Public Trustee (Fees and Charges Notice) (No.1) 2019

Part 1 Preliminary

Pursuant to s 17 of the Public Trustee Act 1978 (the “Act”) The Public Trustee of Queensland by this gazette notice fixes the fees and charges for the services the public trustee performs or provides.

1 Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Public Trustee (Fees and Charges Notice) (No.1) 2019*

2 Commencement

This notice commences on 1 July 2019 (the “date of commencement”).

3 Revocation of previous notices

All previous fees and charges notices are revoked.

4 Definitions

The dictionary in Schedule 15 defines particular words used in this notice.

5 Fees

The undermentioned fees, inclusive of GST, shall be payable to the public trustee in respect of the matters mentioned.

6 Remission of fees

The fees in this gazette notice apply to the types of services specified herein. However, pursuant to s 8 of the *Public Trustee Regulation 2012* the public trustee may remit any or all of the fees in any particular estate or matter otherwise payable. The public trustee’s approved community service obligations address the ability of clients of limited means to pay fees for the level of service required by them, by exercising the authority in s 8 of the *Public Trustee Regulation 2012* to remit the fees payable by those clients to an appropriate level.

Part 2 Deceased Estates

7 Application of part 2

This part applies to deceased estates and matters accepted for administration on or after the date of commencement.

8 Acting as personal representative or administrator

(1) Subject to subsections (3) and (4), the fee payable for acting as

personal representative or administrator under part 3 of the Act is calculated by applying the total number of "standard units of effort" required to administer the estate in Schedule 2 part A to determine the appropriate service level as specified in Schedule 1.

- (2) The general administration activities and duties for acting under this section are stated in Schedule 3.
- (3) The minimum fee for an estate requiring full administration is \$1,691.95.
- (4) Where the only asset is land solely in the name of the deceased and the only action necessary is a transmission application by death with the original will, the fee payable is \$1,007.90.

9 Acting as agent for an executor

- (1) Subject to subsection (2) the fee payable for acting as agent for an executor to administer the estate of a deceased person is calculated by applying the total number of "standard units of effort" required to administer the estate in Schedule 2 part A to determine the appropriate service level as specified in Schedule 1.
- (2) Where the only action necessary is a transmission application in respect to the deceased's real property, the fee payable is \$1,007.90.

10 Land dealing – held as joint tenants

The fee payable for acting on the instructions of a surviving joint tenant to record the death of a joint owner of real property is \$620.70.

11 Additional Service fees

The public trustee may charge additional service fees for the activities specified in part 13 in addition to the fees fixed in this part.

12 Deceased beneficiary

The fee payable for distributing the funds held for a deceased beneficiary shall be:

- (a) where the funds held are distributed following the production of probate or a grant of administration, \$336.65.
- (b) in all other cases calculated at the hourly rate, with a minimum fee of \$336.65 and a maximum fee of \$1123.50.

Part 3 Disability Services

13 Application of part 3

Part 3 applies where the public trustee is:

- (a) appointed as administrator for a financial matter, under the Guardianship and Administration Act 2000 (the "GAAT Act");
- or

Public Trustee (Fees and Charges Notice) (No.1) 2019

- (a) appointed as manager of the estates of an incapacitated person under part 6 of the Act or acts pursuant to s 79 of the Act.

14 Fees payable under s 12

The annual fees payable under s 12 are:

- (1)(a) Where the public trustee is appointed under chapter 11 part 3 of the GAAT Act as administrator for a financial matter limited to a court sanction of a settlement in favour of an adult:
 - (i) An initial establishment fee of \$6,403.80; and
 - (ii) A personal financial administration fee calculated by applying Schedule 5; or
 - (b) For any other appointment as administrator under the GAAT Act, a personal financial administration fee calculated by applying Schedule 4; or
 - (c) For acting as manager under part 6 of the Act, a personal financial administration fee calculated by applying Schedule 4; and
- (2) An asset management fee calculated by applying Schedule 6; and
 - (3) For each real estate property or other place of residence the fee is prescribed by Schedule 6.

15 Remission of fee for principal place of residence

Where a real estate property is occupied by the client as their principal place of residence the fee prescribed in s 14(3) shall be remitted.

16 Additional Service fees

The public trustee may charge additional service fees for the activities specified in part 13 in addition to the fees fixed in this part.

Part 4 Agencies

17 Application of Part 4

Part 4 applies where the public trustee acts as an attorney under the Powers of Attorney Act 1998 (the "POA Act").

- (a) for financial matters;
- (b) under s 147 of the Act;
- (c) during a period of suspension of an enduring power of attorney under s 35 of the Public Guardian Act 2014;
- (d) for personal and health matters.

18 Fee payable under this part

Subject to s 17 the fee payable shall be:

- (a) for ss 17(a) or (b) appointments, the fees as prescribed by part 3

Public Trustee (Fees and Charges Notice) (No.1) 2019

ss 14 (1)(b), (2) and (3);

(b) for ss 17(c) or (d) appointments, the fee is calculated at the hourly rate.

19 The public trustee and a capable principal may negotiate fees

The public trustee and a capable principal may agree (in writing) on the fees payable for acting for the principal provided that if no agreement is reached the fees will be calculated at the hourly rate.

20 Additional Service fees

The public trustee may charge additional service fees for the activities specified in part 13 in addition to the fees fixed in this part.

Part 5 Trusts**21 Application of part 5**

Part 5 applies where the public trustee is appointed or otherwise becomes trustee of property.

22 Fees payable in trusts other than testamentary trusts

Except where the trust instrument provides otherwise, the annual fees payable for acting as trustee of trusts, other than testamentary trusts and DGR charitable trusts, are:

- (a) a service level fee calculated by applying Schedule 7;
- (b) an asset management fee calculated by applying Schedule 6; and
- (c) for each real estate property, the fee is prescribed by Schedule 6.

23 Remission of fee for principal place of residence

Where a real estate property held in trust is occupied by the beneficiary as their principal place of residence the fee prescribed in s 22(c) shall be remitted.

24 Fees payable for testamentary trusts

The fees payable for acting as trustee of a testamentary trust:

- (1) The annual fees payable for the duration of a life or limited interest are:
 - (a) a service level fee calculated by applying Schedule 8;
 - (b) an asset management fee calculated by applying Schedule 6; and
 - (c) for each real estate property, the fee is prescribed by Schedule 6.
- (2) The fees payable on the cessation of the life or limited interest are calculated by applying the total number of "standard units of effort" required to complete the administration of the estate in Schedule 2 Part B to determine the appropriate service level as specified in Schedule 1;

Public Trustee (Fees and Charges Notice) (No.1) 2019

(3) Where there is no life or limited interest forming part of the trust the annual fees payable for the duration of the trust are:

- (a) a service level fee calculated by applying Schedule 7;
- (b) an asset management fee calculated by applying Schedule 6; and
- (c) for each real estate property, the fee is prescribed by Schedule 6.

25 Remission of fee in testamentary trusts for principal place of residence

Where a real estate property is occupied by:

- (a) a person who is entitled to a life or limited interest under the trust, or
- (b) the beneficiary under the trust as their principal place of residence

the fee prescribed in s 24(1) (c) or 24(3) (c) shall be remitted.

26 Additional Service fees

The public trustee may charge additional service fees for the activities specified in Part 13 in addition to the fees fixed in this part.

27 DGR Charitable Trusts

The fee payable under this part shall be calculated at the hourly rate.

30 Application of Part 7

Part 7 applies to the taxation services provided by the public trustee.

31 Fees payable

Fees calculated at the hourly rate shall apply for the following taxation

The fee payable for carrying out valuation services is calculated by applying Schedule 10.

The commission payable for acting as auctioneer or selling agent is calculated by applying Schedule 11.

36 Agreed fee or conjunction fee

The public trustee may negotiate a fee with the principal or accept a lower fee when acting in conjunction with another agent.

37 Application of Part 9

Part 9 applies to the investment services provided by the public trustee.

38 Negotiation of investments

The fee payable for negotiating and arranging investment of funds, other

- Giving an indemnity for lost documents;
- Instructing and overseeing the preparation of taxation advices, returns and notices;
- Investigation and dealing with bank accounts held by the deceased as a trustee and where the public trustee does not assume the trust;
- Arranging distribution of funds to beneficiaries;
- Preparation of statements of account;
- Arranging the distribution of funds held for deceased beneficiaries;
- General care and consideration;
- Administering a prepaid funeral account.



1. Transfer of assets to Queensland Rail (s 78(1)(b)(ii) and (o))

1.1. Moreton Bay Rail Line

Transfer to Queensland Rail the State's right, title, interest, obligations and liabilities in the MBRL Assets at the Effective Time.

1.2. Park and Ride facilities

Transfer to Queensland Rail the State's right, title, interest, obligations and liabilities in the Park and Ride Assets at the Effective Time.

1.3 Make provision that at the Effective Time:

- (a) the MBRL Assets are transferred to Queensland Rail on an as is and where is basis; and
- (b) Queensland Rail will be responsible for all matters relating to the Transferred Assets.

1.4 Confirm that:

in compliance with Interpretation 1038 and FRR 4F, the Transferred Assets are to be accounted for:

- (a) as a withdrawal of contributed equity from the Department of Transport and Main Roads and an injection of contributed equity for Queensland Rail; and
- (b) at the carrying amount of the Transferred Assets (as reported by the Department of Transport and Main Roads) at the Effective Time.

2.1 Transfer of records

Transfer to Queensland Rail the State's right, title, interest, obligations and liabilities in all records relating to the Transferred Assets as at the Effective Time (noting that, by reason of section 83 of the Act, to the extent such transfers are a disposal of Public Records for the purposes of the Public Records Act 2002, such disposal is made under legal authority).

2.2 Process to facilitate transfer of records

Make provision that, as soon as reasonably practical but no later than six months after the Effective Time, the State must deliver or make available to Queensland Rail (to the extent not previously provided) all existing records relating to the Transferred Assets referred to in paragraph 2.1 (a) above, to the extent they are in the possession or control of the State and can be readily made available and provided to Queensland Rail.

3. Provisions to facilitate the transfer of contracts to Queensland Rail (s 78(1)(b) (j) and (o))**3.1. Collaborative Project Agreement**

- (a) Transfer to Queensland Rail the State's right, title, interest, obligations and liabilities arising under or relating to the CPA, effective at the Effective Time.
- (b) Make provision that:
 - (i) Queensland Rail is to be taken to be a party to the CPA in place of the State effective at the Effective Time;
 - (ii) each reference to the State in the CPA is, to the extent possible and if the context permits, taken to be a reference to Queensland Rail.

3.2. Ancillary Instruments (s 78(1)(b), (j) and (o))

- (a) To the extent that they may be lawfully transferred and are not otherwise transferred under this Transfer Notice, transfer to Queensland Rail the State's right, title, interest, obligations and liabilities arising under or relating to Ancillary Instruments that relate to the Transferred Assets, effective at the Effective Time.
- (b) From the Effective Time, to the extent that any warranty or contractual or statutory right relating to the construction or operation of the Transferred Assets is not transferred or is not capable of transfer, make provision that the State holds such rights on behalf of and for the benefit of Queensland Rail and, if requested by Queensland Rail in writing, must enforce such rights at the cost of Queensland Rail.
- (c) Make provision that Queensland Rail must not do or permit anything to occur that would void any warranty or contractual or statutory right relating to the construction or operation of the Transferred Assets that are not transferred or capable of transfer.

4. Legal proceedings and liabilities (s 78(1)(i) and (o))

4.1. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Transfer Notice, rights, interests, obligations and, liabilities which have given, or may give, rise to a cause of action under or in relation to:

- (a) any of the Transferred Assets; or
- (b) any contract, agreement or other instrument for which this Transfer Notice makes provision,

are retained or transferred (as the case may be) such that any demands, claims and legal proceedings that are being, or may be, made or taken by or against the State in respect of any of the Transferred Assets or any such contract, agreement or instrument, make provision that any demands, claims and legal proceedings:

- (c) are to be continued, made or taken by or against the State if the cause of action accrues before the Effective Time; and
- (d) are to be made or taken by or against Queensland Rail if the cause of action accrues on or after the Effective Time.

4.2. Make provision that the State and Queensland Rail must execute such instruments and make such applications to such relevant courts as is necessary to record the substitution of Queensland Rail for the State with respect to those causes of action identified in clause 4.1(d).

5. Further Acts (section 78(1)(o))

Make provision that the State and Queensland Rail must do all things necessary to give effect to the provisions of this Transfer Notice.

6. Definitions and Interpretation

6.1. Definitions

- (c) all contracts, arrangements, understandings, heads of agreement or similar entered into by the State that relate only to the Transferred Assets and which are not transferred pursuant to another provision of this Transfer Notice; and

(d) any indemnity, bank guarantee, security bond, deposit and other securities for the performance of obligations given in favour of the State in respect of any of the Transferred Assets;

“**CPA**” means the Collaborative Project Agreement between TMR and Thiess Pty Limited dated 30 July 2013;

“**Effective Time**” means immediately after midnight at the end of the day on which this Transfer Notice is published;

“**FRR 4F**” means Queensland Treasury Financial Reporting Requirement FRR 4F titled “Equity, Contributions by Owners and Distributions to Owners”;

“**Interpretation 1038**” means Australian Accounting Standards Board Interpretation 1038 titled “Contributions by Owners to Wholly-Owned Public Sector Entities”;

“**MBRL Assets**” means the assets listed in Schedule 1 (MBRL Assets Schedule);

“**Park and Ride Assets**” means the assets listed in Schedule 2 (Park and Ride Assets Schedule);

“**Public Record**” has the meaning given in section 6(1) of the *Public Records Act 2002*;

“**Queensland Rail**” means Queensland Rail Limited, ABN 71 132 181 090;

“**State**” means the State of Queensland, represented by the Department of Transport and Main Roads; and

“**Transferred Assets**” means the MBRL Assets and Park and Ride Assets.

6.2. Interpretation

- (a) Where a document is stated to have been signed by us for identification purposes it is signed in accordance with and for the purposes of s 78 of the Act, with such documents being available for inspection at Department of Transport and Main Roads, Floor 1, 61 Mary Street, Brisbane, Brisbane.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Transfer Notice, nothing effects a transfer of any asset or property of any kind whatsoever which is physically outside the State of Queensland as at the time that the transfer effected by this Transfer Notice would otherwise take effect.
- (c) Unless expressly otherwise provided, nothing in this Transfer Notice affects other agreements or arrangements between the State and Queensland Rail.
- (d) A reference to a “Schedule” is to a document so named and signed by us for identification purposes.
- (e) A provision of this Transfer Notice held by a court or judge to be beyond power to be invalid or unenforceable is to be disregarded or severed and the remaining provisions of this transfer notice will continue to have effect.

2. SunWater Limited ACN 131 034 985 (SunWater) is directed to comply with this notice when charging rural irrigation water prices for the specified tariff groups for all SunWater bulk water supply schemes and distribution systems for 2019-20.
3. SunWater is also directed to comply with this notice in relation to charging for supplemented water allocations purchased and held by the Commonwealth Environmental Water Holder in SunWater bulk water supply schemes.

Prices for SunWater bulk water supply schemes and distribution systems**Bulk Water Supply Schemes**

4. 7. The Fixed (Part C) price for 2019-20 for Burdekin – Gladys Lagoon (other than Natural Yield) is the 2018-19 price as set under the *SunWater Rural Water Pricing Direction Notice (No.1) 2018* increased by 2.5% plus an additional \$1.26 per megalitre in order to reach the cost reflective price².

For the avoidance of doubt in implementing paragraphs 6 and 8, if a distribution system tariff group is in a distribution system that during 2018-19 or 2019-20 transfers to a local customer owned company or co-operative, following that transfer the tariff group is to be removed from the list of tariff groups for distribution systems.

Pricing arrangement for the Commonwealth Environmental Water Holder

10. For all supplemented water allocations purchased and held by the Commonwealth Environmental Water Holder, SunWater will charge the prices specified in paragraph 4.

Termination fees – Distribution Systems

11. For 2019-20, rural irrigation termination fees for SunWater distribution systems are 2018-19 fees as set under the *SunWater Rural Water Pricing Direction Notice (No.1) 2018* increased by 2.5%³.
12. The rural irrigation termination fees are the maximum SunWater can charge. SunWater may decide to charge a fee that is lower than the rural irrigation termination fee specified in paragraph 11.

Water harvesting charges

Burdekin-Haughton Distribution System

13. The water harvesting charges for the Burdekin Distribution System are -
- (a) for 2019-20, 2018-19 prices as set under the *SunWater Rural Water Pricing Direction Notice (No.1) 2018* increased by 2.5%⁴, and
- (b) a fee if set by SunWater and determined in the market.

Drainage charges

14. The drainage charges for relevant SunWater distribution systems (Emerald and Burdekin) are as prescribed under Schedule 16 of the *Water Regulation 2016*.

Drainage diversion charges

15. The drainage diversion charges for relevant SunWater distribution systems (Emerald and Burdekin) are –
- (a) for 2019-20, 2018-19 charges as set under the *SunWater Rural Water Pricing Direction Notice (No.1) 2018* increased by 2.5%⁵
- (b) with the exception that in Emerald, all diversion greater than 100 mega litres will be charged at the rate nominated for 2-100 mega litres.

Non-price directions

16. SunWater is directed to comply with the requirements of **Schedule 1**.

RECOGNISING that people with disability are equal citizens and have the right to the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms, including respect for their inherent dignity and individual autonomy.

AND that people with disability have the same rights as other members of Australian society to live and participate in safe environments free from violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation.

AND all forms of violence against, and abuse, neglect and exploitation of, people with disability are abhorrent.

AND Australia has international obligations to take appropriate legislative, administrative and other measures to promote the human rights of people with disability, including to protect people with disability from all forms of exploitation, violence and abuse under the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

AND to give effect to those obligations and broader responsibilities to all Australians, all Australian Governments provide funding and services for people with disability, and have implemented laws to protect and enhance the wellbeing of people with disability.

AND it is important that violence against, and abuse, neglect and exploitation of, people with disability in all settings and contexts are exposed and examined, including through the sharing of individual experiences.

AND it is important that people with disability are central to processes that inform best practice decision making on what all Australian Governments and others can do to prevent and respond to violence against, and abuse, neglect and exploitation of, people with disability.

AND all Australian Governments have expressed their support for, and undertaken to cooperate with, your inquiry.

NOW THEREFORE We do by these Our Letters Patent issued in Our name by Our Governor in and over Our State of Queensland acting by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our State of Queensland and in pursuance of the *Commissions of Inquiry Act 1950* and all other powers him thereunto enabling HEREBY APPOINT YOU to be Commissioners to inquire into the following matters:

- (a) what governments, institutions and the community should do to prevent, and better protect, people with disability from experiencing violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation, having regard to the extent of violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation experienced by people with disability in all settings and contexts;
- (b) what governments, institutions and the community should do to achieve best practice to encourage reporting of, and effective investigations of and responses to, violence against, and abuse, neglect and exploitation of, people with disability, including addressing failures in, and impediments to, reporting, investigating and responding to such conduct;
- (c) what should be done to promote a more inclusive society that supports the independence of people with disability and their right to live free from violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation;
- (d) any matter reasonably incidental to a matter referred to in paragraphs (a) to (c) or that you believe is reasonably relevant to your inquiry.

AND We direct you to make any recommendations arising out of your inquiry that you consider appropriate, including recommendations about any policy, legislative, administrative or structural reforms.

AND, without limiting the scope of your inquiry or the scope of any recommendations arising out of your inquiry that you may consider appropriate, We direct you, for the purposes of your inquiry and recommendations, to have regard to the following matters:

- (e) all forms of violence against, and abuse, neglect and exploitation of, people with disability, whatever the setting or context;
- (f) all aspects of quality and safety of services, including informal supports, provided by governments, institutions and the community to people with disability, including the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and the NDIS Quality and Safeguarding Framework agreed by all Australian Governments in 2017;
- (g) the specific experiences of violence against, and abuse, neglect and exploitation of, people with disability are multilayered and influenced by experiences associated with their age, sex, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, intersex status, ethnic origin or race, including the particular situation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and culturally and linguistically diverse people with disability;
- (h) the critical role families, carers, advocates, the workforce and others play in providing care and support to people with disability;
- (i) examples of best practice and innovative models of preventing, reporting, investigating or responding to violence against, and abuse, neglect or exploitation of, people with disability;
- (j) the findings and recommendations of previous relevant reports and inquiries.

AND We further declare that you are not required by these Our Letters Patent to inquire, or to continue to inquire, into a particular matter to the extent that you are satisfied that the matter has been, is being, or will be, sufficiently and appropriately dealt with by the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety, another inquiry or investigation, or a criminal or civil proceeding.

AND, without limiting the scope of your inquiry or the scope of any recommendations arising out of your inquiry that you may consider appropriate, We direct you, for the purposes of your inquiry and recommendations, to consider the following matters, and We authorise you, as you consider appropriate, having regard to the date by which you are required to submit your final report, to take (or refrain from taking) any action arising out of your consideration:

- (k) the need to establish accessible and appropriate arrangements for people with disability, and their families, carers and others, to engage with your inquiry and to provide evidence to you, and share information with you, about their experiences;
- (l) the need to focus your inquiry and recommendations on systemic issues, recognising nevertheless that you will be informed by individual experiences and may need to make referrals to appropriate authorities;
- (m) the need to establish mechanisms to facilitate the timely communication of information, or the furnishing of evidence, documents or things, in accordance with any relevant law, including, for example, for the purpose of enabling the timely investigation and prosecution of offences or assisting an inquiry on a related matter by the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety;
