- 1.6 "QETC" means the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited, together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of QETC and other persons authorised by QETC to exercise its rights under this Easement.
- 1.7 "Electricity Works" means such works, apparatus, structures and things as QETC may in its absolute discretion consider appropriate as a means of conveying or transmitting electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms, including conductors, cables, towers, aerials, poles, foundations, ground anchorages, supports and other associated or appurtenant works. The expression includes the Electricity Works existing on the Easement Land at the Date of this Easement or constructed on it after that date, and where the context permits it includes a reference to any part of the Electricity Works.

QETC'S RIGHTS

2. The QETC is acquiring this Easement in perpetuity to permit QETC the right to:
- 2.1 convey and transmit electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms on, from, over, under and through the Easement Land by Electricity Works;
- 2.2 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land, with vehicles, plant and equipment, if necessary, to exercise its rights under this Easement;
- 2.3 construct Electricity Works on, over, under or through the Easement Land;
- 2.4 inspect, maintain, repair or replace the Electricity Works;
- 2.5 clear the Easement Land of trees, undergrowth or vegetation or any obstruction in the manner and by the means QETC considers appropriate;
- 2.6 construct and maintain on the Easement Land such tracks, roads, gates, fences and other structures and works as QETC considers necessary;
- 2.7 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any infringement by the Owner of QETC's rights under this Easement by the Owner; and

the QETC may in connection with its use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of its rights, powers, discretion and functions under the Acts, or any other Act or at law as it sees fit.

QETC'S OBLIGATIONS TO THE OWNER

3. QETC will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:
- 3.1 cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible; and
- 3.2 act reasonably.

QETC WILL COMPLY WITH SAFETY LAWS

4. 4.1 QETC will comply with all laws regarding the exercise of its rights under this Easement and the safety of persons to use the Easement Land.
- 4.2 QETC will not be liable for:

- 4.2.1 the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
- 4.2.2 the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.

THINGS THE OWNER MUST NOT DO

5. The Owner must not:
- 5.1 interfere with, damage or place at risk the Electricity Works, any other structures or works or plant, equipment, tools or material of QETC on the Easement Land;

6. The Owner must not, or consent to allow another party to, after the Date of this Easement, without first obtaining the written consent of QETC:
- 6.1 erect or place any buildings or structures or make any additions or alterations to any buildings or structures on the Easement Land;
- 6.2 erect any fence that is higher than three (3) metres on the Easement Land;
- 6.3 place fill or other substance or carry out any works or do anything whatsoever on the Easement Land which would reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the voltage class of the transmission line on the Easement Land;
- 6.4 cause or allow, except in the case of force majeure, the inundation of those parts of the Easement Land where any Electricity Works are erected or located or are proposed to be erected or located;
- 6.5 lay any metal conduit or pipe within five (5) metres of the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or other means of support on the Easement Land;
- 6.6 do any act or thing which jeopardises the foundations, ground anchorages, supports, the towers or poles, including (without limitation) excavate or remove any soil, sand or gravel within a distance of twenty (20) metres from the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support on the Easement Land;
- 6.7 grow sugar cane on the Easement Land except;
- 6.7.1 where the Owner is a holder of a valid cane supply contract under the *Sugar Industry Act 1999* as at the Date of this Easement; and
- 6.7.1 the Owner grows sugar cane in accordance with clause 5.3 above;
- 6.8 plant upon the Easement Land trees whose size or height would in any way interfere with the statutory clearance that may exist from time to time; or
- 6.9 reside in or permit anyone to reside in or occupy any building, structure, caravan, or other accommodation (including temporary accommodation) which may be located on the Easement Land;

and QETC will not unreasonably withhold its consent but in granting any consent may impose reasonable conditions.

OWNER MAY USE EASEMENT

7. The Owner may use the Easement Land for any lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement.

INDEMNITY

8. QETC indemnifies the Owner against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, costs, losses, damages and expenses arising out of or in respect of any act or omission of QETC in the use or attempted use of the Easement Land by QETC, except where such actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages or expenses arise as a result of any negligent act or omission of the Owner, breach of this Easement or of the law.

SAFETY INSTRUCTION NOTICE (No 01) 2006**

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Safety Instruction Notice (No 01) 2006*.

Notice of safety instruction [s.708B of the Act]

2. (1) On 27 June 2006, in accordance with section 708B of the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004*, the Chief Inspector, Petroleum and Gas, Department of Natural Resources, Mines and Water issued Safety Instruction No.2 to all holders of a gas work licence.

(2) The instruction shall take effect from 30 June 2006 and remain in force until 30 December 2006¹.

(3) The instruction is as follows:

The Australian Standards Committee AG006 has reviewed a new way of connecting copper tube called the 'pressfit' system. This system enables copper tube to be joined to a fitting without the application of heat as the fitting is pressed onto the tube using a portable hydraulic tool.

In consultation with the Gas Technical Regulators Committee (GTRC) and with advice from other regulators, particularly the Office of the Technical Regulator, South Australia, the committee has agreed that this type of fitting technique will be included in the next version of AS 5601. However, this is not likely to occur before 2007.

In the meantime, in accordance with section 708B of the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004*, this system is approved for use in Queensland subject to the following conditions:

1. This instruction applies only to the Crane Copper Tube 'Viega' brand of 'pressfit' copper fittings and associated components.
2. Fittings are required to be marked to indicate compliance with AS 3688 and suitability for fuel gas installations.
3. Non-metallic parts ('O' rings) in fittings shall be colour-coded yellow and be suitable for use with natural gas and LPG.
4. Crane Copper Tube shall provide training, accreditation and technical support in Queensland.
5. The sale of components for this piping system shall be contingent upon the installer obtaining such specialised tools and equipment as is required by Crane Copper Tube to install the system correctly.

It is understood that these fittings will become available shortly through some plumbing supplier outlets.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as Brisbane City Council (Making of Local Law) Notice (No.1) 2006.

Definitions

2. In this notice—

“**Council**” means Brisbane City Council;

“**local law**” means Council’s *Amplified Music Venues Local Law 2006*.

Making of local law

3. (1) Council made the local law by resolution No. 864/2005-06 passed on 13 June 2006.
- (2) The purpose of the local law is to regulate noise from amplified music played at amplified music venues in various precincts of Brisbane.
- (3) The general effect of the local law is to outline the detail of the permit regime Council intends to apply.

- “Code of environmental compliance for certain aspects of regulated waste transport (ERA 83)—Version 1”.

3. Commencement date

This notification commences on 1 July 2006.

ERA 23 — Abrasive blasting (mobile and temporary activity)

This code of environmental compliance (code) has been made under section 63AA of the Environmental Protection Regulation 1998. It contains the standard environmental conditions approved by the Minister, under section 549(2) of the Environmental Protection Act 1994, for carrying out the aspects of the environmentally relevant activity (ERA) specified in section 2 of this code.

ERA 23 — Abrasive blasting (mobile and temporary activity)

1. Introduction

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has introduced an improved environmental compliance framework for environmentally relevant activities (ERAs) with a relatively low risk of environmental impact by introducing codes of environmental compliance (codes) that set out standard environmental conditions. Codes are appropriate for those activities that can achieve a good level of environmental protection through established practices and compliance with standard environmental conditions.

The codes also include advisory notes to help operators understand the conditions or measures that may be taken to ensure compliance. The advisory notes are a guide only and do not limit the range of measures that may be taken to comply with a condition. (NOTE: the advisory notes do not appear in the gazetted copy. Copies of this code with the advisory notes are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au or by contacting the EPA's Ecoaccess Customer Service Unit on telephone 1300 368 326 or by email at: eco.access@epa.qld.gov.au).

The use of codes simplifies and speeds up environmental approvals for the businesses involved, while retaining appropriate standards of environmental protection and performance.

The Minister for Environment, pursuant to section 549 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (EP Act), has approved the standard environmental conditions contained in this code. Approved codes are listed in schedule 6A of the *Environmental Protection Regulation 1998* (EP Reg).

This code has been developed in consultation with stakeholders.

2. Scope of the code

This code applies to ERA 23(b) — Abrasive blasting, where the operation of the ERA will comply with all the criteria outlined in the following table:

Criteria
1. The ERA is mobile and temporary, as defined in schedule 3 of the EP Act, and the administration of the ERA is not devolved to local government under the EP Reg.
2. Abrasive blasting activities carried out over water, on land below highest astronomical tide or on land subject to a 1:10 year flood regime are restricted to fixed items of marine equipment such as jetties, piers, bridges and gantries.

Where the operation of a particular ERA will not meet the above criteria, this code does not apply and a development approval is required to undertake the ERA.

The ERA — Abrasive blasting, is defined in Schedule 1 of the EP Reg as:

“ERA 23. *Abrasive blasting — commercially cleaning equipment or structures using a stream of abrasives:*

- (a) *if the activity is carried out at a permanent location*
- (b) *if the activity is a mobile and temporary environmentally relevant activity*
- (c) *if the activity is carried out at a permanent location and includes a mobile and temporary environmentally relevant activity.”*

3. When the code takes effect

This code applies immediately to all operators of ERA 23 (that meet the criteria in section 2 of this code) who commenced activities on or after 1 July 2006.

Operators who were carrying out ERA 23 under a development approval before 1 July 2006, and continue to carry out the activity have a 12 month transitional period to ensure their operations comply with the code. The

ERA 23 — Abrasive blasting (mobile and temporary activity)

code becomes effective for these operators on 1 July 2007. During the transitional period, these operators must comply with the conditions of their existing development approval.

4. Enforcement of the code

This code contains standard environmental conditions for carrying out the aspects of ERA 23 that meet the criteria outlined in section 2 of this code. Failure to comply with the conditions is an offence under the EP Act and penalties apply.

Enforcement Guidelines published by the EPA are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au.

5. Other requirements

In addition to the conditions in this code, a person carrying out ERA 23 must comply with other requirements of the EP Act and any other relevant Commonwealth, State or local government legislative requirements. Without limiting statutory requirements that may apply, some additional obligations under the EP Act include:

- holding a “registration certificate” issued by the EPA under section 73F; and
- taking all reasonable and practicable measures to prevent or minimise environmental harm. This is referred to as the “general environmental duty”.

6. Amendment of this code

The code may be amended from time to time by gazette notice advising that the Minister has approved new conditions. Proposed changes to the standard environmental conditions, other than changes to correct a clerical error, will be made in consultation with stakeholders. Where there is a significant change to the code, the EPA will notify persons affected by the change.

8. Standard environmental conditions and advisory notes

(NOTE: the advisory notes do not appear in the gazetted copy. Copies of this code with the advisory notes are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au or by contacting the EPA’s Ecoaccess Customer Service Unit on telephone 1300 368 326 or by email at: eco.access@epa.qld.gov.au).

Condition 1 – Activity based management plan

An activity based management plan (ABMP) must be developed for implementing by the person carrying out the activity. The ABMP must be implemented on commencement of the activity and include:

- a) environmental commitments – a commitment by senior management to achieve specific and relevant environmental goals;
- b) identification of environmental issues and potential environmental impacts from the activity;
- c) control measures for routine operations to minimise the likelihood of causing environmental harm;
- d) contingency plans and emergency procedures for non-routine situations;
- e) organisational structure and responsibility;
- f) details of staff training;
- g) record keeping methods; and
- h) provisions for continuous improvement and periodic review of environmental performance.

Condition 2 – Over water abrasive blasting

Where abrasive blasting or surface coating activities of fixed items (for example, jetties, piers, bridges, gantries and other maritime structures and equipment), are to be carried out over water, on land below the highest astronomical tide or on land subject to 1:10 year flood regime, the ABMP (see condition 1) must address the requirements and procedures outlined in the following documents published by the EPA:

**Code of environmental compliance**

ERA 23 — Abrasive blasting (mobile and temporary activity)

- a) *Over-water abrasive blasting in marine and other aquatic environments*; (guideline) and
- b) *Over-water abrasive blasting – environmental risk assessment* (information sheet).

Condition 3 – Notification of contaminant release

Any release of contaminants not in accordance with the conditions of this code must be reported by telephone to the EPA's Pollution Hotline or district office located in the area where the release occurred. Any such release must be reported as soon as practicable, but no later than 24 hours, after becoming aware of the release.

Condition 4 – Information about spills

A written notice detailing the following information must be provided to the EPA within 14 days of any advice provided in accordance with condition 3.

- a) the name of the operator, including their registration certificate number;
- b) the name and telephone number of a designated contact person;
- c) quantity and substance released;
- d) person/s involved;
- e) the location and time of the release;
- f) the suspected cause of the release;
- g) a description of the effects of the release;
- h) the results of any sampling performed in relation to the release;
- i) actions taken to mitigate any environmental harm caused by the release; and
- j) proposed actions to prevent a recurrence of the release.

Condition 5 – Records

All records required by this code must be kept for 5 years and be made available to an authorised officer of the EPA when requested.

Condition 6 – Commencement of activity

Notify the local office of the EPA at least 24 hours before commencing the activity at each new work location. Include in the notification the date of commencement, expected duration, hours of operation and the name and contact telephone number of the person responsible for the activity.

Condition 7 – Spill kit

An appropriate spill kit, personal protective equipment and relevant operator instructions/emergency procedure guides for the management of chemicals used in and wastes associated with the ERA must be kept in each vehicle used for the activity.

Condition 8 – Spill kit training

Anyone operating under this code must be trained in the use of the spill kit detailed in condition 7 and have the details of any training provided documented.

Condition 9 – Airborne contaminants

The release of toxic, noxious or offensive airborne contaminants resulting from the activity must not cause an environmental nuisance at any nuisance sensitive or commercial place.

Condition 10 – Dust and particulate matter

Dust and particulate matter must not cause environmental nuisance at any nuisance sensitive or commercial place nor contaminate any land.

Condition 11 – Protecting waters

Except where provided for in condition 2, there must be no release of a contaminant to a roadside gutter, stormwater drain or waters.

Condition 12 – Collection and storage of contaminants

Except where provided for in condition 2, a contaminant must not be placed in a position where it could reasonably be expected to move or wash into a roadside gutter, stormwater drain or waters.

Condition 13 – Preventing the release of contaminated stormwater

Except where provided for in condition 2, there must be no release of stormwater that has been in contact with any contaminants to any roadside gutter, stormwater drain or waters.

Condition 14 – Noise nuisance

Noise from abrasive blasting activities must not result in levels greater than those specified in the following tables:

Condition 15 – Noise monitoring

When requested by the EPA, noise monitoring must be undertaken and recorded to investigate any complaint of noise nuisance, and the noise monitoring results notified within 14 days to the EPA.

Condition 16 – Measuring and reporting noise levels

The method of measurement and reporting of noise levels in response to any noise monitoring conducted under condition 15 must be in accordance with most recent edition of the EPA's *Noise Measurement Manual*.

Condition 17 – Hazardous materials

The operator shall not permit hazardous materials to be released to land. Examples of such materials include, but are not limited to, asbestos, lead-based paint residues, solvents and spent abrasives.

Condition 18 – Waste records

A record of all regulated waste (excluding trackable waste) must be kept detailing the following information:

- a) date of pickup of waste;
- b) description of waste;
- c) quantity of waste;
- d) origin of the waste; and
- e) destination of the waste.

Condition 19 – Waste handling

All containers used to transport waste must be mounted securely during transport, sealed and maintained in a condition that will prevent spillage or leakage of the waste.

Condition 20 – Ensuring appropriate disposal of waste

All waste generated in carrying out the activities must be disposed at a facility that can lawfully accept that waste.

Condition 21 – Notification of unlawful disposal of regulated waste

If you become aware that a person has removed regulated waste generated from your activity and disposed of that waste in a manner which is unlawful, then you must, as soon as practicable, notify the EPA of all relevant facts, matters and circumstances known concerning the disposal.

Condition 22 – Complaint response

The following details must be recorded when a complaint is received:

- a) time, date, name and contact details of the complainant;
- b) reasons for the complaint;
- c) any investigations undertaken;
- d) conclusions formed; and
- e) any actions taken.

9. Definitions

Note: If a word or phrase is not defined it must be given the meaning it has under the EP Act or its subordinate legislation, as amended from time to time. If a word or phrase is not defined in this code or the EP Act or its subordinate legislation, it has its ordinary meaning.

Activity means an environmentally relevant activity, or aspect of an ERA to which this code relates.

Contaminant — Section 11 of the EP Act defines a contaminant as:

- a) a gas, liquid or solid; or
- b) an odour; or
- c) an organism (whether alive or dead), including a virus; or
- d) energy, including noise, heat, radioactivity and electromagnetic radiation; or
- e) a combination of contaminants.

Environmental nuisance — Section 15 of the EP Act defines environmental nuisance as “unreasonable interference or likely interference with an environmental value” caused by:

- a) noise, dust, odour, light; or
- b) an unhealthy, offensive or unsightly condition because of contamination; or
- c) another way prescribed by regulation (e.g. unreasonable noise or dust emissions).

Impulse adjustment — If impulsiveness is a significant characteristic of the sound within a measurement time interval, an adjustment shall be applied. If impulsive components are clearly audible, the adjustment will be 5 dB(A). If the components are only just detectable, an adjustment of 2 dB(A) will be appropriate.

L_{A1}, adj, 10mins means the A-weighted sound pressure level, (adjusted for tonal character and impulsiveness of the sound) exceeded for 1% of any 10 minute measurement period, using Fast response.

L_{A10}, adj, 10mins means the A-weighted sound pressure level, (adjusted for tonal character and impulsiveness of the sound) exceeded for 10% of any 10 minute measurement period, using Fast response.

L_{A90}, 15 mins (background noise level) means the A-weighted sound pressure level of the residual noise equalled or exceeded for 90 percent of a given time interval of 15 minutes, measured using time weighting “F” and quoted to the nearest whole number of decibels.

L_{A90}, adj, 15 mins means the A-weighted sound pressure level that is exceeded for 90 percent of a given time interval of 15 minutes, plus specified adjustments for tonal character and impulsiveness of sound.

Mobile and temporary environmentally relevant activity is defined in schedule 3 of the EP Act.

Noxious means harmful or injurious to health or physical well being.

Nuisance sensitive place means any of the following places:

- a) a dwelling;
- b) library, childcare centre, kindergarten, school, college, university or other educational institution;
- c) a hospital, surgery or other medical institution;
- d) a park or garden that is open to the public (whether or not on payment of money) for use other than for sport or organised entertainment);
- e) protected area.

Offensive means causing offence or displeasure; is disagreeable to the sense; disgusting; nauseous or repulsive.

Registration certificate means a certificate given under section 73F of the EP Act to the operator of an ERA.

Release of a contaminant into the environment, includes –

- a) to deposit, discharge, emit or disturb the contaminant; and
- b) to cause or allow the contaminant to be deposited, discharged, emitted or disturbed; and
- c) to allow the contaminant to escape; and
- d) to fail to prevent the contaminant from escaping

Standard environmental conditions for a code of environmental compliance, means the standard environmental conditions approved for the ERA, or aspect of the ERA, under section 549 of the EP Act.

Tonal adjustment — If tonal components are significant characteristics of the sound within a measurement time interval, an adjustment shall be applied. If tonal components are clearly audible, the adjustment will be 5 dB(A). If the components are only just detectable, an adjustment of 2 dB(A) will be appropriate.

Waters includes river, stream, lake, lagoon, pond, swamp, wetland, unconfined surface water, unconfined water, natural or artificial watercourse, bed and bank of any waters, dams, non-tidal or tidal waters (including the sea), stormwater channel, stormwater drain, roadside gutter, stormwater run-off, and groundwater and any part thereof.

It contains the standard environmental conditions approved by the Minister, under section 549(2) of the Environmental Protection Act 1994, for carrying out the aspects of the environmentally relevant activity (ERA) specified in section 2 of this code.

ERA 28 — Motor vehicle workshop (mobile and temporary activity)

1. Introduction

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has introduced an improved environmental compliance framework for environmentally relevant activities (ERAs) with a relatively low risk of environmental impact by introducing codes of environmental compliance (codes) that set out standard environmental conditions. Codes are appropriate for those activities that can achieve a good level of environmental protection through established practices and compliance with standard environmental conditions.

The codes also include advisory notes to help operators understand the condition or measures that may be taken to ensure compliance. The advisory notes are a guide only and do not limit the range of measures that may be taken to comply with a condition. (NOTE: the advisory notes do not appear in the gazetted copy. Copies of this code with the advisory notes are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au or by contacting the EPA's Ecoaccess Customer Service Unit on telephone 1300 368 326 or by email at: eco.access@epa.qld.gov.au).

This use of codes simplifies and speeds up environmental approvals for the businesses involved, while retaining appropriate standards of environmental protection and performance.

The Minister for Environment, pursuant to section 549 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (EP Act), has approved the standard environmental conditions contained in this code. Approved codes are listed in Schedule 6A of the *Environmental Protection Regulation 1998* (EP Reg).

This code has been developed in consultation with stakeholders.

2. Scope of the code

This code only applies to ERA 28 — Motor vehicle workshop, where the operation of the ERA will comply with all the criteria outlined in the following table:

Criteria
1. The ERA does not involve car detailing or washing.
2. The ERA does not involve spray painting.
3. The ERA is mobile and temporary, as defined in Schedule 3 of the EP Act, and the administration of the ERA is not devolved to local government under the EP Reg.

Where the operation of a particular ERA will not meet the above criteria, this code does not apply and a development approval is required to undertake the ERA.

The ERA — Motor vehicle workshop, is defined in Schedule 1 of the EP Reg as:

"ERA 28. Motor vehicle workshop — operating a workshop or mobile workshop in the course of which motor vehicle mechanical or panel repairs are carried out in the course of a commercial or municipal enterprise (other than on a farm or under a mining tenement) or on a commercial basis."

3. When the code takes effect

This code applies immediately to all operators of ERA 28 (that meet the criteria in section 2 of this code) who commenced activities on or after 1 July 2006.

Operators who were carrying out ERA 28 under a development approval before 1 July 2006, and continue to carry out the activity have a 12 month transitional period to ensure their operations comply with the code. The code becomes effective for these operators on 1 July 2007. During the transitional period, these operators must comply with the conditions of their existing development approval.

4. Enforcement of the code

The code contains standard environmental conditions for carrying out the aspects of ERA 28 that meet the criteria outlined in section 2 of this code. Failure to comply with the conditions is an offence under the EP Act and penalties apply.

Enforcement Guidelines published by the EPA are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au.

5. Other requirements

In addition to the conditions in this code, a person carrying out ERA 28 must comply with other requirements of the EP Act and any other relevant Commonwealth, State or local government legislative requirements. Without limiting statutory requirements that may apply, some additional obligations under the EP Act include:

- holding a “registration certificate” issued by the EPA under section 73F; and
- taking all reasonable and practicable measures to prevent or minimise environmental harm. This is referred to as the “general environmental duty”.

Part 3 of the EP Reg applies to activities involving ozone depleting substances, such as the maintenance and repair of motor vehicle airconditioning equipment.

6. Amendment of this code

The code may be amended from time to time by gazette notice advising that the Minister has approved new conditions. Proposed changes to the standard environmental conditions, other than changes to correct a clerical error, will be made in consultation with stakeholders. Where there is a significant change to the code, the EPA will notify persons affected by the change.

Condition 1 – Activity based management plan

An activity based management plan (ABMP) must be developed for implementing by the person carrying out the activity. The ABMP must be implemented on commencement of the activity and include:

- a) environmental commitments – a commitment by senior management to achieve specific and relevant environmental goals;
- b) identification of environmental issues and potential environmental impacts from the activity;
- c) control measures for routine operations to minimise the likelihood of causing environmental harm;
- d) contingency plans and emergency procedures for non-routine situations;
- e) organisational structure and responsibility;
- f) details of staff training;
- g) record keeping methods; and
- h) provisions for continuous improvement and periodic review of environmental performance.



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ERA 28 — Motor vehicle workshop (mobile and temporary activity)

Condition 2 – Notification of contaminant release

Any release of contaminants not in accordance with the conditions of this code must be reported by telephone to the EPA's Pollution Hotline or district office located in the area where the release occurred. Any such release must be reported as soon as practicable, but no later than 24 hours, after becoming aware of the release.

Condition 3 – Records

All records required by this code must be kept for 5 years and be made available to an authorised officer of the EPA when requested.

Condition 4 – Information about spills

A written notice detailing the following information must be provided to the EPA within 14 days of any advice provided in accordance with condition 2:

- a) the name of the operator, including the operator's registration certificate number;
- b) the name and telephone number of a designated contact person;
- c) quantity and substance released;
- d) person/s involved;
- e) the location and time of the release;
- f) the suspected cause of the release;
- g) a description of the effects of the release;
- h) the results of any sampling performed in relation to the release;
- i) actions taken to mitigate any environmental harm caused by the release; and
- j) proposed actions to prevent a recurrence of the release.

Condition 5 – Waste records

A record of all regulated waste (excluding trackable waste) must be kept detailing the following information:

- a) date of pickup of waste;
- b) description of waste;
- c) quantity of waste;
- d) origin of the waste; and
- e) destination of the waste.

Condition 6 – Dust nuisance

The release of dust and/or particulate matter resulting from the activity must not cause environmental nuisance at any nuisance sensitive or commercial place.

Condition 7 – Odour nuisance

The release of noxious or offensive odour or any other noxious or offensive airborne contaminant resulting from the activity must not cause environmental nuisance at any nuisance sensitive or commercial place.

Condition 8 – Preventing noise nuisance

Prevent the emission of noise that causes, or is likely to cause, environmental nuisance at any nuisance sensitive or commercial place.

Condition 9 – Preventing contaminant release to land

Contaminants must not be released to land.

Condition 10 – Clean up of spills

Any spills of wastes, contaminants or other materials must be cleaned up as quickly as practicable. Spills must not be cleaned up by hosing, sweeping or otherwise releasing such wastes, contaminants or other materials to any stormwater drainage system, roadside gutter or waters.

Condition 11 – Complaint response

The following details must be recorded when a complaint is received:

- a) time, date, name and contact details of the complainant;

All containers used to transport waste must be mounted securely during transport, sealed and maintained in a condition that will prevent spillage or leakage of the waste or exposure of the contents to the atmosphere.

Condition 14 – Protecting waters

There must be no release of a contaminant to a roadside gutter, stormwater drain or waters.

Condition 15 – Preventing the release of contaminated stormwater

There must be no release of stormwater that has been in contact with any contaminants to any roadside gutter, stormwater drain or waters.

Condition 16 – Spill kit

An appropriate spill kit, personal protective equipment and relevant operator instructions/emergency procedure guides for the management of chemicals used in, and wastes associated with the activity must be kept in each vehicle used for the activity.

Condition 17 – Spill kit training

Anyone operating under this code must be trained in the use of the spill kit detailed in condition 16 and have the details of any training provided documented.

Motor vehicle in Schedule 9 of the EP Reg means—

- a) a vehicle, that is propelled by a motor that forms part of the vehicle and moves on wheels, other than a train or tram; or
- b) a hovercraft.

Motor vehicle mechanical or panel repairs in Schedule 9 of the EP Reg means maintaining, servicing, tuning, reconditioning or repairing—

- a) mechanical components of motor vehicles; or
- b) motor vehicle engine cooling radiators; or
- c) motor vehicle body panels (other than windscreens, window glasses, upholstery and interior trimmings), including, for example, panel beating, rust proofing and spray painting other than minor scratch, chip and dent repairs carried out using a brush, air brush or paintless method; or
- d) motor vehicles by way of car detailing or washing other than if all washdown water arising from the carrying out of the activity is lawfully discharged to a sewer.

Nuisance sensitive place means any of the following places:

- a) a dwelling;
- b) a library, childcare centre, kindergarten, school, college, university or other educational institution;
- c) a hospital, surgery or other medical institution;
- d) a park or garden that is open to the public (whether or not on payment of money) for use other than for sport or organised entertainment);
- e) a protected area.

Noxious means harmful or injurious to health or physical well being.**Offensive** means causing offence or displeasure; is disagreeable to the sense; disgusting; nauseous or repulsive.**Registration certificate** means a registration certificate given under section 73F of the EP Act to the operator of an ERA.**Regulated waste** means non-domestic waste mentioned in Schedule 7 of the EP Reg (whether or not it has been treated or immobilised), and includes:

- a) for an element — any chemical compound containing the element; and
- b) anything that has contained the waste.

Release of a contaminant into the environment, includes –

- a) to deposit, discharge, emit or disturb the contaminant; and

“ERA 83. Regulated waste transport — transporting regulated waste commercially or in quantities of more than 250kg in a load —

- a) for tyres*
- b) for other regulated waste —*
 - (i) for 1 or more, but less than 36, vehicles; or*
 - (ii) for 36 or more vehicles.”*

3. When the code takes effect

This code applies immediately to all operators of ERA 83 (that meet the criteria in section 2 of this code) who commenced activities on or after 1 July 2006.

Operators who were carrying out ERA 83 under a development approval before 1 July 2006, and continue to carry out the activity have a 12 month transitional period to ensure their operations comply with the code. The code becomes effective for these operators on 1 July 2007. During the transitional period, these operators must comply with the conditions of their existing development approval.

4. Enforcement of the code

This code contains standard environmental conditions for carrying out the aspects of ERA 83 that meet the criteria outlined in section 2 of this code. Failure to comply with the conditions is an offence under the EP Act and penalties apply.



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ERA 83 — Regulated waste transport

Enforcement Guidelines published by the EPA are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au.

5. Other requirements

In addition to the conditions in this code, a person carrying out ERA 83 must comply with other requirements of the EP Act and any other relevant Commonwealth, State or local government legislative requirements. Without limiting statutory requirements that may apply, some additional obligations under the EP Act include:

- holding a “registration certificate” issued by the EPA under section 73F; and
- taking all reasonable and practicable measures to prevent or minimise environmental harm. This is referred to as the “general environmental duty”.

It is the operator’s responsibility to obtain any other approvals before carrying out the activity. For example, under section 369 of the EP Act, a person must not, for fee or reward, perform waste management works in a local government area other than under a written contract or written approval from the local government.

6. Amendment of this code

The code may be amended from time to time by gazette notice advising that the Minister has approved new conditions. Proposed changes to the standard environmental conditions, other than changes to correct a clerical error, will be made in consultation with stakeholders. Where there is a significant change to the code, the EPA will notify persons affected by the change.

8. Standard environmental conditions and advisory notes

(NOTE: the advisory notes do not appear in the gazetted copy. Copies of this code with the advisory notes are available at www.epa.qld.gov.au or by contacting the EPA’s Ecoaccess Customer Service Unit on telephone 1300 368 326 or by email at: eco.access@epa.qld.gov.au).

The following tables list groups of standard environmental conditions that apply to different aspects of regulated waste transport. Table 8.1 contains a general set of conditions that apply to all activities covered by this code. Advisory notes appear beside the conditions to provide guidance on compliance.

Depending on the type of vehicle used, and the nature of waste transported, additional standard environmental conditions as specified in Tables 8.2 to 8.8 (see below) may also apply. For example, if an activity involves the transport of asbestos in a rigid vehicle, Tables 8.1, 8.2 and 8.6 will apply.

Table 8.1 General conditions**Conditions applying to all regulated waste transport activities operating under this code.****Condition 1 – Vehicle details**

For new operators — details of all vehicles used to transport regulated waste must be provided to the EPA before commencing the activity.

Condition 2 – Change of details notification

For existing operators — if any vehicle registration details change, or any vehicles are added to or removed from the fleet of vehicles used to transport regulated waste, details of these changes must be provided to the EPA:

- a) as soon as practicable after the changes occur; or
- b) if transporting tyres — prior to each anniversary day (see section 9); or
- c) if transporting other regulated wastes — when paying the annual fee to the EPA for the registration certificate.

Condition 3 – Incompatible wastes

Incompatible wastes must not be:

- a) placed in the same container; or
- b) transported in such a way that mixing may occur.

Condition 4 – Design and compatibility

Regulated waste must only be transported in suitably designed vehicles, tanks, containers or secondary containers that are appropriate for containing the waste being transported.

Condition 5 – Maintenance and cleaning

All vehicles, tanks, containers and secondary containers used to transport regulated waste:

- a) must be maintained in a good condition at all times to prevent any spillage or leakage of regulated waste or other contaminants; and
- b) kept free of regulated waste residues at all times when not in use.

Condition 6 – Partitioning of load

A solid impervious partition must be provided to separate the load compartment/area of the regulated waste transport vehicle from the driver's compartment.

Condition 7 – Disposal

Regulated waste must not be removed or released from any vehicle other than at a facility that can lawfully receive the regulated waste.

Condition 8 – Prevention of spillage

Regulated waste must not leak or spill from the vehicle.

Condition 9 – Clean up of spills

Notwithstanding condition 8, any leakage or spillage of regulated wastes must be contained immediately, recovered and disposed of to a facility that can lawfully accept the waste.

Condition 10 – Spill kit

An appropriate spill kit, personal protective equipment and relevant instructions for the management of the regulated wastes transported must be maintained and kept in each vehicle.

Condition 11 – Notification of spills (interstate)

If operating interstate, any spillage, leak, escape or other loss of regulated waste from the vehicle must be reported as soon as practicable to the relevant regulatory agency of the State or Territory in which the vehicle is travelling when the incident occurs.



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Condition 12 – Notification of spills (Queensland)

When operating in Queensland, any release of contaminants not in accordance with the conditions of this code must be reported by telephone to the EPA's Pollution Hotline or district office located in the area where the release occurred. Any such release must be reported as soon as practicable, but no later than 24 hours (depending on the level of risk to the environment), after becoming aware of the release.

Condition 13 – Information about spills

A written notice detailing the following information must be provided to the EPA within 14 days of any advice provided in accordance with condition 12:

- a) the name of the operator, including the operator's registration certificate number;
- b) the name and telephone number of a designated contact person;
- c) substance and quantity released;
- d) vehicle and vehicle registration details;
- e) person/s involved (driver and any others);
- f) the location and time of the release;
- g) the suspected cause of the release;
- h) a description of the effects of the release;
- i) the results of any sampling performed in relation to the release;
- j) actions taken to mitigate the risk or extent of environmental harm caused by the release;
- k) the success of any actions taken to mitigate the risk or extent of environmental harm; and
- l) proposed actions to prevent a recurrence of the release.

Condition 14 – Insurance

All vehicles used to transport regulated wastes (that are not classified as dangerous goods, or as a placard load of dangerous goods), must be covered by a policy of insurance or other form of indemnity, for a sum that is not less than \$100,000, in respect of:

- a) personal injury, death, property damage and other damage (except consequential economic loss) arising out of fire, explosion, leakage or spillage of dangerous goods in, on or from the vehicle or a container on the vehicle; and
- b) costs incurred by or on behalf of a Commonwealth, State or Territory government authority in a clean-up resulting from any event of the kind referred to in subparagraph a) of this condition.

Condition 15 – Records

All records required by this code must be kept for 5 years and be made available to an authorised officer of the EPA when requested.

Condition 16 – Waste records

A record of all regulated waste (excluding trackable waste) must be kept detailing the following information for every load of waste transported:

- a) date of pickup of waste;
- b) description of waste;
- c) quantity of waste;
- d) origin of the waste; and
- e) destination of the waste.

Condition 17 – Documentation

At all times, a copy of:

- a) the registration certificate issued by the EPA for regulated waste transport activities; and
- b) the appropriate emergency guides in relation to the waste transported

must be carried in the cabin of each vehicle used to transport regulated waste and when requested, be presented to an authorised officer of the EPA or relevant regulatory agency of the State or Territory in which the vehicle is travelling.

Condition 18 – Training

All vehicle drivers must:

- a) have access to a copy of this code in the vehicle, or through direct communication with the vehicle depot or operations base; and
- b) be trained in the requirements of this code, including the use of all equipment and procedures necessary to comply with the conditions of this code, and document all training undertaken.

Condition 19 – Complaint response

The following details must be recorded when a complaint is received:

- a) time, date, name and contact details of the complainant;
- b) reasons for the complaint;
- c) any investigations undertaken;
- d) conclusions formed; and
- e) any actions taken.

Table 8.2 Asbestos conditions**Additional conditions applying to the transport of asbestos waste under this code.****Condition 20 – Asbestos containment**

All asbestos transported must be:

- a) double bagged and sealed in heavy-duty polythene bags (minimum 200 µm thickness); or
- b) contained in sealed drums or bins that are lined with heavy-duty plastic (minimum 200 µm thickness); or
- c) where the volume or size of asbestos waste (e.g. large asbestos cement sheets) is greater than the volume or size of a bag, drum or bin:
 - i) for friable asbestos waste, sealed in double lined heavy-duty plastic sheeting (minimum 200 µm thickness) prior to being placed into a waste skip, vehicle tray or similar container; or
 - ii) for non-friable asbestos waste, kept damp and contained in a waste skip, vehicle tray or similar container that has been double lined with heavy duty plastic sheeting (minimum 200 µm thickness) and then completely sealed with the plastic sheeting and adhesive tape.

Condition 21 – Asbestos handling

All asbestos transported must be:

- a) labelled with a warning statement to indicate the presence of asbestos and that dust creation and inhalation needs to be avoided;
- b) securely loaded and stowed on the vehicle during transit in such a way that does not cause the packaging to rupture;
- c) off loaded carefully to prevent the packaging from rupturing; and
- d) repackaged immediately if rupturing of the packaging does occur.

Table 8.3 Lead conditions**Additional conditions applying to the transport of particulate lead waste under this code.****Condition 22 – Lead**

All particulate lead waste must be:

- a) double bagged and sealed in heavy duty polythene bags (minimum 200 µm thickness), and placed in containers on the vehicle;
- b) labelled to indicate the presence of lead and with appropriate lead risk and safety phrases (see definitions “risk phrase” and “safety phrase” in section 9 of this code);
- c) securely loaded and stowed on the vehicle during transit in such a way that does not cause the packaging to rupture;
- d) off loaded carefully to prevent the packaging from rupturing; and
- e) repackaged immediately if rupturing of the packaging does occur.

Table 8.4 Clinical and related waste conditions**Additional conditions applying to the transport of clinical and related waste under this code.****Condition 23 – Vehicle compartment**

All clinical and related wastes must be transported in a fully enclosed load compartment of a vehicle that:

- a) is bunded or otherwise designed to contain any spills and leaks;
- b) lockable; and
- c) has internal surfaces which are rigid and seamless to facilitate cleaning and disinfection.

Condition 24 – Security

Vehicles and load compartments must be locked when unattended.

Condition 25 – Secondary containment

All clinical and related wastes must be provided with rigid secondary containment during transport.

Condition 26 – Cleaning and disinfection

Secondary containers used for the transportation of clinical and related wastes must be effectively cleaned and disinfected before reuse.

Condition 27 – Compaction systems

Clinical and related wastes must not be transported in vehicles fitted with compaction systems.

Condition 28 – Odour nuisance

Noxious or offensive odours must not be released from any vehicle transporting clinical or related wastes.

Table 8.5 Polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) conditions**Additional conditions applying to the transport of PCB waste under this code.****Condition 29 – PCB management**

The transport of wastes containing PCBs that are also classified as scheduled wastes under the Australian and New Zealand Environment and Conservation Council (ANZECC) *Polychlorinated Biphenyls Management Plan – July 1999* must comply with the requirements of that Plan.

Condition 30 – PCB trained personnel

Personnel suitably trained in methods of handling and containing spilled PCBs must accompany any vehicle transporting waste containing PCBs.

Table 8.6 Rigid vehicle conditions**Additional conditions applying to the transport of regulated waste in rigid vehicles and trailers under this code.****Condition 31 – Vehicle tray**

When transporting regulated waste in rigid vehicles and trailers, the tray of the vehicles must be:

- a) constructed of an impervious material;
- b) maintained in a sound condition; and
- c) designed to contain any spills on the tray.

Condition 32 – Covers

When transporting regulated waste in rigid vehicles and trailers, any waste not fully contained within weatherproof packages must be covered during transport to contain the load and protect it from wind and rain.

Condition 33 – Securing of load

When transporting regulated waste in rigid vehicles and trailers, all regulated waste containers must be:

- a) mounted securely to the vehicle; and
- b) contained within the tray of the vehicle.

Condition 34 – Containment

When transporting regulated waste in rigid vehicles and trailers, the vehicle must be fitted with:

- a) adequate cargo securing devices; and
- b) in the case of vehicles transporting packaged regulated waste (see definitions in section 9 of this code), rigid sides or gates that contain the load while in transit.

Condition 35 – Height of load

When transporting packaged regulated waste in rigid vehicles and trailers, the top of any container must not protrude above the sides or gates of the vehicle by more than 30% of the height of the container.

Table 8.7 Road tank vehicle conditions**Additional conditions applying to the transport of liquescent and dry particulate regulated waste in road tank vehicles under this code.****Condition 36 – Vehicle stability**

Road tank vehicles must be constructed to minimise instability and risk of rollover.

Condition 37 – Roll-over protection

Road tank vehicles must be provided with roll-over protection to protect all tanks, components and fittings on the upper and side surfaces of the tank in the event of the vehicle rolling over or becoming inverted.

Condition 38 – Transfer equipment

Waste transfer equipment, including discharge point and pipe-work on road tank vehicles, must be:

- a) fitted to the vehicle so as to not extend beyond the outer body line of the vehicle; or
- b) designed to provide sufficient inherent resistance to damage; or
- c) provided with protection to prevent damage.

Condition 39 – Sampling points

Road tank vehicles used for the transport of liquid regulated waste must have sampling points on the top of each compartment that are readily accessible for the purposes of a roadside inspection.

Condition 40 – Transfer hoses

Regulated waste material must not leak or spill from waste transfer hoses to the ground while the road tank vehicle is in transit.

Condition 41 – Road clearance

All tank filling and discharge points on road tank vehicles must have adequate ground clearance and be rigidly connected to the tank.

Condition 42 – Vacuum system

All road tank vehicle vacuum pump systems must be fitted with operational:

- a) pressure and/or vacuum relief valves; and
- b) pump shut-off valves.

Condition 43 – Volume measurement

Where regulated waste is transported in road tank vehicles, the tank capacity must not be exceeded and a mechanism for volume measurement that is readily visible and calibrated to show maximum volume of waste in the tank must be fitted to each tank.

Condition 44 – Manholes

Where regulated waste is transported in road tank vehicles, manholes of sufficient size to allow internal inspection, cleaning and maintenance of the tanks must be fitted.

Condition 45 – Outlets

All filling and discharge points of road tank vehicles must be fitted with suitable leak proof caps and captive chains when regulated wastes are in transit.



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Condition 46 – Rear impact protection

Each road tank vehicle must be provided with an effective bumper and/or barrier system to protect the tank and fittings from rear impact.

Table 8.8 Operating 36 or more vehicles.

Additional conditions applying to an activity that involves the operation of 36 or more regulated waste transport vehicles (i.e. ERA 83(b)(ii)) under this code.

Condition 47 – Operational management system

When an activity involves the operation of 36 or more regulated waste transport vehicles, an Operational Management System (OMS) must be developed for implementation by the person carrying out the activity. The OMS must be implemented on commencement of the activity and provide for:

- a) identification of actual and potential releases of all contaminants, their environmental impacts and the actions to be taken to prevent the likelihood of environmental harm;
- b) establishment and maintenance of procedures to identify the potential for accidents;
- c) activation of appropriate responses to emergency situations;
- d) training of staff to achieve awareness of the potential for environmental harm and competence in the application of preventative measures and emergency response procedures; and
- e) a review of, and continual improvement to, the overall environmental performance of the business operations.

9. Definitions

Note: If a word or phrase is not defined it must be given the meaning it has under the EP Act or its subordinate legislation, as amended from time to time. If a word or phrase is not defined in this code or the EP Act or its subordinate legislation, it has its ordinary meaning.

Activity means the environmentally relevant activity, or aspect of the ERA to which this code relates.

ADG Code means the *Australian Code for the Transport of Dangerous Goods by Road and Rail*, sixth edition, or more recent versions as they become available. The ADG Code is available for purchase from Canprint Publications — Telephone: 1300 656 863.

Anniversary day, for a registration certificate is defined in Schedule 3 of the EP Act.

Asbestos-containing material means any material, object, product or debris that contains asbestos.

Asbestos waste means all removed asbestos-containing materials and disposable items used during the asbestos removal work, such as plastic sheeting used for an enclosure or to cover surfaces in the asbestos work area, disposable coveralls, disposable respirators and rags used for cleaning etc.

Clinical waste means waste that has the potential to cause disease including, for example, the following:

- a) animal waste;
- b) discarded sharps;
- c) human tissue waste; and
- d) laboratory waste.

Code of environmental compliance means a code of environmental compliance approved or made under a regulation of the EP Act.

Environmentally relevant activity (ERA) means an activity prescribed by regulation as an ERA.

EPA means the Environmental Protection Agency or its successor.



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Friable asbestos means asbestos-containing material which, when dry, is or may become crumbled, pulverised or reduced to powder by hand pressure.

Note: This may include asbestos containing materials that have been subjected to conditions, such as weathering, physical damage, water damage etc., that leave them in a state where they meet the above definition.

Incompatible wastes means wastes that are likely to interact and increase the risk to human health and/or the environment when mixed or brought into contact.

Liquescent waste means waste tending toward a liquid state; waste that is not spadeable.

Operator means the person carrying out the ERA.

Packaged regulated waste means regulated waste in a container with:

- a) a capacity of not more than 450 litres; and
- b) a nett mass of not more than 400 kilograms.

Registration certificate means a registration certificate given under section 73F of the EP Act to the operator of an ERA.

Regulated waste means non-domestic waste mentioned in Schedule 7 of the EP Reg (whether or not it has been treated or immobilised), and includes:

- a) for an element — any chemical compound containing the element; and
- b) anything that has contained the waste.

Regulatory agency means the agency of a State or Territory that has responsibility for regulating the transport of regulated wastes in that State or Territory.

Related waste means waste that constitutes, or is contaminated with, chemicals, cytotoxic drugs, human body parts, pharmaceutical products or radioactive substances.

Release of a contaminant into the environment, includes:

- a) to deposit, discharge, emit or disturb the contaminant;
- b) to cause or allow the contaminant to be deposited, discharged, emitted or disturbed;
- c) to allow the contaminant to escape; and
- d) to fail to prevent the contaminant from escaping.

Rigid vehicle means a vehicle the load carrying area of which is fixed to the vehicle's chassis or frame (as defined in the ADG Code).

Risk phrase means a phrase stated in the National Occupational Health and Safety Commission's (NOHSC's) document entitled *National Code of Practice for the Labelling of Workplace Substances [NOHSC:2012(1994)]*, or more recent versions, that gives information about the substance's hazards.

Road tank vehicle means a truck, trailer or semi-trailer or unit in a road train, incorporating a tank, or having a tank or tanks mounted thereon, either permanently or temporarily (as defined in AS 2809.1-1999 — *Road Tank Vehicles for Dangerous Goods*).

Safety phrase means a phrase stated in National Occupational Health and Safety Commission's document entitled *National Code of Practice for the Labelling of Workplace Substances [NOHSC:2012(1994)]*, or more recent versions, that gives information about:

- a) the safe use of the substance; or
- b) the personal protective equipment for the substance.

Standard environmental conditions for a code of environmental compliance, means the standard environmental conditions approved for the ERA, or aspect of the ERA, under section 549 of the EP Act.



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Ullage means a vapour space which is left above the liquid surface after filling, to permit a degree of thermal expansion of the liquid without loss of cargo (as defined in AS 2809.1-1999 — *Road Tank Vehicles for Dangerous Goods*)

Waters includes river, stream, lake, lagoon, pond, swamp, wetland, unconfined surface water, unconfined water, natural or artificial watercourse, bed and bank of any waters, dams, non-tidal or tidal waters (including the sea), stormwater channel, stormwater drain, roadside gutter, stormwater run-off, and groundwater and any part thereof.

Appendix 1 — Design rules

General rules applicable to rigid-walled waste containers and waste transport vehicles

It must be designed in a way that ensures:

- a) it performs the intended function when used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions; and
- b) waste does not spill from it during usual usage or servicing; and
- c) it is not adversely affected by environmental conditions, including, for example, heat, humidity or sunlight; and
- d) it is not adversely affected by the cleaning procedures specified by the manufacturer.

The inner surfaces must be smooth, free of recesses and be able to be readily cleaned.

The inner surfaces must be designed to allow easy removal of waste.

If it has internal seams, the seams must be fully welded.

The following matters must be taken into account in designing it:

- a) the type of waste to be collected, removed or conveyed;
- b) the likelihood of abrasion by solid waste;
- c) the likelihood of chemical attack;
- d) the need to exclude rain or other liquid that may be likely to leach a contaminant from the waste.

It must be constructed of a material that will not undergo a change that impairs its life or performance when it comes into contact with waste.

If it is constructed from plastic, the plastic must be UV resistant for the container's life.

If it is a waste container or waste transport compartment within a waste transport vehicle, it must be constructed:

- a) of a durable material that is capable of withstanding normal operating conditions; and
- b) in a way that ensures it minimises the entry of insects and vermin.

If it is a container designed for use to transport waste, it must be designed in a way that provides a permanent way of securing the lid so that waste is not released during transportation.

Specific design principles for waste transport vehicles

If the vehicle is to be used for transporting waste in containers, the vehicle design must include a permanent method of securing the containers in an upright position.

If the vehicle incorporates a tanker body, the vehicle must be designed in a way that ensures:

- a) each discharge point on the body is protected from possible damage; and
- b) each discharge point is capable of being locked in the off position; and
- c) it is fitted with signs detailing the direction and movement needed to shut the discharge and loading valves; and
- d) effective covers are provided for all manholes; and
- e) the manhole covers are capable of being secured at all times when the manholes are not being used; and
- f) a storage area is provided for the vehicle's hoses.

Specific design principles for plastic bags used for clinical and related waste

It must have sufficient strength to safely contain the waste it is designed to hold.

It must be designed to allow for secure final closure when the bag is filled to a maximum of two-thirds of its capacity, or 6kg, whichever is the lesser.

It must not be designed with closure devices that have sharp protuberances, including, for example, staples.

1. Title

Recruitment and Selection

2. Purpose

To specify the requirements applying to the recruitment and selection of public service employees.

3. Legislative Provision

Public Service Act 1996 - Sections 24, 33, 34, 51, 67, 68, 73, 77, and 78.

4. Application

- (a) This Directive applies to –
 - (i) public service officers, including senior executive and senior officers, unless otherwise stated
 - (ii) temporary employees engaged under section 113 of the *Public Service Act 1996*, unless otherwise stated, and
 - (iii) general employees engaged under section 112 of the *Public Service Act 1996*, unless otherwise stated.
- (b) This Directive does not apply to the recruitment and selection of chief executive officers.
- (c) This Directive does not apply to the recruitment and selection of casual employees.

5. Effective date

30 June 2006

6. Definitions

For the purpose of this Directive the following definitions apply –

Agency

– a public service unit as defined in the *Public Service Act 1996*.

Appoint

– appoint an officer or employ a tenured general employee.

Basis for assessment of merit

– the description of the abilities, aptitude, skills, qualifications, knowledge, experience and personal qualities against which applicants will be assessed.

Continuous applicant pool

– an applicant pool which is created by one or more agencies to recruit applicants on an ongoing basis to a class or type of role below the level of senior officer or equivalent.

Employee

– a public service officer or tenured general employee.

Entry-level

– roles in relation to the *Queensland Public Service Award – State 2003* are those at classification levels 1 and 2 of the administrative, technical, professional and operational streams. For roles above these levels and for roles in other Awards, entry-level is the base classification level or levels determined by the chief executive and approved by the Director-General of the department administering the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* and the Public Service Commissioner.

Identical role

– is a role which shares the same title, remuneration, classification level and role description as another role within an agency.

Identified position

– has the meaning given to it by the directive on identified positions.

Limited applicant pool

– comprises applicants who are eligible to be considered for a vacancy which is being offered only to a specified group or groups of existing tenured or temporary staff in an agency or from within a number of agencies.

Merit

– is defined according to the provisions of section 78 of the *Public Service Act 1996*.

Recurring vacancy

– a vacancy below the level of senior officer or equivalent which can be filled from the applicant pool for the same or an identical role.

Vacancy

– a role for which an incumbent is being sought.

7. Directive

7.1 Role evaluation

- (a) Where relevant to the award structure, role evaluation for the purpose of determining the work value and applicable classification level will be

undertaken according to a role evaluation methodology approved by the Public Service Commissioner.

- (b) Unless otherwise approved, the role evaluation methodology to be utilised is the Queensland Public Sector Job Evaluation Management System (JEMS).

7.2 Role description

- (a) A role description must provide applicants with sufficient information to inform them of the requirements of the role and the basis for assessment of merit.
- (b) Mandatory qualifications can be specified only when it is essential for the occupant of a role to hold such qualifications in order to comply with an industrial instrument or to satisfy legal, accreditation or registration requirements.
- (c) Applicants must be informed of mandatory qualifications, as well as any mandatory conditions and requirements, for employment in a role. Mandatory conditions and requirements can include, but are not limited to, mandatory attributes required for appointment to an identified position, certain classes of drivers' licence, statutory restrictions and the requirement for the appointee to undertake regular travel.
- (d) Applicants must be informed of any type of pre-employment checking that will be undertaken and any probationary period which may apply.

7.3 Vacancies required to be advertised

- (a) Subject to the provisions of section 7.4 vacancies for public service officer roles above entry level must be advertised in the *Gazette* and on the Queensland Government *Smart jobs and careers* website for no less than two calendar weeks exclusive of public holidays and the Christmas-New Year closure period.
- (b) The vacancy notification in the *Gazette* and the Queensland Government *Smart jobs and careers* website is to include:
- a vacancy identifier
 - a role title
 - the name of the employing agency or potential range of employing agencies
 - the centre/location or potential range of centres/locations at which a role is to be employed
 - the remuneration applicable
 - the applicable classification level
 - notification if the position is an identified position and the mandatory attribute required for employment
 - the closing date and time for receipt of applications unless vacancies are to be filled from an open applicant pool
 - how applicants are to lodge their application, and
 - the basis of employment of the vacancy: permanent, temporary or contract; full-time or part-time.

- (c) Continuous applicant pools for entry-level vacancies for public service officer roles must be advertised on the *Smart jobs and careers* website.

7.4 Vacancies not required to be advertised

Vacancies for public service officer roles are not required to be notified in the *Gazette* and the Queensland Government *Smart jobs and careers* website where they are –

- (i) designated to be in a Ministerial office
- (ii) subject to an industrial determination by which the salary, duties and designation of the job are modified
- (iii) at entry level other than the circumstances set out in section 7.3(c)
- (iv) to be filled in compliance with a progressional scheme or other scheme contained in an award, certified agreement or determination made under section 149 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999*
- (v) to be filled under a progressional scheme or other scheme subject to an agreement between the relevant industrial organisation of employees and the chief executive and approved by the Public Service Commissioner
- (vi) to be filled temporarily for a period not exceeding 12 months
- (vii) to be filled by transfer or secondment at or below level, including the application of priority placement provisions specified in a current directive
- (viii) to be filled by the promotion of a registered redeployee where the promotion is to a classification level that is not higher than the redeployee's substantive classification level immediately before their redeployment
- (ix) to the office of a chief executive under Part 5, Division 2 of the *Public Service Act 1996*
- (x) a vacancy which has been previously advertised and an appointment made but has subsequently become vacant within a period of three months from the date of appointment
- (xi) to be filled in accordance with sections 7.12 to 7.14 of this Directive.

7.5 Recurring vacancies

- (a) Applications for roles below senior officer level may be used to appoint an employee to an identical role provided that –
 - (i) the job advertisement includes a note that applications may remain current for a specified period up to 12 months after the closing date for receipt of applications for the original vacancy, and

- (ii) the appointment occurs within the period specified in paragraph (i).
- (b) Where an identical role could vary from the advertised role in terms of centre/location or employment basis (full time or part time) the advertised role description must include a note to this effect.
- (c) A permanent role may not be filled from a vacancy which is advertised as temporary.
- (d) Applications received during the period specified in section 7.5(a), but after the initial closing date, may be considered.

7.6 Continuous applicant pools

- (a) A continuous applicant pool must provide an opportunity for new or updated applications to be submitted on an ongoing basis. An agency or agencies filling a vacancy through a continuous applicant pool must ensure that advertising requirements under section 7.3 of this Directive are met each week the pool remains open.
- (b) Where a continuous applicant pool is shared by more than one employing agency, applicants must be able to specify for which agency or agencies they wish to be considered.
- (c) Applicants must be informed of how appointment will be notified and whether they can expect individual notification that they have been unsuccessful in obtaining a given role.
- (d) Applicants who are considered unsuitable because they do not meet mandatory qualifications or requirements are to be notified of the reason that their applications will not be further considered.
- (e) Each selection for an appealable position must document the date on which applications were distributed to the panel following approval being given to fill a vacancy. Applicants who are otherwise eligible to appeal may do so if their application is received prior to the date of distribution of applications to the panel.
- (f) The way that selection is conducted beyond initial application may vary from vacancy to vacancy.
- (g) Agencies must inform applicants of the time for which their applications will remain current.
- (h) Agencies must provide applicants with two weeks notice of the end of a continuous applicant pool and provide information of any alternative application arrangements.
- (i) Vacancies can continue to be filled from a continuous applicant pool for up to six months after notification that the pool will be discontinued.

- (j) A standing offer arrangement is not a continuous applicant pool.

7.7 Assessment of applicants

- (a) Assessment processes must be –
 - (i) appropriate to the basis for assessment set out in the role description
 - (ii) sufficient to assess the merits of applicants
 - (iii) fair and free from bias
 - (iv) consistent with the principles of employment equity and anti-discrimination, and
 - (v) able to be reviewed.
- (b) Where the applicant is a deployee the suitability assessment provisions specified in a current directive relating to deployment apply.
- (c) Applications received after the closing date of the vacancy may be considered.

7.8 Referee checking

- (a) Referee checking relating to an applicant's work behaviour and performance may be undertaken at the discretion of the panel and at any time in the assessment process.
- (b) Where referee checking is undertaken, at least one referee must, unless there are extenuating circumstances, have a thorough knowledge of the applicant's conduct and performance within the previous two years.
- (c) A referee who is a Queensland Public Service employee or an employee in an agency covered by this Directive must disclose all information known to them that is relevant to the applicant's ability to undertake the responsibilities and duties of the advertised vacancy and to the work behaviour of the applicant. Information which is relevant to the basis for assessment or potentially indicative of the applicant's future performance or work behaviour must be provided even if not directly requested by the panel.
- (d) Where adverse comments made by a referee have the potential to affect the selection outcome, the applicant must be given an opportunity to respond. Any such response must be documented and taken into consideration by the panel when evaluating the relative merits of the applicant.
- (e) A referee must be advised of the panel's duty to disclose adverse comments to applicants in the circumstances outlined in 7.8(c).
- (f) A panel may, with the agreement of an applicant, access additional referees to those originally nominated.

7.9 Pre-employment checks

- (a) Pre-employment checks of preferred applicants may include checking of criminal history, identity or previous discipline history.
- (b) Criminal history checking must be undertaken only in accordance with legislation applying to the employees of an agency and, where relevant, directives issued by the Public Service Commissioner.

7.10 Post selection feedback

- (a) All applicants are to be advised that they may request feedback.
- (b) Feedback is to be provided to any applicant who seeks it.
- (c) Applicants who request feedback should receive timely, factual and constructive feedback sufficient to explain why they were not successful.
- (d) Shortlisted applicants who request feedback must receive feedback from a member of the panel.

7.11 Documentation and confidentiality

- (a) Documentation of a selection decision must clearly explain the decision-making process with reference to the basis for assessment contained in the role description.
- (b) Selection documents must be maintained in strict confidence and security for the periods specified under the Queensland State Archives *General Retention and Disposal Schedule for Administrative Records* in the case of roles at senior officer level and below or indefinitely in the case of senior executive officers.

7.12 Direct appointment to roles at a higher level

- (a) This section does not apply to senior officer or senior executive roles.
- (b) Subject to the provisions of this section a chief executive may, without advertising, appoint an employee to role at a higher classification level where -
 - (i) the occupant has been seconded to, or temporarily employed in, the role, or
 - (ii) the role has been reclassified.
- (c) The employee –
 - (i) must have undertaken the role in question for a total of not less than two of the preceding three years, and
 - (ii) must be assessed as meeting the agreed performance objectives of the role.

- (d) In relation to direct appointment following secondment to, or temporary employment in, a role at a higher classification level, the temporary role must have been advertised and the employee appointed on merit.
- (e) In relation to direct appointment to roles which have been reclassified -
 - (i) the employee must be the substantive occupant, and
 - (ii) reclassification must not be higher than one classification level above the employee's substantive classification level, and
 - (iii) an employee who has been appointed to a higher classification level in accordance with section 7.12(b)(ii), or a similar provision in an earlier directive relating to recruitment and selection, is not eligible for further appointment under the provisions of that section in the event that the role in question is again evaluated at a higher classification level.

7.13 Appointment of a temporary employee to tenured status at level

- (a) A chief executive may convert a temporary employee or temporary general employee to tenured status at level in the following circumstances:
 - (i) the temporary employee or temporary general employee was selected for the role in accordance with the provisions of this directive or any directive that applied at the time the appointment was made, and
 - (ii) engagement in the role has been for a continuous period of two years service, and
 - (iii) the temporary employee or temporary general employee has been assessed as satisfactorily meeting the agreed performance objectives of the role, and
 - (iv) the suitability of surplus employees, employees seeking alternative placement due to medical reasons and registered deployees has been considered in accordance with provisions contained in directives relating to priority placement.
- (b) Chief executives are to keep a record of the number, type and classification level of appointments that are made in accordance with this section each financial year. For audit and reporting purposes, these records are to be retained for at least twelve months from the date of approval.

7.14 Limited applicant pools

- (a) A limited applicant pool applies where exemption from the advertising provisions of section 7.3(a) is required to minimise potential displacement of existing permanent public service employees or to minimise, as far as possible, any disruption to the workforce that may result from organisational restructuring.

- (b) All proposals for limited applicant pools must be agreed to by the chief executive and the relevant industrial organisation of employees and have the approval of the Public Service Commissioner. This requirement does not apply to other schemes contained in an award, certified agreement or determination made under section 149 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* as provided for under section 7.4(iv) of this Directive.
- (d) Registered deployees, surplus departmental employees and staff seeking alternative placement due to a medical condition do not need to be included in a limited applicant pool if there is the potential to displace permanent employees.
- (e) Limited applicant pools may include temporary employees only where –
 - (i) there is no potential to displace tenured employees, and
 - (ii) an opportunity has first been given for surplus departmental employees, employees requiring alternative placement due to a medical condition and registered deployees to be considered in accordance with the provisions of relevant directives relating to priority placement.
- (e) Applications received after the closing date of a limited applicant pool may be considered.

7.15 Gazette notification

- (a) If an appointment is made to a vacancy which has been advertised in the *Gazette*, notification of the appointment must be published in the *Gazette*.
- (b) Notification of appointments made to recurring vacancies must be published in the *Gazette* where the original vacancy was notified in the *Gazette*.
- (c) Notice of the direct appointment of an employee made in accordance with section 7.12 is to be published in the *Gazette*.

7.16 Exemption

The Public Service Commissioner may exempt specific jobs or categories of jobs or agencies from specific parts of this Directive.

7.17 Transition

- (a) Selection processes for positions advertised according to Directive 01/04 – *Recruitment and Selection* are to be finalised in accordance with the provisions of that directive.
- (b) The provisions of sections 7.3 and 7.4 of this Directive may, for a period of six months from the commencement date of the Directive, be applied to any position treated as entry-level under Directive 01/04 – *Recruitment and Selection*.

- 2. Definitions**
 - 2.1 "**daily hours**" means –

the number of ordinary daily working hours of an employee as specified in an industrial instrument (as defined);

in any other case – the number of hours determined from the relevant industrial instrument (as defined) as the average number of hours per working day of an employee during a pay period or other period reasonable in the circumstances.
 - 2.2 "**immediate family**" includes –
 - (a) the employee's spouse; or

- (b) a child, ex-nuptial child, step-child, adopted child, ex-foster child of the employee or employees' spouse; or
- (c) parent, grandparent, grandchild, sister or brother of the employee and of the employee's spouse (such as the employee's mother-in-law, father-in-law, grandparent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law).

The list of family members provided for in this definition is not exhaustive. Agencies have the discretion to grant bereavement leave to employees on the death of family members that are not expressly provided for in this definition. Cultural and personal reasons may be taken into consideration when an agency makes a decision.

- 2.3 **"industrial instrument"** for the purposes of this directive means an award, industrial agreement, certified agreement, contract, former determination of the Governor-in-Council, directive or determination made under section 149 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1999*.
- 2.4 **"casual employee"** includes both long term casual employees and short term casual employees.
- 2.5 **"spouse"** of an employee includes –
 - (a) a former spouse; and
 - (b) a defacto spouse, including a spouse of the same sex as the employee.

3. Satisfactory proof

- 3.1 The employee is to furnish evidence of the death or funeral arrangements that are satisfactory to the chief executive.

4. Conversion to hourly basis

- 4.1 Leave prescribed in this directive may be converted to an hourly basis for the purpose of granting and recording the leave.

5. Leave granted on an hourly basis

- 5.1 If an employee applies for leave on a basis other than an hourly basis, the leave may be granted on an hourly basis.

6. Leave entitlement in hours

- 6.1 If an employee's leave entitlement is expressed in working days, the leave entitlement may be read as if it were expressed in working hours using the following formula –

LE = WD x DH

Where:

LE (leave entitlement) means the amount of leave entitlement expressed in working hours to which the employee is entitled.

WD (working days) means the number of working days set out in the directive.

DH (daily hours) means the employee's daily hours (as defined).

7. Leave based on the number of hours that the employee would have worked

- 7.1 Applications for bereavement leave are to be based on the number of hours that the employee was rostered to work on that day but did not work.

Example 1

If an employee, working 7.25 hours a day, departs on bereavement leave after 3 hours, then 4.25 hours bereavement leave is to be applied for.

Example 2

If an employee is rostered to work 7.6 hours and is absent on bereavement leave on that day, then 7.6 hours bereavement leave is to be applied for.

"**high occupancy taxi**" means a taxi capable of carrying five or more passengers (excluding the driver).

"**luxury vehicle**" means a vehicle defined as a luxury motor vehicle in Schedule 3 of the *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Regulation 1994*.

Application of agreed fare [s.74A of the Act]
