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Let's get ready Queensland

A tropical low in the central Coral Sea is moving towards the Queensland coast and is forecast to become tropical cyclone Kirrily. It's likely heavy rainfall will develop across the central and southern inland, as well as southeast Queensland over the weekend and will result in flooding and road closures.



After the flood – resources for small businesses, commercial lease tenants and landlords

The QSBC acknowledges the impact of December's severe weather in Queensland on small businesses and commercial leases. To aid affected parties, we recommend two legal factsheets for advice and answers to common questions:

Cyclones are unpredictable and things can change quickly, bringing flooding and a storm surge with them. It's important to stay informed, follow weather forecasts and act quickly on any advice.

There are some important things we should all do to Get Ready:

- Review your [Household Severe Weather Emergency Plan](#)
- Check that your [emergency kit](#) is up to date
- Know where to go for [local information and warnings](#).

If you're a small business owner, having a plan can help reduce potential impacts so you can recover quickly. Access the [business continuity plan template](#) to learn how to develop a risk management plan, a business impact analysis, an incident response plan, and a recovery plan.



Small business disaster assistance

Businesses and not-for-profits in the Logan, Scenic Rim, Gold Coast, Cairns, Cassowary Coast, Cook, Douglas, Hope Vale Aboriginal Shire, Mareeba, Tablelands, Wujal Wujal Aboriginal Shire and Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire local government areas may be eligible for:

- **disaster assistance loans** up to \$250,000 for small businesses and \$100,000 for not-for profits to help repair or replace damaged assets like plant and equipment, or to repair premises.
- **essential working capital loans** up to \$100,000 for small businesses for the continuation of operations, including paying wages, rents or rates.
- **extraordinary disaster assistance recovery grants** up to \$50,000 for small businesses experiencing direct damage, to hire or purchase equipment and materials, clean up, remove debris, replace or repair damaged infrastructure and stock, and other costs associated with the recovery process.

Additionally, download the [Disaster or Emergency Event Log template](#) which assists in documenting decisions and actions taken post-event, ensuring comprehensive records to minimise stress and improve the efficiency of future insurance claims. Timely completion of this template is crucial, as accessing disaster grants or loans often depends on the completion of the insurance claim process.

Primary producer disaster assistance

Primary producers in Logan, Scenic Rim, Gold Coast, Cairns, Cassowary Coast, Cook, Douglas, Hinchinbrook, Hope Vale Aboriginal Shire, Mareeba, Tablelands, Wujal Wujal Aboriginal Shire and Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire local government areas may be eligible for:

- **disaster recovery grants** up to \$75,000 to assist with short-term recovery needs including pasture rehabilitation, fodder, replacing livestock, and repairs to infrastructure and equipment
- **disaster assistance loans** up to \$250,000 to help repair or replace damaged assets, including stock, and maintain liquidity
- **essential working capital loans** of up to \$100,000 from QRIDA to help you continue operating
- **freight assistance** up to \$5,000 to assist with the movement of stock, feed, machinery, fuel, water, and building or fencing materials.

Queensland businesses have their say on training needs

Let's protect respect – again

The Let's Protect Respect campaign is once again in market, empowering industries to take positive action to embrace gender equality and ensure bullying and unfair treatment has no place in the workplace.

First launched in March 2023, the campaign aims to promote support and drive change for apprentices and trainees, particularly female apprentices, as well as women and girls aspiring for great careers in male-dominated occupations like traditional trades. It does this by promoting respect and support available to all apprentices, trainees and employers so they know their rights and obligations, and where to turn for help if things go wrong at work.

The campaign also promotes positive action for

- the relevancy of courses and content, and the benefits of practical training and access to work experience
- balancing apprentice and trainee study requirements with business needs
- good communication between industry and organisations involved in VET, particularly between the various parties involved in apprenticeships and traineeships
- access to training for both students and employers across Queensland communities
- consistency in training delivery and job-ready graduates
- the strong link between VET pathways and industry.

Celebrating Reconciliation Grants

The Queensland Government Celebrating Reconciliation Grants will support up to 32 Queensland-based reconciliation events held in or around National Reconciliation Week.

National Reconciliation Week (27 May - 3 June) builds on respectful relationships shared by Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous peoples.

Eligible organisations can apply for grants between \$5,000 and \$10,000 (exclusive of GST) per event to deliver a range of reconciliation events that:

- increase awareness of Reconciliation Australia's five dimensions of reconciliation including historical acceptance, unity, equality and equity, race relations and institutional integrity
- raise community awareness of National Reconciliation Week
- offer community members opportunities to learn, share, and grow, for example, through sharing stories about past events and showcasing local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, arts and cultural activities
- promote and facilitate respect, trust and positive relationships between the wider Queensland community and Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islander peoples
- contribute to a state-wide program of inclusive and innovative community events, initiatives and promotions
- promote social cohesion through building better relationships between Aboriginal peoples, Torres Strait Islander peoples and the wider Australian community
- encourage local community organisations to have and show respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Queenslanders.
