OBJECTIONS TO PROPOSED ROAD CLOSURE NOTICE (No 37) 2016

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Objections to Proposed Road Closure Notice (No 37) 2016*.

Application for road closure [s.100 of the Act]

2. Applications have been made for the permanent closure of the roads mentioned in the Schedule.

Objections

3.(1) An objection (in writing) to a proposed road closure mentioned in the Schedule may be lodged with the Regional Service Director, Department of Natural Resources and Mines, at the regional office for the region in which the road is situated.

(2) Latest day for lodgement of objections is **3 November 2016**.

(3) Any objections received may be viewed by other parties interested in the proposed road closure under the provisions of the *Right to Information Act 2009*. If you lodge an objection, please include in your objection letter whether you would like to be consulted if this issue becomes the subject of an access request under the *Right to Information Act 2009*.

Plans

4. Inspection of the plans of the proposed road closures may be made at-

- (a) the Department of Natural Resources and Mines Offices at Brisbane and Warwick; and
- (b) the Local Government Offices of Brisbane City, Lockyer Valley Regional and Southern Downs Regional;

for a particular plan in that district or that local government area.

TENDER (PERMIT TO OCCUPY) NOTICE (No 01) 2016 Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Tender (Permit to Occupy) Notice (No 01) 2016*.

Tender [s.112(b) and s.112(c) of the Act]

2.(1) The unallocated State land described in Schedule 2 and the Reserve Land described in Schedule 3 are to be offered for public tender as Permits to Occupy at the reserve cash premium stated against each lot mentioned in Schedule 4.

(2) Tender documents, marked confidential, should be submitted to the Senior Land Officer, State Land Administration Management, and lodged at the office of the Department of Natural Resources and Mines, Landsborough Highway, Longreach, or posted to PO Box 210, Longreach Q 4730.

(3) Tenders can be lodged between the hours of 8:30 am and 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday and tenders will close at 4:30 pm on Monday, 31 October 2016.

(4) The permit is to be granted for grazing purposes.

(5) The rent category of the permits is category 11.2 (grazing and agriculture).

(6) The tender process is subject to the conditions mentioned in Schedule 1.

(7) The Permits to Occupy granted will be subject to the conditions mentioned in Schedule 2 and Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 1

Conditions of tender

1.1 A person under the age of 18 years is not qualified to apply for, acquire, hold or purchase land under any tenure or to apply for, acquire, or hold any permit under the *Land Act 1994*.

1.2 An agent may tender for and on behalf of any person and any tender made by an agent must, for the purposes of the Act, be taken to be made by the person authorising the agent to tender on the person's behalf.

1.3 The minimum number of lots that may be purchased under this notice by a person (whether for a whole or part interest) is 2 lots.

1.4 No deposit will be required to be lodged with each tender document, however it should be stated in the document the amount that the tenderer is prepared to pay as a cash premium, should the

tender be successful. It should also be noted that a GST charge will be applied to the cash premium

1.5 The highest amount submitted will be the successful tender.

1.6 Payment of the first year's rent, cash premium realised and document fee will be requested in the offer to the successful tenderer.

1.7 Tender documents will be treated as confidential and for Departmental use only.

1.8 Prior to the tender documents being considered, the Minister administering the *Land Act 1994* must give each applicant a notice advising whether or not they are to be included in the tender process. If an applicant is excluded from the tender process, the applicant will be given reasons for such decision. An applicant who has been advised they have been excluded from the tender process may appeal against the decision.

1.9 The Minister may withdraw a lot from tender at any time before acceptance of a successful tender.

1.10 Persons considering tendering for a lot are advised to ascertain from the Local Government (Winton Shire Council) that their proposed use and development of the land will conform to the Town-Planning Scheme, By-laws and requirements of the Council.

1.11 All the provisions of the *Land Act 1994* applicable to a tender of a permit to occupy apply. The successful tenderer will be made an offer on the terms stated in the tender Notification and if the offer is refused by the applicant, the land may be otherwise dealt with in any manner prescribed under the *Land Act 1994*.

3. Rent/Instalment: The permittee must pay the annual rent/instalment in accordance with the *Land Act 1994* and the Land Regulation 2009.

4. Noxious plants: The permittee must keep noxious plants on the land under control. If the permittee does not comply with this condition, the Minister may bring the noxious plants under control, the cost of which will be recovered from the permittee.
5. Information to Minister: The permittee must give the Minister administering the *Land Act 1994*, information the Minister asks for about the tenure.
6. Monies for Improvements: No money for improvements is payable by the State on the forfeiture, cancellation, surrender or expiry of this permit but money may be payable if the State receives payment from an incoming permittee or buyer for the improvements on the land. However, the previous permittee may apply to the Minister to remove the improvements that belong to the permittee, within a period of 3 months from the date of the forfeiture, surrender, or expiry of this permit. The permittee may only undertake the removal of the improvements in the presence of an authorised representative of the department, if required by the Minister. The permittee may only remove those improvements if all monies due from the permittee to the department under this permit have been paid.
7. No sublease/disposal/transfer: A permit to occupy cannot be subleased, disposed, transferred or mortgaged.

REGULATORY CONDITIONS:

A regulatory condition relates to a permit, in accordance with the Land Regulation 2009.

1. Indemnity: The permittee indemnifies and agrees to keep indemnified the Minister, and the State of Queensland and its Representatives, (the "Indemnified parties") against

all liability, costs, loss and expenses including claims in negligence (including any claims, proceedings or demands bought by any third party, and any legal fees, costs and disbursements on a solicitor and client basis) ("Claim") arising from or incurred in connection with:

- a. the granting of this permit to the permittee;
- b. the permittee's use and occupation of the land; or
- c. personal injury (including sickness and death) or property damage or loss in connection with the performance (or attempted purported performance or non-performance) of the permit or a breach of the permit by the permittee.

The permittee hereby releases and discharges to the full extent permitted by law, the Indemnified parties from all actions, claims, proceedings or demands and in respect of any loss, death, injury, illness or damage (whether personal or property and whether special, direct, indirect or consequential financial loss) arising out of the use and occupation of the permit.

To the full extent permitted by law, the Minister, the State of Queensland and their Representatives will not be liable to the permittee for any special, indirect or consequential damages, including consequential financial loss arising out of the use and occupation of the permit.

2. Public Liability: The permittee must effect a public liability insurance policy with an insurer authorised under the *Insurance Act 1973* (Commonwealth) or, if not so authorised then only with the Minister's approval, which can be given or withheld in the Minister's sole discretion, naming the permittee as the insured covering legal liability for any loss of, or damage to any property and for the injury (including death) to any person arising out of anything done or omitted on or about the land or any improvements thereon and against all claims, demands, proceedings, costs, charges, and expenses whatsoever (including claims in negligence) Such policy must:
 - a. be for an amount of not less than \$20 million and have no per event sublimit or such higher amounts as the Minister may reasonably require;
 - b. be effected on a "claims occurring" basis; and
 - c. be maintained at all times during the currency of the permit, and upon receipt of any notice of cancellation, the permittee must immediately effect another public insurance policy in accordance with the terms of the permit.

The permittee must, as soon as practicable, inform the Minister, in writing, of the occurrence of any event that the permittee considers is likely to give rise to a claim under the policy of insurance effected and must ensure that the Minister is kept fully informed of subsequent actions and developments concerning the claim.

The permittee must renew such policy, at the permittee's expense, each year during the currency of this permit. The condition will be satisfied if the permittee is the State of Queensland or a statutory authority eligible for cover under the Queensland Government Insurance Fund and is insured and continues to be insured by the Queensland Government Insurance Fund.

This condition will be satisfied if the permittee is the Commonwealth of Australia or a statutory authority eligible for cover under the Comcover Insurance Fund and is insured and continues to be insured by Comcover.

3. Access: The provision of access, further access or services to the land will not be the responsibility of the State.
4. Survey Costs: If the land needs to be surveyed or re-surveyed the permittee must do this at their own cost under the *Survey and Mapping Infrastructure Act 2003*. This survey plan must be lodged in the land registry within the specified time.
5. Jurisdiction: The permittee is subject to the *Land Act 1994* and all other relevant Queensland and Commonwealth legislation.
6. Compliance with Laws: The permittee must comply with all lawful requirements of the –

- a. Local Government; and
- b. any department within the Queensland or Commonwealth governments (including the department administering the *Land Act 1994*), local authority or statutory instrumentality having jurisdiction over the land, or the development, use and occupation of the land, in regard to its use, occupation and development of the land.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

These conditions relate to this permit.

Termination

1. Should it be determined at some future date by any Court that native title exists over the subject land, this permit may be terminated and the permittee may be required to remove any works established under this permit at the permittee's own cost, expense and risk. In that event, no compensation for works, development costs or loss of income shall be payable to the permittee by the State of Queensland.
2. The permit to occupy must be cancelled upon the transfer or disposal of the adjoining land held by the successful Tenderer.

Cancellation/Forfeiture

1. The permit may be cancelled after giving the permittee reasonable notice in writing, in accordance with the *Land Act 1994*.

Improvements or development on or to the land

The permittee must not interfere with any forest products or remove any quarry material (including any stone, gravel, sand, earth, soil, rock, guano or clay which is not a mineral within the meaning of the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*) or other material upon the land without the permission of the Minister administering the *Land Act 1994* except under the authority of and in compliance in every respect with the requirements of a permit, licence, agreement or contract granted or made under the *Forestry Act 1959*.

Other conditions the Minister considers appropriate

sand, earth, soil, rock, guano or clay which is not a mineral within the meaning of the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*) or other material upon the land without the permission of the Minister administering the *Land Act 1994* except under the authority of and in compliance in every respect with the requirements of a permit, licence, agreement or contract granted or made under the *Forestry Act 1959*.

Other conditions the Minister considers appropriate

1. The permittee must, within three (3) months from the commencement of the lease, at the permittees' expense provide, erect and maintain erected notice boards in prominent positions on the road frontages of the leased land or where roads enter such land, stating clearly that the leased land is a Reserve for Camping and Water and that it may be used for that specific purpose.
2. The permittee must manage the leased land in a manner that will not interfere with or restrict the rights of the public in the use of the leased land for the purpose Camping and Water for which it was dedicated.
