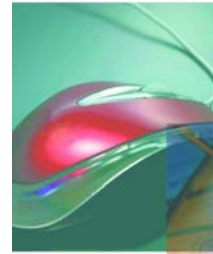

The Queensland Public Service is committed to equal opportunity in employment. Selection will be given on the basis of merit only and fair consideration will be given to all applicants. The Queensland State Government's policy is to seek to retain skilled staff. Registered employees who apply for an advertised job will be considered before other applicants. The symbol (g) appears next to vacancies where an exemption from this requirement applies. Employees are to indicate in their application for the advertised job that they are registered with the Office of the Public Service Commissioner. The Queensland Public Service Commissioner is committed to equal opportunity in employment. Selection will be given on the basis of merit only and fair consideration will be given to all applicants.

CONTINUOUS APPLICANT POOLS

A continuous applicant pool allows you to apply for jobs within an occupation where vacancies are regularly available. This means that agencies can 'dip' into the pool for suitable applicants as soon as they have a vacancy. You can submit or refresh your application at any time. If you are refreshing your application, make sure that you indicate this either on your email or, if sending by post, in a covering letter. In search results, continuous applicant pools can be identified by 'Ongoing' in the 'Closes' column of a search result.

Note: If a continuous applicant pool is closing, applicants will be notified two weeks prior to this date. Applications may be used for up to six months after the pool closes.

MULTI-AGENCY POOLS

Some Queensland Government agencies are on the lookout for people to fill similar jobs or occupations at the same time. Some of these jobs have a fixed closing date and others are ongoing (continuous applicant pools). With multi-agency pools, you only have to apply once to access job opportunities across participating agencies. Your application will then be able to be viewed and assessed by all the agencies in that pool - or, if you prefer, you can specify that you want to be considered only for particular agencies. Make sure you check the specific vacancy to find out how each pool works.

HOW TO APPLY

When you have found the job you would like to apply for.

1. You can phone for a copy of the information kit or you can download the documents from the Smart Jobs and Careers website at www.jobs.qld.gov.au. The information kit will include:
 - the position or job description detailing: background of the department or work area; roles and responsibilities, and selection criteria
 - a job information package, outlining the procedure for preparing and sending in your application, and
 - an application cover sheet.
2. Do your homework - research the agency to understand the background to the job.
3. Prepare your application. This should include your:
 - completed cover sheet (available on jobs online or in the kit mailed to you)
 - covering letter
 - resumé / curriculum vitae
 - names and contact details of (2) referees, and
 - responses to the selection criteria if required.
4. Mail or email your application (Details of where and how are available in either the job description or the job information package).

Check with the job vacancy contact person if you are unsure about how or where to submit your application or how many copies to send. Make sure you send your application by the closing date. If you don't, it may not be accepted. Once your application is received, you will usually be sent a written acknowledgement.

1. Title: Declaration of Interests – Chief Executives of Government Departments

2. Purpose:

This directive provides for the matters which must be disclosed by Chief Executives of government departments, how those matters must be disclosed, and specifies requirements for storage of, and access to, declarations.

3. Legislative Provision: *Public Service Act 2008* – sections 101-102

4. Effective date: 9 July 2010

5. Directive:

5.1 Principles

- 5.1.1 This Directive should be interpreted broadly. Its application should not be limited to a literal reading of the provisions.
- 5.1.2 Chief Executives are responsible for fully disclosing their interests that may have a bearing, or be perceived to have a bearing, on their ability to properly and impartially discharge the duties of their office.
- 5.1.3 Chief Executives are also responsible for disclosing the interests of their partner and/or dependents. Those interests that may have a bearing, or be perceived to have a bearing, on their ability to properly and impartially discharge the duties of their office, need be disclosed.
- 5.1.4 Responsibility for the recognition of a real or perceived conflict of interest rests solely with the Chief Executive concerned.

5.2 Provisions

- 5.2.1 Within one month of their appointment to a department, a Chief Executive is required to:
 - a) make a Declaration of Interests in a form prescribed by the Public Service Commission Chief Executive; and
 - b) submit a copy of the prescribed form to their portfolio Minister/s, the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and the Public Service Commission Chief Executive.
- 5.2.2 In the event that the interests of a Chief Executive change, the Chief Executive should notify the portfolio Minister/s, the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and the Public Service Commission Chief Executive of the change in a form prescribed by the Commission Chief Executive.
- 5.2.3 Chief Executives will review their Declaration of Interests at the end of each financial year and submit to their portfolio Minister/s, the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and the Public Service Commission Chief Executive by 31 July each year, either:
 - a) if there are changes to interests (see 5.3 below), on a form prescribed by the Public Service Commission Chief Executive; or

- b) if there are no changes, by verification on a form prescribed by the Public Service Commission Chief Executive.

5.3 Information to be declared

5.3.1 Information about interests which a Chief Executive shall declare includes information in relation to all significant *pecuniary* interests and relevant *non-pecuniary* interests of:

- the Chief Executive;
- their partner; and
- any dependents.

5.3.2 Within the principles outlined in section 5.1 of this directive, the interests referred to in 5.3.1 above are those which may have, or may be perceived to have, the potential for a conflict of interest and may include –

- a) shareholdings in public and private companies;
- b) family and business trusts and nominee companies;
- c) bonds, debentures and like investments;
- d) savings and investment accounts;
- e) partnerships;
- f) real estate;
- g) directorships in or employment by a public or private company;
- h) other assets;
- i) other substantial sources of income;
- j) other interests;
- k) liabilities;
- l) organisational memberships.

5.4 Identifying a conflict of interest

5.4.1 A Chief Executive who identifies that he or she has a conflict of interest must disclose the circumstances to the departmental Minister/s. They must not take action in the matter unless authorised by the Minister/s – see section 102 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

5.5 Changes in interests

5.5.1 When interests change to the extent that the potential for a conflict of interest is altered, a Chief Executive must submit a revised Declaration of Interests within one (1) month after the relevant facts of the change come to the knowledge of the person.

5.5.2 Change in interests may include:

- a) any significant change in the interests about which information is required including acquisition, divestment or an altered relationship in the interest; or
- b) a significant change in the official responsibilities of the public service employee.

5.6 Storage of records

5.6.1 Completed Declaration of Interests records will be filed securely within the office of the portfolio Minister/s, the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and the Public Service Commission Chief Executive;

5.6.2 Upon the separation of employment of a Chief Executive, the portfolio Minister/s will forward the Declaration of Interest documentation for that Chief Executive to the Public Service Commission Chief Executive to be securely filed, along with the copy held by the Commission Chief Executive, on the Chief Executive's personal record.

5.7 Access to records

- 5.7.1 Declarations are to be maintained in the strictest confidence. Unless required by law, Declaration of Interests records are only accessible by the Chief Executive, the portfolio Minister/s, the Premier, the Queensland Integrity Commissioner (including authorised officers of the Integrity Commissioner), and the Public Service Commission Chief Executive (including authorised senior officers of the Public Service Commission).
- 5.7.2 Declaration of Interests records may be the subject of applications for access under the *Right to Information Act 2009* and/or the *Information Privacy Act 2009*. Each application for access would be considered on a case by case basis before a decision is made on whether it is in the public interest to release the document.
- 5.7.3 In the event of receipt of an application for access to a Declaration of Interests, the agency is required to consult the Chief Executive who made the declaration about their views on the application prior to any decision being made to release the document.

5.8 Chief Executives to be fully informed

- 5.8.1 A Chief Executive is responsible for acquiring and being familiar with the information released from time to time by the Integrity Commissioner, the Public Service Commission and the Crime and Misconduct Commission concerning conflict of interest issues.
- 5.8.2 A Chief Executive should be aware of the role of the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and seek counsel on any issue that may arise as a conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest.

1. Title: Declaration of Interests – Public Service Employees (other than departmental Chief Executives)

2. Purpose:

This directive provides for the matters which must be disclosed by public service employees when directed by their Chief Executive, how those matters must be disclosed, the purpose of the disclosure, and specifies requirements for the storage of, and access to, declarations.

3. Legislative Provision: *Public Service Act 2008* – sections 185-186

4. Effective date: 9 July 2010

5. Directive:

5.1 Principles

When a public service employee is directed by a Chief Executive to provide a Declaration of Interests, the following principles apply:

- 5.1.1 This Directive should be interpreted broadly. Its application should not be limited to a literal reading of the provisions.
- 5.1.2 Employees subject to this policy are responsible for fully disclosing their interests that may have a bearing, or be perceived to have a bearing, on their ability to properly and impartially discharge the duties of their office.
- 5.1.3 Employees are also responsible for disclosing the interests of their partner and/or dependents only if those interests have a bearing, or may be perceived to have a bearing, on their ability to properly and impartially discharge the duties of their office.
- 5.1.4 Responsibility for the recognition of a real or perceived conflict of interest rests solely with the employee concerned.

5.2 Provisions

- 5.2.1 When directed by the Chief Executive of their department, public service employees are required to provide the Chief Executive with a Declaration of Interests in a form prescribed by the Commission Chief Executive.
- 5.2.2 In the event that the interests of a public service employee change, the public service employee should notify their Chief Executive of the change in a form prescribed by the Commission Chief Executive.

5.3 Information to be declared

- 5.3.1 Information about interests which public service employees shall declare includes information in relation to all significant *pecuniary* interests and relevant *non-pecuniary* interests of:
 - the public service employee,
 - their partner; and
 - any dependents.

5.3.2 Within the principles outlined in section 5.1 of this directive, the interests referred to in 5.3.1 above are those which may have, or may be perceived to have, the potential for a conflict of interest and may include –

- a) shareholdings in public and private companies;
- b) family and business trusts and nominee companies;
- c) bonds, debentures and like investments;
- d) savings and investment accounts;
- e) partnerships;
- f) real estate;
- g) directorships in or employment by a public or private company;
- h) other assets;
- i) other substantial sources of income;
- j) other interests;
- k) liabilities;
- l) organisational memberships.

5.4 Identifying a conflict of interest

5.4.1 A public service employee who identifies that he or she has a conflict of interest, or potential for a conflict of interest, must disclose the circumstances to their Chief Executive. They must not take action in the matter unless authorised by the Chief Executive – see section 186 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

5.5 Changes in interests

5.5.1 When interests change to the extent that the potential for a conflict of interest is altered, a public service employee must submit a revised Declaration of Interests within one (1) month after the relevant facts of the change come to the knowledge of the person.

5.5.2 Change in interests may include:

- a) any significant change in the interests about which information is required including acquisition, divestment or an altered relationship in the interest; or
- b) a significant change in the official responsibilities of the public service employee.

5.6 Storage of records

5.6.1 Completed Declaration of Interests records will be filed securely with the Chief Executive.

5.6.2 Upon the employee ceasing employment with the agency, their declaration of interest documentation will be securely filed on the employee's personal record.

5.7 Access to records

5.7.1 Declarations are to be maintained in the strictest confidence. Unless required by law, access to Declarations of Interests is limited to the employee and the Chief Executive or delegate.

5.7.2 Declaration of Interests records may be the subject of applications for access under the *Right to Information Act 2009* and/or the *Information Privacy Act 2009*. Each application for access would be considered on a case by case basis before a decision is made on whether it is in the public interest to release the document.

- 5.7.3 In the event of receipt of an application for access to a Declaration of Interests, the agency is required to consult the public service employee who made the declaration about their views on the application prior to any decision being made to release the document.

5.8 Public service employee to be fully informed

- 5.8.1 A public service employee is responsible for acquiring and being familiar with the information released from time to time by the Integrity Commissioner, the Public Service Commission and the Crime and Misconduct Commission concerning conflict of interest issues.
- 5.8.2 Public service employees who are senior officers or senior executives should be aware of the role of the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and seek counsel on any issue that may arise as a conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest.

1. **TITLE:** **Recognition of Previous Service and Employment**
2. **PURPOSE:** To prescribe the entitlements for recognition of previous service and employment when a person is appointed or reappointed, engaged or re-engaged to work in the Queensland public service.
3. **LEGISLATIVE PROVISION:** Section 54(1) of the *Public Service Act 2008*.
4. **APPLICATION:** This directive applies to –
 - public service officers; and
 - temporary employees engaged under section 148(2)(a) of the *Public Service Act 2008*; and
 - general employees engaged under section 147(2)(a) of the *Public Service Act 2008*; and
 - casual employees engaged under section 147(2)(b) or section 148(2)(b) of the *Public Service Act 2008* but only for the purposes of determining long service leave and paid parental leave entitlements.
5. **STANDARD:** The conditions prescribed in the Schedule apply.
6. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This directive is to operate from **1 July 2010**.
7. **VARIATION:** The provisions in the Schedule may be varied in accordance with certified agreements made under Chapter 6, Part 1 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* or decisions of an industrial tribunal of competent jurisdiction.
8. **INCONSISTENCY:** Sections 51 and 52 of the *Public Service Act 2008* and section 687 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* apply if there is a conflict with an act, regulation or industrial instrument.
9. **SUPERSEDES:** Directive 2/03: “*Recognition of Previous Service and Employment*”
10. **PREVIOUS REFERENCES:** Directive 14/01: “*Recognition of Previous Service and Employment*”
 Directive 22/99: “*Recognition of Previous Service and Employment*”
 Directive 3/98: “*Recognition of Previous Employment (Interim)*”
 Determination No. 4
 Section 22 of the *Public Service Management and Employment Regulation 1988* as in force on 24 February 1995.
 Circulars 1/91, 5/91
 Administrative Instruction No. 1 1 60

**SCHEDULE
RECOGNITION OF PREVIOUS SERVICE AND EMPLOYMENT
GENERAL CONDITIONS**

1. Entitlement

- 1.1 Eligible persons who are appointed or reappointed, engaged or re-engaged to work in agencies covered by this directive are entitled to recognition of previous service as prescribed by this directive.
- 1.2 The "General Conditions" of this directive must be read in conjunction with Part A of the directive. Note that the paid parental leave provisions (clause 8) are prescribed under "General Conditions", not in Part A.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 "employee" means a public service officer appointed under section 119 of the *Public Service Act 2008*, a general employee employed under section 148(2)(a) of the *Act*, a temporary employee employed under section 147(2)(a) of the *Act* or a casual employee employed under section 147(2)(b) or section 148(2)(b) of the *Act*.
- 2.2 "officer" means a public service officer appointed under section 119 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.
- 2.3 "temporary employee" means an employee employed as such under section 147(2)(a) or section 148(2)(a) of the *Public Service Act 2008*.
- 2.4 "casual employee" means an employee employed as such under section 147(2)(b) or section 148(2)(b) of the *Public Service Act 2008*.
- 2.5 "former employer" means the preceding employer under Part A for which service is being recognised (see clause 9).
- 2.6 "previous employment" means employment that is recognised under this directive.

3 Entitlement on reappointment to the Queensland public service as an officer

- 3.1 A person, previously employed as an officer in the Queensland public service, who is reappointed as an officer and –
- is appointed to a vacancy that has a closing date for applications that was within 12 months from the date of the person's termination from the Queensland public service; and
 - the termination was for reasons other than disciplinary action,
- is to have his or her previous service counted for the purpose of calculating any –
- (a) sick leave accumulation; and
 - (b) long service leave entitlement; and
 - (c) salary payable (paypoint and increment); and
 - (d) paid parental leave.

4. Entitlement on appointment – leave

- 4.1 To the extent provided in this schedule, the previous employment of a person to whom this directive applies (other than an officer reappointed to the Queensland public service referred to in clause 3 above) is to be counted for the purposes of calculating –
- (a) sick leave accumulation;
 - (b) long service leave entitlement; and
 - (c) paid parental leave.

- 4.2 The application of this directive to employees engaged on a casual basis is limited to previous service with a government entity as defined in section 24 of the *Public Service Act 2008* and is further limited to determining service for long service leave and paid parental leave purposes only.

The recognition of previous casual employment is limited to determining service for long service leave and paid parental leave purposes only.

- 4.3 The application of this directive to persons appointed as temporary employees is limited to previous service with a government entity as defined in section 24 of the *Public Service Act 2008*.

5. Entitlement on appointment – salary payable

- 5.1 Subject to the provisions of any relevant industrial instrument, the chief executive may count the previous relevant employment of a person

engaged as an officer, general employee, temporary employee or casual employee for the purpose of calculating salary payable (i.e. paypoint).

6. Waiving of further qualifying period – long service leave

- 6.1 An employee given recognition of previous employment and who has been paid a cash equivalent of long service leave by the former employer is not required to complete any further qualifying period in order to be granted long service leave.

7. Long service leave and sick leave**7.1 Information requirements**

Recognition of an employee's previous employment for long service leave and sick leave purposes is to be based on the following information obtained from that employee's former employer –

- (a) details of service;
- (b) details of sick leave granted;
- (c) details of any cash equivalent of sick leave paid at the date of termination;
- (d) details of any long service leave granted and cash equivalent thereof paid at the date of termination;
- (e) details of any undertakings given in relation to the non acceptance of a cash equivalent of long service;
- (f) details of any deductions made from the employee's long service leave because of disciplinary reasons; and
- (g) details of any special leave without salary granted together with the reasons for such leave.

7.2 Calculation of entitlements

Entitlements are to be calculated by applying the following formula:

$$E = (S \times AR) - LT$$

Where –

- E = entitlement
- S = years of service
- AR = accrual rate applicable to appointed position
- LT = leave taken

The accrual rate for sick leave is 10 days per year of service. The accrual rate for long service leave is 1.3 weeks per year of service.

7.3 Defence Forces service – sick leave

Recognition of sick leave for Defence Forces service shall be based on sick leave records (e.g. medical records).

Where sick leave records are not available the recognition rate shall be 5 days per year of service.

The recognition rate of 5 days per year of service is based on an accrual rate of 10 days per year of service and the employee being deemed to have taken 5 days sick leave per year of service.

8. Paid parental leave

- 8.1 Where an employee has service recognised for long service leave and/or sick leave purposes under this directive, service shall also be recognised for the purposes of the qualifying period under the Ministerial Directive titled *Paid Parental Leave*.

9. Former employer

- 9.1 Where the former employer has recognised service for previous employers, that service is also to be recognised at the appropriate accrual rate.

It is irrelevant whether or not the previous employers to the former employer fall within the "Category of Former Employer" in Part A.

- 9.2 Where the former employer has not recognised service for any previous employers, no service prior to the former employer is to be recognised.

It is irrelevant whether or not the previous employers to the former employer fall within the "Category of Former Employer" in Part A.

<p>9.3 In rare circumstances there may be more than one former employer. This would only occur where the person seeking recognition has been engaged by more than one employer falling within the “Category of Former Employer” in Part A within the 12 months prior to engagement in the Queensland public service.</p> <p>9.4 Where there is more than one former employer, service with each of the former employers is to be recognised.</p> <p>9.5 Where there is more than one former employer, service with any previous employers recognised by any of the former employers is also to be recognised. However, where more than one former employer has recognised service with the same previous employer, such previous service shall be recognised once only.</p> <p>10. QUEENSLAND COMPETITION AUTHORITY ACT 1997**Section 23A****MINISTERS' DIRECTION NOTICE****Direction**

As the Premier and the Treasurer of Queensland, pursuant to section 23A of the *Queensland Competition Authority Act 1997* (the QCA Act), we refer the monopoly distribution and retail water and wastewater activities (the activities) of the following Distributor-Retailer Authorities (the entities):

- Southern SEQ Distributor-Retailer Authority (Allconnex Water);
- Central SEQ Distributor-Retailer Authority (Queensland Urban Utilities); and
- Northern SEQ Distributor-Retailer (Unitywater);

to the Queensland Competition Authority (the QCA) for a price monitoring investigation covering the period from 1 July 2010 to 30 June 2013 (the interim regulatory period).

Conduct of the QCA pursuant to this Direction

In referring this investigation, the Ministers direct the QCA under section 24 of the Act as follows. For each entity, the QCA shall:

- (a) provide timely and transparent information to customers about the costs and other factors underlying the annual increase in water and wastewater prices, including distinguishing the bulk and distribution/retail components to the extent that it is possible given the availability and reliability of relevant information;
- (b) provide guidance to entities on the application of the information requirements referred to in (j) below;
- (c) recognise the Government's policy that the prices charged by the SEQ Water Grid Manager for bulk water storage, treatment and delivery are to be passed through to customers in full;
- (d) consider the availability of information from the entity, their emerging capability to provide information and the transitional work required to integrate and establish the entities;
- (e) accept the operational constraints imposed by the SEQ Urban Water Arrangements Reform Workforce Framework 2010;
- (f) monitor the revenues of each activity having regard to the maximum allowable revenue over the interim regulatory period, based on the total costs of carrying on the activity including each of the following:
 - (i) the operational costs incurred in carrying on the activity;
 - (ii) depreciation; and
 - (iii) return on capital employed.

(g) consider a weighted average cost of capital (WACC) within a reasonable range of values for 2010-11. The QCA is to advise the entity by 1 March 2011 and 1 March 2012 of the WACC benchmark that it will consider in 2011-12 and 2012-13 respectively;

(h) roll forward the regulated asset base (RAB) using the following principles:

(i) council distribution/retail asset valuations, establishing the initial regulated asset base as at 1 July 2008, are as advised by the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade;

(ii) the opening RAB for each subsequent year to be rolled forward annually in accordance with the following formula:

$$RAB_t = (RAB_{t-1} + \text{Capital Expenditure}_t - \text{Regulatory Depreciation}_t - \text{Disposal}_t + \text{Indexation}_t)$$

where t = the year under consideration;

(iii) to assess Capital Expenditure in (ii) above, the QCA is to assess capital expenditure (including information technology systems) for prudence and efficiency. The QCA must accept as prudent and efficient, and include in the RAB:

- actual capital expenditure, excluding establishment costs, for water and waste water as included in Council financial accounts for the period 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2010;
- allowable establishment costs as advised by the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade; and
- contributed, donated and gifted assets and capital expenditure funded through cash contributions and subsidies (capital contributions), for water and waste water for the period 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2010.

(iv) the QCA is to accept that, in setting prices from 1 July 2008, the councils applied a revenue offset approach to account for capital contributions received. This approach is to remain in effect until such time that the entity nominates, through their price monitoring information returns, to adopt the asset offset method. Where a change in methodology is adopted, the RAB is not to be adjusted retrospectively;

(v) to assess Regulatory Depreciation in (ii) above, the QCA must take into account for the period 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2010 the apportionment of Council distribution/retail valuations in (i) above to individual assets and evidence that regulatory depreciation on the physical assets has been calculated using existing useful lives attaching to the individual assets;

(vi) to assess the Indexation in (ii) above, the QCA must take into account the latest available Australian Bureau of Statistics Consumer Price Index (all groups, Brisbane), however, for the period 1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010, the 2009-10 Queensland State Budget inflation forecast may be used;

- (i) take into account any revenue glide path submitted by the entity for the purpose of avoiding price shocks over the interim period; and
- (j) monitor according to the QCA Final Report on the SEQ Interim Price Monitoring Framework (April 2010) and Information Requirements for 2010-11 (December 2009), except as amended by this referral, and excluding the process for triggering consideration of price setting regulation.

Consultation

The QCA must undertake an open consultation process with all relevant parties and consider submissions within the timetable for the review and reports. Consistent with section 34 of the QCA Act, all reports and submissions must be published on the QCA website.

Timing

For 2010-11, the entities must provide their price monitoring information returns to the QCA by 31 August 2010. For each subsequent year, the entities must provide their price monitoring information returns to the QCA by 1 July.

The QCA must provide a Final Report to the Ministers and the Minister for Natural Resources, Mines and Energy and Minister for Trade as follows:

- a) for 2010-11, by 31 March 2011; and
- b) for 2011-12 and 2012-13, by 31 December respectively.
