

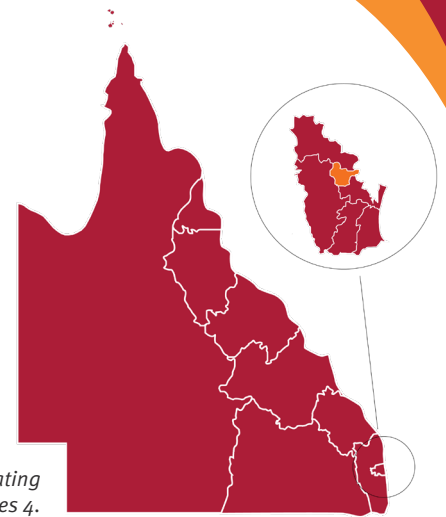

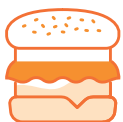

Trade Taster helps Tully find her path

A Trade Taster course in high school is what helped Tully Kendall ultimately decide on a trade career.

The TAFE Queensland program offers students a taste of what it is like to work in areas such as carpentry, hairdressing and health care while at school.

For Tully, a good trade was her ticket out of an unhappy schooling experience.

“I thought if I found a trade to start – that my parents would approve of – I could convince them to allow me to continue my education elsewhere,” Tully said.

Tully signed up to complete a Certificate III in Joinery with TAFE Queensland through the Queensland Government’s Free Apprenticeships for Under 25s initiative.

She credits her successful move from school-to-work to having an amazing employer and support system, including TAFE teachers who are passionate about helping students to learn and succeed.

Now 17, Tully has become an immensely skilled and respected worker at Brendale’s RWD Joinery, and was recently named the 2023 TAFE Queensland – SkillsTech Outstanding Apprentice of the Year.



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
