

Example of the main application questions

Our online application form will ask general demographic questions of the target audience for your grant, requested items you intend to purchase with the grant funds and general questions relating to your organisation and location.

We do ask five specific questions relating to your road safety education idea. These questions are outlined below to assist you in preparing your online application. Keep in mind that your responses should align to the funding objective: To support Queensland communities with the development and delivery of effective road safety education initiatives that support people to be safer road users.

Questions:

1. What is the local road safety issue you have identified that is placing road users at risk?

Support notes:

Road users can include motorists, passengers, motorcyclist, pedestrians, bicycle/scooter riders and users of personal mobility devices.

2. Thinking about your local road safety issue, what behaviours and/or attitudes have you identified that may be contributing to the issue?

Support notes:

Example of behaviours may include speeding, drink and drug driving, distraction, fatigue, not wearing a seatbelt, disobeying road rules.

People's attitudes are how they feel about a particular issue. Examples of attitudes could be "it's ok to speed if nobody is in the car with me" or "it's ok to drink and drive as long as I take the back roads home" or "it's ok to use my mobile phone when stationary at traffic lights".

- 3. Thinking about the behaviours and/or attitudes you identified, what education will you provide that will assist people to become safer road users?
- 4. Outline what community support or partnerships you have established that will be involved with the delivery of this grant? Examples may include local police, council, schools, community groups and businesses.
- 5. How could the road safety education message you deliver continue to be available to participants following completion of the grant?
