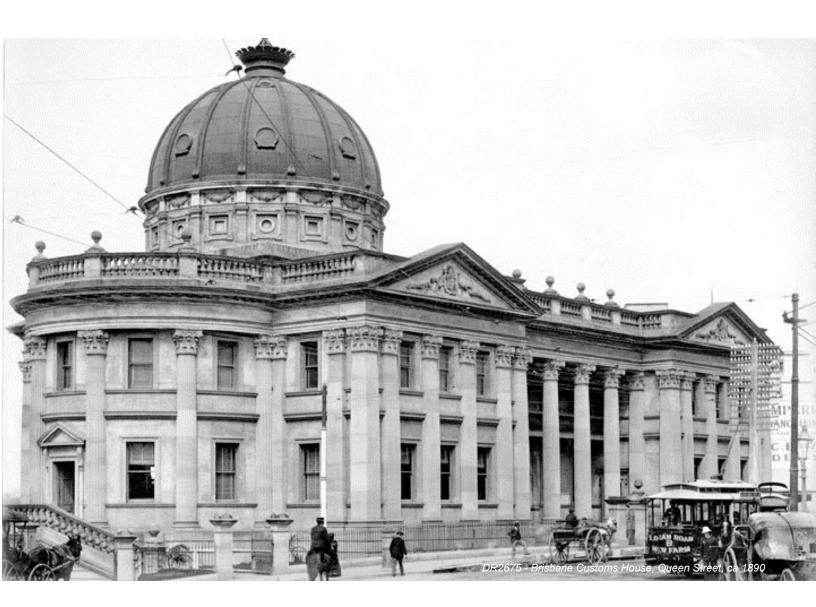
Government building records



Research Guide to government building records at Queensland State Archives

Queensland State Archives (QSA) is the official repository for Queensland Government records selected for permanent retention because of their continuing value. The archived public records are from state government departments, state courts, local government authorities and statutory authorities. The records are in our facility at <u>Runcorn, Brisbane</u>, and open records are available for viewing in the Reading Room, free-of-charge.

QSA holds archival records about buildings constructed by or for the Colonial and State government, courts, local government and buildings owned or occupied by these agencies. There are some records of Colonial and State government buildings which were later transferred to the Federal government.

The main finding aid for records held at QSA is the <u>Queensland State Archives' online catalogue</u> (known as ArchivesSearch).

The following citation abbreviations are used throughout our catalogue:

- ITM QSA Item (describes the item)
- PR Physical Representation (generally the original or microfilm copy)
- DR Digital Representation (for a digital image)
- S Series (for a series of records)
- A Agency ID (for the creating or responsible agency).

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander readers are advised that our catalogue contains images, names and voices of people who have died.

Background

Records about government buildings are described in this guide and include a variety of government buildings such as court houses, police stations, state schools, railway stations, lighthouses, post and telegraph offices, hospitals, pilot stations, drill halls and rifle ranges, quarantine stations, and offices of government departments.

The amount and type of information available on government buildings varies depending on the type of building and the likely date of construction. In some instances, records may include plans and specifications, architectural drawings, tenders for construction, and correspondence about the building's construction and maintenance. There is no single name index which lists all references to public buildings. This guide lists groups of records by the public authority who created the records, including Clerk of Works, Moreton Bay, and by type of public building, such as schools.

Most official records concerning government buildings prior to the separation of Queensland from New South Wales in 1859 are held by the State Records Authority of New South Wales at Kingswood, Sydney. Contact details are available at <u>http://www.records.nsw.gov.au/contact-us/contact-us</u>

Colonial Secretary's Office

From December 1859 to about April 1862 the Colonial Secretary's Office was responsible for Public Works. The indexes and registers for the letters received can be used to find letter numbers. Public Works Department

The Department of Public Works was established in 1866. Its responsibilities included the construction and maintenance of government buildings and the supervision of contracts for the construction of government buildings by private firms.

This series comprises architectural drawings for a diverse range of public buildings in Queensland including educational institutions, e.g. schools; penal institutions e.g. prisons; hospitals; orphanages; aged persons homes; court houses; police stations; Parliament; public facilities e.g. museums, libraries, botanical gardens; and, other public offices e.g. lands offices, taxation, bank premises, Anzac Square building. Search by type of building and place, for example, Bundaberg court house.

Colonial Architect's Office

Correspondence, letterbooks and financial records of the Colonial Architect's Office (later Government Architect) for the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, and the Deputy Government Architect from 1907 to 1916 are also relevant for building research. The Colonial Architect's letterbooks contain some reports on privately owned buildings used for public purposes, e.g. theatres. The letterbooks of the district Architects, from the Northern, Central and Southern Districts 1900–1907 provide useful information on buildings in centres outside Brisbane. Letterbooks of the Foreman of Works and Inspector of Works, 1892–1916 are also available.
