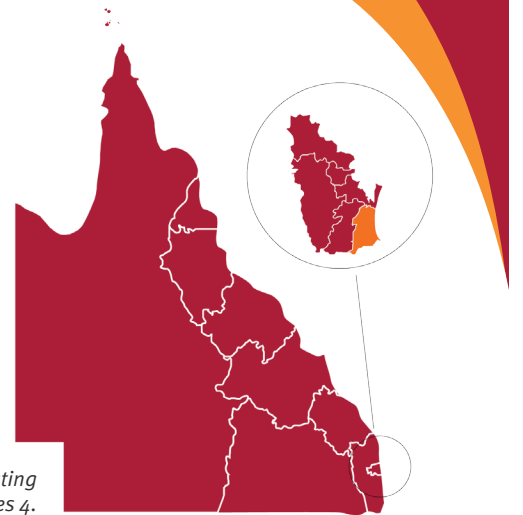

Emma Flori, Gold Coast | Cabinet-making apprentice

Free TAFE gives Emma a dream career path

Before picking up the tools, Emma Flori faced the universal dilemma of choosing a career path. She was drawn to the idea of engaging in physical work but wasn't sure what direction to take.

A visit to TAFE Queensland's Ashmore campus marked a pivotal moment for Emma – putting her on a path to a dream career, funded as part of the Queensland Government's Free Apprenticeships for Under 25s initiative.

"Among all the different trade areas of electrotechnology, plumbing, automotive, carpentry and engineering, it was cabinet-

making that resonated with me," said Emma, who is now in her first year as an apprentice.

"I love going to work and learning new things each day. I am fascinated by the intricate processes behind kitchen and bathroom constructions and find it very cool to see how it is all put together."

Facing an industry dominated by men, Emma had initial reservations about a trade career. But she soon found a welcoming and supportive community that valued skills over gender, further strengthened by the presence of other women at Joinery Eleven where she works.
