Geopolitical shifts provide **opportunities** for expansion into new and emerging markets with new trading partners, and present **risks** related to high energy input costs and destabilisation disrupting access to markets and supply chains.

Heightened community awareness of the importance of food security **and biosecurity** provides **opportunities** to explore and implement innovative ways of delivering our services.

Advances in data and digital technologies provide opportunities to improve productivity and profitability through new technologies, artificial intelligence and automation, and **risks** associated with data ownership and information security.

A changing labour market provides an **opportunity** to position the sector as a preferred employer for rewarding careers, and generates **risks** associated with sourcing a skilled workforce at the right time and place.

Climate change presents **opportunities** for new products and markets due to changing spatial distribution of food production systems and risks due to the increasing frequency of extreme climatic events, increasing climate variability and market consequences if greenhouse gas emissions are not reduced.

Consumer focus on positive health and environmental outcomes provides an **opportunity** to capitalise on Queensland's reputation for high quality, ethically produced food and fibre and the risk of losing our competitive advantage if we can't reliably authenticate our ESG credentials.

Changing economic conditions and rising input costs (particularly energy and fertilisers), present a **risk** to the economic viability and international competitiveness of Queensland agribusinesses as well as their ability to supply affordable food to Queenslanders.
