**Adoption of Planning Scheme and Planning Scheme Policy Amendments to Development Control Plan 1 Kawana Waters 1996 and Caloundra City Plan 2004**

Notice is given in accordance with the *Integrated Planning Act 1997* that on 13 November 2008 the Sunshine Coast Regional Council adopted Planning Scheme and Planning Scheme Policy Amendments to Development Control Plan 1 Kawana Waters 1996 (Round 3A) and Caloundra City Plan 2004 (Round 3B). The adopted amendments will have effect on and from Wednesday 23 December 2009.

**Round 3A**

The purpose and general effect of Round 3A amendments is to provide for the development of the Sunshine Coast University Hospital at Birtinya and relates to Development Control Plan 1 Kawana Waters 1996.

**Round 3B**

The purpose and general effect of Round 3B amendments to Caloundra City Plan 2004 is to:

- Provide for a wider range of uses in the Moffat Beach Business Park compatible with the existing industrial area and surrounding residential areas, incorporating a new Moffat Beach Business Park Planning Scheme Policy;
- Change a portion of the 'Maleny Community Precinct' (Lot 2 on SP 163952, North Maleny Road, Maleny) from a Rural Precinct to Rural Residential Precinct and identify a minimum lot size. This is achieved by amending the Maleny Plateau Planning Area Precinct Map to change a portion of the 'Maleny Community Precinct' from a Rural Precinct to Rural Residential Precinct and amending the Maleny Plateau Planning Area Code Map to identify the Rural Residential Settlement Precinct area as having a minimum lot size of 1500m<sup>2</sup>;
- Apply 'Environmental' amendments across the whole planning scheme area to achieve consistency with the Caloundra City Council Biodiversity Strategy. Amendments have been made to definitions, Planning Area Codes, the Landscaping Code, Overlays Planning Scheme Policy, Landscaping Planning Scheme Policy and Environmental Assessment and Management Planning Scheme Policy.

18. amend provisions relating to development in slope stability areas.
19. amend the applicability provisions of the Dual Occupancy, Multiple Dwelling Units and Aged Persons Housing / Care Code.
20. rezone a former road reserve between Greenwattle and Euston Roads, Glenvale.
21. rezone 164-176 Handley Street.

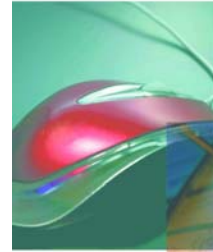

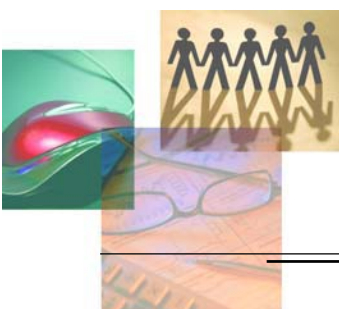

Make sure you check the specific vacancy to find out how each pool works.

**HOW TO APPLY**

When you have found the job you would like to apply for.

1. You can phone for a copy of the information kit or you can download the documents from the Smart Jobs and Careers website at [www.jobs.qld.gov.au](http://www.jobs.qld.gov.au). The information kit will include:
  - the position or job description detailing: background of the department or work area; roles and responsibilities, and selection criteria
  - a job information package, outlining the procedure for preparing and sending in your application, and
  - an application cover sheet.
2. Do your homework - research the agency to understand the background to the job.
3. Prepare your application. This should include your:
  - completed cover sheet (available on jobs online or in the kit mailed to you)
  - covering letter
  - resumé / curriculum vitae
  - names and contact details of (2) referees, and
  - responses to the selection criteria if required.
4. Mail or email your application (Details of where and how are available in either the job description or the job information package).



Check with the job vacancy contact person if you are unsure about how or where to submit your application or how many copies to send. Make sure you send your application by the closing date. If you don't, it may not be accepted. Once your application is received, you will usually be sent a written acknowledgement.

**NOTE 2 :** As prescribed under sections 55, 194, 195 and 196 of the *Public Service Act 2008* and Part 1 of the Appeals Directive (No.: 6/08): an appeal can not be made to the Commission Chief Executive against a decision to appoint or second an officer or other person to Senior Officer levels (SO1 and SO2), and; otherwise, an officer entitled to appeal must satisfy the following requirements.

1. the officer must have applied for a vacancy to which one of the following persons was promoted.
  - an officer of a Department
  - a general employee of a Department with tenure
  - an officer of a Public Service Office
  - a general employee of a Public Service Office with tenure; or
  - a tenured public sector employee of a public sector unit which applies promotional appeal rights under Schedule 1 of the *Public Service Regulation 2008*;
2. the officer's application for the vacancy must have been received before the deadline for the receipt of applications;
3. the officer's notice of appeal must be actually received by the Commission Chief Executive before the deadline for its receipt;
4. the officer must continue to be entitled to appeal.

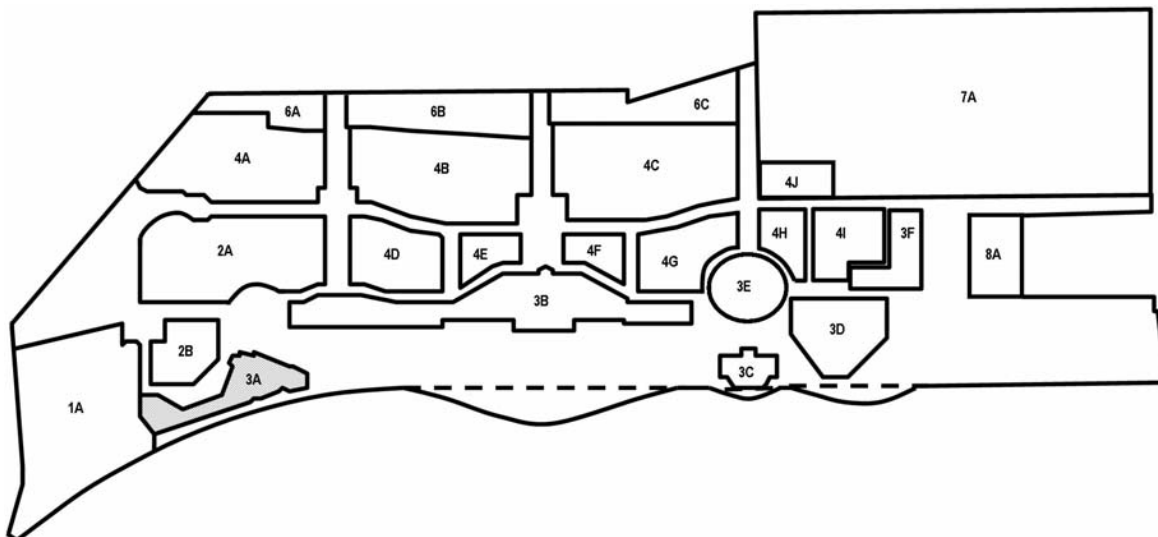


Figure 6.1(a) Key Plan 3A

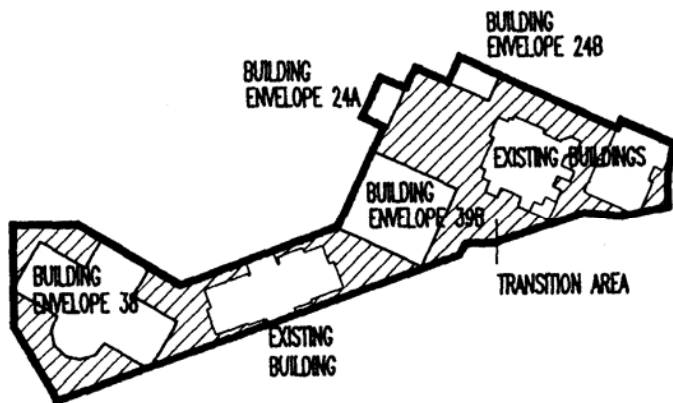
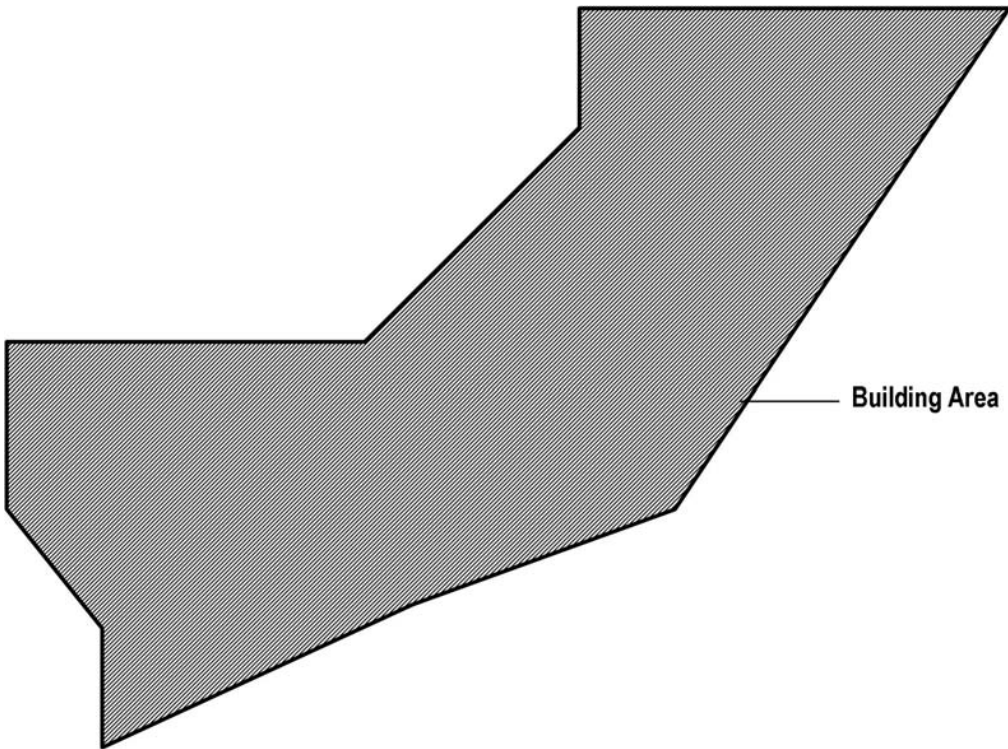
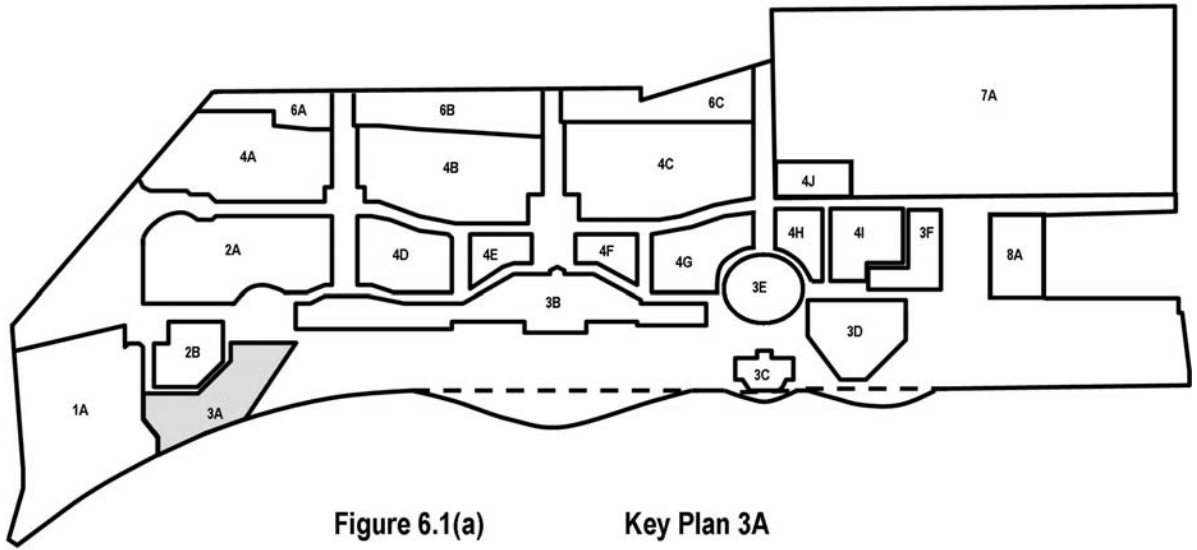


Figure 6.1(b) Development Area 3A Plan

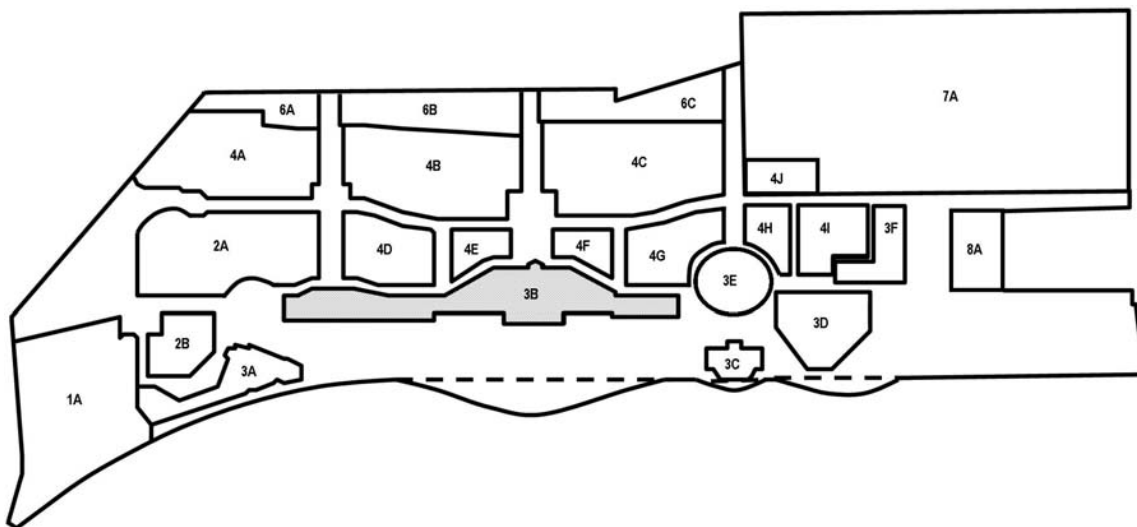


Figure 6.2(a) Key Plan 3B

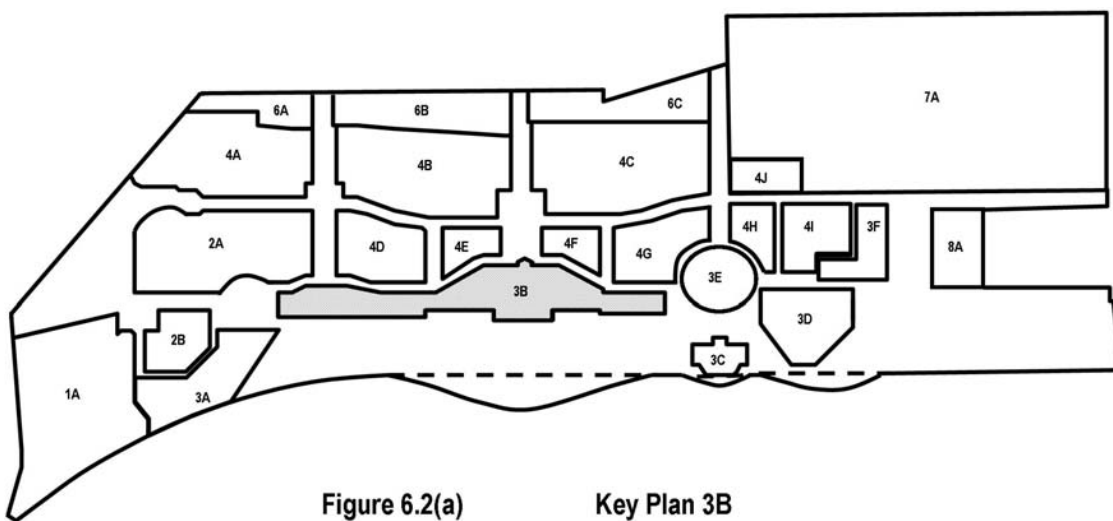


Figure 6.2(a) Key Plan 3B

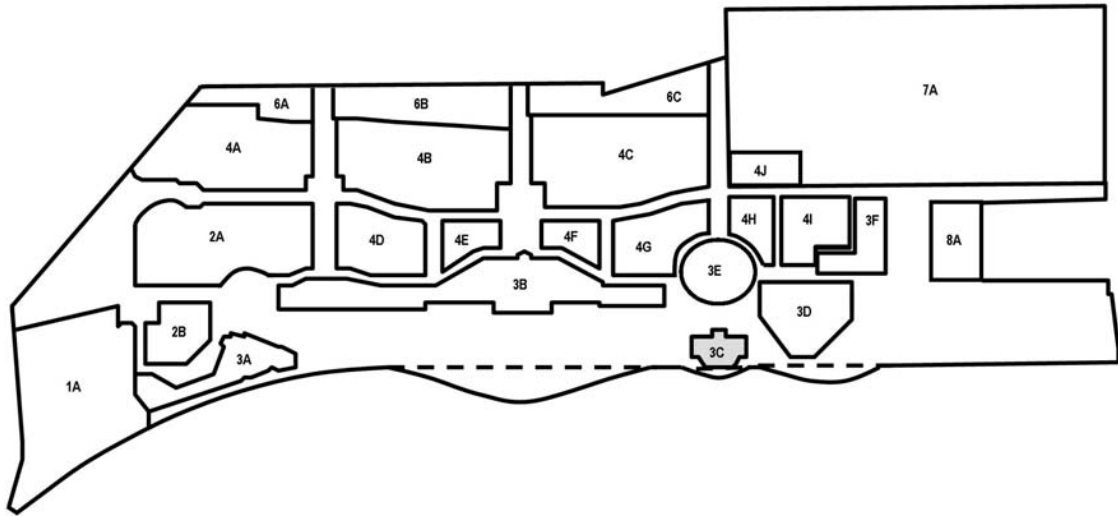


Figure 6.3(a) Key Plan 3C

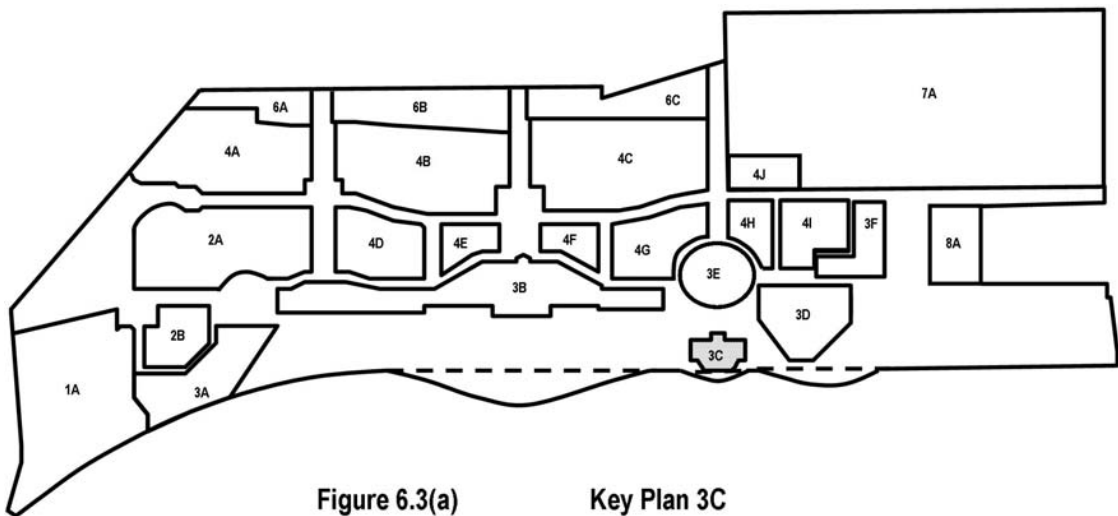
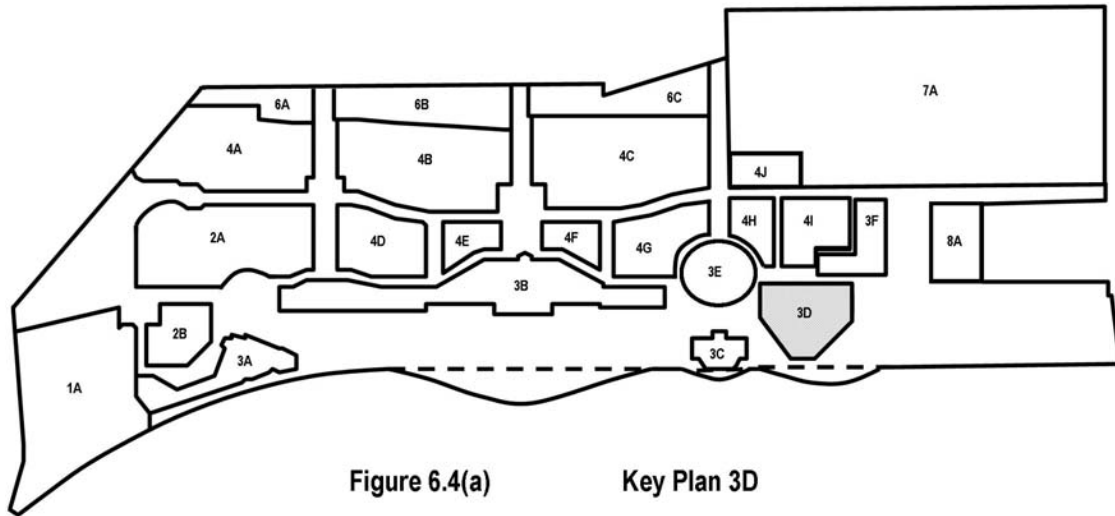
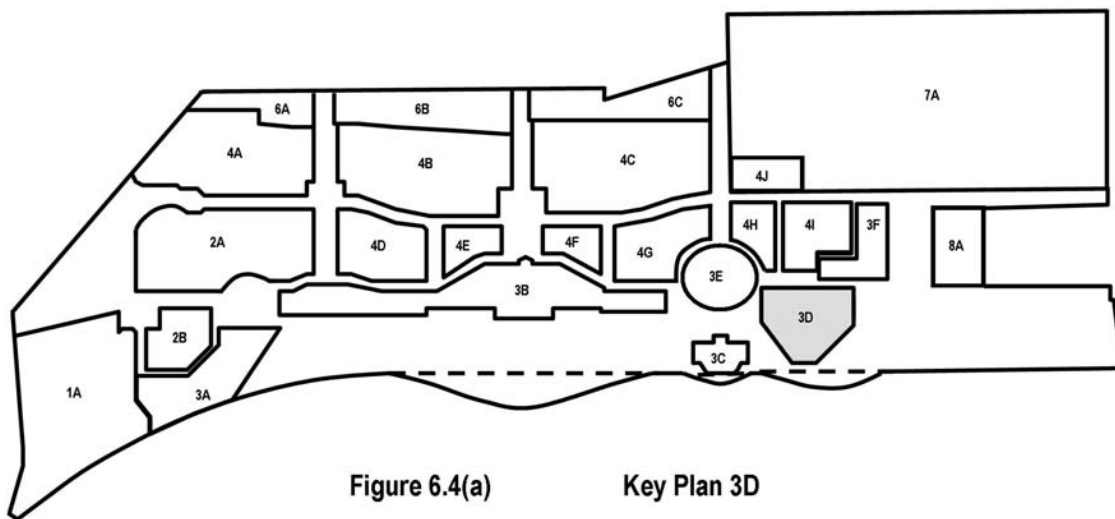


Figure 6.3(a) Key Plan 3C

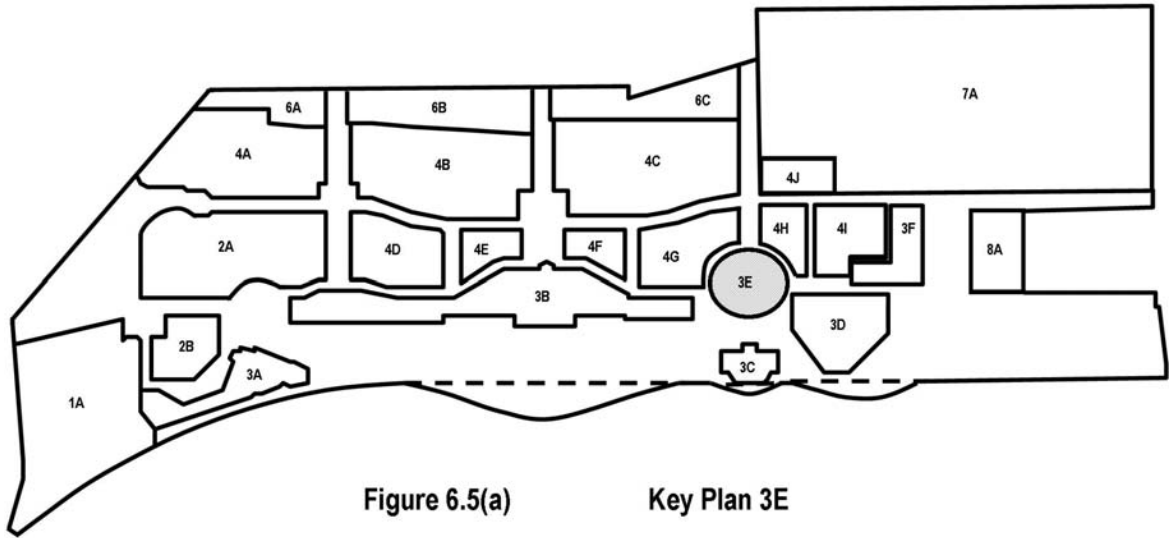

1. The participating agency for the structure plan, master plan applications and structure plan amendments for the master planned area is the chief executive of the entity stated in table 2, column 1 in this declaration.
2. The participating agency's jurisdiction for the structure plan, master plan applications and structure plan amendments for the master planned area is stated in table 2, column 2 in this declaration, but does not include either:
  - a. the referral agency jurisdiction stated in table 2, column 3; or
  - b. the referral agency jurisdiction for an area that, under the structure plan, does not require master planning.
3. Where the structure plan requires that an area undergo master planning, the referral agency's jurisdiction for development applications is confined to those triggers identified in table 2, column 3.
4. Where the structure plan does not require an area to undergo master planning, the participating agency's jurisdiction for development applications in that area is not affected by this declaration.

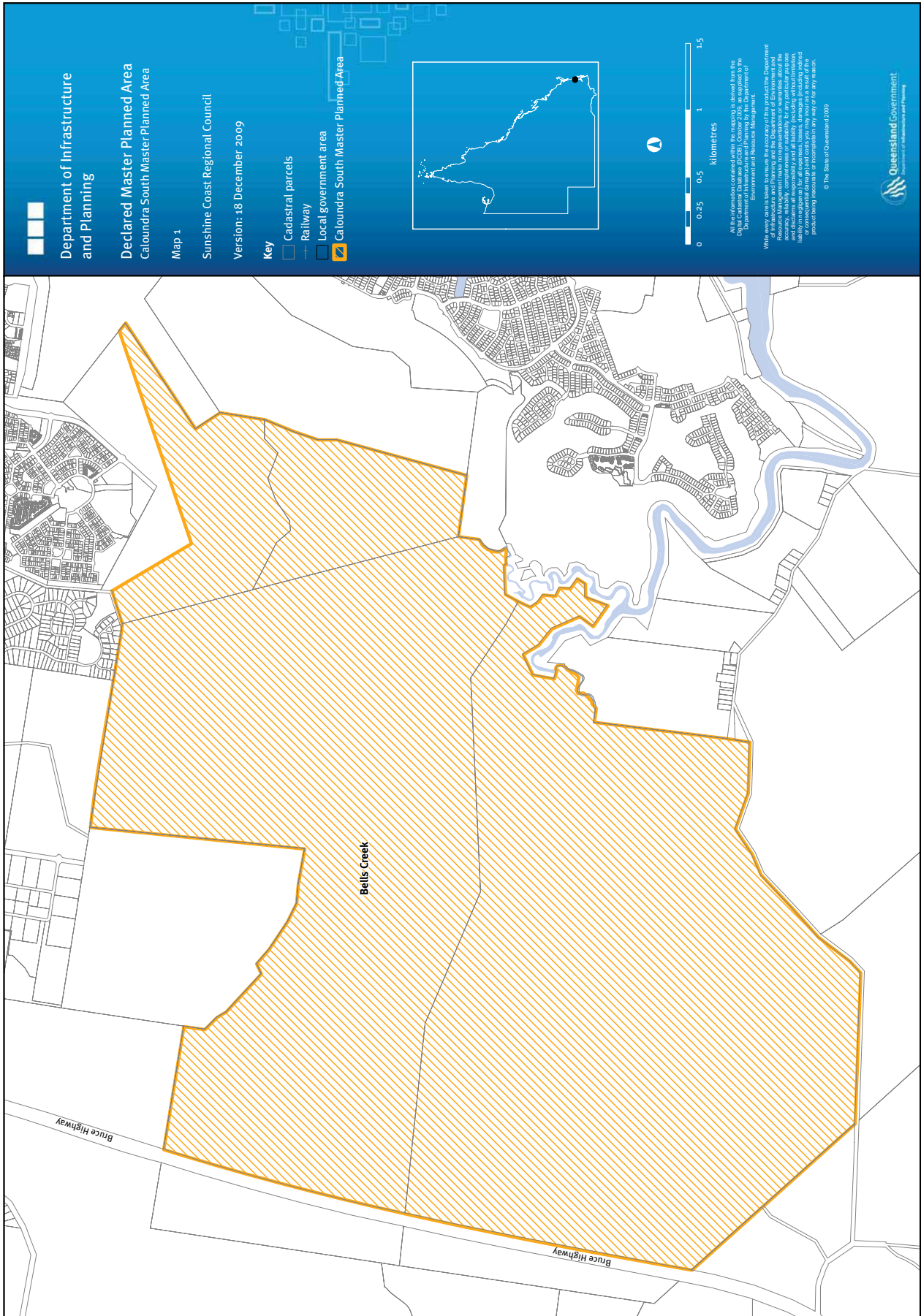

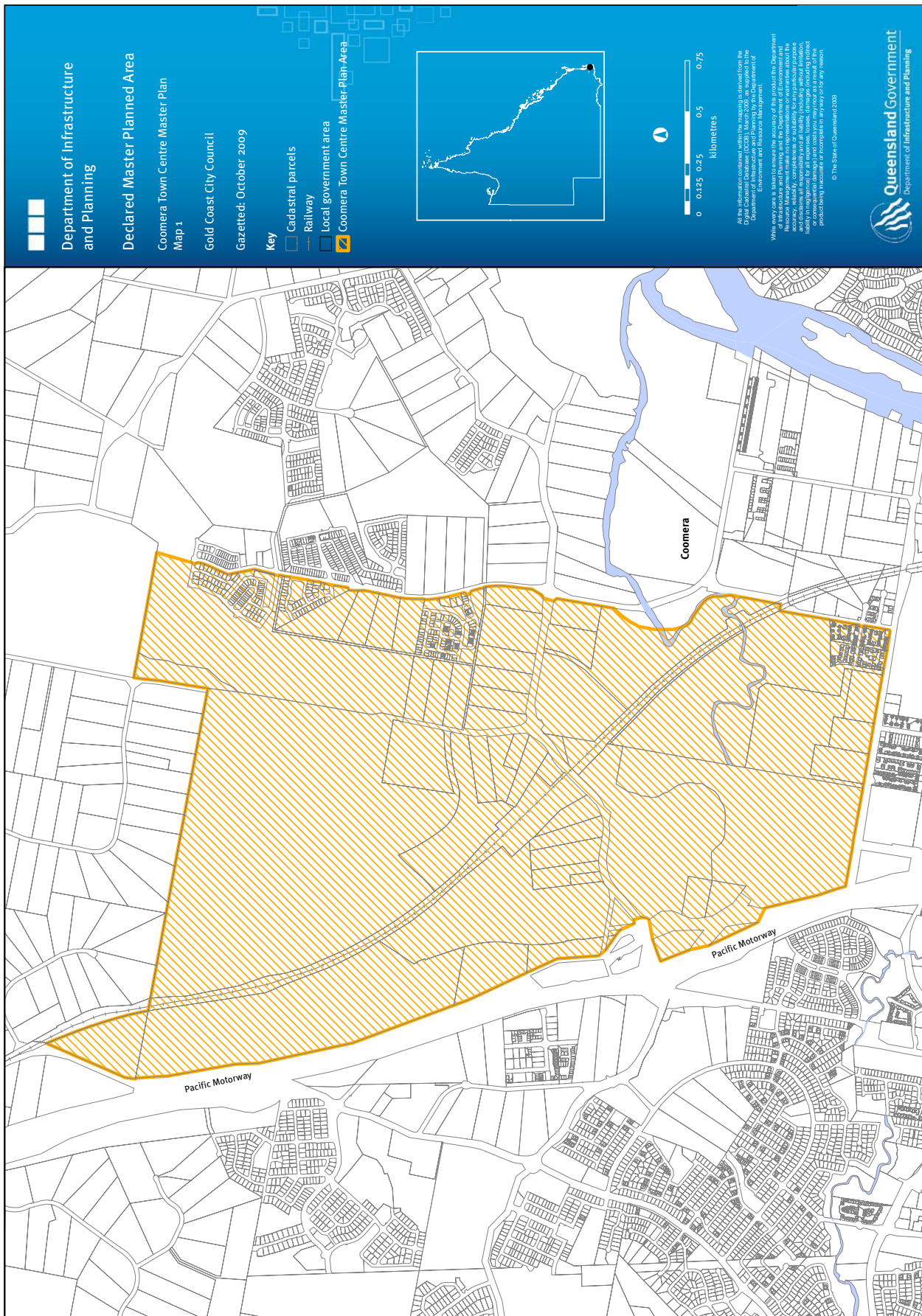

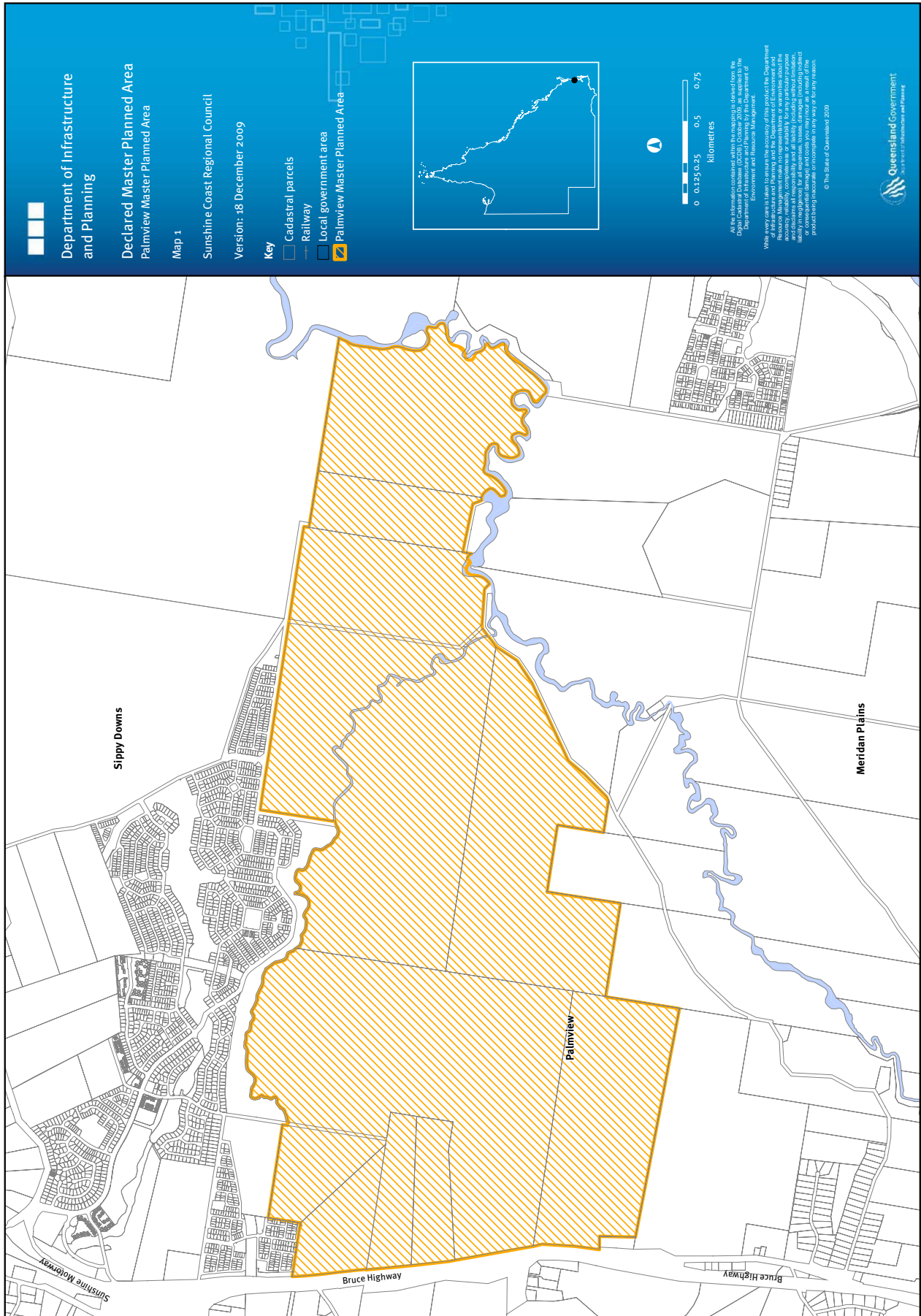
