Landowners have an obligation to inform the Office of State Revenue (OSR) of any inaccuracies in their landholdings and when they receive an exemption or deduction to which they are not entitled. Failure to notify OSR may incur a penalty. Also, landowners may be entitled to claim an exemption or deduction. Landowners who consider that they may be liable to pay land tax and do not receive an assessment by 30 June 2004 must provide details of their landholdings to OSR by 31 July 2004.
