

Notification requirements

- Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) is exotic to Australia. The threat FMD poses to Queensland agriculture and the importance of early detection is reflected in Queensland legislation.
- FMD is <u>prohibited matter</u> under the <u>Biosecurity Act 2014</u>.
- All suspected cases of FMD must be reported to Biosecurity Queensland on 13 25 23 or the Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888. Biosecurity Queensland personnel are on call after hours and available to speak to persons who call either of these numbers.
- The *Biosecurity Act 2014* details the obligation of persons to notify Biosecurity Queensland of their suspicion of prohibited matter, which includes FMD. A maximum penalty of 1000 penalty units or 1 year's imprisonment applies to persons who fail to notify Biosecurity Queensland of their suspicion of prohibited matter.
- The *Biosecurity Act 2014* also imparts a <u>general biosecurity obligation</u> on persons who deal with biosecurity matter or things that may be carriers. In the context of FMD:
 - Biosecurity matter is the FMD virus
 - Carriers are anything capable of moving biosecurity matter including infected or potentially infected livestock, non-susceptible animals, persons and fomites.
- The general biosecurity obligation requires persons to take all reasonable and practical measures to prevent or minimise biosecurity risks. Refer to the fact sheet entitled "Interim measures following Biosecurity Queensland notification" for guidance on biosecurity risk management measures to implement on suspect premises following notification, in order to discharge your general biosecurity obligation.
