### Tax Time 2023 toolkit - small business

The ATO small business tax time toolkit 2023 is [now available](#). The toolkit includes updated links to useful

Association (RLPA) as part of a pay dispute with the NRL.

What you may have missed is the RLPA has put forward a proposal to sit down with the NRL and a mediator to try and resolve the issue.

The QSBC has a panel of 17 mediators that can help solve disputes about commercial and retail leases, usually between tenants and landlords.

Mediation can reduce the time and cost of disputes for small businesses and in June, 72% of our disputes were resolved successfully using mediation.

## Queensland Workforce Strategy providing practical support for employers

Queensland employers are able to access a range of workforce related support thanks to the [Queensland Workforce Strategy 2022–2032](#).

Small to medium businesses can reach out to an [Industry Workforce Advisor](#) to help identify workforce solutions, develop a workforce plan, identifying recruitment strategies to expand applicant pools or connecting with available support, including government programs and funding.

Through the [Workforce Connect Fund](#), small businesses can apply for a Human Resources (HR) Support Grant of up to \$5,000 (subject to available funding) to implement new and innovative HR solutions to address an immediate need.

Employers can also have one-on-one sessions with business mentors through the [Mentoring for Growth](#) programs to discuss options and ideas to solve workforce challenges or other business issues.

Other initiatives available assisting employers in attracting and retaining workers include the [Diverse Queensland Workforce](#) program to connect employers with local migrants, refugees and international students looking for work and the [Back](#)

information, tools, calculators, learning resources and other support and services.

You will also find updated [fact sheets on claiming deductions](#) for:

- the cost of using your home as a place of business
- motor vehicle expenses for your business
- expenses you incur when travelling for your business
- the cost of digital products used in running your business.

## Queensland Digital Licence app

Queensland's first Digital Licence app is now open for trial in Townsville and the wider Fraser Coast. This means businesses that check identification will begin to see their customers using their Digital Licence to prove their identity.

Legislation was passed in 2020 making the Digital Licence the legal equivalent of the physical licence under Queensland law, so Queenslanders can now use their Digital Licence as a legal and legitimate form of identification.

The Digital Licence is opt-in and optional so you will see a mix of physical and digital licences being used.

A range of resources has been developed to help you to help you incorporate the Digital Licence into your business processes, including ['how to' videos](#) and a [resource pack for businesses](#).

You are encouraged to check out the available resources to support your business and download the Digital Licence app for your own use. The expanded trial is open to all residents residing in eligible trial postcodes. You will find all the information you need to check your eligibility,



The RAP outlines key commitments to enhance cultural capability within the public sector, as well as the work each agency will do to support the establishment of a First Nations Treaty Institute, a Truth-telling and Healing Inquiry, an Interim Truth and Treaty Body and a Path to Treaty Office.
