said easement and for the purposes aforesaid and for the purpose of patrolling, inspecting, replacing, cleansing, amending, enlarging, repairing and removing any such underground main or pipe or mains or pipes, equipment and fittings, full free and uninterrupted right and liberty at all times by day and by night in time of emergency and from time to time to enter upon and to go, pass and repass, over along and under the said easement or any part or parts thereof with or without engineers, surveyors, workmen, servants, agents, contractors or any of them and with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description, laden or unladen, and to dig into, sink shafts in, erect scaffolding upon and to open and break up the soil of the said easement or any part or parts thereof as well the subsurface as the surface thereof and to bring and place in and upon the said easement or any part or parts thereof and remove such materials, machinery, equipment, tools and other articles and to do such other incidental works and things in the said easement as the Council and its successors shall in its discretion think fit doing as little damage as may be and being responsible and held liable only for such damage to the Registered Owner for the time being as may be caused or suffered by reason only of the neglect or default of the Council and its agents, servants and employees and the Council agrees as follows.

1. All mains, pipes, equipment and fittings installed in or placed upon the said easement shall remain the property of the Council.
2. It shall be the duty of the Council to reinstate to the satisfaction of the Registered Owner the said easement and all fences, roads and paved surfaces where the same have been damaged by the Council in the exercise and performance of any of its rights and liberties granted herein.
3. For the purpose of gaining access to the servient tenement the Council shall be entitled to pull down or break open any fencing on or adjacent to the servient tenement provided that where livestock are contained within the fenced area sufficient notice shall be given to the Registered Owner to enable the said livestock to be securely held.
4. In lieu of reinstating any fence pulled down in accordance with Clause 3 herein, the Council may install a gate the quality of the materials and workmanship of which except with the Registered Owner's consent shall be not less than the quality of the materials and workmanship in the existing fence. All such gates shall become the property of the Registered Owner of the fence in which the gate is installed and thereafter shall be maintained by the said owner.
5. The Registered Owner will refrain from any action likely to jeopardise or prejudicially affect the safety or reliable working of any pipes, mains, equipment or fittings installed in or placed upon the said easement and that the Registered Owner will at all times refrain from using the said easement in a manner likely to obstruct or unreasonably hinder access thereto by the Council; and without limiting the Registered Owner's responsibility herein it is expressly agreed that the Registered Owner may on the said easement place or erect any building, structure, pavement, road, filling, refuse, drain, fence or plant any tree or excavate any hole, well, bore or tunnel only with the prior consent in writing of the Council. In considering any such proposal for consent, the Council may –
 - (a) consent to the proposal; or
 - (b) refuse to consent to the proposal; or
 - (c) consent to the proposal subject to such conditions as the Council thinks fit.
6. The Council indemnifies and at all times agrees to indemnify the Registered Owner against any claims, demands or actions which may be made or brought against the Registered Owner as a result of

the installation, maintenance and use of the pipes, drains, equipment and fittings aforesaid.

7. The Council agrees to pay all costs associated with the registration of the said easement.

8. At its cost the Registered Owner agrees to maintain the said easement in good order and repair and in a clean and tidy state at all times.

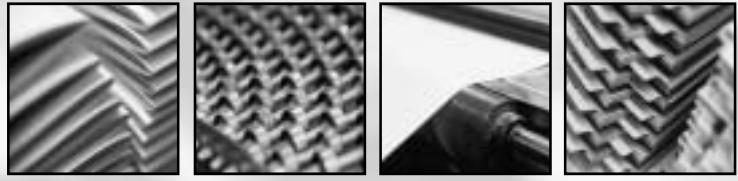
