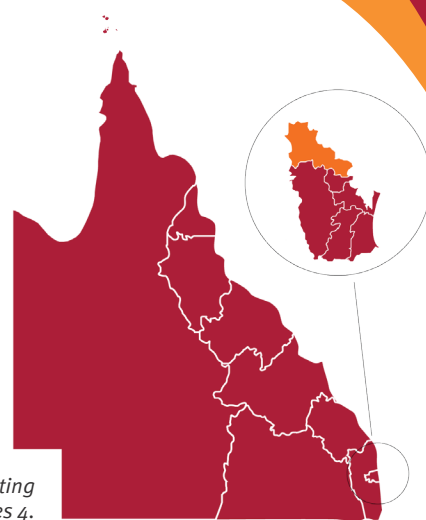

### Free TAFE helps Mickey help others

Michaela 'Mickey' Sykes is drawing her lived experience to support others, enrolling in a Certificate IV in Mental Health through Free TAFE.

After spending 35 years as a seamstress, Mickey took a leap of faith to change careers and study full-time from July 2023.
