#### **Short Title**

1. This order in council may be cited as the Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2015.

#### **Administrative Arrangements**

- 2. (1) The public business of the State is distributed among Ministers as set out in the Schedule.
  - (2) Each Minister is to administer the matters set out in the Schedule next to the Minister's title as follows:

#### **Short Title**

1. This notice is made under the *Public Service Act 2008* and may be cited as the *Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No.1) 2015*.

#### Commencement

**2.** This notice commences on the day it is published in the Gazette.

## ESTABLISHMENT AND DECLARATION OF GOVERNMENT ENTITIES

- 3. Under sections 14(2) and 15(a) of the Act, that part of the Department of Science, Information Technology, Innovation and the Arts known as Arts Queensland is established as a government entity and declared to be part of the Department of Science, Information Technology, Innovation and the Arts.

- If the ship is operating within smooth or partially smooth waters, is powered by an engine of greater than 15kw (20hp) but less than 37kw (50hp) and is 7.5 metres or less in length the master must hold a Recreational Marine Driver Licence and a Yachting Australia Safety Boat Handling Course qualification and an unlicensed trainee must be under the direct and immediate supervision of the trainer on the same ship: or
- If the ship is operating in an official capacity in conjunction with a sailing club, within smooth waters and is 12 metres or less in length the master must hold a Recreational Marine Driver's License and a Yachting Australia Safety Boat Handling Course qualification and an unlicensed trainee may only operate the ship subject to the provisions of Section 87 of the *Transport Operations (Marine Safety)* 2004 Operation of ship by unlicensed person; or
- If the ship is operating within smooth or paritially smooth waters, is powered by an engine of greater than 37kW (50hp) and is less than 7.5m in length, the master must hold a Recreational Marine Driver Licence, has completed a Shipboard Safety Skills set or equivalent, has undertaken an induction of the vessel and is familiar with the vessels Safety Management System, has completed and logged at least 20 supervised hours as a master whilst engaged in the intended activities for the vessel without incident.
