Improving and enforcing **motor dealer industry** compliance with the *Motor Dealer and Chattel Auctioneers Act 2014, Agents Financial Administration Act 2014,* and Regulations. This will include targeting unlicensed **motor dealers** and **caravan** safety.



#### **REAL ESTATE**

Improving and enforcing **real estate industry** compliance with the *Property Occupations Act 2014, Agents Financial Administration Act 2014,* and Regulations. This will include targeting unlicensed activites.

#### SECOND-HAND DEALERS AND PAWNBROKERS

Conducting targeted compliance checks on **second-hand dealers**, **scrap metal** and **car wrecking** dealers to ensure their licensing requirements and compliance obligations are being met.

#### PRODUCT SAFETY

Promote **safety** in the supply of **consumer goods and services**. Further targeted product safety priorities will focus on:

- Online retailers
- Market traders
- Importers
- Show bag contents and show-related products
- Toys and other household items sold by retailers in the lead up to Christmas

## **Emerging priorities**

OFT will also assess emerging trends as they arise. These matters will be prioritised after an assessment of the following factors:

- Whether it results from or impacts the introduction of new or amended legislation
- Whether the issue causes material consumer detriment
- Whether the issue impacts the public interest
- Whether the issue is a systemic failure or mischief in OFT's regulated industries
- Whether the issue unduly impacts consumer safety.
