Any entitlements not permanently transferred in this time will become entitlements of the State. Clubs wishing to temporarily transfer their entitlements are not required to lodge this form and must retain a gaming machine licence for the term of the transfer. Refer to guidelines. If the club is a party to a temporary transfer of entitlements, the surrender of the gaming machine licence will end that transfer. The club is advised to consult with the other party to the transfer and seek legal advice before lodging this form with OLGR. Clubs transferring their liquor licence are not required to lodge a surrender as the entitlements will automatically transfer to the new licensee on the re-issue of the liquor licence and issue of the new gaming licence.
