**Area:** Brisbane pilotage area

**Locality:** Brisbane River – South Brisbane Reach

**Activity:** Temporary Gazetted Speed Limit, Victoria Bridge works

Mariners are advised that:

Maintenance works will commence on the Victoria Bridge on Friday 24 March 2023.

Mariners are advised that a 6-knot speed limit has been established. Map S8sp-56-3-11-554 and 'Gazette Notice' dated 24 March 2023 February 2022' outlines the temporary 6 knot speed limit in the South Brisbane Reach. Lit starboard lateral marks, light characteristic Fl.G.2.5s will be established in approximate position latitude 27°28.516'S and 153°01.457'E and 27°28.215'S and 153°01.245'E identifies the 6-knot speed limit area. This is to provide a slow speed, no wash zone for the marine aspects of contraction works for the Victoria Bridge maintenance and Neville Bonner Bridge.

Construction activities will include both shoreside and waterborne, as well as dynamic in nature. The Construction barges will be mobilised to the site. All vessels and the barges will monitor VHF channel 12, 13 and 16 whilst operating in the construction area.

Lit Yellow Special Marks will mark the extremity of dangers that may be a hazard to navigation. This may include barge anchors, piles and other constructions.

Mariners are remined to observe the operational 6 knot speed limit, navigate with extra caution and minimise wash when transiting the area in vicinity of the terminals listed above and construction barges.
