

Compared to non-Indigenous young people, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people were:

15 x as likely to have a proven offence

23 x as likely to receive a supervised order

30 X as likely to be held in Youth Justice custody

27 x as likely to be on remand



Custody is defined as young people in a youth detention centre on precourt custody, remand or sentence or in a police watchhouse/other custody location (e.g. in police transit, court cells, hospital) on remand or sentence. It excludes young people on pre-court custody in locations other than a youth detention centre.
- f. Includes both pre-court custody and remand


