Safe and Diverse Communities grants program

Queensland Government stakeholder communication kit – February 2024

The Queensland Government's *Safe and Diverse Communities* grants program has been launched to support community-led projects in diverse communities to recognise and respond to domestic and family violence.

Culturally and linguistically diverse Queenslanders can be at increased risk of experiencing domestic and family violence and can experience unique forms of abuse and additional barriers to reporting violence, seeking support and escaping a domestic and family violence situation.

The \$1 million *Safe and Diverse Communities* grants program will run for four years to 2024, with \$250,000 available each year. In 2021 and 2022 applications were invited for initiatives seeking funding from \$10,000 to \$25,000.

This year, an increased investment of \$850,000 is available for an **enhanced grant round**. Under the enhanced grant round, small grants of up to \$25,000 and larger grants up to \$150,000, will be available for prospective applicants. A maximum of three larger grants will be available to successful applicants across Queensland.

The program will support women's safety and violence prevention in Queensland's culturally and linguistically diverse communities through innovative, culturally appropriate, tailored primary prevention and early intervention projects.
