## A human rights culture

Protecting human rights in Queensland requires more than just complying with the law. It requires a human rights culture — a pattern of shared attitudes, values and behaviours that influence the policy-making, decisions and practices of government to uphold the human rights of all people.

A culture of human rights requires public entities to understand their duties to respect, protect and promote human rights. It also requires rights holders, people in Queensland, to know their rights and how to take action.
