# Town commons records



Research Guide to town commons records at Queensland State Archives

Queensland State Archives (QSA) is the official repository for Queensland Government records selected for permanent retention because of their continuing value. The archived public records are from state government departments, state courts, local government authorities and statutory authorities. The records are in our facility at <a href="Runcorn, Brisbane">Runcorn, Brisbane</a>, and open records are available for viewing in the Reading Room, free-of-charge.

Queensland State Archives holds town commons files from 1866 to 1974.

The main finding aid for records held at QSA is the <u>Queensland State Archives' online catalogue</u> (known as ArchivesSearch).

The following citation abbreviations are used throughout our catalogue:

ITM QSA Item (describes the item)

PR Physical Representation (generally the original or microfilm copy)

DR Digital Representation (for a digital image)

S Series ID (for a series of records)

A Agency ID (for the creating or responsible agency).

#### Historical context

Section 14 of the *Alienation of Crown Lands Act 1860* gave right to unenclosed common lands within any agricultural or other reserve, to purchasers of land within the reserve and to the residents in any adjacent township, to be determined by regulation. The Minister for Lands was responsible for making regulations.

The *Crown Lands Alienation Act 1868* formalised the setting up of town commons. The Governor-in-Council could proclaim unsold land as a town common, if it was requested by a petition signed by not less than 30 resident town freeholders and provided the petition had not generated a counter-petition signed by a greater number of resident freeholders, following a 60-day gazettal notice. The common was vested in the Crown and could be sold or extended. The common was not to exceed 20 square miles. Conditions were laid down on who could use the common, and the fees for de-pasturing stock.

Sheep were allowed on commons only in special circumstances. The cost to de-pasture cattle was at a rate of not less than two shillings per head per annum, and in no case was any one freeholder to run more than twenty head on the same common. The 1868 Act gave a definition of 'cattle' for the purposes of the act. Cattle 'shall mean and include mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, mules, cows, oxen, heifers, steers, and calves...'.

The *Commonage Act 1870* allowed the Governor-in-Council to delegate the power to manage and make rules and regulations relating to the common to the mayor and corporation of a municipality.

The *Crown Lands Act 1884* provided for the resumption of commons, and in the *Land Act 1910* all commons were deemed to be pasturage reserves.

The files include the petition or petitions, maps and correspondence about the setting up of the common. A few files have correspondence relating to the later sales of land from the common. These files can be useful for locating people in the area. The occupations of the petitioners are usually listed after the signature.

To find a file, identify the town common (by location) and the ITM number from the description list in the table provided in Appendix A.
