TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE (No 11) 2004

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No 11) 2004*.

Easements taken [s.9 of the Act]

2. The Easements described in Schedule 2 are taken by the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited ACN 078 849 233 for Electrical Works (transmission line) purposes and vests in the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited ACN 078 849 233 on and from 26 March 2004.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by each Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1 DEFINITIONS

1. In this Easement:

- 1.1 "Acts" means the *Electricity Act 1994* and *Government Owned Corporations Act 1993* and any amendments to them or either of them or any Acts superseding those Acts.
- 1.2 "Date of this Easement" means the date of Notice.
- 1.3 "Easement" means the rights obtained from the Owner by QETC including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.
- 1.4 "Easement Land" means that portion of the Owner's land over which this Easement is obtained.
- 1.5 "Owner" means the Registered Proprietor together with its successors, successors in title and assigns. Where the term appears in Clauses 3, 4, 5 and 6 it includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen and contractors of the Owner and other persons authorised by the Owner to use or enter upon the Easement Land.
- 1.6 "QETC" means the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited, together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of QETC and other persons authorised by QETC to exercise its rights under this Easement.
- 1.7 "Electricity Works" means such works, apparatus, structures and things as QETC may in its absolute discretion consider appropriate as a means of conveying or transmitting electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms, including conductors, cables, towers, aerials, poles, foundations, ground anchorages, supports and other associated or

appurtenant works. The expression includes the Electricity Works existing on the Easement Land at the Date of this Easement or constructed on it after that date, and where the context permits it includes a reference to any part of the Electricity Works.

QETC'S RIGHTS

2. The QETC is acquiring this Easement in perpetuity to permit QETC the right to:

- 2.1 convey and transmit electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms on, from, over, under and through the Easement Land by Electricity Works;
- 2.2 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land, with vehicles, plant and equipment, if necessary, to exercise its rights under this Easement;
- 2.3 construct Electricity Works on, over, under or through the Easement Land;
- 2.4 inspect, maintain, repair or replace the Electricity Works;
- 2.5 clear the Easement Land of trees, undergrowth or vegetation or any obstruction in the manner and by the means QETC considers appropriate;
- 2.6 construct and maintain on the Easement Land such tracks, roads, gates, fences and other structures and works as QETC considers necessary;
- 2.7 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any infringement by the Owner of QETC's rights under this Easement by the Owner; and

the QETC may in connection with its use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of its rights, powers, discretion and functions under the Acts, or any other Act or at law as it sees fit.

QETC'S OBLIGATIONS TO THE OWNER

3. QETC will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:
 - 3.1 cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible; and
 - 3.2 act reasonably.

QETC WILL COMPLY WITH SAFETY LAWS

- 4.1 QETC will comply with all laws regarding the exercise of its rights under this Easement and the safety of persons to use the Easement Land.
- 4.2 QETC will not be liable for:
 - 4.2.1 the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
 - 4.2.2 the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.

THINGS THE OWNER MUST NOT DO

5. The Owner must not:

- 5.1 interfere with, damage or place at risk the Electricity Works, any other structures or works or plant, equipment, tools or material of QETC on or near the Easement Land;
- 5.2 interfere with or obstruct QETC in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under this Easement; or
- 5.3 where the Owner is the holder of an assignment under the *Sugar Industry Act 1991* over the Easement Land, grow sugar cane within ten (10) metres of any tower, base or pole upon the Easement Land.

THINGS THE OWNER MAY ONLY DO IF QETC CONSENTS

6. The Owner must not, or consent to allow another party to, after the Date of this Easement, without first obtaining the written consent of QETC:
- 6.1 erect or place any buildings or structures or make any additions or alterations to any buildings or structures on the Easement Land;
- 6.2 erect any fence that is higher than three (3) metres on the Easement Land;
- 6.3 place fill or other substance or carry out any works or do anything whatsoever on the Easement Land which would reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the voltage class of the transmission line on the Easement Land;
- 6.4 cause or allow, except in the case of force majeure, the inundation of those parts of the Easement Land where any Electricity Works are erected or located or are proposed to be erected or located;
- 6.5 lay any metal conduit or pipe within five (5) metres of the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or other means of support on the Easement Land;
- 6.6 do any act or thing which jeopardises the foundations, ground anchorages, supports, the towers or poles, including (without limitation) excavate or remove any soil, sand or gravel within a distance of twenty (20) metres from the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support on the Easement Land;
- 6.7 if unassigned sugar cane land, grow sugar cane on the Easement Land;
- 6.8 plant upon the Easement Land trees whose size or height would in any way interfere with the statutory clearance that may exist from time to time; or
- 6.9 reside in or permit anyone to reside in or occupy any building, structure, caravan, or other accommodation (including temporary accommodation) which may be located on the Easement Land;
- and QETC will not unreasonably withhold its consent but in granting any consent may impose reasonable conditions.

OWNER MAY USE EASEMENT

7. The Owner may use the Easement Land for any lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement.

INDEMNITY

8. QETC indemnifies the Owner against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, costs, losses, damages and expenses arising out of or in respect of any act or omission of QETC in the use or attempted use of the Easement Land by QETC, except where such actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages or expenses arise as a result of any negligent act or omission of the Owner, breach of this Easement or of the law.

PUBLIC RISK

9. QETC will effect and keep current a public risk insurance policy in respect of this Easement and the use by QETC of the Easement Land for an amount which QETC considers appropriate to the public liability risk involved but in any event not less than TEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$10,000,000.00).

TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE (No 12) 2004

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No 12) 2004*.

Easement taken [ss.6, 9(7) and 9(8) of the Act]

2. The Easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by the Council of the City of Logan for stormwater drainage purposes and vests in the Council of the City of Logan on and from 26 March 2004.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

1. **RIGHTS**

The Council shall have the full, free and uninterrupted right and liberty at all times of the day and the night and from time to time at the Council's pleasure:

- (a) To enter upon and traverse the Easement for any purpose whatsoever connected with the Council's drainage powers and whether or not such entry or traversal is for the benefit or detriment of the Easement and whether or not it is for the benefit of the Easement or any neighbouring or other lands;
- (b) To carry out such works on the Easement and do such things including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, digging, sinking shafts, erecting scaffolding, opening and breaking up the soil both surface and subsurface, placing and operating of machinery and equipment, storing of soil and gravel, laying pipes, digging trenches and drains and laying concrete on or within the Easement as the Council in its discretion thinks necessary or desirable for any purpose whatsoever connected with the Council's drainage powers and whether or not such works and things are for the benefit or detriment of the Easement and whether or not such works and things are for the benefit of the Registered Proprietor's land or any neighbouring or other lands; and
- (c) To permit the uninterrupted flow of stormwater drainage, whether flowing individually or in concentration, and whether continuously, intermittently or occasionally, above or beneath the surface of the Easement, and through or along the drains.
2. **LIMITATION**
The powers, rights and liberties contained in clause 1 shall in all respects be limited to the following:
- (a) The surveying, testing and excavating for the drains, the laying and constructing of the drains and thereafter forever maintaining the drains over, under or through the Easement; and
- (b) The obtaining of free and uninterrupted access to any or any part of the drains from the surface of the Easement for the purpose of laying, relaying, changing the size or number of, operating, inspecting, patrolling, altering, removing, replacing, constructing, reconstructing and repairing the drains.
3. **COUNCIL'S AGENTS; EQUIPMENT**
- (a) The Council in exercising any of the powers, rights and liberties conferred by this Easement may do so by itself or by any one or more of the Council's agents.
- (b) The Council or the Council's agents whether by themselves or in conjunction with others may exercise any one or more of the powers, rights and liberties conferred by this Easement on the Council and if necessary with vehicles, machinery and equipment of any description whatsoever and whether such vehicles, machinery or equipment are laden or unladen.
4. **REGISTERED PROPRIETOR NOT TO OBSTRUCT EASEMENT**
The Registered Proprietor shall not make, cause, allow or permit:
- (a) Any obstruction, interruption, impeding, hampering or interference with, diversion, scouring, change or alteration in or to the flow of stormwater drainage at any time;
- (b) Any obstruction, interruption, impeding, or hampering of or interference with the powers, rights and liberties granted and conferred on the Council or the Council's agents by this Easement;
- (c) Any ponding, storage, retention or deviation of waters through or under the Easement caused by or consequent upon:
- any use to which the Easement is or might be put;
 - the erection, raising, making, placing of or suffering to stand or to remain any structures, paving, vegetation (except grass which is kept properly mown at all times), or anything whatsoever upon the Easement;
- (d) Any alteration in level or gradient of the Easement;
- (e) Any change to the surface of the Easement or to the natural or artificial features of the Easement which contain or assist in containing the flow of stormwater drainage on, under or through the Easement; or
- (f) Any obstruction, erection, making, placing of or allowing to stand any structure of any kind on the land of or within the Easement, unless permitted in writing by the Council or the permanent head and only to the extent permitted and upon such terms and conditions as the Council or the permanent head imposes or stipulates in the event of such permission being granted.
5. **COUNCIL MAY REMEDY BREACH**
- 5.1 If the Registered Proprietor or any occupier of the Easement or part of it breaches any part of Clause 4, the Council or the Council's agents may (without prejudice to any other remedy which the Council might have) remedy such breach by:
- demolishing, removing or otherwise disposing of any structure, paving, vegetation or thing whatsoever;
 - performing any works or doing anything necessary for restoring, repairing or reinstating the drains and the Easement (including re-grassing it) and reforming the natural or artificial features containing or assisting in containing the flow of stormwater drainage above under or through the Easement to their former state and condition;
 - altering, grading, paving, preparing, grassing and fertilising or mowing the surface of the Easement or placing, installing, establishing or constructing and keeping any earthworks and any other works whatsoever (whether of the class just mentioned or not) on or in the Easement.
- 5.2 Should the Council or the Council's agents exercise any of the rights, powers and remedies contained in Clause 5.1, then the cost of exercising those rights, powers and remedies and the doing and performing of any works, making alterations, grading, paving, preparing, grassing, fertilising, mowing, demolishing, removing or disposing of any structure, paving, vegetation or anything whatsoever shall be at the cost of the Registered Proprietor or the registered owner or occupier for the time being of the Easement.
- 5.3 All of the powers, rights and liberties mentioned in Clauses 1 and 3 hereof shall be exercisable by the Council or the Council's agents for the purpose of carrying out the rights, powers and remedies set out in Clause 5.1.
6. **DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION**
- 6.1 In this document, unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires:
- "**Drain**" includes a drain (open or closed), pipe, conduit or channel above or below ground level, with or without bankments, for the passage or conveyance of stormwater drainage; and a manhole, manhole chamber, inlet, any equipment (whether mechanical or otherwise) and any fittings in connection therewith.
- "**The Council**" includes the Council of the City of Logan and its successors, transferees and assigns.
- "**Council's Agents**" includes the servants, agents, licensees, contractors, sub-contractors and professional consultants of the Council.
- "**Council's drainage powers**" includes the drainage powers given to the Council by its Local Laws, the *Local Government Act 1993*, *Integrated Planning Act 1997* and the powers, rights and liberties conferred on the Council by this Easement.
- "**The Registered Proprietor**" includes the respective transferees and assignees of the Registered Proprietor and the registered owner or owners (and their and each of their respective successors, executors, administrators and assigns as the case may be) and the occupier or occupiers for the time being of the Easement.
- "**Permanent head**" means the permanent head for the time being of the Council's Department of Engineering Services.
- "**Easement**" means the land so described in Schedule 2, and includes the airspace above that land.
- "**Stormwater drainage**" means drainage of all kinds and, without limitation, includes rainwater, stormwater, liquid wastes and stormwater runoff.
- "**Structure**" includes buildings, fences and walls.
- 6.2 In this document, unless a contrary intention appears, reference to:
- a clause is to a clause in this document;
 - the singular includes the plural and vice versa;
 - any gender includes all other genders;
 - a person includes a firm, a corporation, an association and a body, whether incorporated or not and a government or statutory body or authority;
 - a statute includes statutory instruments under it; and consolidations, amendments, re-enactments or replacements of any of them;

- (f) writing includes any mode of representing or reproducing words in tangible and permanently visible form and includes facsimile transmission; and
- (g) this or any other document includes the document as varied or replaced and is not affected by any change in the identity of the parties.
- 6.3 The clause headings appearing in this document are inserted for convenience of reference and do not affect the construction of this document.
- 6.4 If any words are italicised or otherwise printed differently, this has been done for convenience only and does not affect the construction of this document.
- 6.5 Whenever more persons than one constitute a party all the covenants, agreements, conditions, restrictions and provisos on the part of that party contained or implied in this document bind those persons jointly and each of them severally.
- 6.6 This document is in all respects to be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Queensland; and the parties irrevocably and unconditionally submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that state, and any courts having jurisdiction to hear appeals from them, and waive any right to object to proceedings being brought in those courts.
- 6.7 Nothing contained in this document affects, prejudices or derogates from the requirements of any statute or from the rights, powers and authorities of the Council under the provisions of any statute or under any declared policy of the Council.

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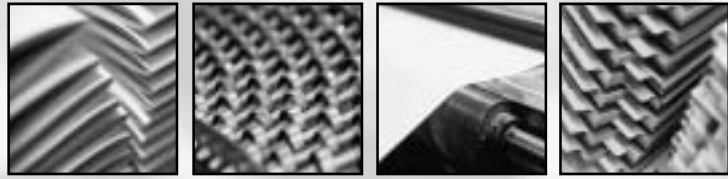

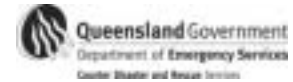

- If the fire-risk dangerous goods became involved in a fire, could that fire spread to the combustible liquids (or vice-versa)?
- Could the Class 5 oxidising agents and the combustible liquids come into contact and start a fire?

If the answer to any of these questions in 'Yes', then you have combustible liquids stored with fire-risk dangerous goods.

While you may have both combustible liquids and fire-risk dangerous goods at your premises, if they are segregated from each other so as to avoid the potential of interaction between them, it is appropriate to answer 'No' to the questions above. (Segregation of materials may be achieved by distance or barriers or both.)

To answer these questions adequately, you may need to conduct a thorough risk assessment.

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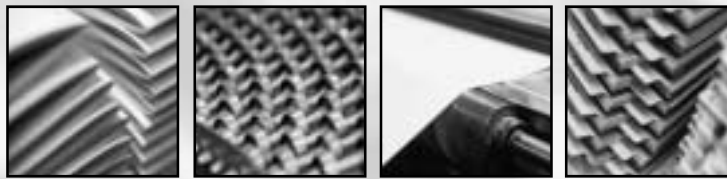
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
