**Marine Parks Regulation 2006
ACCREDITATION OF AUTHORISATION
PROCESS OR MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENT
FOR AN ACTIVITY NOTICE (No. 01) 2012
(Section 94B Notice)**

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Accreditation of Authorisation Process or Management Arrangement Notice (No. 01) 2012*.

Chief Executive accreditation of an authorisation process or management arrangement [s.94B of the Marine Parks Regulation 2006]

2. Notice is hereby given that the Chief Executive on 20 January 2012 accredited the *Great Sandy Region Marine Aquaculture Plan* ('GSRMAP') and Implementation Guide for the GSRMAP ('Implementation Guide') for the activity of marine-based aquaculture operations in the Great Sandy Marine Park (the 'Activity'), on the conditions imposed by the chief executive as stated in Schedule 1.

3. A person may without an authority under *the Marine Parks Act 2004*, enter or use the Great Sandy Marine Park for the Activity if the person –

- (i) is authorised to conduct the Activity under the GSRMAP and the Implementation Guide; and
- (ii) complies with the conditions imposed by the Chief Executive on the conduct of the Activity under the GSRMAP and the Implementation Guide, as stated in Schedule 1.

4. The accreditation does not authorise the person to carry out prohibited purposes in the Great Sandy Marine Park.

5. A copy of this gazette notice, the GSRMAP and the Implementation Guide is available for inspection by the public, free of charge, on the Department of Environment and Resource Management's website (www.derm.qld.gov.au).

**SCHEDULE 1
Conditions on the conduct of marine-based**

aquaculture operations in the Great Sandy Marine Park under the GSRMAP and the Implementation Guide

1. The aquaculture operation must be carried out within the boundary of a site for marine aquaculture described in Appendix 5 of the GSRMAP.
2. Aquaculture operations involving the addition of feed must not be conducted in any zone of the marine park.
3. Aquaculture operations that involve dredging or trawling may only be conducted in general use zones of the marine park. At site 812 (in the Hervey Bay Precinct), the harvest of scallops by trawl must comply with condition CA91 of the Implementation Guide.
4. Aquaculture operations at Double Island Point Precinct and Wide Bay Bar Precinct, operations must comply with assessment criteria AC16 of the Implementation Guide.
5. Aquaculture operations at Wide Bay Harbour Precinct and Tinnanbar Precinct must comply with condition CA87 of the Implementation Guide.
6. Aquaculture operations at Hervey Bay Precinct, site 812 must comply with conditions CA92 of the Implementation Guide.
7. Structures must be designed and maintained so as to minimise potential impact on marine mammals, turtles and sharks. In particular, aquaculture involving structures must comply with the following:
 - assessment criteria AC12, AC13 and AC14 of the Implementation Guide; and
 - conditions CA73, CA74 and CA75 of the Implementation Guide.

The Queensland Coastal Plan incorporating State Planning Policy 3/11: Coastal Protection, in accordance with section 31 of the *Coastal Protection and Management Act 1995*, schedule 4, section 9 of the *Integrated Planning Act 1997*, and section 775 of the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009*, replaces the:

- State Coastal Management Plan (2001);
- Wet Tropical Coast Regional Coastal Management Plan (2003);
- Cardwell–Hinchinbrook Regional Coastal Management Plan (2003);
- Curtis Coast Regional Coastal Management Plan (2003); and
- South-east Queensland Regional Coastal Management Plan (2006)

The replacement of these plans will take effect upon the commencement of the Queensland Coastal Plan incorporating State Planning Policy 3/11: Coastal Protection on 3 February 2012.
