

Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islander peoples hold distinct cultural rights. Section 28 of the *Human Rights Act 2019* recognises and protects these rights in Queensland.

The rights protected by section 28 cover a range of different aspects of culture, including:

- identity and cultural heritage
- language
- kinship ties
- relationship with land, water and resources
- protection of the environment.

Consultation with First Nations peoples is an important first step in understanding how a decision, policy or law may impact on cultural rights.
