

Minor and machinery in nature	<p>To replace the <i>Liquor (Approval of Adult Entertainment Code) Regulation 2002</i> with the <i>Liquor (Approval of Adult Entertainment Code) Regulation 2024</i>, as a consequence of the repeal of the <i>Prostitution Act 1999</i> (Prostitution Act) and <i>Prostitution Regulation 2014</i> (Prostitution Regulation), by the <i>Criminal Code (Decriminalising Sex Work) and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2024</i>.</p> <p>Other minor technical amendments involve:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> removing references to the Prostitution Act and Prostitution Regulation, as the prostitution licensing framework has been repealed; replacing a reference to 'prostitution' with 'commercial sexual services' as the prostitution licensing framework has been repealed; adding a sectional reference to the new definition for 'commercial sexual services' which is defined in section 4 of the <i>Liquor Act 1992</i> (Liquor Act); and updating Liquor Act references by replacing references to 'section 103E' with 'section 103N' for accuracy. <p>The amendments do not change the prescribed behaviour for adult entertainment, or otherwise impact the operation of adult entertainment on liquor licensed premises.</p> <p>Under section 1.5 of the <i>Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy</i>, the Regulation does not require further impact analysis as it is minor and machinery in nature, making consequential amendments that do not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy or new impacts on business, government, or the community.</p>
