Notice is given under the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009* that on 28 July 2015, Townsville City Council adopted administrative and minor amendments (Amendment Package 2015/01) to the Townsville City Council planning scheme (Townsville City Plan) and associated planning scheme policies.

The purpose and general effect of the administrative amendments are to correct formatting and presentation, spelling and grammar and mapping errors.

The purpose and general effect of the minor amendments to the planning scheme are as follows:

- Part 1 – 1.7 Local government administrative matters – Inclusion of a new section 1.7.1 which reflects the declaration of a mall on Stokes Street, between Flinders Street and Ogden Street, as per council resolution on 9 June 2011 and in accordance with s80A(2) of the *Local Government Act 2009* and s58 of the *Local Government Regulation 2012*.
- Part 5 – Levels of assessment – Mixed use zone (Table 5.5.13) – Deletion of the existing site area threshold and Editor’s note associated with a Car wash, Garden centre, Outdoor sales, Parking station and Service station.
- Part 5 – Levels of assessment – Bushfire hazard overlay (Table 5.10.1 – High hazard area) – Inclusion of a trigger relating to reconfiguration of a lot within those areas that are of High hazard.
- Part 5 – Levels of assessment – Building work in the Character residential zone – Inclusion of the phrase “unless on a rear lot” in (e) of Table 5.7.1 and inclusion of a definition of “Rear lot” in Schedule 1 Definitions – Administrative definitions.
- Part 5 – Levels of assessment – Flood hazard overlay (Table 5.10.1 Flood hazard overlay (High and medium hazard areas)) – Inclusion of Emergency services, Hospital, Special industry, High impact industry, Residential care facility, Retirement facility, Major electricity infrastructure or Air services uses as code assessable uses.

- Part 6 – Low density residential zone (Table 6.2.1.3) – Deletion of the word “Unit” from AO28.2 to ensure there is no confusion regarding a dwelling and dwelling unit.
- Part 6 – Rural zone code – Cunggulla precinct (Table 6.6.1.3) – Inclusion of wording in AO3.2 to ensure that Class 10 buildings are nominated a setback.
- Schedule 2 – Overlay Map Coastal Protection – Coastal hazard areas (OM-03.1 and OM-03.2) – Refinement of mapping to reflect improved LIDAR information.
- Schedule 2 – Overlay Map Coastal Protection Coastal hazard areas (OM-03.1 and OM-03.2) – Expansion of area identified as “Inner City Area” to compliment the work completed on the Townsville City Waterfront Priority Development Area.
- Schedule 2 – Development Constraints Overlay Map – Flood hazard (OM-06.1 and OM-06.2) – Reduced flood hazard extents for some upper reaches of the flood hazard areas across Townsville following review to improve their accuracy.
- Schedule 2 – Development Constraints – Landslide hazard overlay map (OM-07.2) – Inclusion of additional land in the rural areas that contains a slope of greater than 23 degrees to reflect new LIDAR information.

The purpose and general effect of the minor amendment to the planning scheme policies is as follows:

- Schedule 6 – Development manual planning scheme policy – SC6.4.4.4 Attachment A – Design AEPs for arterial roads and major system design AEP figures have been updated.

The amendments (Amendment Package 2015/01) to the Townsville City Plan and planning scheme policies will commence on 28 August 2015.

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No. 2) 2015*.

Easement taken (ss.15D of the Act)

2. Following agreement in writing, the easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Maranoa Regional Council for the purposes incidental to an easement and vests in Maranoa Regional Council for an estate in fee simple.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1**Interpretation and Definitions****1.1 Definitions**

The following expressions (whether appearing with or without capital letters) have the following meanings:-

Business Day means any day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday in Roma.

Easement means the Form 9 Grant of Easement, this Form 20 Schedule and each annexure described in this Form 20.

Easement Area means the land described as the servient tenement in Item 2 of the Form 9 Grant of Easement.

Equipment means equipment and vehicles of all kinds which the Grantee considers to be reasonably required in connection with the carrying out, keeping or maintaining of the Works upon the Easement Area.

Proposed flood mitigation levee means the proposed flood mitigation levee depicted in the plans in Schedule 1.

Grantee means Maranoa Regional Council or any entity to which the benefit of this Easement is transferred from time to time and includes those authorised by the Grantee for the purposes of exercising the Grantee's powers or rights under this Easement.

Grantor means the registered owner of the Land.

Land means the lot of which the Easement Area forms part and includes the Easement Area.

Observe includes to comply with, discharge, fulfil, keep and perform.

Project means the Roma Flood Mitigation Project.

Statute means any statute, regulation, proclamation, ordinances or local law.

Works means the flood mitigation works, including the proposed flood mitigation levee as shown in the plans in Schedule 1, to be constructed within the Easement Area and, subject to the terms of this easement, any additional or replacement works which the Grantee (acting reasonably) from time to time determines are reasonably required for the purposes of flood mitigation and such ancillary works, matters and things as may be reasonably necessary in connection with them (for example, survey, design, construction, commissioning) and incidental or related works required to undertake the Project so far as it relates to the Easement Area.

1.2 Interpretation

In this Easement unless the context requires otherwise:

- (a) the singular includes the plural and vice versa;
- (b) a gender includes the other genders;
- (c) the headings are used for convenience only and do not affect the interpretation of this Easement;
- (d) other grammatical forms of defined words or expressions have corresponding meanings;
- (e) a reference to a document includes the document as modified from time to time and any document replacing it;
- (f) a reference to a party is to a party to this Easement and a reference to a party to a document includes the party's executors, administrators, successors and permitted assigns and substitutes;
- (g) if something is to be or may be done on a day that is not a Business Day then it must be done on the next Business Day;
- (h) the word "person" includes a natural person, partnership, body corporate, association, governmental or local authority, agency and any body or entity whether incorporated or not;
- (i) the word "month" means calendar month and the word "year" means 12 months;
- (j) the words "in writing" include any communication sent by letter, facsimile transmission or email or any other form of communication capable of being read by the recipient;
- (k) a reference to a thing includes a part of that thing;
- (l) a reference to all or any part of a Statute includes that statute as amended, consolidated, re-enacted or replaced from time to time;
- (m) wherever "include", "for example" or any form of those words or similar expressions is used, it must be construed as if it were followed by "(without being limited to)";
- (n) money amounts are stated in Australian currency unless otherwise specified;
- (o) a reference to time is to Queensland, Australia time;
- (p) a reference to any agency or body, if that agency or body ceases to exist or is reconstituted, renamed or replaced or has its powers or functions removed (**defunct body**), means the agency or body which performs most closely the functions of the defunct body;
- (q) any agreements, representation, warranty or indemnity in favour of two or more parties (whether those parties are included in the same defined term or not) is for the benefit of them jointly and separately;
- (r) any agreements, representation, warranty or indemnity by two or more parties (whether those parties are included in the same defined term or not) binds them jointly and severally; and
- (s) a reference to a party includes its contractors, agents, servants, employees and all others authorised by it (including persons connected with or introduced into the Project in whatever capacity).

2. Grantee's Rights and Obligations

2.1 Grant

The Grantor grants to the Grantee an easement over the Easement Area for the purposes of carrying out and keeping the Works upon the Easement Area and maintenance of the Works.

2.2 Ancillary Rights

In the exercise of its rights and powers under clause 2.1, the Grantee may:-

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter the Works as it reasonably requires from time to time including alterations to the form, nature or extent of the Works (but the Grantee is not entitled to make any variations or alterations which would change the nature of the Works from their sole purpose of flood mitigation or which would increase the height or width dimensions of the flood mitigation levee from that shown in the 'typical section' of the proposed levee where appearing in the plan contained in Schedule 1);
- (b) use other parts of the Land to gain access to the Easement Area for the purposes of carrying out or maintaining the Works but the Grantee shall not use such other parts of the Land, without first giving reasonable notice to the Grantor of its intention to take access (except in case of emergency when no notice is required) and the Grantee must comply with the reasonable requirements of the Grantor about the times and manner in which it may take access;
- (c) take down the following improvements on the Land to gain access to the Easement Area - fences, and drinking troughs and such other improvements as the Grantor shall have given prior written consent (not to be unreasonably withheld) but subject always to the obligation to repair and reinstate in clause 2.4;
- (d) clear and remove vegetation upon or from the Easement Area;
- (e) temporarily restrict access to parts of the Easement Area (including by fencing off provided that appropriate farm gates are installed in such fencing);
- (f) bring Equipment onto the Easement Area during such hours as the Grantee is actually carrying out, keeping or maintaining the Works upon the Easement Area;
- (g) remain upon the Easement Area during such hours as the Grantee is actually carrying out, keeping or maintaining the Works upon the Easement Area; and
- (h) undertake construction work on, below and above the surface of the Easement Area.

2.3 Limitations on Exercise

However, in the exercise of its rights and powers under clause 2.1 and clause 2.2:

- (a) the Grantee shall not exercise such rights before giving the Grantor at least seven days notice of its intention to exercise such rights and provide the Grantor full particulars of the action it proposes to take; and
- (b) nothing in clauses 2.1 and 2.2 shall prevent to Grantor from attending to the day to day activities of husbandry on the Land which may include the non-intensive grazing animals in the Easement Area.

2.4 Conditions of Exercise

In exercising any of its rights and powers under this Easement, the Grantee must ensure that:-

- (a) all Works are properly carried out in a good and workmanlike manner and in accordance with all applicable standards and laws;
- (b) the proposed flood mitigation levee is constructed with dimensions that are no greater in height or width than is shown in the 'typical section' of the proposed levee where appearing in the plan contained in Schedule 1;

- (c) as little inconvenience is as reasonably practicable is caused to the Grantor;
- (d) any damage caused is promptly rectified;
- (e) the surface of any part of the Land which has been used by the Grantee is left in a smooth, grassed state;
- (f) any improvements taken down are reinstated to a good condition and in such position as is required by the Grantor (acting reasonably);
- (g) if any drinking troughs or dams are taken down or removed the Council must simultaneously provide an alternate supply of water, in such places as may be reasonably required by the Grantor, for the Grantor's husbandry activities on the Land;
- (h) if the Owner's paddock fencing and incorporated gates are taken down or moved the Council must reinstate that fencing and incorporated gates to their original position and alignment;
- (i) the movement of cattle or other livestock and other day to day activities of husbandry on the Land is not impeded by any of the Works other than for short periods and in such cases only after arrangements, satisfactory to the Owner (acting reasonably), are made with the Owner to facilitate such activities; and
- (j) all applicable laws and standards, including those regarding occupational health and safety, are complied with.

3. Grantor's Rights and Obligations

3.1 Grantor's Right to Use

Subject to the provisions of this Easement, the Grantor is entitled to use the Easement Area for access purposes and in other ways which are not inconsistent with:-

- (a) the rights and powers of the Grantee under this Easement; and
- (b) the primary function of the Works, being flood mitigation.

3.2 Grantor's Obligation

- (a) The Grantor must not knowingly do anything or allow anything to be done which would, or would be likely to:-
 - (i) prevent, restrict or otherwise adversely affect the exercise by the Grantee of any of its rights or powers under this Easement; or
 - (ii) damage the Works, affect the structural integrity of the Works or inhibit the ability of the Works to function in accordance with their designed purpose of flood mitigation.
- (b) To avoid doubt, clause 3.2(a) includes an obligation that the Grantor must not without the Grantee's prior written approval (which must not be unreasonably withheld):-
 - (i) erect any buildings or structures of any type on the Easement Area;
 - (ii) plant trees or shrubs or cultivate any crops on the Easement Area;
 - (iii) intensively graze any animals on the Easement Area; or
 - (iv) dig or open up the surface or sub-surface of the Easement Area.

4. Maintenance and Repair

4.1 Grantee's Obligation

- (a) The Grantee must maintain the Works in good repair and condition at all times.
- (b) The costs of repair and maintenance of the Works must be paid by the Grantee except where:-
 - (i) the need for the repair or maintenance arises because of the breach by the Grantor of an obligation under this Easement; or
 - (ii) this Easement expressly states otherwise.

4.2 Mowing/Slashing

- (a) The Grantor may, at its discretion but it is acknowledged that the Grantor is under no obligation to do so, undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation control in relation to the Easement Area from time to time but in doing so must not increase the risk of erosion or scouring of the Works.
- (b) To the extent that the Grantor does not do so, the Grantee must undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation control in relation to the Easement Area on a regular basis so as to ensure that the Easement Area does not become overgrown and in doing so must not increase the risk of erosion or scouring of the Works.

5. Default

5.1 Remedies

Subject to clause 5.2, if a party to this Easement is in default of its obligations under it, and that default is not remedied within a reasonable time after written notice from the other party specifying (in reasonable detail) the default, the non-defaulting party may, at its election:-

- (a) do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the default; and
- (b) recover from the defaulting party the costs which it reasonably and properly incurs in doing so.

5.2 Emergency Action

In cases of emergency or where there is a likelihood that a failure to act promptly will result in imminent injury, damage or loss to any person or property, the non-defaulting party is entitled to exercise the rights in clause 5.1 without first having given a notice and opportunity to remedy the default in accordance with that clause.

5.3 No liability

To avoid doubt, a party which properly exercises its rights under clause 5.1 or clause 5.2 does not incur liability to the other party merely by reason of doing so.

6. General

6.1 Ownership of Works

To avoid doubt, the Grantee at all times retains ownership of the Works and any other matters of things which it brings onto the Land, irrespective of their attachment to the Land and even though they may otherwise be considered to be fixtures or fixed improvements to the Land.

6.2 Passing of Obligations

- (a) The burden and benefit of the Grantor's covenants and obligations under this Easement pass with the Easement Area so that any person who from time to time comprises the Grantor is only liable to Observe the Grantor's obligations and entitled to exercise the Grantor's benefits under this Easement while that person is the registered owner of the Easement Area.
- (b) The burden of the Grantee's covenant and obligations under this Easement pass to the person who is, from time to time, entitled to be benefit of this Easement so that any person who from time to time comprises the Grantee is only liable to Observe the Grantee's obligations under this Easement while that person is entitled to the benefit of this Easement.
- (c) Nothing in this clause affects a person's obligations or liabilities arising while it is the Grantor or Grantee under this Easement.

6.3 Costs, Stamping and Registration

- (a) The Grantee must pay the reasonable and proper legal costs on an indemnity basis of the Grantor of and incidental to the negotiation, execution and registration of this Easement, all duty, registration fees and survey costs of and incidental to the creation and registration of this Easement in the Land Titles Office.

- (b) The Grantor must promptly do all things reasonably required of it by the Grantee to enable the creation and registration in the Land Titles Office of this Easement (including, for example, producing any certificate of title of the Land and arranging the consent of any mortgagee of the Land to the grant of this Easement).

6.4 Nature of Obligations

- (a) Any provision in this Easement which binds more than one person, binds all of those persons jointly and each of them severally.
- (b) Each obligation imposed on a party by this Easement in favour of another is a separate obligation. Unless specified otherwise, the performance of one obligation is not dependant or conditional on the performance of any other obligation.

6.5 No Adverse Construction

This Easement, and any provision of this Easement, is not to be construed to the disadvantage of a party because that party was responsible for its preparation.

6.6 Further Assurances

A party, at the Grantee's expense, which shall include the reasonable and proper legal costs of the Grantor on an indemnity basis, and within a reasonable time of being requested by another party to do so, must do all things and execute all documents that are reasonably necessary to give full effect to this Easement.

6.7 No Variation

This Easement cannot be amended or varied except in writing signed by the parties.

6.8 Notices

A notice to be given under this Easement must be in writing and is treated as being properly given if it is:-

- (a) served personally or delivered or sent by prepaid post to:-
 - (i) in the case of the Grantor, the address of the Land; or
 - (ii) in the case of the Grantee, its principal place of business; or
- (b) delivered or sent by prepaid post to an address provided by a party as its address for service.

6.9 Time of Receipt

A notice given in accordance with clause 6.9 is treated as having been duly given and received:-

- (a) when served or delivered; or
- (b) on the second business day after posting (if sent by prepaid post).

6.10 Indemnity and Insurance of Works

The Grantee must indemnify (and keep indemnified) the Grantor from and against all:-

- (a) damage, loss or injury which the Grantor suffers; and
- (b) claims, demands, actions, suits and proceedings which may be made against the Grantor

arising out of or caused or contributed to by the exercise by the Grantee of any of its rights under this Easement or the carrying out or maintenance of the Works except to the extent caused or contributed to by the act, neglect or default of the Grantor.
