TEMPORARY STATE PLANNING POLICY: PROTECTING WETLANDS OF HIGH ECOLOGICAL SIGNIFICANCE IN GREAT BARRIER REEF CATCHMENTS

The Temporary State Planning Policy 1/11: Protecting Wetlands of High Ecological Significance in Great Barrier Reef Catchments (SPP 1/11) will commence on 3 May 2011. This State planning policy replaces the Temporary State Planning Policy 1/10: Protecting Wetlands of High Ecological Significance in Great Barrier Reef Catchments (SPP 1/10). The remake of SPP 1/10 was necessary to allow sufficient time for persons affected by the recent extreme weather conditions to provide comment on the Draft State Planning Policy: Protecting Wetlands of High Ecological Significance in Great Barrier Reef Catchments. The draft policy was released in December 2010 to seek submissions on a final State planning policy. SPP 1/11 will continue to apply to wetlands of high ecological significance within the Great Barrier Reef catchments only, from the Daintree River catchment to Baffle Creek catchment, whilst submissions are considered.

The Queensland Government, through the Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM) and the Department of Local Government and Planning, is committed to protecting the Great Barrier Reef. Wetlands in river basins and catchments that flow into the reef lagoon play a significant role in reducing pollution and sediment that can damage reef ecosystems.

SPP 1/11 focuses on managing high impact earthworks that change the way water flows in and out of these wetlands. These earthworks can include filling or draining wetlands, or constructing levees, bunds or dams.

SPP 1/11 will apply for up to 12 months from the release date.

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No 07) 2011*.

Easements taken [s.15 of the Act]

2. The easements described in Schedule 2 are taken by Ergon Energy Corporation Limited (ACN 087 646 062) for Electrical Works purposes and vest in Ergon Energy Corporation Limited

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by each Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

**STATEMENT OF RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS
DEFINITIONS**

1. In this Easement:-
 - 1.1 "Acts" means the *Electricity Act 1994* and *Government Owned Corporations Act 1993* and any amendments to them or either of them or any Acts superseding those Acts;
 - 1.2 "Date of this Easement" means the date of the gazette resumption notice;
 - 1.3 "Easement" means the rights obtained from the Owner by Ergon including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule;
 - 1.4 "Easement Land" means that portion of the Owner's land over which this Easement is obtained;
 - 1.5 "Electricity Works" means such works, apparatus, structures and things as Ergon may in its absolute discretion consider appropriate as a means of conveying, transmitting or distributing electricity, telecommunications and other electrical energy in all its forms, including conductors, cables, towers, aerials, poles, foundations, ground anchorages, supports and other associated or appurtenant works. The expression includes the electricity works existing on the Easement Land at the Date of this Easement or constructed on it after that date, and where the context permits it includes a reference to any part of the electricity works;
 - 1.6 "ERGON" means Ergon Energy Corporation Limited ACN 087 646 062 together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of Ergon and other persons authorised by Ergon to exercise its rights under this Easement;
 - 1.7 "Ergon's Land" means Ergon Energy Corporation Limited ACN 087 646 062 together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of Ergon and other persons authorised by Ergon to exercise its rights under this Easement;
 - 1.8 "Owner" means the Registered Proprietor together with its successors, successors in title and assigns. Where the term appears in Clauses 3,4,5,6 and 7 it includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen and contractors of the Owner and other persons authorised by the Owner to use or enter upon the Easement Land;
 - 1.9 "Road" means an access formation or carriage way including any earth works, drainage, culverts, and/or other associated or appurtenant works;
 - 1.10 "Services" means underground drains, pipes, conduits and channels for the passage or conveyance of services including but not limited to water of whatsoever nature or kind through, across, under or above the Easement Land together with manholes, field inlet pits and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments as may be required from time to time.

ERGON'S RIGHTS

2. Ergon is acquiring this Easement in perpetuity to permit Ergon the right to:-
 - 2.1 unrestricted access to pass and repass over the Easement Land at any time by day or by night;
 - 2.2 convey, transmit and distribute electricity, telecommunications and other electrical energy

- 2.3 in all its forms on, from, over, under, across and through the Easement Land by Electricity Works; enter upon and traverse the Easement Land, with vehicles, plant and equipment, if necessary, to exercise its rights under this Easement;
- 2.4 construct Electricity Works on, from, over, under, across or through the Easement Land;
- 2.5 construct and maintain a Road on the Easement Land to a standard that ERGON determines;
- 2.6 inspect, maintain, repair, replace or remove the Electricity Works;
- 2.7 clear and keep clear the Easement Land of trees, undergrowth or vegetation or any obstruction in the manner and by the means Ergon considers appropriate;
- 2.8 construct and maintain on the Easement Land such tracks, roads, gates, fences and other structures and works as Ergon considers necessary;
- 2.9 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any infringement by the Owner of Ergon's rights under this Easement; and
- 2.10 Ergon may in connection with its use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of its rights, powers, discretion and functions under the Acts, or any other Act or at law as it sees fit.

ERGON'S OBLIGATIONS TO THE OWNER

3. ERGON will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:-
 - 3.1 cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible;
 - 3.2 act reasonably.
4. **ERGON WILL COMPLY WITH SAFETY LAWS**
 - 4.1 Ergon will so far as it is lawfully bound to do comply with all laws regarding the exercise of its rights under this Easement and the safety of persons to use the Easement Land;
 - 4.2 Ergon will not be liable for:-
 - (a) the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
 - (b) the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.
 - 4.3 Ergon indemnifies the Owner against all actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages and expenses arising out of or in respect of any act or omission of Ergon in the use or attempted use of this easement and the Easement Land by Ergon, except where such actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages or expenses arise as a result of any negligent act or omission of the Owner, breach of this Easement or of the law.

THINGS THE OWNER MUST NOT DO

5. The Owner must not:-
 - 5.1 interfere with or obstruct Ergon in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under this Easement;
 - 5.2 interfere with, damage or place at risk the Electricity Works, Road or Services, plant, equipment, tools or materials of Ergon on the Easement Land.

**THINGS THE OWNER MAY ONLY DO IF ERGON
CONSENTS**

6. The Owner must not, after the Date of this Easement, without first obtaining the written consent of Ergon:-
 - 6.1 erect or place any buildings or structures or make any additions or alterations to any buildings or structures on the Easement Land;
 - 6.2 erect any fence that is higher than three (3) metres on the Easement Land;
 - 6.3 place or stockpile fill, soil, sand, gravel or other substance or construct any roads, dam walls or other earthworks or carry out any works or do anything whatsoever on the Easement Land which

- would reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the voltage class of the transmission line on the Easement Land;
- 6.4 cause or allow, except in the case of force majeure, the inundation of those parts of the Easement Land where any Roads or Electricity Works is located or erected or is proposed to be located or erected;
- 6.5 lay any metal object, conduit or pipe on, over, under, in or across the Easement Land within five (5) metres of the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support;
- 6.6 do any act or thing which jeopardises the foundations, ground anchorages, supports, towers or poles, including (without limitation) excavate or remove any soil, sand or gravel within a distance of twenty (20) metres from the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support on the Easement Land;
- 6.7 grow or permit the growing of sugar cane upon the Easement Land where it is not assigned sugar cane land as at the date hereof;
- 6.8 where the Owner is the holder of a cane production area under the *Sugar Industry Act 1999* over the Easement Land, grow sugar cane within ten (10) metres of any tower base, pole, cable or ground anchorage upon the Easement Land;
- 6.9 plant upon the Easement Land trees or any other vegetation whose height would in any way interfere with the statutory clearance that may exist from time to time;
- 6.10 reside in or permit anyone to reside in or occupy any caravan, mobile home or other temporary accommodation which may be located on the Easement Land, even when the Easement Land is part of a caravan park;

and Ergon will not unreasonably withhold its consent but in granting any consent may impose reasonable conditions.

OWNER MAY USE EASEMENT

7. The Owner may use the Easement Land for any lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement.

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No 08) 2011*

Easement taken [s.9 of the Act]

2. The Easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Rockhampton Regional Council for Drainage purposes and vests in Rockhampton Regional Council on and from 6 May 2011.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

1. INTERPRETATION

- 1.1 In this Easement -
 “Council” means **ROCKHAMPTON REGIONAL**

COUNCIL and includes the successors in title of the Council;

“**Easement Area**” means the area of land affected by the Easement in the lot burdened by the Easement without limitation as to height or depth;

“**facility**” includes work;

“**jurisdiction of local government**” has the same meaning as the term “jurisdiction of local government” under the *Local Government Act 2009*;

“**Land**” means each lot burdened by the Easement;

“**Land Title Act**” means the *Land Title Act 1994*;

“**local government**” has the same meaning as the term “local government” under the *Local Government Act 2009*;

“**Local Government Act**” means the *Local Government Act 2009*;

“**local government Act**” has the same meaning as the term “local government Act” under the *Local Government Act 2009*;

“**Owner**” means each registered owner of an interest in the Land and the successors in title of each registered owner;

“**structure**” means anything built or constructed, whether or not attached to land;

“**territorial unit**” has the same meaning as the term “territorial unit” under the *Local Government Act 2009* for a local government;

“**Works**” means the Council’s works at any time constructed, in the course of construction or to be constructed wholly or partly upon, beneath or above the surface of the Easement Area determined by the Council to be necessary for or in connection with the purpose for which this Easement is granted as well as works for the protection and/or support of all such things **AND** without limiting the generality of the abovementioned includes but is not limited to overland or underground drains, pipes, conduits and channels for the passage or conveyance of rainwater and other lawful discharges through, across or under the Easement Area together with manholes, field inlet pits and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments including overland drains created by extensive excavation and incision which substantially alter the natural surface levels and contours of the Easement Area.

- 1.2 If any covenant or its application to the Owner, the Easement Area or circumstances shall be or become invalid or unenforceable, the remaining covenants of this Easement are not to be affected and each covenant is to be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

- 1.3 References to statutes regulations local laws or subordinate local law extend to all statutes regulations local law or subordinate local law amending consolidating or replacing the same.

- 1.4 If the Owner comprises two or more legal entities, their covenants bind them jointly and each of them severally.

2. PURPOSE OF EASEMENT

- 2.1 The Easement is granted for the Council to use the Easement Area for -

2.1.1 Drainage purposes; and

2.1.2 Any service, facility or activity of whatever description which the Council has authority to undertake, directly or indirectly in the exercise by the Council of the jurisdiction of local government within its territorial unit under a local government Act or otherwise directly or indirectly referable to the purpose stated at Article 2.1.1.

3. WHAT THE COUNCIL IS ALLOWED TO DO

- 3.1 To enable the Council to fully use the Easement Area for the purpose of this Easement, the Owner must allow the Council at any time without any interruption from the Owner or any occupier of the Land or any part of the Land to do all things upon, beneath or above the surface of the Easement Area at any time determined by the Council to be necessary for or in respect of the Works.

- 3.2 Without limiting the generality of the lastmentioned but by way of example, the Owner or any other occupier of any part of the Land must allow the Council -

3.2.1 to place the Works wholly or partly upon, beneath or above the surface of the Easement Area;

- 3.2.2 to construct, operate, test, inspect, cleanse, maintain and repair the Works;
- 3.2.3 to alter, add to, augment, replace, extend or deviate the Works;
- 3.2.4 to dig up the surface and sub-surface of the Easement Area and remove any soil from the Easement Area;
- 3.2.5 to enter upon and remain, pass and repass on and over the Easement Area for all or any of the authorised purposes with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description whatsoever;
- 3.2.6 to take down any fencing on the Easement Area;
- 3.2.7 to run and pass water, fluids, stormwater, substances of any description, electric current, electric and gas transmissions, electronic signals and electronic transmissions through, from, to or about the Works or the Easement Area;
- 3.2.8 to clear and keep clear the Easement Area by any means or method and to cut and remove timber, trees and undergrowth from the Easement Area and dispose of the same by any method;
- 3.2.9 to construct and maintain on the Easement Area such access tracks, gates and appurtenant works as the Council shall consider necessary;
- 3.2.10 to do such other matters and things through, across, in or under the Easement Area as are incidental to the proper exercise of the rights conferred under this Easement.
- 3.3 In doing anything allowed in respect of the Easement, the Council is entitled to do those things by its employees, agents and invitees and with or without the use of all necessary motor vehicles, machinery, equipment and implements.
- 3.4 All soil which the Council determines is to be dug up from the Easement Area for or in respect of the Works -
- 3.4.1 becomes the property of the Council without Council being under any liability whatever to pay any amount to the Owner by way of compensation or otherwise; and
- 3.4.2 may be removed by the Council from the Easement Area at the cost and expense of the Council.
- 3.5 When an employee, agent or invitee of the Council enters onto and remains on the Easement Area under this Easement for or in respect of the Works and with or without the use of all necessary motor vehicles, machinery, equipment and implements -
- 3.5.1 the employee, agent or invitee of the Council is able to do so at any time;
- 3.5.2 the employee, agent or invitee of the Council may do so without any requirement for the Council or the employee or agent or invitee to obtain the further agreement of the Owner and/or any occupier of the Land;
- 3.5.3 consistent with the nature of the activity undertaken for or in respect of the Works, the Council is to reinstate, replace or restore the Easement Area or that part of the Easement Area to a condition determined by the Council to be appropriate in the then prevailing circumstances and the particular situation.
- 4. WHAT THE OWNER IS TO DO**
- 4.1 To enable the Council to fully use the Easement Area for the purpose of the Works, neither the Owner nor any occupier of the Land or part of the Land is to do or permit to be done anything on or in respect of the Works or the Easement Area which could obstruct or interfere with the Works or the proper and effective use of the Works or the Easement Area by the Council.
- 4.2 Without limiting the generality of the lastmentioned but by way of example, the Owner or any other occupier of any part of the Land is not to -
- 4.2.1 build or erect any structure on, under or over the Easement Area unless specifically permitted, in writing, by Council;
- 4.2.2 plant trees or shrubs within the Easement Area or immediately adjacent to the Easement Area and, in the latter case, which could obstruct or interfere with the Works or the proper and effective use of the Works by the Council;
- 4.2.3 install concrete, bitumen or other pavement or driveways on the Easement Area or gardens or landscaping involving concrete, brick or other permanent materials;
- 4.2.4 remove or stockpile or permit the removal or stockpiling of any soil, sand, gravel or other substance or material on the Easement Area or construct any roads, paths, dam wall or other earthworks on the Easement Area which would in any way obstruct or interfere with the property and effective use of the Works by the Council;
- 4.2.5 apart from external boundary fences across or along the Easement Area, which are not to be brick or masonry, fence the boundaries of the Easement Area in such a manner that Council's access to the Works could be obstructed or interfered with;
- 4.2.6 where the Works comprise or include a surface drainage channel or flow path, place or allow to be placed in on or adjacent to the Works material which could lessen the depth or alter the path of the channel;
- 4.2.7 erect any fence or other devices across larger gullies within the Easement or on the Easement boundary, or anywhere else within the Easement Area, where such a fence or device could obstruct the overland flow of water within the Easement;
- 4.2.8 alter the ground surface level of the Easement Area to expose Works or reduce or increase the depth of ground between Works and the ground surface level nor place temporary or permanent loads of any description in or on the Easement Area or on land adjacent to the Easement Area which may affect the integrity of the Works;

- Council may enter the Easement Area and remove the obstruction or stem the interference or otherwise do such acts or things as may be necessary to enforce the Council's rights hereunder.
- 4.6 All costs incurred by the Council (including the Council's usual administrative on costs and legal costs calculated on a solicitor and own client basis) in acting under Article 4.5 are a debt due and owing by the Owner to the Council payable by the Owner to the Council on demand.

- 5.1 To gain access to the Easement Area the Council may pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area. However, if livestock are contained within the fenced area, the Council must give reasonable notice to the Owner to enable the Owner to secure the livestock.
- 6. REINSTATEMENT OF FENCING**

- 9.1.2 the mediation notice must state that a dispute has arisen and identify what the dispute is about;
- 9.1.3 the parties must appoint a mediator within fourteen (14) days of service of the mediation notice, but if they fail to agree, a mediator must be appointed by the President of the Queensland Law Society Incorporated or any successor of that Society;
- 9.1.4 the parties must observe the instructions of the mediator about the conduct of the mediation;
- 9.1.5 if the dispute is not settled in thirty (30) days after the mediator is appointed, the mediation ceases.
- 9.2 The parties must share equally the costs of the mediation.

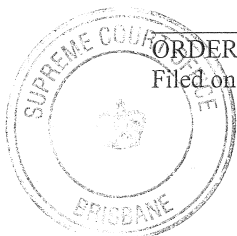


