Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No. 1099) 2006*.

Easement to be taken [s.9(7) of the Acquisition of Land Act 1967]

2. 1. Interpretation

"DMR" means the State of Queensland acting through the Department of Main Roads and includes all persons authorised by the Chief Executive of the Department of Main Roads.

"install and operate" means install, construct, erect, operate, maintain, inspect, repair, renew, replace, upgrade, dismantle and/or remove.

Planning Scheme Policy 10: Park Contributions

SCHEDULE 3

Act means the Water Act 2000 as in force from time to time.

active playing surface means:

- a turf cricket wicket and practising wickets;
- a grass running or race track;
- a green (that is, croquet, bowling or golf);
- a golf tee off area;
- a grass tennis court;
- a synthetic hockey pitch or synthetic bowling green;
- other principal part of a sportsground used during a sport game or competition, but does not include the surrounding grassed surface of a sporting oval or a golf fairway; or
- designated soft fall areas in registered child care centres.

animal husbandry means the keeping, raising, breeding or any combination thereof of animals, including but not limited to cattle, pigs, deer, emus and any birds or poultry either for the purpose of profit or at a scale and in a manner which is analogous to a commercial enterprise regardless of whether a profit is sought to be derived.

attended hand held hose means a hose fitted with a trigger nozzle or twist nozzle that is held by hand by an attendant when it is used and includes a high pressure water cleaning device.

bucket means a bucket and other similar vessels with a volume capacity of less than 20 litres.

commercial operator means a person or entity conducting a business which is primarily focused on delivering the relevant service contemplated in the particular Restriction and where:

- the service is delivered for a fee or reward on a commercial basis;
- the business is duly registered and has an Australian Business Number (if required); and
- the operator uses water efficient methods in providing the relevant business activity or service.

Commission means the Queensland Water Commission as established and constituted from time to time under the Water Act.

Cooling tower means a system located on Non-Residential Premises to cool water (by water evaporation) using it as a coolant for a building air conditioning system.

Council means a local government authority as defined in the Local Government Act 1993.

Evaluation Criteria means in the context of setting an alternate submission date for a WEMP, or the review of an implementation date for a measure contained in a Restriction set out in this Commission Water Restriction (where the service provider has a discretion to vary such a date), the following criteria being:

- The extent of the immediate financial impact of compliance with this Commission Water Restriction on the entity owning or operating a particular affected premises;
- The ability of such an entity to access information or the external resources that are reasonably necessary or required to undertake the action or measure;
- The past actions of the entity in respect of the particular premises in achieving water efficiencies prior to the commencement of this Commission Water Restriction;
- The actions that have been taken by the entity in respect of the particular premises to comply with this Commission Water Restriction; and
- Whether the alternate dates proposed by the entity to undertake the action or measure are reasonable in all the circumstances.

fountain means any indoor or outdoor ornamental fountain/water feature.

garden means any ground used for the cultivation of, or in which there are situated trees, shrubs, flowers, plants, vegetables, or vegetation of any kind including plants in pots or tubs and excluding lawn.

hand held hose means a hose fitted with a trigger or twist nozzle that is held by hand when it is used, including a high pressure water cleaning device.

heritage garden means a garden that is heritage listed or nominated by a Council or other relevant body.

high pressure water cleaning unit means a machine which has a pump to increase the pressure of the water delivered from a trigger nozzle, forming part of the device.

hose means a flexible hose with an internal diameter up to 25 mm for domestic purposes and up to 50 mm for commercial, industrial and construction activities.

lawn means an expanse of grass-covered land that is usually associated with a garden, but does not include active playing

licensed plumber means a plumber appropriately licensed under the Plumbing and Drainage Act 2002.

Local, State and Commonwealth government reserves means land under government custodianship reserved for public benefit purposes.

ML Megalitre means million (1,000,000) litres of water drawn from reticulated (town) supply system. This equates to 1,000 kilolitres (kL).

Non-Residential Premises means premises that are not residential premises including business premises, industrial premises, factory premises, commercial office premises, Commonwealth, State and Local government premises, hotels, private training centres, nursing homes, hostels, public and private hospitals, caravan parks, churches and convents, halls and show grounds, neighbourhood centres, shopping centres, sporting clubs, medical and dental clinics, transport depots, nurseries, market gardens, turf farms, farms, education facilities (including universities, State and private schools), conference centres, childcare centres, kindergartens, parks and gardens of significance (as determined by a Council), heritage gardens and sportsgrounds and the common property of a community title scheme under the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997* or under the *Building Units and Group Titles Act 1980*.

outdoor public swimming pool means a pay by entry outdoor swimming pool which is managed by a Council, tertiary education institution or other commercial operator but does not include a swimming pool located within a hotel or motel.

outdoor swimming pool means an outdoor swimming pool located on premises excluding premises where the outdoor swimming pool forms part of the common property for a community title scheme under the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997* or under the *Building Units and Group Titles Act 1980*.

outdoor spa means an outdoor spa located on premises excluding premises where the pool forms part of the common property for a community title scheme under the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997* or under the *Building Units and Group Titles Act 1980*.

parks and gardens of significance means a park or a garden which is identified as significant by a Council.

paved surfaces means areas such as streets, paths, driveways, patios, decks or similar areas with surface areas of bitumen, concrete, rock, timber, masonry, metal or other hard material.

pond means an artificially formed small body of water used for ornamental purposes but does not include a swimming pool, fish pond, frog pond or outdoor aquarium.

renovated swimming pool or outdoor spa means a swimming pool or outdoor spa that has had to be substantially emptied for the purpose of undertaking repairs to the pool or spa structure.

residential building construction means building construction which is undertaken on Residential Premises on a commercial or non commercial basis and includes painting and the preparation for painting/re-surfacing but does not include garden watering.

Residential Premises means a house (single dwelling), townhouse, unit, block of flats, boarding house or any other form of permanent residential accommodation.

reticulated (town) supply system means a system of water distribution infrastructure delivering potable (drinking quality) water to premises in a local government area, directly to the premises through the distribution system or indirectly to the premises in a drum tanker or other container that exceeds 20L capacity containing water that has been sourced from the reticulated supply system; the system also includes a rainwater tank which contains any water sourced from the reticulated water supply system.

service provider means any of the following entities:

- Beaudesert Shire Council;
- Brisbane City Council;
- Caboolture Shire Council;
- Council of the Shire of Esk;
- Gatton Shire Council;
- Gold Coast City Council;
- Ipswich City Council;
- Kilcoy Shire Council;
- Laidley Shire Council;
- Logan City Council;
- Pine Rivers Shire Council; and
- Redcliffe City Council.

service provider approved sign means a sign that complies with the standard signage issued by the relevant service provider and displays the appropriate permit or approval number if a permit or approval number has been issued as part of the approval process put in place by the service provider.

spa means a bath or larger facility through which aerated water is pumped and which is primarily used for recreation. The term includes mobile or portable spas.

sportsground means any land used or adapted for use for the purpose of any sport, game, contest or any other form of recreation by any public authority, business, company, trust, club, school, institution, or like organisation.

swimming pool cover means a cover that has a 400 micron thickness (400 thousandths of a millimetre) and which is approved as a pool cover under the *Smart Approved WaterMark Scheme*.

trigger nozzle or twist action nozzle means a nozzle, controlled by a trigger, button, twist action or similar mechanism which must be controlled by hand for the water to flow.

vehicle means a conveyance that is designed to be propelled or drawn by any means and includes a motor vehicle, trailer, caravan, boat or aircraft whether registered for use on roads or not.

water efficient methods means those methods of operation that achieve the desired outcome with the minimum amount of water.

water efficient showerhead means a showerhead that has a 3 star rating or better under the Australian Water Efficiency Labelling and Standards Scheme or a showerhead that has a maximum flowrate of 9 litres per minute.

water efficient tap means a tap that has a 3 star rating or better under the Australian Water Efficiency Labelling and Standards Scheme or a tap that has a maximum flowrate of 9 litres per minute.

water efficient toilet means for new dwellings a toilet that has a 3 Star rating (6/3 L) or better under the Australian Water Efficiency Labelling and Standards Scheme or, for an existing dwelling it means a toilet that has a 1 Star rating (9/4.5 L) or better under the Australian Water Efficiency Labelling and Standards Scheme.

water efficient trigger spray means a trigger spray that has a 3 star rating or better under the Australian Water Efficiency Labelling and Standards Scheme or a trigger spray that has a maximum flowrate of 7.7 litres per minute.

water efficient washing machine means a washing machine that has a 4 Star rating or better under the Australian Water Efficiency Labelling and Standards Scheme.

watering can means a watering can and other similar vessels with a volume capacity of less than 20 litres.

water play facilities means facilities in non-commercial or public places where water sprays, pools and other water features are used predominantly for recreation and children's play activities.

water play pools and water toys means any toy that is operated by running water supplied by a hose or any portable play pool.

WEMP means a Water Efficiency Management Plan:

- prepared in accordance with WEMP Guidelines published by the Queensland Water Commission;
- which the relevant service provider has not declined to approve;
- is capable of third party certification;
- contains details of how either a water consumption reduction of 25% or best practice water efficiency is being achieved, or will be achieved within a nominated time for the types of water uses on the premises; and
- contains an outline of the quantity of water savings that will be achieved and the program timelines for achieving these
 water savings.

WEMP Guidelines means Guidelines issued from time to time by the Queensland Water Commission and which deal with issues relating to WEMPs including:

- approval processes for a WEMP;
- the review and monitoring of a WEMP;
- the level of commitment by an organisation to comply with a WEMP; and
- the making of amendments to a WEMP.


