*Constitution of Queensland 2001***ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 1) 2015****TABLE OF PROVISIONS**

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**Short Title**

1. This order in council may be cited as the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2015*.

**Administrative Arrangements**

2. (1) The public business of the State is distributed among Ministers as set out in the Schedule.

(2) Each Minister is to administer the matters set out in the Schedule next to the Minister's title as follows:

- (a) the matters connected with the public business of the State listed under the heading '*Principal Ministerial Responsibilities*';
- (b) the legislation listed under the heading '*Acts Administered*'; and
- (c) the administrative units listed under the heading '*Administrative Units*'.

(3) Information in the Schedule under the heading '*Responsible Heads*' is included for information only and does not form part of this order.

**Repeal of earlier Administrative Arrangements**

3. The *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2014* is repealed.

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## PRELIMINARY

### Short Title

1. This notice is made under the *Public Service Act 2008* and may be cited as the *Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No.1) 2015*.

### Commencement

2. This notice commences on the day it is published in the Gazette.

## ESTABLISHMENT AND DECLARATION OF GOVERNMENT ENTITIES

3. Under sections 14(2) and 15(a) of the Act, that part of the Department of Science, Information Technology, Innovation and the Arts known as Arts Queensland is established as a government entity and declared to be part of the Department of Science, Information Technology, Innovation and the Arts.
4. - If the ship is operating in an official capacity in conjunction with a sailing club, within smooth waters and is 12 metres or less in length the master must hold a Recreational Marine Driver's License and a Yachting Australia Safety Boat Handling Course qualification and an unlicensed trainee may only operate the ship subject to the provisions of Section 87 of the *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) 2004* – Operation of ship by unlicensed person; or
- If the ship is operating within smooth or partially smooth waters, is powered by an engine of greater than 37kW (50hp) and is less than 7.5m in length, the master must hold a Recreational Marine Driver Licence, has completed a Shipboard Safety Skills set or equivalent, has undertaken an induction of the vessel and is familiar with the vessels Safety Management System, has completed and logged at least 20 supervised hours as a master whilst engaged in the intended activities for the vessel without incident.

#### SCHEDULE

- For a person who acts as the trainer or teacher in the supervision of unlicensed persons including trainees in compliance with the conditions above; or
- For a unlicensed trainee engaged in sporting, training or educational activities and the trainee under the direct supervision of a trainer who complies with the conditions above; or
- For a person who acts as an official in conjunction with the activities of a sailing club who complies with the conditions above.
