



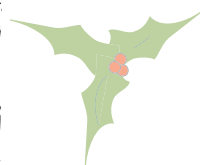

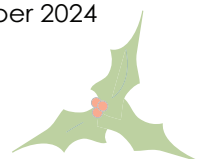

**DECLARATION OF A SCHEME UNDER THE
*ELECTRICAL SAFETY ACT 2002***

I, CARL PORRITT, Director Electrical Equipment Safety, Electrical Safety Office (ESO), Office of Industrial Relations, being the delegate of the regulator acting under Part 2A, Division 3, Section 48J of the *Electrical Safety Act 2002*, hereby declare TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD, Australian Business Number: 75 124 175 953, as a Recognised External Certification Scheme (RECS) to issue Certificates of Conformity for In-Scope electrical equipment Level 3 and Certificates of Suitability for In-Scope electrical equipment Level 2.

The establishment of the RECS is effective from the date of publication of this notice in the Queensland Gazette and is for a period of 2 years.

In accordance with the *Electrical Safety Act 2002*, Part 2A, Division 3, Section 48J and the *Electrical Safety Regulation 2013* – Part 7 In-scope electrical equipment, Division 8 Recognised external certification schemes – I, Carl Porritt Director Equipment Safety, Electrical Safety Office, Office of Industrial Relations, being the delegate of the regulator impose the following conditions on the declared scheme:

Conditions:

1. All certificates issued under the Electrical Equipment Safety System (EESS) by the Recognised External Certification Scheme (RECS) shall be in accordance with these conditions, the Queensland *Electrical Safety Act 2002*, *Electrical Safety Regulation 2013*, and the Equipment Safety Rules as current at the time of issuing the certificate. The RECS shall also adhere to any rulings, interpretations or other guidance material issued by the regulator or as published on a website by the regulator. The RECS shall maintain a quality system in accordance with AS/NZS ISO/IEC 17065 and any scheme system processes accepted by the regulator.
2. The RECS shall not authorise or otherwise permit persons to conduct conformity assessments on certificate applications or make determinations to issue certificates if those person's details were not originally supplied with the application to become a RECS and accepted, or whose details were subsequently supplied to and accepted as suitable by the regulator. All certification processes shall be conducted in Australia or New Zealand unless otherwise authorised by the regulator (temporary travel of authorised persons does not affect this condition).

This includes, once a person is accepted by the regulator to conduct conformity assessments for certification, that person only conducts independent assessments (e.g. without supervision for their part of the process) on equipment to standard(s) once they are considered fully competent by the certification body, using accepted processes for competency in alignment with Clause 6.1.2 of the AS/NZS ISO/IEC 17065 and any scheme system processes accepted by the regulator. The RECS must have a two-stage independent review process of conformity assessment for issuing certificates. This involves, at a minimum, two competent persons accepted by the regulator conducting conformity assessments in accordance with this condition.

3. The RECS shall remain independent of any other parts or processes involved in the in-scope electrical equipment supply chain (that includes: design, manufacture, import, testing, consultancy, sale of in-scope electrical equipment), nor shall they be involved in work of, or act as, a consultant or agent or lobbyist for persons or companies involved in those processes. The RECS will not engage persons to assess applications for certification, or decide on certification, or to be involved in any other processes that relate to assessment or decisions for RECS certification (such as, but not limited to, training of staff, assessment of competency, writing of policies and procedures for certification), if those persons conduct other work in the supply chain of in-scope electrical equipment, unless the person and activity is accepted by the Regulator prior to the activity occurring. Such other work includes, but is not limited to, designing, importing, manufacturing or selling in-scope electrical equipment, consultancy, compiling documents for application for certification, testing of the in-scope electrical equipment or supervising or training of people conducting any of that work.
4. During the period of recognition as a RECS, the RECS shall notify the regulator of any material change related to the information supplied with the related application to become a RECS within two weeks of any such change. Such change includes, but is not limited to: change of ownership, change of directors, change of senior officers of company, change of personnel involved in certification processes as a RECS, relocation of business premises or places where certification processes are conducted, changes to procedures.
5. The RECS shall allow the regulator access to the RECS within 5 working days of a request by the regulator, including participating in random and/or scheduled auditing of files by the regulator. Such access may include making available files, the staff involved in the assessment of an application

for certification, the staff involved in making decisions to issue a certificate, making available the physical location where assessment and decisions for certification occur and all records and documentation relating to any certificate or the process of assessing and issuing of certificates.

6. All certificates issued will be in accordance with the requirements of the Equipment Safety Rules, any rulings, interpretations or other guidance material issued by the regulator or as published on a website by the regulator. Certification shall be based on test reports that meet the requirements of the Equipment Safety Rules, any rulings, interpretation or other guidance material issued by the regulator or as published on a website by the regulator unless otherwise agreed to by the regulator. The RECS shall maintain suitable records of the equipment certified to be able to verify this condition.
7. If a certificate is issued, the RECS shall provide written documentation of the details of certification to the applicant related to that certificate. If the certification status changes the RECS shall give written documentation to the certificate holder of the changed certification status.
8. The RECS shall execute the EESS National Electrical Equipment Certification and Registration Database – Private Certifier Access Agreement. Unless otherwise agreed to by the regulator the RECS shall ensure the relevant equipment certification details are uploaded onto the EESS National Electrical Equipment Certification and Registration Database within 3 days of issue of the certificate. TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD shall onboard to EESS National Electrical Equipment Certification and Registration Database and perform manual upload of certificates (and automatic program interface {API} upload as and when the system and TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD are ready to do so).
9. The RECS shall cancel, suspend or amend any details relating to a certificate within 5 days of written advice from the regulator. The RECS shall update the certificate details on the certification database to align with the status of the certificate within one day of making the required change.
10. The RECS shall cancel, suspend or amend any details relating to a certificate that they identify as having been issued incorrectly (either through failing of certifier or failing of applicant supplied information or failing in the safety standards applied) and inform the regulator within 5 days, in a form acceptable to the regulator.
11. The RECS shall not extend a certificate beyond the initial expiry date without evidence of compliance to the relevant standard as in force at the time of extension unless written exemption to this requirement is given by the regulator, the duration of extension is agreed to by the regulator.
12. Where the RECS issues an additional certificate or modification to an existing certificate to include additional equipment on that certificate the RECS shall ensure the equipment on the certificate falls within the definition of ‘family’ as indicated with the Equipment Safety Rules, and shall ensure the additional equipment listed on the certificate is compliant to the relevant standard listed on the existing certificate.
13. The RECS shall inform the regulator within 5 days, in a form acceptable to the regulator, of any applications for certification that were refused by the RECS.
14. The RECS shall inform the regulator, in a form acceptable to the regulator, within 5 days of becoming aware of equipment certified by the RECS that no longer meets the conditions of the issued certificate.
15. The RECS shall only issue certificates identified as being a RECS issued certificate for equipment within the scope of the RECS declaration. If any status changes (either RECS status or status of declaration listed in the application for RECS) any further certificates issued will only be within the scope of the changed declaration. The RECS will ensure any certificates issued by the RECS that relate to electrical equipment that is not in the scope of the RECS recognition will be clearly identified as not being a certificate issued under the regulators recognition of the RECS and details of the certificate will not be placed on the National Electrical Equipment Certification and Registration Database.
16. A RECS shall not indicate there is authorisation of the use of the RCM mark on electrical equipment. The RCM mark can only be used where that use is consistent with the requirements of AS/NZS 4417 standards and electrical safety legislative requirements. The RECS shall not mandate use of any other marks unless agreed to by the regulator.
17. The RECS shall not make statements or provide advice that may be considered to bring the EESS into disrepute or otherwise cause harm to the implementation and application of the EESS. The RECS shall not offer their ‘interpretation’ of the requirements of the equipment safety rules or requirements for certification issued by the RECS that are inconsistent with the interpretations given by the regulator or as published on a website by the regulator. If any ‘interpretation’ of the Equipment Safety Rules or certification offered by a RECS is found to be inconsistent by the regulator the RECS will take immediate steps to rectify the information previously offered and will not continue to offer that ‘interpretation’.
18. The RECS shall not misrepresent their RECS declaration or offer information in relation to the EESS and/or their declaration as a RECS that may mislead persons in relation to the extent of acceptance of themselves or any other organisation by electrical safety regulators; recognition of certificates not within the scope of the RECS declaration; recognition or endorsement of any other products or services offered by the RECS. The RECS shall not misrepresent to the regulator any details of their organization, or withhold from the regulator any information that may show they do not comply with the requirements to maintain their RECS declaration.
19. Unless the information obtained by a RECS from the regulator has been made public by the regulator, the RECS shall consider the information obtained from the regulator as confidential information and shall not disclose or use the information without the written consent of the regulator unless required by law.
20. The RECS shall not act as a consultant, or offer consultancy, or exclusively offer the services of a consultant or test facility. The only exceptions being the RECS may assist the applicant for certification, who is also a registered responsible supplier, by acting as an authorised representative to register the equipment for that responsible supplier for certificates the RECS have issued to that certificate applicant/responsible supplier; offering general information on electrical equipment safety requirements; details of requirements relating to the RECS process for application for certification; information on the various test facilities or consultants that the applicant may utilise to assist in their application process.
21. The RECS shall not specify particular consultants or test facilities that an applicant for a certificate of conformity or certificate of suitability must use. The RECS shall not indicate, intimate, suggest or otherwise recommend a particular consultant, testing facility or other person/company would be able to give a service that would cause the RECS to reduce the appropriate assessment and verification processes of the RECS. The RECS shall not engage in agreements or advertising of agreements or other activities that may be seen to compromise the independence and impartiality of the RECS in the performance of the RECS function.

22. The RECS shall inform the regulator without delay of any circumstances that may cause the RECS to not be able to perform its functions in accordance with the Equipment Safety Rules, these conditions and Queensland electrical safety legislative requirements.
23. The RECS shall make arrangements such that if the RECS ceases to trade all files relating to certificates issued as a RECS are to be made available to the regulator.
24. These conditions do not in any way inhibit the regulator from exercising powers under the *Electrical Safety Act 2002* or *Electrical Safety Regulation 2013* to amend, revoke or vary conditions or to act on regulators own initiative to vary or impose new conditions. Any variations to the requirements of these conditions shall be in writing and shall form part of these conditions.
25. Disputes as to interpretations or application of the Queensland *Electrical Safety Act 2002*, *Electrical Safety Regulation 2013*, and the Equipment Safety Rules and any rulings, interpretations or other guidance material issued by the regulator or as published on a website by the regulator shall in the first instance be referred to the regulator for consideration.
26. The RECS shall maintain suitable professional indemnity, public liability and business continuity insurances commensurate with the level of risk of work undertaken.
27. The RECS shall, upon request by the regulator for information or a specified report, furnish such reports or information to the regulator within 5 days, or a time longer if agreed by the regulator.
28. A RECS shall not place themselves in a position where a conflict of interest may arise in relation to issuing of certificates. Any real or perceived conflict of interest shall be resolved to the satisfaction of the regulator. As part of maintaining the independence of certification process of a RECS, the RECS shall not be part of any processes to lobby to government or any other body on behalf of requirements or criteria or actions demanded by designers, manufacturers, importers, sellers of in-scope electrical equipment, or bodies who are involved in acting as a consultant or agent or lobbyists for persons or companies involved in those processes. This includes RECS shall not be members of associations formed for the purposes of advancing interests of the above. This does not preclude a RECS being part of an independent association aimed at representing interests of certification bodies or participating on bodies to develop equipment safety standards ('equipment safety standards' does not include the standards related to use of the RCM mark or risk levels of equipment).
- Supplementary conditions for TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD**
- I. For DC Isolators (In-Scope level 3 equipment) TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD to only issue certificates of conformity to AS 60947.3:2023 & AS/NZS 60947.1:2021 (or later editions of those standards),
 - II. For the period of this declaration, TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD to conduct internal audits at least every three months to verify all staff follow all TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD procedures, comply with all conditions of this declaration, comply with AS/NZS ISO/IEC 17065 requirements, and provide reports of those audits to the regulator (ESO) within 1 week of the audit occurring,
 - III. Within the first 3 months after this declaration TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD Advisory Board ("Advisory Committee") to be confirmed as trained (and training details and method and outcome documented) on the EESS and RECS requirements,
 - IV. Within the first 3 months after this declaration TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD to confirm content details of documented training methods used and any training to be via trainers acceptable to the regulator (ESO) for determining competence of staff to assess safety standards and EESS requirements,
 - V. TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD either to not accept test reports from any TUV related entity, or within 6 months of this declaration TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD to confirm they have properly reviewed and documented, and submitted to regulator (ESO) for approval, detailed policy and procedures to address risk to impartiality and independence from accepting test reports for TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD related entities,
 - VI. Within 12 months of this declaration TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD to confirm they have, or develop, a new risk register that addresses each of the risks to impartiality identified to meet clause 4.2 in AS/NZS ISO/IEC 17065 and submit to the regulator (ESO) for approval,
 - VII. Within 18 months of this declaration confirm TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD have, or properly develop, a consistent risk assessment approach to determine the equipment being certified is 'electrically safe'.
 - VIII. The following TUV RHEINLAND AUSTRALIA PTY LTD staff are acceptable to the regulator to conduct EESS RECS assessments in accordance with RECS condition 2:

CASSOWARY COAST REGIONAL COUNCIL – MAKING OF
AMENDING LOCAL LAW**

Name of the local laws

1. This notice may be cited as *Cassowary Coast Regional Council – Amending Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Animal Management and Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2024*.

Commencement

2. This notice commences on the date that it is published in the Gazette.

Making of local laws

3. Pursuant to the provisions of the *Local Government Act 2009* the Cassowary Coast Regional Council (the “Council”) has, by resolution dated the 31 October 2024, made *Amending Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Animal Management and Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2024*.

The amended local laws

4. *Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Animal Management) 2022*.
5. *Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2022*.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1**1. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION****1.1 Definitions**

In this Easement unless the context or subject matter require otherwise:

- (a) Easement Land means that part of the land over which this easement is taken;
- (b) Matter means buildings, structures or other materials or things erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement Land and includes trees and plants within the Easement Land;
- (c) Owner means any person who has an estate, interest, right, power or privilege in, over, or in relation to the land subject to the Easement Land and that person's administrators, assignees and successors; and
- (d) **Relevant Works** means:
 - (i) where the purpose of this Easement is "Sewerage": sewer(s) and/or pipeline(s) for the purpose of conveying sewerage and all kinds of waste through, across or under the Easement Land together with manholes, stopcocks and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments (including pumps and/or pump stations where required) as well as works for the protection and/or support of such things; and
 - (ii) where the purpose of this Easement is "Water Supply": water reticulation mains and/or pipelines for the purpose of conveying water supplied by Unitywater through, across or under the Easement Land together with manholes, stopcocks, meters, pressure control devices, pumps and/or pump stations, water reservoirs, and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments as well as works for the protection and/or support of all such things; and
- (e) **Unitywater** means:
 - (i) The Northern SEQ Distributor-Retailer Authority (trading as Unitywater) established under section 8 of the *South-East Queensland Water (Distribution and Retail Restructuring) Act 2009* and its assignees and successors; and
 - (ii) If the context permits, Authorised Persons.

1.2 Interpretation

In this Easement:

- (a) a reference to a statute includes Orders in Council, Proclamations, Regulations, Rules, Local Laws and Ordinances made under the statute and any statute amending, consolidation or replacing the statute;

- (b) headings have been included for ease of reference and guidance and this Easement is to be construed without reference to them;
- (c) the singular number includes the plural and vice versa;
- (d) words importing a masculine gender includes all other genders; and
- (e) words importing persons include companies and corporations and vice versa;
- (f) if a covenant contained in this Easement is or becomes invalid or unenforceable, the remaining covenants contained in this Easement remain in full force and effect; and
- (g) If a party to this Easement comprises two or more legal entities, the covenants contained in this Easement bind each of them jointly and severally.

2. RIGHTS OF UNITYWATER**2.1 Access**

Where the purpose of this Easement includes Access, the following will apply:

The Owner grants to Unitywater the full and free right and liberty at all times, after the date of this Easement, to enter upon and remain, pass and repass on and over the Easement Land at will and as often as the occasion requires, with employees, agents and contractors and other persons authorised by Unitywater and with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description whatsoever.

Where the purpose of this Easement includes Sewerage or Water Supply or both the following will apply:

2.2 Sewerage or Water Supply or Both

The Owner grants Unitywater the full and free right and liberty at all times, after the date of this Easement, to enter upon the Easement Land for the purposes of constructing and thereafter forever using and maintaining the Relevant Works as it shall from time to time think fit and in so doing, Unitywater by its employees, agents and other persons authorised by Unitywater has the right to:

- (a) construct, install, extend, deepen, widen, cleanse, add to, remove, inspect, maintain and repair the Relevant Works and when and where thought fit by Unitywater to remove and replace the Relevant Works with new Relevant Works (whether of a similar nature to those replaced or not);
- (b) to change the size and number of any pipes which form part of the Relevant Works;
- (c) dig into, sink shafts in, and erect scaffolding upon the Easement Land and to open and break up the soil of the Easement Land or any part of the Easement Land including its sub-surface;
- (d) remove and dispose of spoil created as a consequence of exercising its rights hereunder;
- (e) clear and keep clear the Easement Land by any means or method and to cut and remove timber, trees and undergrowth from the Easement Land and to burn off such timber, trees and undergrowth;
- (f) construct and maintain on the Easement Land such access tracks, gates and appurtenant works as it considers necessary;
- (g) enter upon and remain, pass and repass on and over the Easement Land for all or any of the purposes aforesaid with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description whatsoever;
- (h) enter and exit to and from the Easement Land over such part or parts of the Owner's land adjoining or adjacent to the Easement Land as is reasonably required by Unitywater and Unitywater shall consider most convenient or necessary for the purpose of passing between the Easement Land and the most convenient point of entry to or exit from the Owner's land (whether adjoining a constructed road or not);

- (i) do such other works and things through, across, in or under the Easement Land as are incidental to the proper exercise of the rights granted to Unitywater under this Easement; and
- (j) use such part or parts of the Owner's land immediately adjacent to or adjoining either side of the Easement Land as may be reasonably required by Unitywater for the proper exercise of the rights granted to Unitywater under this Easement.

3. PROPERTY IN RELEVANT WORKS

The Relevant Works are and remain the property of Unitywater notwithstanding any actual or apparent affixing to the Easement Land. Unitywater shall be solely responsible, for the operation and maintenance of all Relevant Works.

4. FENCING

4.1 Removal

For the purpose of gaining access to the Easement Land, Unitywater may demolish or break open any fencing on or adjacent to the Easement Land. However, if livestock are contained within the fenced area, Unitywater must give reasonable notice to the Owner to enable the Owner to secure the livestock.

4.2 Reinstatement

Unitywater must either:

- (a) reinstate all fences (other than a fence erected in contravention of Clause 5) damaged by Unitywater in the exercise and performance of any of the rights and liberties granted to Unitywater under this Easement; or
- (b) if the fences are not reinstated, install a gate using materials and employing workmanship which is not less than the quality of the materials and workmanship in the existing fence. The gate installed pursuant to this subclause becomes the property of the owner of the fence in which the gate is installed and after installation shall be maintained by the owner.

5. NO STRUCTURES ON THE EASEMENT LAND

The Owner must not at any time without the express written permission of Unitywater (which must not be unreasonably withheld):

- (a) erect any buildings or structures (other than fences) upon the Easement Land or any part of it;
- (b) permit the Easement Land or any part of it to be used in such a way as to obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Works by Unitywater;
- (c) install concrete, bitumen or other pavement or driveways (except residential driveways) on the Easement Land or gardens or landscaping involving concrete, brick or other permanent materials; or
- (d) remove or stockpile or permit the removal or stockpiling of any soil, sand, gravel or other substance or material on the Easement Land or construct any roads, dam walls or other earthworks on the Easement Land which would in any way obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Works by Unitywater.

6. DAMAGE TO STRUCTURES

- (a) Unitywater acting reasonably at all times and complying with all relevant laws, will determine how and in what manner the rights granted to Unitywater under this Easement are exercised.
- (b) Unitywater must not wilfully damage or destroy any Matter to any extent greater than is reasonably necessary in order to exercise its rights under this Easement but:

- (i) Unitywater is not otherwise responsible for any damage to or destruction of any Matter in the course of the exercise by Unitywater of its rights under this Easement; and
- (ii) subject to Clause 4, Unitywater is not under any obligation to reinstate or repair any Matter damaged or destroyed in consequence of the exercise by Unitywater of its rights under this Easement and its only obligation where such Matter has been so damaged or destroyed is to leave the Easement Land in as clean and tidy state as practicable having regard to the nature of the Matter which has been damaged or destroyed and the work which it has done; and
- (iii) Unitywater is not in any event responsible for any inconvenience or disturbance to the Owner or occupiers of the Easement Land arising out of the exercise by Unitywater of its rights under this Easement.

7. REMOVAL OF UNAUTHORISED STRUCTURES

If a Matter is erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement Land in contravention of Clause 5, Unitywater may, in addition to any other remedies and after having first given the Owner reasonable notice of its intention to invoke this clause, enter upon the Easement Land and remove or demolish the Matter and, if it does so:

- (a) it may dispose of the Matter or any resultant demolition materials in such manner as it sees fit without being liable to account to the Owner therefore (except as provided in subclause (b) of this clause); and
- (b) it may recover, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, costs actually incurred by it in taking that action (including internal wage and salary costs) less any moneys actually received by it as a result of disposing of the Matter or any resultant demolition materials.

8. PROTECTION OF RELEVANT WORKS

The Owner will not do any act or make any omission which will jeopardise or prejudicially affect the safety or reliable working of any Relevant Works.

9. RATES AND CHARGES

The Owner is responsible for all local authority rates and assessments and lawful charges in relation to the Easement Land.

10. FURTHER ASSURANCES

The benefit and burden of this Easement shall pass with and bind the Easement Land so as to enure to and bind all persons deriving title thereto from and under the Owner and Unitywater respectively and the Owner, whenever required by Unitywater or the person or persons for the time being entitled to the benefit of this Easement, must do all such things and give all such assurances as are reasonably required for the proper and effective carrying into effect of the rights conferred under this Easement but not so as to render the Owner liable to be called upon to contribute towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Relevant Works.

11. SPECIAL COVENANTS FOR STATE RESERVE LAND

- (a) The following clauses are in addition to or replace where noted those set out above and will form part of the covenants of this Easement when any land is designated as a "Reserve" in accordance with the *Land Act 1994* (as amended from time to time).
- (b) In this clause: "Minister" means the Minister administering the *Land Act 1994* (as amended from time to time); and

- “Trustee” means the relevant Trustee of the State Reserved Land.
- (c) **Reinstatement of fencing**
 Clause 4.2 of this Easement is deleted and replaced with the following:
Unitywater must either:
- (a) *Reinstate all fences damaged by it in the exercise of any of its rights granted herein; and*
 - (b) *In lieu of reinstating any such fence, install a gate the quality and materials of workmanship of which must be not less than the quality and materials of workmanship of the existing fence.*
- (d) **Removal of Unauthorised structures etc**
 Clause 7 of this Easement is omitted and replaced with the following:
If anything is erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement Land in contravention of Clause 5, Unitywater may, in addition to any other remedies, and having given the Owner reasonable notice of its intention to invoke this clause, enter Easement Land and remove or demolish the Matter. If it does so it may dispose of the Matter or any resultant demolition materials in such manner as it sees fit without being liable.
- (e) **Removal of Trees**
 Unitywater must not cut or remove timber or tress from the Easement Land without first giving reasonable notice to the Owner and obtaining all necessary permits. Such notice will not be required under this clause in the event that there is an actual or potential danger to persons or property or there is any interference or jeopardy to the supply of the Relevant Works.
- (f) **Removal of Assets upon termination of easement**
 Under the *Land Act 1994*, an easement over a reserve ends when the dedication of reserve is revoked unless a written approval is provided by the Minister that the easement may continue over unallocated State Land when the dedication of reserve is revoked.
 Upon termination of the Easement, Unitywater
- (i) must ensure that the Easement Land is left in a safe and stable condition to the satisfaction of the Minister; and
 - (ii) will unless directed by the Minister otherwise, at its own cost and expense, remove all of the Relevant Works from the Easement Land; and
 - (iii) will remove, at its own cost and expense, all of the Relevant Works from the Easement Land that may cause contamination or environmental harm to the Easement Land as defined by the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* or similar legislation.
- (g) **Indemnity and Risk**
 The following clauses will apply for the duration of the Easement and will continue to apply during the periods of rehabilitation and any removal of the Relevant Works under clause 11 (f):
- (i) **Indemnity**
 - a. Unitywater indemnifies and agrees to keep indemnified the Minister, the State of Queensland, Trustee and Owner (the “indemnified parties”) against all actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages and expenses (“Claims”) arising out of or in any way connected to or resulting from the granting of this Easement to Unitywater or which is connected to or resulting from Unitywater’s use and occupation of the Easement Land (all of which are referred to as “the indemnified acts or omissions”) save to the extent that the claim arises as a result of any negligent act or omission of the indemnified parties, however, any negligent act or omission or one of the indemnified parties does not negate the indemnity to any other indemnified parties.
 - b. Unitywater hereby releases and discharges the indemnified parties from any Claim relating to the indemnified acts or omissions which may be made against the indemnified parties, save to the extent that the Claim arises as a result of any negligent act or omission of the indemnified parties, however, any negligent act or omission of one of the indemnified parties does not negate the release and discharge in favour of any of the other indemnified parties.
 - (ii) **Public Risk**
 - a. Unitywater must effect a public liability insurance policy with an insurer authorised under the *Insurance Act 1973* (Commonwealth) or, in any other case, to the satisfaction of the Minister naming Unitywater as the insured covering legal liability for any loss of, or damage to any property and for the injury (including death) to any person arising out of anything done or omitted on or about the easement land or any improvements thereon and against all claims, demands, proceedings, costs, charges and expenses whatsoever in respect thereof subject to the terms and conditions of the insurance policy.
 - b. Such policy must:
 - (a) be for an amount not less than \$20,000,000.00 (Twenty Million dollars) in respect of all claims arising out of a single event or such higher amounts as the Minister may reasonably require; and
 - (b) be effected on a “claims occurring” basis so that any claim made by Unitywater under the policy after expiration of the period of policy cover but relating to an event occurring during the currency of the policy will be covered by the policy subject to the claim meeting the policy’s other terms and conditions; and
 - (c) be maintained at all times during the currency of the Easement, and upon receipt of any Notice of Cancellation, Unitywater

- must immediately effect another public liability insurance policy in accordance with the provisions of this Clause 11(g) (ii).
- c. Unitywater must also provide a certificate of currency within 14 days of a request by the Owner who may only make such request once a year.
- d. Unitywater must, as soon as practicable, inform the Minister and Owner in writing, of the occurrence of any event that Unitywater considers is likely to give rise to a claim under the policy of insurance effected and must ensure that the Minter and Owner are kept fully informed of subsequent actions and developments concerning the claim.
- (h) ***Power of Attorney***
Whilst the Easement Land remains unallocated State Land or is dedicated as a Reserve pursuant to the *Land Act 1994* as amended from time to time or is registered solely in the name of the State of Queensland, Unitywater irrevocably appoints in so far as it is legally able to the State of Queensland the true and lawful attorney of Unitywater enabling the attorney to do all such things as the attorney may consider necessary or desirable to effect a surrender of this easement upon the default by Unitywater of any condition, covenant or clause of this easement provided however that the State of Queensland may only exercise its right to surrender the easement under this clause if:
- (i.) Unitywater has breached a condition, covenant or clause of this easement; and
- (ii.) the State of Queensland has given written notice to the breach of Unitywater; and
- (iii.) the State of Queensland has allowed Unitywater 90 days from the date of receipt of the notice to remedy the breach; and
- (iv.) Unitywater has not remedied the breach by the expiration of that 90 days.
