Restrictions update

The <u>local government areas of Brisbane, Gold Coast, Moreton Bay, Logan, Townsville and Palm Island</u> will return to Stage 2 restrictions from 4pm today (Thursday 30 September) for two weeks.

This means businesses can operate with 1 person per 4m² indoors or 1 person per 2m² for smaller venues (up to a maximum of 50 people) or outdoor spaces. Customers must be seated when they are eating or drinking.

Weddings and funerals are capped at 100 people. Up to 30 people can gather at home.

People in these areas or anyone who has been in these areas recently must also follow the mask wearing requirements.

Please continue to use the <u>Check In Qld app</u> when you leave your home to support fast contact tracing and <u>book a vaccination appointment</u> with Queensland Health or a local GP or pharmacy or search for a walk-in vaccination centre.

You can see the <u>updated Roadmap to easing restrictions</u> and check back for updates to the latest directions from the Chief Health Officer.

COVID-19 Business Support Grants

Nearly 17,000 COVID-19 Business Support Grants paid - apply before 16 Nov 2021

The application window for COVID-19 Business Support Grants has hit the halfway point, and with more than \$170 million already paid to Queensland businesses affected by the August lockdowns, it's time to check your eligibility to apply.

West End gym owner, Ash Danenic, is determined to see her business bounce back from the August lockdown, so she was quick off the mark to apply for a COVID-19 Business Support Grant.

"Operating in this environment is tough, there's no reduction in the outgoing bills, but what's coming into the business is significantly reduced," Ash said. "So, grants like this mean we can trade confidently for the rest of the year."

COVID-19 Business Support Grants of between \$1,000 and \$30,000 are available for all eligible businesses that apply before 16 November 2021 (for businesses or not-for-profits that employ staff) and 30 November 2021 (for sole traders without staff).

To be eligible, you must show a drop in business of 30 per cent or more during the lockdown, have an annual turnover of at least \$75,000 and be registered for GST.
