	 additional controls on the use of cash and clarifications about how wagers may be paid for; modernising how inspectors obtain information; allowing excluded persons and minors to remain in a casino if required to assist a casino inspector or police officer; and removing redundant references to casino-based keno games.

	The proposal as it relates to the implementation of the recommendations of the External Review was exempted from further impact analysis due to the public interest imperative of implementing the recommended reforms, noting that the reforms align with Government policy through in-principle acceptance of the recommendations, and that the recommendations were arrived at through a public inquiry.
Cabinet exemptions	The proposal as it relates to officer due diligence, access to casino monitoring systems and increased penalties was exempted from further impact analysis due to the public interest imperative, noting the measures are consistent with the findings of the External Review and the intention of Government policy in accepting the External Review recommendations.
	The remaining amendments comprising the proposal are considered to have minor impacts and may otherwise require no further RIA on that basis, but have nevertheless been included in the Cabinet exemption.
