- Modifications to the Natural Assets Planning Scheme Policy ensure consistency with the Vegetation Management Act.

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Public Trustee (Fees & Charges Notice)

No. 2, 2004

PART 1 – PRELIMINARY

1. Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Public Trustee* (Fees and Charges Notice) (No.2) 2004.

2. Commencement

This notice commences on 1 July 2004 (the "date of commencement").

3. Definitions

The dictionary in schedule 15 defines particular words used in this notice.

4. Fees

The undermentioned fees, inclusive of GST, shall be payable to the public trustee in respect of the matters mentioned.

5. Remission of fees

While the following fees are intended to apply in the usual case, the public trustee reserves the right, pursuant to the authority granted to him by section 7 of the *Public Trustee Regulation 2001*, to remit any or all of the fees in any particular estate or matter. The public trustee's community service obligations ensure that clients of limited means receive an appropriate standard of service at a reduced cost and this will be achieved by exercising the authority in section 7.

PART 2 – DECEASED ESTATES

6. Application of part 2

This part applies to estates and matters accepted for administration on or after the date of commencement.

7. Acting as personal representative or administrator

- (1) Subject to subsections 3 and 4, the fee payable for acting as personal representative or administrator under part 3 of the Act are stated in schedule 1;
- (2) The general administration activities and duties for acting under this section are stated in schedule 3;
- (3) Subject to subsection 4, the minimum fee payable under this section is \$1037;
- (4) Where the only action necessary is a transmission application in respect to the deceased's real property, the fee payable is \$619.

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8. Acting as agent for an executor

- (1) Subject to subsection (2) the fee payable for acting as agent for an executor to administer the estate of a deceased person is stated in schedule 1.
- (2) Where the only action necessary is a transmission application in respect to the deceased's real property, the fee payable is \$619.

9. Land dealing – held as joint tenants

The fee payable for acting on the instructions of a surviving joint tenant to record the death of a joint owner of real property is \$381.

10. Special fees

The provisions of part 13 shall apply in addition to the fees set out in this part.

11. Deceased beneficiary

The fee payable for distributing the funds held for a deceased beneficiary shall be:

- (a) Where the funds held are distributed following the production of probate or a grant of administration \$208;
- (b) In all other cases, calculated at the hourly rate, with a minimum fee of \$208 and a maximum fee of \$690.

PART 3 – DISABILITY SERVICES

12. Application of part 3

Part 3 applies where the public trustee is:

- (a) Appointed as administrator under the Guardianship and Administration Act 2000 for all financial matters for the adult;
- (b) Acting as administrator under an interim order made under section 129 of the *Guardianship and Administration Act 2000*;
- (c) Acting as manager under part 6 of the Act;
- (d) Appointed as administrator under the *Guardianship and Administration Act* 2000 for a financial matter limited to an award or settlement in favour of the adult.

13. Fees payable under section 12 (a) or (b) or (c)

The annual fees payable under section 12 (a) or (b) or (c) are:

- (a) A personal financial administration fee stated in schedule 4;
- (b) An asset management fee stated in schedule 6; and
- (c) A fee for each real property and other place of residence stated in schedule 6.

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14. Fees payable under section 12 (d)

The fees payable under section 12 (d) are:

- (a) An initial establishment fee of \$3931; and
- (b) Annual fees payable of: -
 - (i) A personal financial administration fee stated in schedule 5;
 - (ii) An asset management fee stated in schedule 6; and
 - (iii) A fee for each real property and other place of residence stated in schedule 6.

15. Remission of fee for principal place of residence

Where a property is occupied as the client's principal place of residence the fee applicable to that property shall be remitted.

16. Special fees

The provisions of part 13 shall apply in addition to the fees set out in this part.

17. Disposal of property on death

The fee payable for the disposal of property on death under section 88 of the Act shall be:

- (a) Where the property held is disposed of following the production of probate or a grant of administration \$208;
- (b) In all other cases, calculated at the hourly rate, with a minimum fee of \$208 and a maximum fee of \$690.

PART 4 – AGENCIES

18. Application of part 4

Part 4 applies where the public trustee:

- (a) Acts as attorney under a financial power of attorney;
- (b) Acts as attorney under section 147 of the Act;
- (c) Acts as attorney during the suspension of an enduring power of attorney under section 196 of the *Guardianship and Administration Act 2000*;
- (d) Acts as attorney under a personal power of attorney.

19. Fee payable under this part

Subject to section 20 the fee payable shall be:

- (a) Acting under sections 18(a) or (b) as stated in part 3;
- (b) Acting under sections 18(c) or (d) as calculated at the hourly rate.

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20. Fee negotiated between the principal and the public trustee

The public trustee may reach an agreement in writing with the principal as to the fee payable for acting under this part.

21. Special fees

The provisions of part 13 shall apply in addition to the fees set out in this part.

22. Disposal of property on death

The fee payable for the disposal of property on death under section 88 of the Act shall be:

- (a) Where the property held is disposed of following the production of probate or a grant of administration \$208;
- (b) In all other cases, calculated at the hourly rate, with a minimum fee of \$208 and a maximum fee of \$690.

PART 5 – TRUSTS

23. Application of part 5

Part 5 applies where the public trustee is appointed or otherwise becomes trustee of property.

24. Fees payable in trusts other than testamentary trusts

Except where the trust instrument provides otherwise, the annual fees payable for acting as trustee of trusts, other than testamentary trusts, are:

- (a) A service level fee stated in schedule 7;
- (b) An asset management fee stated in schedule 6; and
- (c) A fee for each real property and other place of residence stated in schedule 6.

25. Remission of fee for principal place of residence

Where trust property is occupied as the beneficiary's principal place of residence the fee applicable to that property shall be remitted.

26. Fees payable for testamentary trusts

The fees payable for acting as trustee of a testamentary trust:

- (1) The annual fees payable for the duration of a life or limited interest are:
 - (a) A service level fee stated in schedule 8;
 - (b) An asset management fee stated in schedule 6; and
 - (c) A fee for each real property and other place of residence stated in schedule 6.

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- (2) The fees payable on the cessation of the life or limited interest are stated in schedule 1.
- (3) Where there is no life or limited interest forming part of the trust the annual fees payable for the duration of the trust are:
 - (a) A service level fee stated in schedule 7;
 - (b) An asset management fee stated in schedule 6; and
 - (c) A fee for each real property and other place of residence stated in schedule 6.

27. Remission of fee in testamentary trusts for principal place of residence

Where trust property is occupied by the person entitled to a life or limited interest under the trust or as a beneficiary of the trust as that person's principal place of residence, the fee applicable to that property shall be remitted.

28. Special fees

The provisions of part 13 shall apply in addition to the fees set out in this part.

PART 6 – PRISONERS

29. Application of part 6

Part 6 applies where the public trustee is administering the property of prisoners under part 7 of the Act.

30. Fee payable under this part

The fee payable under this part shall be calculated at the hourly rate.

PART 7 - TAXATION SERVICES

31. Application of part 7

Part 7 applies to the taxation services provided by the public trustee.

32. Fees payable

Fees calculated at the hourly rate shall apply for the following taxation services:

- (a) Preparation and lodgement of personal and trust income tax returns and other tax documents, including checking of assessments;
- (b) Preparation of partnership and business accounts together with the preparation and lodgement of the relevant taxation returns;
- (c) Conducting research and providing taxation advice;
- (d) Preparation and lodgement of regular Business Activity Statements subject to a minimum annual fee of \$119;

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- (e) The reconstruction of asset registers required for Capital Gains Tax purposes where such registers were not properly maintained by the deceased or client prior to the public trustee's administration;
- (f) Setting up and maintaining Capital Gains Tax registers during the public trustee's administration or management.

PART 8 - PROPERTY SERVICES

33. Application of part 8

Part 8 applies to the property management, valuation, auctioneering and related services provided by the public trustee.

34. Property management fee

The fee payable for acting as property manager is stated in schedule 9.

35. Valuation fee

The fee payable for carrying out valuation services is stated in schedule 10.

36. Auctioneers and agents commission

The commission payable for acting as auctioneer or selling agent is stated in schedule 11.

37. Agreed fee or conjunction fee

The public trustee may negotiate a fee with the principal or accept a lower fee when acting in conjunction with another agent.

PART 9 - INVESTMENT SERVICES

38. Application of part 9

Part 9 applies to the investment services provided by the public trustee.

39. Negotiation of investments

The fee payable for negotiating and arranging investment of funds, other than in the Public Trustee Investment Funds is stated in schedule 12 and shall apply for the term of such investment.

40. Managing the Public Trustee Investment Funds

- 40.1 Entry Fee
- (a) For investments made by the public trustee in the capacity, either solely or jointly as administrator, personal representative, trustee or attorney Nil;
- (b) In all other cases, an entry fee for the Public Trustee Investment Fund shall be negotiated with the public trustee and not exceed 4.4% of the value of the funds invested;
- (c) Entry fee may be amortised over a four-year period.
- 40.2 Management Fee

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- (a) The fee for the management of the Public Trustee Investment Fund inclusive of all charges and outgoings shall be at a rate not exceeding 2.15% (including GST) per annum of the market value of the funds;
- (b) The management fee payable shall be calculated on a date of valuation determined by the public trustee each month and paid monthly in arrears.

41. Custodial trustee

The fee payable for acting as custodial trustee under the *Managed Investments Act 1998(Cwth)* or the *Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993 (Cwth)* shall be agreed between the parties.

42. Corporate trustee services

The fee payable for providing corporate trustee services in commercial business trusts shall be agreed between the parties.

PART 10 - SPECIAL FUNCTIONS OF A PUBLIC NATURE

43. Application of part 10

Part 10 applies to the functions of the public trustee outlined in part 5 of the Act.

44. Sanction under Section 59

The fee payable for a sanction by the public trustee of a compromise of actions by or on behalf of persons under a legal disability is stated in schedule 14.

45. Section 61 and 62

- 1. Subject to subsection 2, the fee payable for exercising powers under sections 61 and 62 of the Act shall be calculated at the hourly rate.
- 2. Where the public trustee acts under sections 61 or 62 of the Act prior to the acceptance for administration of an estate the minimum fee is \$246, in all other cases, the minimum fee is \$328.

46. Audit of trusts

The fee payable for the audit of a trust under section 60 of the Act shall be calculated at the hourly rate.

PART 11 -UNCLAIMED MONEYS AND UNCLAIMED PROPERTY

47. Application of part 11

Part 11 applies to the functions of the public trustee as outlined in part 8 of the Act.

48. Unclaimed property

The fee payable to administer unclaimed property pursuant to part 8 division 2 of the Act shall be calculated at the hourly rate.

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49. Unclaimed moneys and unclaimed superannuation

The fee payable to receive and hold unclaimed moneys and unclaimed superannuation pursuant to part 8 division 1 of the Act and moneys held unclaimed on behalf of estates and trusts and transferred to the unclaimed moneys fund pursuant to section 116 of the Act shall be \$157.

50. Inspecting the register

The fee for inspecting the unclaimed moneys register shall be:

(a) Fee for inspecting the register

\$22 per name searched

(b) Paper copy of details from the register

\$2 per page up to 20 pages

In excess of 20 pages at the hourly rate for the time taken to prepare the paper copy

(c) Providing an electronic copy of register

Charged at the hourly rate for the time taken to prepare and dispatch the electronic copy.

51. Managing the unclaimed moneys fund

The fee for managing the unclaimed moneys fund shall be at the rate of 6.6% per annum on the first \$50,000 of income received and then at the rate of 5.5% per annum on the excess income over \$50,000.

PART 12 - MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

52. Powers of attorney

- 1. Subject to subsection 2, the fee payable for the preparation or revocation of an enduring power of attorney or general power of attorney is stated in schedule 13.
- 2. Where the public trustee is appointed as the primary attorney under a power of attorney, no fee shall be payable for the preparation of the document.

53. Right of the Crown to bona vacantia

The fee payable for an application for the waiver of the rights of the Crown to bona vacantia shall be calculated at the hourly rate with a minimum fee of \$263.

54. Reseal of grant of administration

The fee payable for resealing a grant of administration made outside Queensland or obtaining a grant in Queensland on behalf of an executor or administrator resident outside Queensland where the public trustee does not administer the Queensland estate shall be calculated at the hourly rate.

55. Application under Workcover Queensland Act 1996

The fee payable for making, investigating or prosecuting an application for compensation under section 137 of the *WorkCover Queensland Act 1996* or for

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conducting any appeal or reference under the provisions of that Act shall be calculated at the hourly rate.

56. Disaster appeals fund

- (1) Subject to subsection 2, the fee payable for administering and managing the disaster appeals fund shall be 2.47% of interest received on such moneys held on behalf of the disaster appeals fund in the common fund and 1.1% of other income received.
- (2) No fee shall be charged in respect of moneys paid to or representing the proceeds of property transferred to or vested in the public trustee under the provisions of sections 35B, 35C, or 35D of the *Collections Act 1966*.

PART 13 – SPECIAL FEES

57. Application of hourly charge

- (1) Special fees calculated at the hourly rate shall be payable, when acting in any capacity or carrying out or undertaking any of the activities set out in this part:
 - (a) Arranging and authorising a funeral or cremation for a deceased person where there is no other person able or willing to do so.
 - (b) Providing instructions or other information to the Official Solicitor to the Public Trustee in regard to legal services provided by the Official Solicitor.
 - (c) Undertaking genealogical research to establish entitlements to a deceased person's estate.
 - (d) Dealing with or disposing of household furniture, effects, chattels and jewellery where there is no agreement in writing from the beneficiaries or other persons having a claim.
 - (e) Taking action to deal with or preserve a client's interest in a trust, corporation, business or partnership, including supervising the continuing operations.
 - (f) The collection or payment of considerable debts owing to or by a client at the time of commencement of the public trustee's management or administration.
 - (g) Any other activity undertaken by the public trustee for which no fee has been set in this notice.
- (2) The activities set out in this section are in addition to and not included in the activities set out in schedules 2 and 3.

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PART 14 - TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

DISABILITY SERVICES

58. Definitions

In this part: "pre-commencement fee" is the aggregate of the capital commission charged (adjusted each quarter in line with the increase in the CPI) and the income commission charged to the date of commencement.

"annual management fee" is the personal financial administration fee or trust service level fee plus the asset management fee.

"notional management fee" is the aggregate value calculated as if the annual management fee applicable had been applied since the date the management by the public trustee first commenced.

59. Application

This part applies where the public trustee:

- (a) Is appointed as administrator under the *Guardianship and Administration Act* 2000.
- (b) Acts as manager under part 6 of the Act;
- (c) Acts as attorney under section 147 of the Act;
- (d) Acts as attorney during a suspension of an enduring power of attorney under section 196 of the *Guardianship and Administration Act 2000*;
- (e) Acts as attorney under a personal power of attorney;
- (f) Is appointed trustee of a trust except;
 - (i) where the trust document makes provision for the fee payable to the trustee; or
 - (ii) where the trust is a testamentary trust which provides for a limited or life interest with a gift over.

60. Fee-free period

- (a) A fee-free period will apply where, at 1 December 2001, the value of the pre commencement fee is greater than the notional management fee.
- (b) The fee-free period will be estimated by applying the annual management fee against the difference between the pre-commencement fee and the notional management fee to derive the estimate of time in months that a fee free period will apply.

61. Charging where a fee-free period applicable

(a) The continuing entitlement to a fee-free period will be reassessed each month by applying the annual management fee that would have been payable since the 1 December 2001 had section 60 not applied against the

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difference between the pre-commencement fee and the notional management fee.

(b) No fee will be charged for the month in which the fee-free period expires.

62. Limitation on transitional relief

The fee-free period will not be given after the first of the following:

- (i) the fee-free period has expired; or
- (ii) the expiry of 60 months from 1 December 2001.
