

#### Grounds

Information or evidence being relied on to support a reasonable suspicion that evidence of the commission of an offence or the confiscation related evidence is at the place.

At approximately 13:50 on the 25<sup>th</sup> June 2020, Trinity May BROWNE had been shopping at Moxies for Ladies in the Townsville Mall.

Upon leaving the store she noticed a man approaching her at a fast pace. The man is described as caucasian, late teens to early 20s, with an unshaven face, wearing a red piping hot t-shirt and black shorts.

BROWNE stated she immediately felt uncomfortable and turned into Town Lane to locate a security guard, as she turned the man grabbed her handbag straps and yanked and pulled until the bag came away from BROWNE'S shoulder.

During the same time Ace Security Guard Daniel GREEN was walking down Town Lane and observed the man yanking a bag from a woman's shoulder. GREEN was about 20 metres away and ran towards the incident. As the security guard came closer GREEN recognised the man, which by this time had fled with the woman's handbag. GREEN did not give chase as the woman was laying on the ground and GREEN stopped to provide aid.

The woman identified herself as Trinity May BROWNE while GREEN used his mobile phone to call police and continued to provide aid to BROWNE.

Police arrived at the scene at 13:52, in attendance was Sergeant Lou TENNANT and Constable Gene WRIGHT, also in attendance where paramedics from Queensland Ambulance Service, who provided first aid to BROWN for a suspected wrist fracture.

GREEN stated to police that the man was known in the area as a regular person who is known to shoplift from shops in Town Lane. GREEN was able to provide a name for the alleged offender – Johnno. GREEN further explained he had moved Johnno on earlier that day from the grocery store, Kwike Mart.

After receiving treatment BROWNE provided a statement of events QPS11223344, which included a description of alleged offender and the items stolen: one tote handbag and wallet containing a Google Pixel mobile phone, \$150 in cash, 2 bank cards, an Australian Passport issued to BROWNE.

Investigating Police obtained CCTV footage from Kwike Mart timestamped 25<sup>th</sup> June 2020 during 09:00 and 14:00. The footage clearly shows a man in a red shirt and black pants using inside the store and his appearance matched BROWNE's description.

GREEN attended the Townsville Police Station on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2020 to assist investigating officers with further identifying the man known as 'Johnno'. Using CCTV footage and police records GREEN was able to provide positive identification of 'Johnno' being one Johnathon Frank CITIZEN.

Current police records indicate the CITIZEN is currently residing with a female relative, believed to be CITIZEN's mother, at 1 Caper Street, Townsville and is known to go by the name 'Johnno'.

### Authority to exercise powers

Clothing the alleged offender was wearing during the offence can be worn by the person. Due to the size and nature of bank cards, they can easily be concealed on a person
